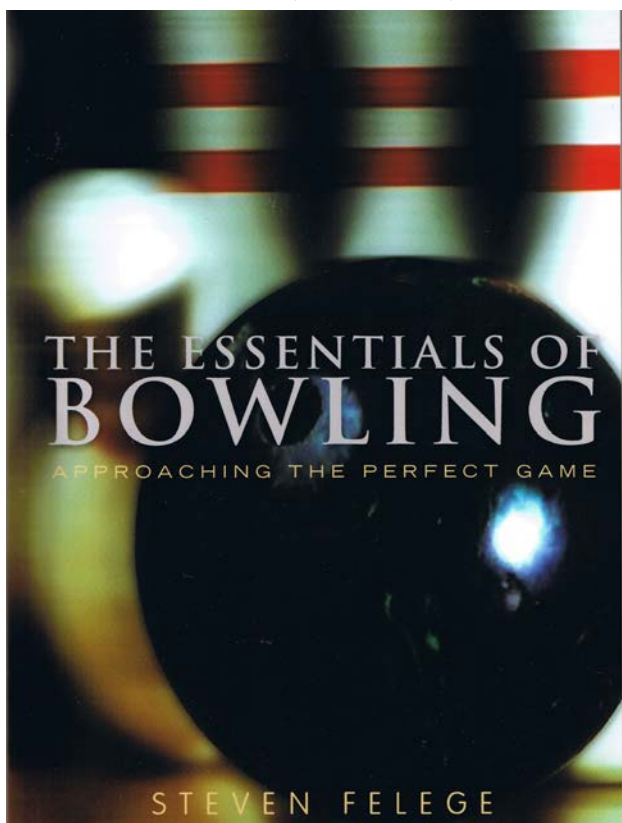

## WCST (WEST COAST SENIOR TOUR) WILL OPEN UP ORGANIZATION TO ALL AGES, WITH A CHANGE OF NAME TO WCBT (WEST COAST BOWLERS TOUR) STARTING ON JANUARY 1, 2012

NORWALK — To start our 20th year, the WCST known as the WEST COAST SENIOR TOUR, will change their organizational name to WCBT, WEST COAST BOWLERS TOUR, as of January 1, 2012. Since our beginning in January 1993, this organization has been made up of bowlers between the ages of 45 and up, and then went as far as the ages of 40 to be eligible to

bowl in our tournaments. Over 27, 000 entries and 335 tournaments, that have paid out a total of over \$3,500,000.00 in prize fund, that has given this organization a very creditable reputation, as being one of the best scratch Senior bowling organization on the West Coast. Over the past two years, and especially this year, many other clubs, have been losing entries for their events,

and we are no different. The Super Senior ages of 60 and up, have held steady, but the younger division has drastically reduced entries.

# The Essentials of Bowling Introduction

by Steve Felege

If you keep doing what you’ve always done, you’ll just keep getting what you’ve always gotten.  
—Jim Macy, GE Executive

There is a big difference between knowing what you want and knowing how to get what you want. All bowlers want to get better. This book is written for the sole purpose of teaching you how to get better, nothing more, nothing less. Your improvement relies merely on learning a few universal principles that dictate successful technique and then adjusting your skills to obey them.

The Essentials of Bowling is not just another “Bowling: A to Z” book. It is a clear and concise manual that will allow you to take the abilities you already possess and improve them. Because it is primarily for anyone who already bowls, one assumption is made in the text: that you, the reader, have a basic knowledge of bowling terminology and technique. Even if you do not, as a beginner, this book will serve you well as a platform upon which to base the game you are about to develop.

Many bowling books and instructors teach the same standard techniques that have been taught for generations. These are the very skills you may be using. The fact that you are looking at this book proves that you sense there must be a better way, and you are right! The techniques in this modest manual are based on sound and rational logic rather than on what has always been done.

The Essentials of Bowling is formatted to make it an easy-to-use reference source. It is a common sense look at the game and the skills it requires. It introduces you to the importance of the basic skills and then describes exactly how to perform them properly. These descriptions, if combined, comprise less than one full page of normal text, making it easy for you to incorporate what you are about to learn into a 2-3 second delivery.

The techniques described in this book are “tried and true,” easy to learn, and effective. As stated, some of these techniques differ from 12 traditional teachings. For this reason, each chapter ends with a discussion and explanation of each element of that particular skill. It is not necessary for you to read the “Discussion” sections. Their only purpose is to help you understand why these techniques work and need to be practiced exactly as described to allow you to achieve your full potential. Another aim of this book is to save you time and money as you seek to improve your game. For most people, both are very limited resources. Of the four basic skills you are about to relearn, three can be practiced and easily mastered at home, in front of a mirror! You will be able to practice wherever and whenever you want. With that having been said, I wish you a lifetime of better bowling! PS: It should be noted that this book is written in “right hand.” Translation into “left hand” is unnecessary (except where noted) because the techniques you are about to learn are universal.

