Jack Jurek Wins PBA50 South Shore Open for First PBA50 Tour Title

HAMMOND, Ind. - Jack Jurek of Lackawanna, N.Y., who has endured a series of bad breaks in his quest for his first PBA50 Tour title, made a breakthrough Thursday night when he struck on eight of his first nine shots to defeat PBA Hall of Famer Randy Pedersen of Clermont, Fla., 242-205, in the title match of the PBA50 South Shore Open at Olympia Lanes.

"It's never an easy battle out here," Jurek said. "I've won a couple of Steve Nagy Sportsmanship Awards because I've lost a lot of times in title matches and people think I'm a nice guy.'

Jurek, who had disappointing losses in Dayton, Ohio, a week earlier after losing a crushing loss to Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. earlier in the year in the USBC Senior Masters title match, came into the finale in Hammond with a fresh attitude, thanks in part to some advice he got from Pedersen, his traveling roommate.

"(Randy) and I talked a little after my debacle in Dayton

and he gave me some thoughts about how he approaches things," Jurek said. "It helped. I've got a lot of guys who have been trying to help. (PBA legend) Mark Roth has been telling me, stop being so nice. Go beat people, so tonight I just decided to go for it. I was a lot more aggressive than I have been."

Against Pedersen, Jurek's only major mistake was leav-

ing a 2-4-8-10 split in the fourth frame, but otherwise he was nearly perfect.

"Jack was due," Pedersen said. "He's been bowling really well. After he left the 2-4-8-10 (in the fifth frame), I was wondering if the old Jack was going to show up or the new one. He preserved."

In the first semifinal round between a pair of PBA Hall of Famers, Pedersen defeated

Pete Weber of St. Ann, Mo., 267-226, putting a crimp in Weber's hopes to overtake fellow PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke in the 2014 PBA50 Player of the Year race. That battle will be decided in the PBA50 Tour's season finale in Welch. Minn., next week.

Duke, who leads the race with 56 points, failed to add to his total in Hammond when he continued on page 11

50th Anniversary Barbasol PBA Tournament of Champions Returns to Indianapolis *Historic PBA major championship returns to the city of its birth Feb. 11-15, 2015*

INDIANAPOLIS – Woodland Bowl, the host for some of the most memorable championships in Professional Bowlers Association history, will once again step into the spotlight early in 2015 when the 50th anniversary PBA Tournament of Champions returns to the city where it was born.

The newly-renovated Woodland Bowl will host the milestone Barbasol PBA Tournament of Champions Monday, Feb. 11 through Sunday, Feb. 15, when ESPN will televise the finals live at 1 p.m. ET. First prize will be \$50,000. All qualifying and match play rounds will be covered live on PBA's subscription-based online bowling channel, Xtra Frame.

Throughout its history, Woodland Bowl has hosted 30 PBA Tour events including four U.S. Opens, two PBA World Championships, two PBA Touring Players Championships and, most recently, the 2013 PBA Tournament of Champions which was won in historic fashion by PBA Hall of Famer Pete Weber.

Weber also won the 1991 U.S. Open and 1992 PBA Touring Players Championships at Wood-land.

"I told (Woodland Bowl general manager) Jim Doty, what a great place to break Earl's record," Weber said, referring to the fact that he's currently tied with PBA legend Earl Anthony with 10 PBA major titles. "I feel comfortable when I walk in the door because I know I'm going to bowl well."

Weber will have opportunities to break the majors record in the PBA World Championship later this year in Las Vegas or the United States Bowling Congress Master the week prior to the Tournament of Champions, but if he doesn't win either of those events, he'll come to Indianapolis with a lot of confidence.

"When I heard the news that we're going back to Woodland, I told myself I know I can win there. You always want to do something Earl hasn't done, so winning my 11th major there would be really cool."

Weber tied Anthony for most PBA majors when he defeated Australia's Jason Belmonte, 224-179, to win the 2013 Barbasol PBA Tournament of Champions, becoming the oldest player ever to win at the TOC at age 50 and becoming the only player in PBA history to complete the PBA Triple Crown (TOC, U.S. Open and PBA World Championship) twice. Belmonte will return to Indianapolis as defending TOC champion after winning the 2014 title in Allen Park, Mich.

The return of the TOC to Indianapolis is significant because the tournament originated at Play Bowl in 1962 in Indianapolis and Indianapolis was the home to titled sponsor Barbasol when it was invented as the first commercial shaving cream in 1919.

