## Is Hilltop Bowl Haunted?!

WAXAHACHIE, TX—It is that time of year when kids return to school, football is back, morning breezes become very pleasant, and thoughts turn toward the holidays ahead.

For this writer, the new season always coincides with fall league bowlers returning to the lanes, and it leads to one of our favorite holidays – Halloween; a time for ghosts and goblins, and fun for all the kids, grandkids, and the young-at-heart.

For this "spirited" story, we travel to the beautiful little city of Waxahachie, Texas, about a half-hour drive down Interstate 35 from the new International Bowling Campus in Arlington, the heart of the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex.

You may remember Waxahachie from the national news in the late 80's and early 90's – it was the site selected by the United States Energy Department for the construction of the largest scientific project of the 20th century (aside from NASA) – the Superconducting Super Collider.

The "SSC" was an international effort first introduced by President Ronald Reagan to build the world's largest atom smasher – a 54-mile oval shaped underground tunnel where atomic particles traveling at light speed in opposite directions would crash into one another.

The scientific community was extremely excited that it would lead to new discoveries about the origins of the universe, and other finds too difficult for mere mortals to understand. City fathers were even

more excited about the potential for the local economy.

The project would have employed more than 2500 scientists and created thousands more permanent ancillary jobs, but alas, it was cancelled by Congress in 1993 after about 25% of construction on the 10,000 acre site was completed; and Waxahachie returned to it's origins as a small farming community known for its ornate courthouse, and many historic homes. Its Gingerbread Trails Home Tour draws thousands of visitors each summer

But this story is about a different kind of energy - the paranormal kind.

# Kulick Wins PBA Women's World Championship

ALLEN PARK,MI—Kelly Kulick of Union, N.J., earned the right to become the first woman to bowl in the Professional Bowlers Association Tournament of Champions thanks to her victory in the inaugural PBA Women's World Championship at Thunderbowl Lanes in suburban Detroit.

Kulick's historic victory aired Sunday on ESPN. The first of eight PBA World Series of Bowling telecasts also included a long-awaited win for Detroit area favorite Harry Sullins, who ended a 15-year winless dry spell in the resurrected PBA Senior World Championship.

Kulick, the only woman ever to earn an exemption to bowl full-time on the Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour, defeated Shannon Pluhowsky of Phoenix, 219-204, to win the newly-created major championship for women bowlers. In addition to her berth in the PBA Tournament of Champions Jan. 19-24 at Red Rock Casino in Las Vegas, Kulick earned \$15,000 and a spot in the end-of-season PBA Women's Showdown presented by BOWL.COM.

Kulick bowled a clean game including a late string of three strikes to build a 35pin lead in the eighth frame. Pluhowsky finished with four strikes in a row, but it wasn't enough to overcome an unconverted 8-10 split in her third

"It's a long overdue win," Kulick said. "I've been knocking on the door for awhile. I came close in the (United States Bowling Congress) Queens earlier in the year." Kulick finished second to Liz Johnson of Cheektowaga, N.Y., in the Queens in Reno,

"Last year I wasn't exempt for the PBA Women's Series and that really gave me things to think about. I was kinda depressed at first and then I really refocused," Kulick added. "I asked myself if I belonged out here, but I went back to my routines - worked out, exercised, practiced a lot - and ever since the Queens, things have gotten better and better.

"Getting a chance to bowl in the Tournament of Champions is the icing on the cake. You blow out the candle and your wish comes true. My focus was on winning the title," she continued, "but now I not only get to go to Las Vegas,

but I get to bowl with the guys, which I've enjoyed doing in the past.

"My only failure on the men's tour (during the 2006-07 season) was that I hit the pocket as often as they did, but I didn't knock down as many pins because I don't have as high of a rev rate. That said, if you want to be the best, you have to bowl against the best

players, so the only way I'm going to get better is to bowl against them. I'll enjoy the experience in the Tournament of Champions and we'll see what happens."



## **National Deaf Bowling News**

#### DeGroff Still Hot With 258/934 In Deaf Travel At AMF Cerritos Lanes

CERRITOS — Kenneth DeGroff has bowled in many different bowling centers across the nation and bowling in AMF Cerritos Lanes for the first time did not faze him. So in the 50th Anniversary So. Calif. Deaf Traveling League's stop at AMF Cerritos Lanes, the newcomer just let his ball do the work there last Sunday. The result was his 4th consecutive 700 and 900 series; both are league records. His games were 226-247-258 (731)-203

This writer founded this first ever all deaf traveling league back in 1960. As it's secretary-treasurer, I've kept all its records since that showed more than 300 deaf bowlers bowled once or for years in this unique scratch match game league. Among the 300 includes the deaf and hearing-impaired all star great bowlers such as Carl Malucci, Mark Fisser and Darrell Stogryn. All three had bowled 3 consecutive 900s in this league. Only long time member Stogryn is still bowling in this league. Newcomer DeGroff's four 700s and 900s with a record 1009 are quite a feat in this league.

