LAS VEGAS - Eric Forkel (Henderson, NV), won his 15th WCST Regular Division Title, last week-end at the Gold Coast Lanes in Las Vegas. Eric qualified for the 10 games with 2400 and was the leader. He battled 2nd place finisher Alan Frederick thru out the entire finals.

Alan had won all of his matches up until the Position Round. Eric had won 6 and one half matches, and held a 38 pin lead over Alan. Both bowlers began a string of strikes. Eric outlasted Alan 268-255, and won by 81 pins. The other six bowlers were never in contention. Alan's 1932 was the high score for the 8 games.

26 bowlers entered this tournament in the regular division, with 8 checks being paid out for \$3,785.00. Super Seniors had 33 entries, and paid out 11 checks for \$4,830.00. Totals so far for the year, 14 \$105,850.00 Tournaments, paid out, and for 314 tournaments, \$3,579,501.00 paid out. PBA Unveils Plans for Richest Tournament of Champions in History

\$1 million prize fund, tournament format, eligibility rules set for record-setting event

SEATTLE, Wash. (Aug. 13, 2010) - The Professional Bowlers Association is gearing up for the richest tournament in professional bowling history, the \$1 million PBA Tournament of Champions, and for the first time is creating an opportunity for any player who has ever won a PBA title to take a shot at the record \$250,000 first prize.

The PBA Tournament of Champions will be conducted Jan. 16-22 at Red Rock Lanes in Las Vegas, Nev., and it will feature an all-new format featuring a "Champions field" to determine the players who will advance to the "Elite field."

The "Elite field" will be composed of: 2010-11 Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour exempt players; any player who was listed among the "50 Greatest Players in PBA History" during the PBA Tour's 50th anniversary celebration in 2009; any PBA Hall of Famer; any player who has won five or more PBA Tour titles; any player who has won a PBA major championship; the 2010 PBA Senior U.S. Open and USBC Senior Masters champions, and the 2010 PBA Regional Players Championship and Regional Players Invitational winners.

All other PBA title winners, up to a maximum of 180, will make up the "Champions" field. The Champions field

"To receive such a high level

will include players who have won four or fewer PBA Tour titles or a PBA regional, PBA Women's Series, PBA Senior Tour or PBA Senior Regional title as of Jan. 9, 2011. Titles won by players who were not members at that time are not eligible.

The Champions field will bowl 14 games - two sevengame qualifying rounds each on Sunday and Monday, Jan. 16 and 17. After 14 games, the top half of the Champions field (up to 90 players) will join the Elite field. Qualifying scores from the Champions round will be dropped.

The Elite field - including Champions field qualifiers and Elite players – will begin qualifying on Monday evening, Jan. 17. All bowlers then will bowl 20 games in four fivegame blocks to determine the top 54 (based on 216 entries) who will advance into the Cashers Round.

After two eight-game blocks in the Cashers Round, the top 24 based on 36 total games will advance to a traditional 24 games of round-robin match play. At the conclusion of match play, the top four will advance to the TV final.

The first key step, however, is that all players eligible and wishing to enter must be fullfledged PBA members as of Oct. 1.

The entry fee for all Tour-

nament of Champions competitors will be \$750 if paid by Dec. 15 (\$1,000 after Dec. 15). To enter, look for the Tournament of Champions entry link when you log on to pba.com as a PBA member.

The rewards for bowling well will be unprecedented in PBA history. The payoffs for making the four-player stepladder final on Saturday, Jan. 22. will be \$250,000 to win. \$100,000 for second, \$60,000 for third and \$40,000 for fourth place. Based upon a starting field of 216, last-to-cash will be \$2,500 for 54th place.

Concluding the week will be the PBA Hall of Fame dinner on Saturday, Jan. 22. Details on that event will be announced soon.The entire Tournament of Champions will be covered live on pba.com's Xtra Frame video streaming service. To subscribe, visit pba.com and click on the Xtra Frame logo. Details regarding television coverage of the Tournament of Champions will be announced soon.

The PBA Tournament of Champions is the PBA Tour's signature event, an event filled with historical significance including the 2010 TOC which was won by Kelly Kulick of Union, N.J. - the first woman ever to bowl in the event, and the first woman ever to win a

PBA Tour title.



The Bowler (Ken DeGroff's Story)

At the age of 7, Ken De-Groff walks into Brooksville Bowling Center in Florida with his dad Albert DeGroff. Watching his dad practice, the eager 7 year old kid says to himself, "Wow" I can do that. So his dad let him bowl and this is when his bowling journey begins.

Since Ken started to practice all the time. He had his good days and bad days but bad didn't discourage him at all. When Ken's dad rolled his first 300 at age 61 on his Monday night men's league, Ken was so proud of him and filled with envy and determination to get a 300 himself. Ken's dad unfortunately passed away in July 2008. Ken misses him very much and will always be thankful his father taught him to bowl.

