Following graduation from High School in 1945 he joined the U.S. Navy. During the next eight years, after attending Navy schools, he was assigned to the USS Repose (a hospital ship in Tsingtao, China) as a scrub nurse and later transferred to the Marine Corp where he served as a medic during the Korean War. Following his discharge in 1953 he attended City College in Oakland and San Francisco State while working as a lab assistant for Pabco Corpora-

He ultimately went to work for Chevron Research and Technology as a researcher in 1968 and retired from there in

1972 and says they successful-

ly merged their families (his four and her two) and have lived happily ever since. He discovered bowling at Lucky 60 Lanes in San Pablo, joined the local bowling association in 1978 and proceeded to amass an impressive record of service to bowling. He served as Treasurer of the West Contra Costa Country BA for 11 years, President for two, and is a member of their Hall of Fame. Robert became a director of the California State Senior BA in 1987 and served as its president in 1993.

He had managed the CSS-BA Singles and Doubles tournament since 1989 and is also in their Hall of Fame. Smoking in bowling centers - A throwback to an earlier era

Some stereotypes are hard to break. Take bowling and smoking for example.

In the early 1900s, most bowling establishments were connected to taverns where Caucasian men smoked and drank to get away from their wives. Soon after, women took to bowling; and by the 1950s, minorities became more involved in the sport.

When league bowling was at its peak in the 1960s and 1970s, bowling alleys had bars in them and smoking still was a major part of the culture. This shouldn't have been surprising since nearly half of American adults smoked.

Thanks to education about it and a growing amount of laws against it in public places, smoking nationwide has now dropped to around 20 percent. Yet while society was changing, some bowling centers still chose to cater to smokers for fear of losing long-time customers.

That decision has too many people still thinking bowling is played in dark, dingy, smoke-filled facilities. Truth is most of today's centers are clean, bright, family-friendly places.

So some questions need to be asked like, Has smoking been a bigger reason than people realize for the 30-year decline in league bowling? Is it one of the major reasons why to many, bowling's image still is negative? Does it hurt the chance to grow the sport and keep sponsors from helping finance the future?

"I don't know why some proprietors cater to 20 percent of their customers," said retired United States Bowling Congress Chief Executive Officer Roger Dalkin.

'Smoking does affect business in the short term," said Brunswick president of bowling products Brent Perrier. "In the long term, we see people who wouldn't come in are coming in. Once a center gets over the hump – 6 months to a year – they can do

The challenge is the battle between freedom of choice and second-hand smoke. Michael Fiore, director of the University of Wisconsin-Madison Center for Tobacco Research and Intervention, is clear on what he believes is making it possible to eliminate tobacco use in America.

'Two things – first the recognition of tobacco use as a drug of dependence, and second, the recognition that when I smoke in your presence, it's not just a choice I'm making, but it's also putting your health in danger," Fiore said in On Wisconsin magazine. "These developments have totally changed the landscape."

So too have governmental smoking bans.

"People get used to them," said Luby Publishing President Keith Hamilton. "Some come back and they learn to deal with it. Bowlers cope and some even come back and bowl more.'

Laws curtailing smoking in public places began appearing about 20 years ago. By the middle of the 1990s, the Bowling Proprietors' Association of America introduced the National Restaurant Association's Accommodation Program to meet the needs of both smokers and non-smokers. The idea was to promote non-smoking areas of the center like the bar or specific days when smoking wouldn't be allowed. The program also encouraged centers to improve their ventilation systems to help remove the smoke.

Since then, more local or state anti-smoking laws have been enacted. In states without such laws, centers must weigh the benefits of attracting new bowlers against the drawbacks of alienating their smoking customers.

But in advance of or even in areas without such laws, some bowling centers made the business decision to go non-smoking on their own. For example, some AMF centers in the Midwest banned smoking in many areas of the centers in 2000. Others since have voluntarily made the choice because they understood at a time that when families are looking to do more together, doing so in a healthy environment makes sense.

"It's a generational thing kind of like bumper bowling 20 years ago," said Jim Welch, general manager of Strike Zone at Sunset Station in Henderson, Nev. "Back then they called ahead to see if you had bumper bowling. Now they ask if you are nonsmoking. If you are, they will bring the family.'

Hillside (Mich.) Lanes went non-smoking in 2009 before a ban went into affect this year. Owner Steve Aemisegger told Bowlers Journal International he was glad he made the decision.

We lost a few league bowlers but what we gained in open bowling and outings far exceeded what we lost," he told the Jackson Citizen Patriot.

Strike Zone Lanes in Southaven, Miss., has been smoke free since it opened in 1997 and recently earned an award for the smoke-free business of the month from the Mississippi Tobacco-Free Coalition of DeSoto County.

"People in the community appreciate a place to have their child's birthday party and family get-togethers without smelling like smoke when they leave the building," said general manager Dudley Stone in the Bowlers Journal Cyber Report.

While league numbers are at their lowest since the early 1950s, the number of people bowling at least annually keeps rising; now more than 70 million. The growth of family entertainment centers, most of which are non-smoking from Day 1, may be one reason.