"We're very happy to continue our long-standing partnership with the PBA," said Barbasol Director of Media Relations Dean Bring. "Barbasol has a rich legacy of sports sponsorship and to be aligned with the PBA's signature event is a great fit for both of our organizations."

Tournament of Champions week will begin with PBA Hall of Fame induction ceremonies on Tuesday, Feb. 10. The PBA will announce additional details regarding the hall of fame soon.

A capacity field of 150 champions will begin competition on Wednesday, Feb. 11, with eightgame qualifying rounds at 10 a.m. and 5 p.m. Every PBA member in good standing who has ever won a PBA title – PBA Tour, PBA50 Tour, PBA International Tour, PBA Regional or PBA Women's Series – will be eligible to participate.

After a third qualifying round Thursday morning, the top 24 players will advance to eight-game round-robin match play rounds Thursday and Friday to determine the five stepladder finalists.

Saturday's schedule will feature three pro-am squads for Indianapolis area grassroots men, women, youth and senior league bowlers.



No one was surprised by Mike's performance because he is a SMOOTH STROKER who regularly averages 225 or better. When Mike releases the ball he is able to get so low that you can't hear the ball contact the lanebed. Mike is smoooth.

Mike used an Ebonite Playmaker to register his super score and is grateful to JIM and MATT MURTISHAW of Fast Lanes Pro Shop for teaching him to drill bowling balls and allowing him to use their equipment to drill his balls.

Lauffer's previous high was an 806. The 857 (268 - 289 -300) was his third eight hundred to go along with seven perfect games. Mike is one those bowlers who could have thirty 300s if he had any luck. Like many strokers he has dozens of games where he rolled twelve perfect hits and got "TAPPED."

Mike has been bowling since the day his grandparents gave him a ten pound Silver Siren. He loves bowling and has enjoyed every moment of his journey to the top. While Mike launches from the right side his favorite bowler is PARKER BOHN III. Why, because of his form and personality. Mike considers Parker to be the ideal role model, always friendly, always accommodating and always the consummate professional.

The big question is: Is Mike's 857 a Cal Oaks house record? YES and NO!

Better yet, "TO BE DETERMINED." JUSTIN BORLAND'S 858 has been considered the house record for several years now, but is it? Rumor has it that Justin bowled his super score in games two, three and four of a four game set and I believe the USBC only recognizes an eight hundred series when bowled in the first three games of a four game set. If the rumor is true, Mr. Lauffer is the real Cal Oaks record holder. I am trying to reach Mr. Borland for a clarification and will report my findings at a later date.

PAUL NIELSON is the perfect example of this rule. Last season he scored 879 in games two, three and four of a four game series and it wasn't recognized by the USBC or the house.

HALL OF FAMER JASON COUCH Wins PBA East "Super Regional" Title in Delaware

MIDDLETOWN — PBA Hall of Famer Jason Couch of Clermont, Fla., bowling in his first PBA competition in a year, defeated Ryan Shafer of Horseheads, N.Y., 234-190, to win the \$15,000 first prize in the PBA Gene Carter Pro Shop Classic, a PBA East Region "super regional," at Mid-County Lanes in Middletown, Del., Sunday. PBA's Xtra Frame fans got to watch the entire tournament unfold live, start-to-finish, on PBA's online bowling channel.

Couch, who was inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame in 2012, had not competed in a PBA event since announcing his retirement from PBA Tour competition a year ago. After qualifying 14th, Couch posted a 12-4 match play record to become the tournament leader entering the stepladder finals. He broke open a title battle with Shafer when Shafer lost his footing in the final frame and opened.

In addition to his 26th career PBA Regional title, Couch took home a \$15,000 prize, the largest payoff in PBA East Region history, surpassing the \$12,500 prize earned last year by Danny Wiseman of Baltimore. The tournament drew a field of 171 participants from 18 states and two Canadian provinces.



was eliminated in the Round of 8. Weber picked up four points for finishing fourth to increase his total to 48 heading into Welch, Minn. In the second semifinal match, Jurek, a PBA50 Tour rookie and two-time PBA Tour title winner, used a string of nine strikes to defeat Canadian John Chapman, 267-206. For Chapman, who was trying for his first PBA50 title, it was his highest finish as a senior player.

The most dramatic match of the tournament came in the bestof-five-game Round of 16 when Chapman eliminated Duke, 3-2. After Duke jumped out to a 2-0 lead, Chapman rallied to win the last three games, 247-234, 231-224 and 248-247.