The day finally came at the age of 25, Ken DeGroff rolled his first 300 at a tournament in Tampa Bay, Florida. Later on Ken joined a league in West Palm Beach, Florida and at one time when he missed two weeks of bowling, his team was worried. He wasn't and after warming up, the first game began with a 265, then a 300, then another 300! Everyone was watching with excitement, his team congratulated him and bought drinks. He had a 865 series with 34 of 36 strikes. He was not very nervous and was very relaxed. His father missed the event due to work but was very proud of his son.

In 2000, Ken moved to Pennsylvania. While working at Berks Lanes, he also bowled a league there. One night Ken bowled 300 back to back again

with 223-300-300. He could not believe that twice in his career and in two different states that got him a new record in USBC books. He finished with a 240 average that year.

In 2004 Ken moved to California and at present working as a porter and just finished the 2009-2010 season bowling on Wednesday night league at Mission Hills Bowl and Friday night league at Jewel City Bowl and in 8 different centers with Connie Marchione's Southern California Deaf Traveling League in it's 50th season. In this traveling league Ken made the leagues new record high series with four games 235-279-258-258/1030.

Ken also bowled in the USBC 2009 Las Vegas Open Championship Doubles with his cousin Derek DeGroff from Stillwater, Oklahoma. Ken guessed bowling is in the family blood as Derek averaged 232 in his Oklahome league and had 300 with 837 series. Ken was very proud of his good friend Carl Malucci who is a lefty, and a holder of a high 246 average in a league at Red Rock Lanes in Las Vegas.

Recently Ken bowled his 28th career 300 in a league at Jewel City Bowl and has a career total of 16 800 series. In his lifetime Ken had bowled 300 in 6 different states and had 800 series in 4 different states. Ken is married to Valarie whom he met in 2007 in a league at Mission Hills bowl.

Ken said there are a lot of good bowlers out there, both hearing and hearing-impaired. He had met a lot of good people. He's not done yet, there's more 300's to come. God Bless and Good Luck to everyone!! Ken DeGroff (8-1-10).

- * Citrus Belt women's high book average three times










NORWALK-In our return to Keystone Lanes we had a turnout of 112 bowlers on Saturday and 56 on Sunday for a total of 168. The shot this time was tougher than in the past, so on Saturday the cut scores were a +36 for the men and + 8 for the women. On Sunday the cut scores were +22 for the men and +17 for the women. The three Super Seniors added to the board this week were Leo Tartamella (+ 32), Jack Trongale (+27) and for the women it was Lynda Armstrong (-15). We would see 42 bowlers take the floor in the semifinals, with 3 people failing to come back and bowl from those that Qualified on Saturday.

During our Qualifying squads, the top qualifier for the Men was Roger Romero with a + 150, and for the women it was Bobbie McCollum (one of our fine Directors) with a + 47. Each will get paid entries into a future regular ABTA event. Roger being the top seed would draw the Match Series worth \$960 this week and he drew a 628 that was not bowled by any of our bowlers this week. So next week we will estimate the pot to be at \$1300 for that 3 game series. For the 3-6-9 qualifying this week, the ones that made it saw Vuong Do be the last one left in the roll off to go for the \$800, that makes it back to back weeks for Vuong in the 3-6-9. This week he would not get the (5) 9 count or strikes needed, so he gets the consolation of \$50. We will go for \$900 next week at West Covina Lanes.

In the doubles this week,

we had 105 groups get into the doubles, with 17 spots paid out. The top prize this week went to Dominador La Guardia and Roger Romero with a 1438 for \$130. In 2nd place were Minh Dang and Roger Romero at 1401 for \$110. The low to cash was 1263.

In the semis we saw Ronnie Lopez lead the field with a + 78 to sit out and bowl for the title. Behind Ronnie was David Caballero with a +77, he would sit out the first round of match play. It took a + 22combined for men and women to make the Top 16 single elimination match play finals.

Our top seed Ronnie Lopez would draw our match game this week. The Match Game this week was 167, and it was matched by 2 fine individuals. The winners were Tomas Chavez and JJ Soon. They would each get \$1,750 dollars for that 167. Next week we will have another \$3,500 in our Match Game as the reserve pot is at \$3240. This week we had 4 new bowlers join us, and 1 returning member. Lets welcome these new bowlers to the club, Joey Nepomuceno, Melonie Castro, Paul Alvarez and Vincent Duarte, with Billy Foster returning to the club. In this we saw one of them cash.

