Bowling Open In 49 States But NOT California!

The Southern California Bowling Association represents over 80+ bowling centers are integral parts of our communities. Right now, we need your immediate help to survive.


Then President Trump turned a corner in late April and began calling upon States to begin responsibly reopening their economies. Almost every Governor eventually came out with their own, individual reopening phases.

Our state's chief executive announced on April 28, a four-phased reopening plan, in coordination with our Pacific Northwest neighboring states. Our industry was placed in the third phase, which Governor Newsom vowed would be several more "months not weeks" away. This was after a month-and-a-half of compelled closures.

But as the days, weeks and months progressed, and as not a single hospital (outside of downtown NYC) was ever overwhelmed by COVID patients, many people began to question the duration of the shutdown.

Everyone's frustration only grew as we all sat back and watched so-called "essential" businesses continuing without any disruption

of their businesses, including many — like home improvement retailers — experiencing a dramatic spike in patronage.

Our Association developed best practices based on CDC recommendations and state safety guidelines, on top of the advice from the Bowling Proprietors' Association of America and others and engaged state officials on proper safety guidelines and received

permission from state and local health officials to open. Several centers were able to open for a short period before the virus impact got worse and all family entertainment businesses were shut down again.

Experiences during the

limited reopening period demonstrated that many of our bowling centers successfully implemented these safety protocols. Particularly given the facilities' size and square footage, social distancing policies for both our employees and

customers can be effectively achieved.

On August 28, California embarked on a new tiered plan for reopening businesses by releasing a Blueprint for a Safer Economy criteria were revised to loosen and tighten restrictions on activities. This has many of us crying foul.

This system has not considered that some businesses can operate safely, even in counties with relatively high numbers of COVID-cases. And it hits some businesses like ours harder than others, even when it appears, we perform similar services.

Still today, most of Cali-


fornia's 250 bowling centers have been closed. The 9,000 employees have been sent home, and their average 35,000 square foot facilities remain empty. Sadly, many centers are on the verge of closing permanently.

As we continue to work behind the scenes educating the key people within the Department of Public Health and the Governor's office on our sport to get us reopened, we need your help to make our voices heard louder. We previously developed an email strategy to target government officials with a back to bowling appeal from

Butturff Clutch At Playoffs To Advance To Round Of 16

CENTREVILLE, Va. — Going up against one of the most clutch players in PBA history, Jakob Butturff showed he could be just as clutch in the first show of the 2020 PBA Playoffs.

Butturff struck out in the final frame to beat Tommy Jones, known for his clutch performances, 215-214, in a Round of 24 match at Bowlero Centreville. Also advancing on the show was Francois Lavoie, Dick Allen and Marshall Kent.

Butturff needed all three strikes after Jones struck out in the ninth and 10th frames to put maximum pressure on the young lefty. Butturff was up to the task but pulled his third shot inside. It held, however, for the winning strike.

"I think the nerves just

hit me because that was my first big time on television needing a big hit in the 10th frame to lock it up," said Butturff, who will now face top seed Jason Belmonte in the Round of 16. "I was very fortunate to get away with that last hit."

Lavoie advanced past PBA legend Norm Duke with a 256-193 victory and will now face Sean Rash in the next round.

Surprisingly, both players missed a 10 pin in the match but Lavoie was able to throw many more strikes

en route to the victory. After missing the 10 pin in the third, Lavoie strung seven strikes in a row and pulled away.

In the third match on the show, Allen took down Dom Barrett, 227-190, and

The California USBC Association Board of Directors met on 9/29/20 and have made the following decisions:

- The 2021 Adult State Championships to be held at Forest Lanes has been cancelled due to the unknown future of the centers re-opening and the unknown capacity that the centers can hold once they do re-open.
- The 2021 Pepsi Youth Championships will be District (March) and State Finals (May) only. League level qualifying is removed. Only current

California youth that are entered in a 2020-21 USBC certified league can participate. Youth Directors will be emailed a tournament packet by November 1st and hard copy packets by December. If centers are still closed by February 1, this event will unfortunately have to cancel.

• All other CUSBC events will be addressed next year.

The 80 Lane Bowling Center That Became A Tire Warehouse

Last week when I completed an article about the largest bowling centers in world history, I clicked the "send" button, and almost immediately thought of Marcel's Olympic Bowl in Rochester, New York. Was it an 80-lane center, I thought to myself, as I searched the web looking for articles about the Camera City icon of bowling activity?