# USBC Changing Direction To Put More Emphasis On Creating Lifelong Bowlers

At its 2005 inception, the United States Bowling Congress took its new role as the sport’s national governing body seriously enough to include in its mission statement to ensure the integrity and protect the future of the sport.

Its vision sought to grow the sport of bowling through more people recognizing bowling as a sport and more people participating in bowling as a sport.

Many people thought this was a good direction because it brought USBC back to the original intent of its American Bowling Congress roots to standardize the rules of bowling amid the chaos of conflicting ideas. Only later did ABC, and after it the Women’s International Bowling Congress and Young American Bowling Alliance, begin thinking about members to fund those principles.

“ABC, WIBC and YABA were membership organizations supporting USA Bowling (the then-United States Olympic Committee-recognized NGB),” said former USBC President Darlene Baker July 1 at the USBC Convention. “USBC has both responsibilities as an NGB and membership organization which has caused some confusion. The last few years there’s been a lot of attention on the NGB and it’s led to the perception we don’t care about the average member.”

“I agree with that,” said USBC Executive Director Stu Upson a month later. “I’ve been here two years and consider myself an average member and think that perception has been true.”

So to help change that perception and help grow membership and revenue, USBC has decided to move the needle to the middle of the NGB/membership pendulum.

The decision to do so began last year when the USBC Strategic Planning Committee looked again at what the organization should be when it grows up.

“It was quite simple,” Upson said. “What we’d been doing for the past 20 years hadn’t been working.

“Certainly we’re an NGB. That is what we are about. But we need members to help fund what we do and to get more people involved in bowling.”

One of the first things the committee did was to create new mission and vision statements. While approved by the board and announced to the USBC staff long before, they weren’t officially revealed to the public until the Convention.

- Mission – To provide benefits, resources and programs that enhance the bowling experience.
- Vision – Create lifelong bowlers.

To begin the transition to this new model, USBC asked everyone it could what it would take for more people to join.

“We learned it is not possible to create products that appeal to everyone,” Upson said. “We have to offer a broad amount of products and services.

“For example, Apple has the iPod but has several different versions. That’s where we have to have a variety of things.

“We have been too rigid with our offerings. Yes, certified averages and awards are important to some people but not everyone.”

Once USBC learned peoples’ thoughts, it began testing some new concepts in the 2010-11 season. These included different products and upgrades and delivery methods.

Among the products was a member welcome gift. Also tested was a blanket league certification where all bowlers in a center become members. Other tests featured short season, fun leagues and casual memberships.

The question remains - will members pay more for better benefits?

“It’s not so much continuing with things they have to buy but giving them something they want to buy,” Upson said. “The key element is frequent, casual bowlers. What is it that will entice them to join USBC?”

What will entice them may not even involve traditional bowling related products and services, said new USBC President Jim Sturm.

“For some people it’s not about league prize money but about reward points,” Sturm said. “Others may want discounts on bowling balls or discounts on food and beverages. It’s all about what will it take to get them into USBC.”

New on the delivery side is league secretary software that would have memberships sent directly from the league secretary to USBC. Currently, the process has bowlers fill out membership information and give it to their league secretary who sends to the local association which processes the applications and sends on to USBC headquarters in Arlington, Texas.

The new model identifies two stakeholders – field ambassadors who care about and will help promote bowling and bowling center owners and staff who deal daily with their customers.

What about the more than 3,000 local and state USBC associations?

“As I said at Convention, this is not in any way a program to put associations out of business,” Upson said. “Will it change their roles? Yes. And we’ll need feedback from all of our constituents, association volunteers, proprietors and bowlers.”

“We will refocus the purpose of the local and state associations,” Baker said. “They will be more than processing centers. Everyone’s time is valuable and we want to help the proprietors.”

About 12-15 markets of varying sizes and locations are testing the new ideas in the first four months of the 2011-12 season. USBC leaders will then analyze the results and form a plan to present at the 2012 USBC Convention in April.

The goal is for a limited rollout of the new package in 2012-13 with national rollout in 2013-14 with the hope of no membership loss that season.

While some new programs are in the testing phase, two aimed at youth are in place this season. One is teaching parents and other volunteers basic coaching skills. Free instructional classes for USBC associations and Bowling Proprietors’ Association of America-member centers feature curriculum aimed strictly at teaching youth how to bowl.

