Team USA Wins Weber Cup For 11th Time

Release Date Set For FloBowling's Newest Documentary

FloBowling's newest documentary titled *Two Hands On the Future* will make its worldwide debut on Nov. 13 at 1 p.m. live on FloBowling.com.

Two Hands On The Future will chronicle the rise of competitive two-handed bowling in the Professional Bowlers Association. It will prominently feature the first two-handed PBA Tour champions Jason Belmonte and Osku Palermaa.

The documentary will feature in depth interviews with Belmonte and Palermaa and many others. It will take a closer look at the rise to prominence of the two-handed approach through the eyes of the first two champions using the style.

In addition, the documentary looks back into the past with a sit down interview with Chuck Lande, widely believed to be the first regular two-handed competitor to join the PBA. It also looks ahead to the future of two-handed bowling and includes interviews with young bowlers in the sport.

ENGLAND — After opening up a 6-0 lead on the first day of the Weber Cup, Team USA simply needed to tread water to win this year's event. That's exactly what they did as they finished off Europe, 23-18, on Wednesday night.

The winning point came courtesy of EJ Tackett, who defeated European stalwart Jesper Svensson, 278-244, at Ricoh Arena in Coventry, England. Tackett was named the event's most valuable player.

In the 21-year history of the Weber Cup, the United States has now won 11 times, while Europe has won 10. The last three years, Team USA has come away with the victory.

The U.S. team was made up of captain Chris Barnes, Tackett, Kyle Troup, Anthony Simonsen and Bill O'Neill. Team Europe was captained by Dom Bar-

rett along with Svensson, Thomas Larsen, Osku Palermaa and Stu Williams.

"I think I had the easiest job in the world," Barnes said after the victory. "I had four of the top eight guys in the world to bowl with. I think a lot of guys could do OK captaining this group. These guys are easy to get along with, they support each other and they know how to do a whole bunch

of different things on the lanes. Credit goes to them."

The USA dominated the first session of the event Monday, winning six of seven matches to build what turned out to be an unsurmountable lead. At the end of the second session on Monday, the USA maintained a 10-3 lead. On Tuesday, Europe managed to hang with the Americans, finishing the first session of

Day 2 with a 3-3 record. In the second session, it was also 3-3 and finished the day with the USA up 16-9.

Europe won the first session of the day Wednesday by a margin of 4-3 but simply wasn't making up enough ground. In the final session of the event, Europe went 5-4 to win another session but the overwhelming losses on Monday were too much to overcome.

Four Players Survive Playoffs Grind To Move On

CENTREVILLE, VA — On a night where surviving the grind was the story, AJ Johnson, Nicholas Pate, Tom Smallwood and Brad Miller moved on at the 2020 PBA Playoffs.

In the closest match of the night, Pate took down Darren Tang, 207-202, in the second group of Round of 24 matches at Bowlero Centreville.

Tang actually started with the front three but that was as good as it got for him as he left a 7-10 split in the fourth frame and struggled down the stretch.

Pate, meanwhile, survived by making the 1-2-10 washout in the first frame and staying clean. By the time the 10th frame rolled around, Pate needed eight, spare, eight to advance and



got a strike and count to get the job done. Pate will face Kyle Troup in the Round of 16

The show opened with Johnson taking a blowout win against Kyle Sherman, 223-166, as he advanced to face Bill O'Neill in the

Round of 16. Johnson's 223 would end up being the highest score of the night by any player.

Johnson struck on four of his first five shots to build a 34-pin lead and rolled to the victory. Sherman struggled throughout,

missing the headpin to the right lane on four consecutive shots.

Smallwood, who will take on EJ Tackett in the Round of 16, built a big early lead and was able to roll past Chris Barnes, 215-

The 84 Lane Bowling Center That Became A Home Depot

While cruising the internet looking for additional 80+ lane bowling centers, I spotted an article about Satellite Bowl, an 84 lane facility in Dearborn Heights, Michigan. As I continued searching the internet, I found a photo of Satellite Bowl from the City of Dearborn Heights. The article that accompanied the photo goes on to mention that the famous female bowling star Aleta Sill was a frequent guest at the site which closed in 1994.

For those of you that may not remember, Aleta Sill was perhaps the greatest female bowler in history, with the possible exception of fellow Michigander Marion Ladewig. Her record speaks for itself, with 31 Professional Women’s Bowling Association (PWBA) titles, the first woman to win over \$1,000,000 in earnings, and thirty-seven 300 games.

When I contacted Aleta at her “Aleta Sill’s Bowling World Pro Shop” inside Country Lanes in Dearborn Heights, she fondly remembered Satellite Bowl, with a road sign that must have been 3 or 4 stories high. “I first started bowling at Oxford Lanes in Dearborn, and then Thunderbowl in Allen Park,” said Sill. “I switched to Satellite Bowl in Dearborn Heights because their pro shop owner Mark Robey was drilling all of my equipment.”

I asked Aleta about the physical makeup of the bowling center and if the lanes were all in a row. “Oh, no,” she replied. “The lanes were back to back, with the machines butted against one another, 42 on each side.” This reminded me of another famous Detroit center, State Fair Recreation, which had 70 lanes and featured the back to back machines that were incorporated to take advantage of lower payroll costs for pin boys, which were necessary prior to the invention of the automatic pinsetter.