"In every single case where I've been involved with traveling around, once a center stops smoking the customer base changes and people are much happier to come when they wouldn't come bowling before," said industry veteran Dale Niemela, currently marketing and event coordinator for Storm Products. "The fact that there's not smoking gets rid of the stereotype of smoke."

So what's the industry to do? Dalkin suggests taking lessons from the American Cancer Society.

"You can't change the perceptions of the influential people age 20-50 so we must focus on the next generation," he said. "We have to change the attitudes of kids from first grade to high school. We need to educate parents, high schools; talk about Bowlopolis. Focus on bowling as fun and cool. We have to accept the fact we can have little impact now; but have to start with the kids."

If nothing else works, Hamilton has a different idea.

"Maybe having bowling centers get together to determine which ones will cater to smokers and which ones will be smokefree is the answer." he said.

Whatever the answer, it does seem true that bowling centers that improve their indoor air quality eventually fare well. If nothing else, fewer patrons come home smelling like ashtrays.

'Many centers are on the edge, and if they lose 10 percent they are out," Dalkin said. "Can they ride out the initial drop? But long term, it helps the image and helps bowling grow."



Small Entries in Deaf Seniors Tourney at Orleans Bowl in Las Vegas

LAS VEGAS—As expected due to the slowing economy, the entries for the 14th annual Deaf Senior Bowlers of America tournament are down for the 2nd straight year. There will be 80 men and 24 women aged 55 and over from all over the country and Canada gathering in the annual event at the Orleans Hotel Bowling Center on October 12 to 14 for the quest of cashing in the total prize fund of \$7,540.00.

The numbers is down from last year's 83 men and 32 women but this year's prize fund is only \$900.00 less that last year. The first places prizes for senior men are still good as \$800 for the singles event, \$620 for men Classic Match Plays \$120 for all-events. The women with understandably smaller entry have first place prizes at \$240 for singles, \$180 for Senior Queens and \$50 for all-events. The Mixed Doubles has a grand prize of \$1040.00 to split for first place.

Anyway for the majority of the deaf senior bowlers, their annual trek to this event in Las Vegas is for the fun of meeting old and new friends and to try their luck in bowling and at the casino tables and slot machines. Also to some of them is to hit the town's colorful Strip for its fantastic shows

The list of entries sent by DSBC Secretary-Treasurer Carol Moers, Denver shows some bowlers back for a repeat try. Robert Taylor, Los Angeles is back to defend his singles crown which he won with 2nd highest 759 score from games of 193-278-246 (717) plus 42 handicap. Ditto for former Californian Tom Parker now of Columbus. OH to make two in row in all-events which he won with a record 1379 from (247-227-233)707 in singles and 600 in mixed doubles plus 72 handicap. But John Hesser from Texas had not entered to defend his Match Play Classic crown. Also nor had former (2008) champion Mike Landry, Louisiana who led last year's Classic 4 games qualifying round with 989 from (225-247-233-196)901 plus 88 handicap.

On the women's side, last year's both singles and Senior Queens champion Elaine Bice from Alabama had not entered but former (2008) singles champion Janis Bowers from Colorado is trying for another title. Ditto for last year's Senior Queens runner-up Delores McCarty, CA and former (2008) champion Celia Salcedo, CA both wants to win this one. Patricia Morford, CA who won last year's all-events with 1301 and also Mixed doubles with 1333, has entered with a new partner, Wesley Kay, CA and her last year's winning partner George Loustalot, CA did not enter.

The schedule has two squads of singles and mixed doubles with first squad starting at 8 AM Tuesday October 12 and 2nd squad follows at 11 AM. Each squad bowls 3 games on a pair of lanes then move to another pair for the mixed doubles. In the evening at 7 PM there will be a general meeting for all bowlers in the meeting room near the lanes. On the agenda is an election for new president as President William Heacock, NY is ending his two terms.

On Wednesday October 13, all Match Play Classic and Senior Queens entrants will bowl in 4 games qualifying round with first squad starting at 9 AM and 2nd squad following at 11 AM. Top 32 men and top 16 women at the end of 4 games will return for double elimination match plays on Thursday morning.

On Thursday morning the top 32 men start their one game matches at 9 AM and the women top 16 starts at 9:30 AM with same one game matches. Bowlers with two losses are eliminated until two is left for their respective championship finals.

After the Finals, raffles will be drawn for cash prizes for these who purchase the raffle tickets. Support DSBA by buying the raffle tickets.

ARCADIA—In our return to Bowling Square Lanes we had a decent turnout of 164 bowlers. Cut scores were average or less +35 for the men and +21 for the women. In the semis we saw Christina Cheung get hot and lead the field with a +168 to sit out and bowl for the title. hind Christina was a William Garrett at +146 who would sit out the first round. It took a +36 for the men and women combined, as we would take 3

women to make the semi-finals this week, but the men tied at a +36 and Carlos Vejar and Wilson Cheung would have a 9th and 10th frame roll-off to decide who would be seeded into the top 16 and who would finish in 17th. Wilson won the roll-off and advanced to the match play finals.