“Our belief and vision is that we can grow the sport simply by teaching the game and developing a volunteer coaching base is paramount in executing that vision,” said International Bowling Campus Director of Youth Development, Chad Murphy. “With the help of Carolyn Dorin-Ballard and the USBC Coaching team, we have some of the best instructors in the nation onboard to lead these seminars. Now we need parents, association leaders and center managers to take advantage of the opportunity.”

Also now available is the USBC Roll ‘N Grow membership for youth age 7 and under. For just \$8, those young bowlers in regular or bumper league of any length can join and receive special awards and benefits.

Roll ‘N Grow memberships include a \$1 processing fee and are in addition to USBC Youth Basic membership for \$5 (\$1 local processing) and Youth Standard for \$17 (\$2 local processing, 50 cents state fee).

“We’re putting a lot of emphasis on youth,” Upson said. “The creation of the youth department on Campus proves that.

“I know it’s a cliché but youth are our future. But we also want to do what we can for adults.”

## Rocky O'Campo Wins Labor Day Special at Cal 5 Bowlers Share Match Series Worth \$992

LAKEWOOD—Welcome everyone to the weekly edition of ABTA news. We returned to Cal Bowl for our ANNUAL 4 day Labor Day event, where 620 entrants pursued a possible \$12,200 top prize. We had a decent shot, and cut scores were fair. The men having +50 or,n Thursday, +63 on Friday, + 61 on Saturday, +63 on Sunday, and +39 for the re-entry Squad. The women had +60 on Thursday, +51 on Friday, +40 on Saturday, +42 on Sunday, and +26 for the re-entry. The Super Seniors added to the board (3 men and 3 female) were Esther Tambio (38), Karen Roubinov (35), Sue West(33), Henry Mancini (66), Dennis Barrett (62), and Vic Garcia (58). Super Seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 128 bowlers making it to the semi-finals on Sunday.

Top qualifiers were Men, “Hot Shot” Sean Nguon with a +178, and for the women it was Ludee Masangcay with a +127. Each of them will get paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. The Top seed Nguon would draw for a \$992 Match Series Pot. He drew a 582. We had 5 bowlers that bowled this score during qualifying and they were William Garrett, Sal Gulluzzo, Sol Cericos, Bryan Moore, and Dom La Guardia. Each will get \$198. At our next event we will estimate the Match Series at \$450 at the 2 day event. For the 3-6-9 qualifying, it was Melvin Finner who missed on his 2nd shot and got a \$100 consolation. The 3/6/9 will be \$2,700 at Chaparral.

In our Optional Doubles,

finishing in first were Sean Nguon and Michael Kong with a 1484 for \$180. Finishing second was Sean Nguon and Giang Huynh with 1449 for \$160. There was a total of \$2,090 paid out in doubles. 26 paid spots with low to cash of 1343.

In the semis we saw Gerald Sanchez lead the field with a huge +180 to sit out and bowl for the title at Cal Bowl. Coming in second was Cesar Marcella with a +165 to sit out the first round. It took a +61 for the men and +37 for the women. Cesar would enter in round two of the single elim rolloffs.

Sanchez, our top seed in semi-finals had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$3,500. The pot is maxed out and we have a back-up of \$3,500 with a 2nd back-up pot that is growing which is now at \$2,185. He drew a 181. After a review of all the scores bowled, we had a record 14 bowlers who shot that score so they will each get \$250. The winners were Melvin Finner (twice), Kevin Collier, Glen Dantes, Jerry Ernest, Albert Fernandez, Debra Sanders, Joevin Bolanos, Adam McKenzie, Tim Tran, Thomas Licacuo, William Garrett, Marcus Battiest, Rick Mousouleas. We will have \$3,500 at Chaparral, and continue to build on the second back-up pot. Now, to our top 32 Match Play finals.

In the first round, the fifteen losers were Danny Guevarra, Cecilia Lung, Stephanie Alvarez, William Zarek, Sue West, Eugene Haynes, Andy Yu, Charles Weeks, Fred Go, Rico Cayton, Marvin Crowder, Derick Masangcay, Adrian Pe-