Sure enough, in an article from The Democrat & Chronicle ("What Happened to Olympic Bowl," October 28, 2017), the number of lanes was referenced in the second paragraph. I decided to give Marcel Fournier, former owner of Olympic Bowl, a call at his new home in Port Orange, Florida, to get a little more information on Olympics' history.


Although I had not chatted with Mr. Fournier in over thirty years, he immediately remembered me from my AMF Bowling Centers affiliation. I also reminded him of our mutual volunteer work on one of the most infamous associations in bowling history... the Limited Distance Dressing (LDD) Committee for the American Bowling Congress (now USBC).

While we both embarrassingly recollected our involvement on the LDD Committee, we also concluded that there was really no other answer to the dilemma of honor scores, in the support of both league bowlers and proprietors. Like so many other sports, bowling scores had become a product of the improvements in technology.

As we continued our conversation, Marcel confirmed that Olympic was indeed 80 lanes, with an interesting series of additions along the way. Olympic Bowl originally opened in 1955. There was a total of 32 lanes - 16 lanes on each side, with all the amenities in the middle. Business was so successful that they added another 16 lanes in 1956, and then another 16 in 1960. Marcel adds, "In 1960 we also added an indoor miniature golf course, and in 1963 we added 26 billiard tables and 8 candlepin lanes."

"By 1965 we had decided to remove the miniature golf course and replaced it with another 8 tenpin bowling lanes," said Fournier. "That gave us a total of 80 bowling lanes. Along the way we wound up with 48 lanes of AMF 82-30 pinsetters, 16 lanes of Brunswick A converted machines, 8 lanes of Brunswick A-2 machines, and 8 lanes of Bowl Mor candlepin machines." (The candlepin machines were removed in 1976 and replaced with A-2's).

Fournier's additions to the bowling center reminded me of my association with Robert Kaplus of Nationwide Bowling Centers, where I worked for over 16 years. Kaplus had an unusual accumulation of equipment that included everything from 82-30's, 82-70's, A's and A-2's. Nationwide also had an unusual number of different types of scoring systems, from

AMF MagicScore to AccuScore, Brunswick AS-80 to AS-90, and finally Quibica AMF Scoring.

I once asked Kaplus why he didn't convert to one system. I'm sure that the initial costs and the profit/loss ratio of the equipment was of paramount importance, but Kaplus also added that by keeping the variety of equipment that he had inherited through acquisitions, he was able to keep AMF and Brunswick bidding for his business. Eventually he began a plan of converting to all Brunswick A-2 machines and Qubica AMF Scoring... the best of both worlds!

Fournier eventually sold his business to AMF in 1998. He was saddened by AMF's decision to sell Marcel's Olympic Bowl just a few years later. "The site is now a tire warehouse," Fournier explains with a degree of sorrow and regret in his voice. At the age of 81, Marcel continues to remain active by working with his daughter at her business (Heritage Realty Associates in Port Orange), bowling in a couple of leagues, and playing golf once a week.