Lifelong friend Ted Rebain, who grew up at State Fair Recreation, where his father was the manager, had often relayed stories to me about the unique set up of State Fair that included a separate snack shop and bedding for the pin boys. It wasn’t until about 1960 that the automatic pinsetter became so popular because of a rental rate per game that was less than the pin boy payroll. Satellite Bowl, like State Fair Recreation, must have fit this standard.

Another famous female kegler, Michelle Mullen, is a partner with Aleta at Country Lanes in Farmington Hills, a suburb of Detroit. My guess is that their business is booming, because every time that I called, Aleta was either with a customer or drilling a bowling ball. Evidently the COVID-19 scare is over in Michigan, although their governor has been extremely cautious in reopening the state.

I mentioned to Aleta how much I enjoyed her intensity during PWBA telecasts, which can still be viewed on YouTube, even though her professional career ended almost 20 years ago. She’s a member of 8 Halls of Fame, including, but not limited to: Crestwood High School, Dearborn, Detroit, Michigan, the PWBA, the United States Bowling Congress (USBC), and the National Polish American Sports Hall of Fame.

As a USBC Certified Silver Coach, she has been instructing for the past 29 years. Oh, and did I mention, she won the women’s Triple Crown - TWICE. Only one other bowler, Pete Weber, has accomplished that feat. “But I did it first,” Aleta adds, quietly of course.

Another bowling center, Detroit Recreation, popped up in my quest for further information about Satellite Bowl. It had a total of 22 lanes on four separate floors in downtown Detroit, making a grand total of 88 lanes. Detroit Recreation closed in 1960. If you have any further information about Detroit Recreation, or are aware of any large bowling centers (80 or more lanes) in your area that have closed, let us know and we will add them to the list.

180.

Smallwood started with three consecutive strikes, while Barnes looked completely lost through the first five frames to fall behind by 45 pins.

Among Barnes' miscues was a 4-6-7 split in the second frame and a chopped 3-6-10 in the fifth frame.

After his impressive performance in the PBA Chameleon Championship, Miller used that momentum to defeat Tom Daugherty, 215-195, as he advanced to face Jesper Svensson in the Round of 16.

Miller started with the front four and built a 42-pin lead but made some mistakes in the mid-section of the game. He left and missed the 3-4-6-7 split in the fifth and chopped the 2-4-5 in the eighth.

In the 10th frame, however, Miller delivered the goods. Needing a double and two pins, Miller struck out, including a trip four pin on his first shot.

The next PBA Playoffs show will air Nov. 1 at 4:30

COGNITIVE TESTING, “BOWLING”, PRESIDENT TRUMP & VICE PRESIDENT BIDEN

Hey bowlers, COULD YOU PASS A COGNITIVE TEST? Are you 100% fully cognizant as you should be? Are your cognitive faculties as acute as they should be? Do you think you could outperform PRESIDENT DONALD TRUMP or VICE PRESIDENT JOSEPH BIDEN on a cognitive test? I would like to see what you’ve got.

I pose the question (could you pass a cognitive test?) because so many people these days want our PRESIDENTIAL CANDIDATES to be cognitively tested. I wonder why? While they want our presidential candidates to be tested, I would like our older bowlers to be tested. My reason, it’s all about intervention and prevention.

Every senior bowler should be cognitively tested. There is no reason to be scared of a cognitive test. There is nothing to study and you can’t fail a cognitive test. There is no pass or fail score. While an IQ test measures our intelligence level a cognitive test merely screens for possible memory problems. Cognitive tests are looking for red flags, indicators of memory loss, the onset of dementia and Alzheimer’s disease.

No senior bowler should avoid a cognitive test. There is nothing to fear. Remember, we BOWLERS HAVE A REPUTATION FOR HAVING MEMORIES EQUAL TO THAT OF ELEPHANTS!!! That’s damn impressive because elephants never forget. Too bad there aren’t cognitive tests for elephants to prove whose cognitively better, bowlers or elephants.

Besides not having to worry about failing, no senior bowler should avoid a cognitive test because they are short and simple. Many cognitive tests only take a few minutes to complete and include as few as half dozen questions.

So as to encourage senior bowlers to request a cognitive test the next time they visit a physician, I will share six typical cognitive test questions with you. Then you can see for yourself that the questions and test are nothing to fear.

Six typical cognitive test questions follow:

- 1. The test subject is asked to speak three to five words and then recall them a few minutes later.
- 2. The test subject is asked to study a drawing for fifteen to twenty seconds and then after a few minutes see if he/she can remember selected details from the drawing.
- 3. The test subject is asked to speak a half dozen words with the same first letter.
- 4. The test subject is asked to identify animals in a photograph.
- 5. The test subject is asked to identify all similarities between two objects in a photo.
- 6. The test subject is asked to count backwards from 100 by sevens (7s).

How do you think you would do on a cognitive test? Do you think you could count down from the number 100 by multiples of the number 7? Do you think you would do better on a cognitive test then PRESIDENT TRUMP and VICE PRESIDENT BIDEN?

Go for it. Prove that your memory is better than their memory. Start counting down from 100.