layo, Vic Paolucci and Julian Conwi. They received checks of \$215 each. In the 2nd round, the 8 losers were Demetrisus Cash, Rey Josafat Sr., Gina Velarde, Cezar Marcella, Faye Josafat, Kin San Chung, Dennis Kelsey, and Patricia Lin. They received checks of \$250 each. In the third round, losers were Rick Masangcay, Dominator LaGuardia, Angela Lung, and Vic Garcia, they received checks of \$325 each. This would get us to down to the final five bowlers. At this point, our horses would be paying anywhere from a low of \$75 (Sean Nguon) to a high of \$1277 (Dung Le) depending on who would win. 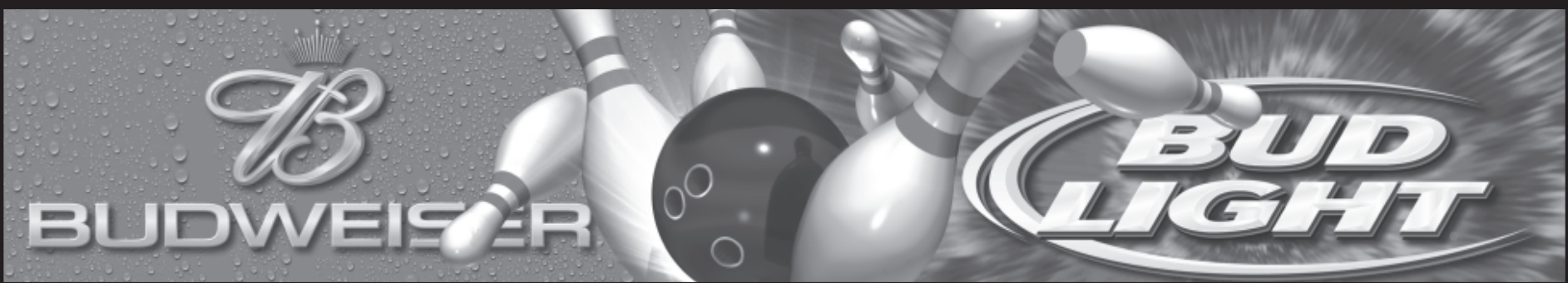

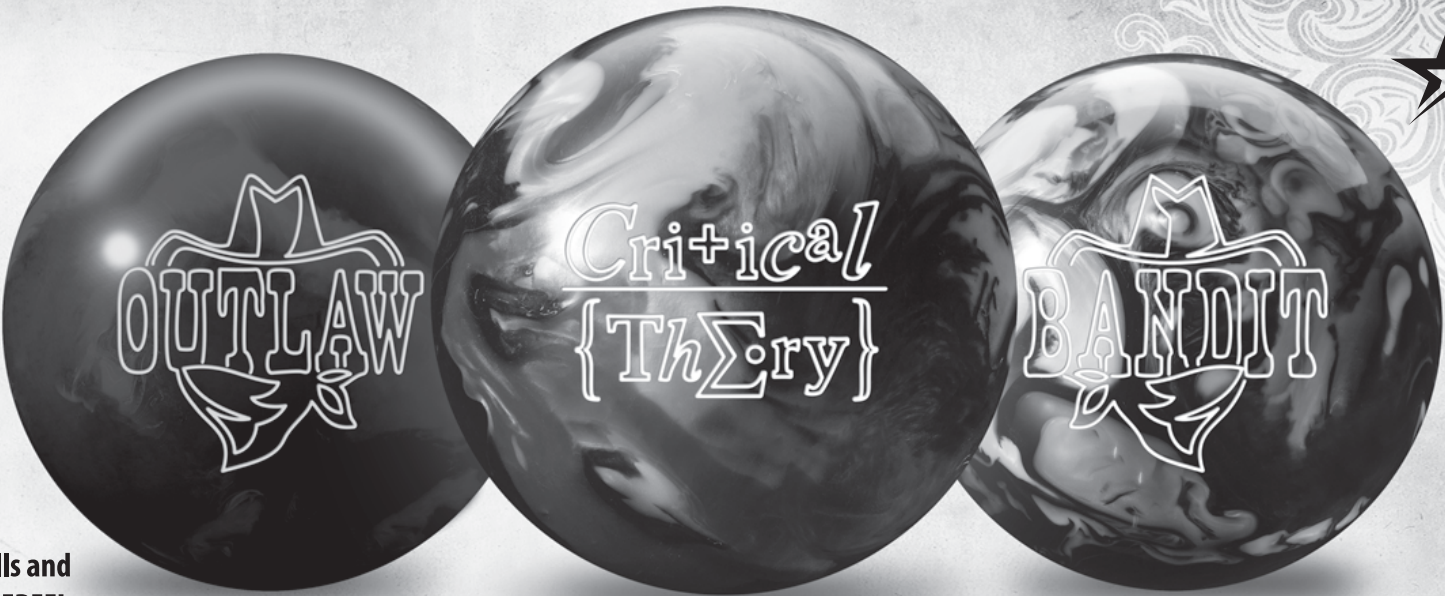