- The ABC, WIBC and YABA folded their flags forever in Greendale. The new combined association was named United States Bowling Congress.
- Local Hall of Fame Hank Brandt passed away. His acting career included the priest in the movie Kingpin.
- Ken Daleiden sold his ABT Inc. club to Myron Mitchell in Salt Lake. Daleiden Jr. headed the Orange Co. club.
- Bach's Bowling Supply was "Oval Thumb" headquarters.
- Roof cave in finished local center. "**Pinky's / Cadillac / Soprano**" was plagued from grand opening to closing.
- Bob Smith's ABTA club averaged over 200 entries per weekend.
- The ladies remember Alice Meglemre and her Las Vegas Travel League. She gave up her bowling paper "The Kegler" in 2004.
- 47 Centers were on the Directory Page.
- Dick Stoeffler's weekly column from Vegas gave you lots to think about.
- Mika Koivuniemi picked up the 3-4-6-7 to beat Parker Bohn III in Arizona PBA stop.
- Over 50 writers contributed stories on a regular basis.
- Biggest money tournament ready to roll was the Mini Eliminator in Vegas. \$30,000 Top Prize.
- Treesa Spencer's "Stargazer" weekly predictions was the #1 article read each week.
- For the first time the Bowling News could be read online.
- **Cal Bowl** tool up a whole page to report their activities. Gary Kowarsch led the parade.
- The Brunswick Invitational at **Del Rio Lanes** manned 30 teams of the "Best in the West".
- Junior bowlers were VERY important to each center. They were the future! There was SED, JAT, ALL STARS, ELIMS, etc. etc. etc. They came shirited and knowledgeable. (Thanks to parents.)
- A television show "The Amazing Race" featured bowling. Linda Ruiz & Karen Heins of Palmdale were known at the "Bowling Moms".
- Another NBC Show "The Biggest Loser" was looking for Overweight Bowlers. NBC provided everything needed to lose the weight plus a Grand Prize.
- The Normandie Casino was a weekly advertiser for years. Was one of the first casinos in California.
- Wal-Mart and Kmart sold and drilled cheap balls. 3 holes - done!
- ABTA League rolled at **Valley View Lanes**. Another Bob Smith project.
- Rock – 300 provided bowling center music and marketing.
- Win a WCST event and bank \$1000.00. Entry fee \$165.00.
- The Brunswick Invitational League at **Del Rio Lanes** was tough! But Vernon Adams was tougher posting 823.
- Sad notice. Popular Dennis Roach died of heart attack. He had 32 300 games on record.
- Mike Bradley was in the pocket 30 times at **Rossmoor Bowl**. "Game one: 290, Game two 279 and topped off the night with 300".
- Cheryl Carma was all smiles when she received her 300 award from Phyl Knoll at **Westminster Lanes**.
- Connie Marchione – the deaf writer and organizer was known round the world and wrote weekly columns.
- Vegas centers offered "deals" to leagues for their sweepers. Biggest advertisers – **Gold Coast – Orleans – Suncoast**. 2020 – still "sweeper" escapes. South Coast was being built in 2005.
- Charles Willison advertised his Westside Pro Shop inside **Woodlake Bowl**. Even gave lessons.
- Big Scores got a bit "Congrats ad. Victor Arteaga 300, Steve Warren 812, Argenio Baltasar 300, Chris Marques 297, Brian main 299. Rosales guys were the drillers.
- David Meade cleared the decks for 300/802 at **Gable House Bowl**.
- Ditto for Paul Hutchinson – 300/810 at **Irvine Lanes**.
- Dick Weber passed away – the same week as Johnny Carson. Leagues held a moment of silence.
- Nadine Olson – the heart of the L.A.W.B.A. passed away at age 93. She knew and told more funny stories than Bob Hope.
- New on the market... a "personal ball spinner". 850 RPMs created a "high polish which created higher scores". Only \$249.00 A Donkee Product.
- Sherman Joseph – 2020 Pro Shop manager at Del Rio Lanes – was pictured with Cedric Brown, they were one/two in the Donkee at Carter Lanes.
- The WWPB ran their 40th Anniversary Tournament at **Harleys Camarillo**. Scott Poddig was hosting manager. The great women bowlers of the Western U.S.A. showed off their stuff every month. Where did you go???
- Don Cecil ranked his favorite (and best) bowlers: Dick Weber, Kenny Bayer, Billy Myers Sr. and Roy Pinchback (passed away Feb 9). Don knew – and told – stories about anyone you would mention!
- This week bragging rights went to Jay Bautista 300, Troy Kendrick 300, Mike Bradley 300/869 and Mike Pecora 300.
- Chris Barnes makes the front page winning his first "PBA event, The U.S. Open" banking \$100,000.00.
- Del Shoala was the manager at **AMF Eagle Lanes** in San Marcus CA.
- Joe Roussia won Cal State Scratch All Events at **Riverside Lanes**.
- The Mexican Bowlers Association National Tournament was held at Del Rio Lanes. (first time tacos were on the snack bar menu)
- Laura Lee Daniel won WWPB 40th Year Tournament at **Harleys Camarillo**.
- Rolf Gauger – well known national bowling writer became a regular in the Bowling News. Always testing your thoughts!
- Manager Gary Kowarsch was pictured handing Steven Hood \$10,000.00 cash for breaking a pot at Cal Bowl.
- Spanky Rosales tamed the lanes at **Del Rio Lanes** in the Brunswick. Spanky slammed a 300/777.
- **Del Rosa Lanes** tooted loud and clear every week. Another center that disappeared. Did it become a car wash?
- The Friday Afternoon NO-TAP at **Cal Bowl** was a lane filler for months. Favorite lanes were "reserved" in advance. The coffee was free and "high fives" demanded. The "Best in the West" competed regularly.

February was a short month but not short on high scores and action. A large number of weekend regulars confided in me that they weekly spent between \$300 and \$500 in entry fees. Plus, regular league fees, equipment, gas food, drinks, side pots and tips. How did they manage???


An Amazing Night for Brent Bowers






