Scott Norton Wins Glover Masters Tournament

BAKERSFIELD—The late Don Glover had to have been smiling down on AMF Southwest Lanes this past weekend, September 27-28, as the 2nd annual Glover Masters Scratch Tournament took place. Not only did the tournament nearly double the number of entries that it had at its inaugural event last year, but the prize fund doubled—not only for the champion but there was a visible increase in all the monies given to the Top 20 that placed!! To top it off, a former youth state standout, who was bowling his first year in the Professional Bowlers Association (PBA), became the 2008 Champion. Scott Norton, of San Francisco, emerged as the 2008 Don Glover Masters Scratch Champion and took home \$3,055.00.

It wasn't an easy win for Norton, who ended up the number two seed, as he had to win his Stepladder Final match against fourth seed Jeff Gordon who dominated the Stepladder matches by beating fifth seed PBA standout Tony Reyes 269-238, then third seed Daniel Watanabe 247-189. Norton and Gordon had a great match, but Norton emerged with a win 279-245 and then faced number one seed Mason Sherman (the current PBA Western Regional point's leader who dominated qualifying by ranking first in the Top 20 and then again first after MatchPlay). Sherman started the final match strong with a string of strikes. Norton had a strike in the first frame but spared in the second. But Norton turned on the strikes and finished with a 280 game to Sherman's 255. Over 60 spectators enjoyed an afternoon of terrific matches.



139 Deaf Seniors To Compete In 12th Tournament at the Orleans

LAS VEGAS—The Deaf Senior Bowlers of America secretary-treasurer Carol Moers mailed out from her Denver address, DSBA newsletter and schedule program books to 103 men and 36 women scattered all over US and some from Canada. She and DSBA staff welcome them to the 12th annual (this writer miscounted as 11th two weeks ago) tournament held at The Orleans Hotel & Casino bowling center on October 14 to 16.

Although one more late entry will be needed to complete the 70 mixed doubles pairs, there will be 103 men and 36 women all aged 55 years and older in their respective male and female singles events.

There will be two squads starting on Tuesday morning Oct. 14 at 8:00 AM and 11:00 AM.

The unofficial prize lists showed a cool \$1,060 for the top men handicap 3 games singles and \$360.00 for the top women 3 games singles. The handicap mixed doubles will have top prize of \$1,400 to be split by the champions.

On Wednesday morning Oct. 15 the 86 male and 24 women seniors are split into two squads to bowl the 4 games qualifying round of their respective Men's Senior Handicap Classic Eliminations and Women's Handicap Senior Queens. The first squad begins at 9AM with the 2nd squad following at 11 AM.

On Thursday morning Oct. 16 at the time to be announced, the top 32 or 16 men qualifiers and top 16 or 8 women qualifiers will begin their respective one game double elimination match play. The champions will be crowned in the afternoon and at stake will be \$860.00 for the male winner and \$240.00 for the Queens winner.

Among the entrants are the defending Classic champion William Van Spankeren, AZ who also won in 1998 and 2000, the Singles champion from Alberta, Canada Roy Matsune, women's Singles champion Theresa Gutierrez, CA and Mixed Doubles champions Sammy and Winifred Sain of Las Vegas. Defending Queens champion Linda Glenn, AR did not enter.

An important item for all those Senior entrants, there will be a general meeting on Tuesday evening at 7 PM in the bowling center's meeting room. Plans for the future and elections will be held there.

FOR ALL DEAF FANS WHO FOLLOW THE PBA TOUR ON TV

PBA will no longer use Denny's as its title sponsor but Denny's will sponsor two events on the new PBA tour. PBA had signed with one of its tour sponsors, Lumber Liquidators as its new title sponsor for 3 years and it will be Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour.

Also in case you do not know, PBA is now in its 50th year and is planning a big 50th anniversary celebration party during the PBA Tournament of Champions at Las Vegas in January. Already it had named the 50 Greatest Bowlers in PBA History and given each of the 50 names as honorary title name in each of 50 PBA Regional tournaments.

Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour will start on Oct. 19 at Wichita, KS with PBA World Championship and \$50,000 to the winner on October 26.