At AMF Cerritos Lanes, DeGroff led the league's honor roll of 14 bowlers including an 814 by durable Stogryn which included games of 241-243. Three bowlers came close to 800 with Deaf Seniors Singles Champion Robert Taylor closing with a 224 after games of 189-191-183 for 787. Taylor was matched against De-Groff and finally won a point from him on the fourth game. Two others were long time member and league President Ed Abakumoff with 203-244/785 and long time member Andy Lorenzo with 256-203/780. Teammates Pablo Yoma and Robert Audette were next with (202-203) 769 and (228) 754, respectively. Followed by Bob Jones 211/760, Frank Soleto 716, sub Lonnie Jones Jr. 705 and Emad Aranki 702. Don Millwee had a 231, Bob Bergan 212 and Alfonso Ruelas 212.

Taylor's Mid City with Millwee's 231, Denis Vigil's 198, LeRoy MacMonagle's 198 and Taylor's 183 scored the day's high team game 810 after a battle against DeGroff's Sunland which had 794 including DeGroff's 258. Mid City's 810 tied the season high team game of 810 made in last session by Riverside. Sunland had team games of 721-706-794 but finished with 694 with the day's high team series of 2915, 9 pins short of Beach Cities season high 2924.

League leader Beach Cities with 5 points each from Yoma and Audette continued its domination with a 19 to 6 win over Stogryn's El Camino Village and now led with 10 points ahead of Riverside. While former 2nd place Taylor's Mid City battled with 3rd place DeGroff's Sunland for 2nd place, Riverside in 6th place won a near sweep 22-3 battle over Orange County and jumped 4 places up to second with Sunland a 15.5 to 9.5 winner over Mid

The league thanks AMF Cerritos Lanes General Manager Ron Peter and his staff for their excellent hosting. We will move onto Oak Tree Lanes in Diamond Bar on Sunday, November 8. This will be a challenge for Ken DeGroff to extend his 700 and 900 series record in this league.





near the center's parking lot on the day of his demise.

Former Hilltop proprietors Richard and Donna Lonon are believers. "I'm not one who normally believes such things," said Donna, "but there were so many incidents that we can't explain."

Her most vivid personal memory is being in the center late at night after closing, and seeing shadows moving across the lane surface, as if someone were walking in the back behind the pinsetters and masking units. But she knew no one was there, and when she checked - no one was there. . . "But the moving shadows were real," she said.

During the years they owned the business, Richard had several 'close encounters.' Like Donna, he can't explain how objects changed locations from one night to the next morning when no one was in the building, or how lights and machines went on and off by themselves.

One night, while closing the books for the day, he heard a loud noise from behind the pinsetters. When he went to investigate, he found the mechanic's tools strewn on the concrete floor - but the mechanic had left an hour before. And all the doors were locked from the inside.

The center mechanics also reported sightings. Ken Danford, who worked with Richard and Donna, was working on a pinsetter one day, and he saw a man wearing jeans and a white shirt standing by the door. Knowing customers were not supposed to be in the machine area, he yelled at the guy, who quickly darted out the door toward the front of the center. When he went to the front desk to ask who the guy was, Richard told him he had been at the front desk the whole time, and no one had entered or exited the pinsetter

In recent years, Sharion Harwell cannot claim to have seen the spirit, but does acknowledge some strange happenings. "One day, we kept having pinsetter problems, one after another during a big league. Finally, when we couldn't find any reason for the breakdowns, we got on the PA to the back and yelled 'Brad, whatever you are doing, cut it out!' - we didn't have another problem all day.'

All of the encounters seem to suggest that "Brad" is not an evil spirit – just a little mischievous, like a typical teenager. And he hasn't been seen or heard from recently. Maybe he is hanging out in one of Waxahachie's 100 year-old-homes; or maybe he has taken up residence with Elizabeth Anderson, a young lady who was strangled to death on her wedding day in her father's house, which is now the Catfish Plantation Restaurant - another famous Waxahachie haunt.

But that is a story for another day.
