National Deaf Bowling News

deaf/hearing-impaired bowler, Ken DeGroff. This issue we are showing the other part story written by the best left handed deaf/hearing-impaired bowler Carl Malucci. So enjoy reading and compare.

Carl Malucci who was born in El Monte, CA now resides in Las Vegas, NV. He is among one of the top deaf

bowlers in the world. Going back in time at age 13 when he first joined a junior league at Friendly Hills Bowl in Whittier, CA he started to develop a passion for the game.

Besides having some great coaches named Lloyd Stone, Gary Kowarsch and Les Funderburg who had taught

him the game of bowling, Carl did a lot of self taught through a lot of practice after school to improve his average and his average improved nicely time after time. At 17 years old, Carl shot his first 300 game in a junior league and went on to bowl five 300's in the junior ranks. He also won a couple of JATFC tournaments and made the

TV finals in a JAT TV championship at 18 years old.

Around that time is when Carl met Connie Marchione who told him about deaf bowling leagues and tournaments and should join and meet new friends, which he did over the years. Carl wants to thank Connie for

everything Connie had done for him.

At present time, Carl with 47 300 games and 22 800 series puts him as the most in the world for a deaf and hearing impaired bowler. During this 2009-10 season alone, Carl with 6 300's and 5 800's and counting is also the most for the season. He also finished his two leagues with 243 and 241 average. Last year he got an award for being the highest average bowler in Southern Nevada USBC Association with a 246 average and also made USBC record with 17 straight 700's in league play.

Some of Carl's career highlights are being the only bowler to win the Connie Marchione Award 5 times at Southern California Bowling Writers All Stars Awards, 1996 both American Athletic Association of the Deaf and USOC Deaf Male Athlete of the Year Award and Deaf Bowler of the Decade for 90's. Twice bowled two 300 games in one day in tournament action, first and only deaf bowler to bowl a 300 in So. Calif. Deaf Traveling League in 39 years, and also first and only deaf to bowl a 300 game in Angel West Deaf League in 37 years with both leagues still going on without one since. He holds the highest all-event scratch score in deaf history with 2333 (259 ave.) made last February. Carl is fortunate to win both the World Deaf Championship and National Deaf Masters in the same year 1997 and also won the National Deaf Masters again in 2001. He also won the prestigious Pacific Coast Deaf Masters in 1995, 2001 and 2003. The list goes on but there are too many to put on.

Carl's mom Dorothy Malucci always has told Carl that if you want something bad enough you got to want it badly and dig deep inside your heart to achieve it. Carl wants to thank his Mom Dorothy for all the inspiration words over the years.

Carl knows that Ken Degroff is a great bowler and is a good friend. Also he is well respected and Carl knows he's 0-2 against him in tournament match-plays which shows why that he's a tough opponent and that's the kind of challenge that Carl likes and hopes to have many more challenges to come.

Electronic Device Helps Roth Achieve Another Milestone: He Goes Bowling

"It's like a miracle," Denise Roth said after watching husband Mark Roth, a Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer and one of the greatest bowlers in history, walk unaided on the approach and throw a 12-pound bowling ball for the first time in more than 14 months.

Since Roth, 59, suffered a massive stroke in late May 2009 that left the left side of his body paralyzed, he has refused to give up the fight to regain his life. His first public appearance following his stroke was at the GEICO Mark Roth Plastic Ball Championship in late March in West Babylon, N.Y., motivated him to continue his rehabilitation. He followed that appearance with a trip to Columbus. Ohio, in April where he spent a week with his former PBA Senior Tour competitors.

Last week, with the assistance of a recently-developed device called a "WalkAide" that provides electronic stimulation to eliminate a common stroke condition called "drop foot," the 34-time PBA Tour champion made another milestone leap forward. With the WalkAide, he was able to lift his left foot almost normally and walk "without tripping over his toes," Denise Roth said. And with the ability to stand and walk on his own, Roth decided to test the device on a bowling lane in Fulton, N.Y., where he quickly worked his way up from a 6-pound ball to a 12-pounder, Denise said.

"Mark had use of the device for a seven-day trial and it was amazing," Denise said. "He could walk faster and farther than any time since his stroke. He actually bowled with confidence. He was getting around 100 percent better, which helped him get some badlyneeded exercise.

"He had to turn the WalkAide back in after the trial period, so now we have to wait to see what the insurance company says (about getting it back)," she added. "It's a wonderful device. It actually took some of his hip pain away, too.