This brings us to our Match Play finals now, so in the first round 14 bowlers would take the floor. In the first round, the 7 losers were David Dittlinger. Galdino Chavez, Vincent Duarte (in a double 9th and 10th frame roll-off against Ramiro Garcia), Joshua Navarro, Don Quitangon, JJ Soon and Minh Dang, and they would receive checks of \$100 each. In the second round, the losers were Jack Trongale, Ramiro Garcia, Deborah Sanders and Ed Palma and each would get checks of \$105. In round 3 we saw Jennifer Grant bowling Cecilia Lung on lanes 33 and 34. In this match, Jennifer would get the better of Cecilia in this match with a 221 to 185. In the other match we saw Jeremy Paulsen bowling our number 2 seed David Caballero on lanes 29 and 30. This match went down to the 10th fame and Jeremy would open in the 10th frame allowing David to advance with a 203 to 198 final score. So Cecilia and Jeremy were 4th and 5th getting checks for \$110 each.

So our semi-final match was set to be bowled on 35 and 36. We had our 2nd and 3rd seeds into the top 16 bowling each other. In our horses this week we would see David paying \$50 and Jennifer paying \$35 if they win their match. In this match David would struggle the first couple of frames and see Jennifer strike in the 3rd, 4th and 5th frames to pull away, and lock David out by the 8th frame. This week Jennifer was to prevail with a score of 243 to 166 in this match and send her to the title match. David would finish in 3rd place for \$205 this week. This week the horses paid \$35 for all of you that bet on Jennifer making all the way to the title match.

The title game is set and would be bowled on lanes 37 and 38 this week. Ronnie being the top seed elected

Jennifer would double in the 6th frame to jump out to a 24 pin lead and would continue that way until the 8th frame when Ronnie would throw a gutter ball on the first ball and open in the frame giving Jennifer a 45 pin lead that she would not let go, as she continued on her way to her First ABTA title. The final scores were 165/208 for Ronnie and 183/225 for Jennifer. Jennifer would take home \$1,000 for the first place. Ronnie would take home a nice \$300 check for his 2nd place finish as he was bowling on a

reduced entry. Champion Jennifer Grant is from Bellflower and used a Cell drilled by Al at Keystone Lanes. She has 3 children, Saniah, King and Brydon and is married to Brandon. 





WALTER RAY 11TH IN WORLD HORSESHOE CHAMPIONSHIPS, BUT WINS A BIG ONE

Walter Ray Williams Jr. isn't playing horseshoes at the same level he was when he won six World Horseshoe Pitching Association championships, but a champion always seems to show his stripes.

The reigning PBA Player of the Year finished a disappointing 11th in the 2010 World Horseshoe Pitching Championships in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, on Aug. 6, posting a 9-10 "match" record. But in the process, he handed horseshoe superstar Alan Francis of Defiance, Ohio, his only loss of the competition – a 41-36 decision that forced Francis into a playoff with Vermont's Brian Simmons for the title. Francis won the playoff, 40-12, for his eighth consecutive world title and his 16th overall.

"Alan had about his worst game in five years against me with an unbelievable amount of bad luck, kind of like someone getting pocket splits and taps as he had about nine ringers bounce off of the stake," Williams said. "I pitched a decent game against him, but still quite a bit less than what I am capable of. I basically pitched the worst I have ever pitched at the world tournament having two of the worst games I have pitched since I was 10 years old."

PBA STARS VISIT "PETERSEN CLASSIC" FOR A DOUSE OF HUMILITY

Most Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour players have been active this summer bowling in PBA Regionals, international tournaments, and conducting clinics and exhibitions. And a handful have visited the "home of humility," the Petersen Classic at AMF Hoffman Lanes in suburban Chicago, where averaging 200 for eight games across 16 lanes is a feat even the greatest players cherish.

In 2009, PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke tried the Petersen Classic for the first time and posted a 1,448 total – a 181 average. In late July, he returned with golfing buddy Ken Smith and missed the magical 200 average milestone by a single pin, shooting 1,599 with a 171 final game.

"I was pretty stoked to have a chance to take the lead with a game to go," Duke said, "especially after what I did the first year."

As of Aug. 10, only three players had topped 1,600 pins and PBA Central Region competitor Jeff Roche of Dearborn, Mich., was the leader with a whopping 1,648. Duke was tied for fourth, but some other familiar names were further down the list: Eddie Van Daniker of Essex, Md., was 13th at 1,560; PBA Hall of Famer Parker Bohn III, Jackson, N.J., was 40th at 1,513, and Mika Koivuniemi was tied for 77th at 1,480. A handful of additional exempt tour players are expected to bowl before the tournament ends on Labor Day weekend.

The Petersen Classic – a legendary event known for its nearly impossible lane conditions, absence of marker arrows and dots, off-set racks and "mysterious" breakdowns just when a bowler thinks he's bowling well – is open to whomever wants to try. It was founded by proprietor Louis P. Petersen in 1921 and held more than once a year in its early years. "The Pete" was conducted for years at Petersen's second-floor bowling center, 35th and Archer Recreation, until it was sold in 1994 and moved to Hoffman Estates. The 2010 Petersen Classic is the 100th edition.


