NEW YORKER ROLLS USBC APPROVED 900 SERIES

ARLINGTON — William Howell III of Middletown, N.Y., has big aspirations for his bowling career and took a step toward making a name for himself as he became the 16th bowler in history to roll a United States Bowling Congress-approved 900 series.

The 22-year-old left-hander rolled 36 consecutive strikes in the Bruce Bryan 3 Person League at Tarsio Lanes in Newburgh, N.Y., on Oct. 21. He now has 14 USBC-certified perfect games, while his previous-high series was 828.

"That night was truly amazing, and it means a lot to know that I'm now a part of bowling history," said Howell, whose 900 was the 17th overall. "I tried my best to keep my focus, and luckily, I had a lot of people there to support me. I knew I had the line, so all I had to do was put the ball there."

As Howell closed out his perfect set, the 36-lane bowling center grew quiet and the members of the 20-team league stopped to watch him make history as the second bowler from the Empire State to record a 900 series.

"It felt just like a normal night when I started, and after the first 300, I started thinking 800 was possible, but I never imagined I'd get to 900," said Howell, whose father, Bill Howell Jr., competes in the same league. "By the end, it was very crowded, and the entire league was there watching me. It was more emotional than my first 300, and I even broke down and cried after. I just couldn't believe it."

Howell's high average last season was 228, but he encountered some struggles on the lanes earlier this year. He turned to former Junior Team

USA member Matt O'Grady for help and got things back on track. Howell and his father drove an hour and a half to Hudson Lanes in Bayonne, N.J., for a tune-up with O'Grady, and it clearly paid off.

"I just felt like I wasn't throwing the ball very well, or there was something weird in my approach, so I went to see Matt for a professional opinion," Howell said. "He told me that in his opinion, everything looked OK, and that helped my confidence. He showed me some hand and finger positions that I've been working on since, and obviously, that helped, too."

O'Grady, who honed his skills as a member of Junior Team from 2006-2008, prides himself on his knowledge of the physical game and lane *continued on page 8*

LAS VEGAS — Congratulations to Scott Norton on his first PBA title, the Chameleon Championship of the World Series of Bowling, held at South Point in Las Vegas. The only lefty to make the cut, Norton climbed his way from 13th to the lead during match play.

During the live taping on Friday, Sean Rash took down two-hander Osku Palermaa 236-211 in the first match. Up next for Rash was Chris Barnes, who struggled and lost 227-175. In the semi-final match, Sean faced Wes Malott, who opened early in the match and failed to catch up, losing, 235-217.

Finally, it was the tournament leader's turn to bowl. A little love in the first frame and great shots the next six frames

helped Norton string the first seven and put Rash away early, making it easier for his fans to enjoy the match.

Rash left back to back splits and Norton locked up the match, his first title, and the \$15,000 prize.

Scott shared his moments after victory on the lanes with his mother, USBC Hall of Famer Virginia Norton.

Also there watching with pride were his father Rick, Craig, and many of his closest friends. Having seen all of his major bowling accomplishments first hand, this one probably ranks as the best.

Norton plans to bowl everything he can this PBA season, his first with exemption. Hopefully that pesky little career as an attorney won't slow him down.

Deaf Traveling League's favorite centers, Del Rio Lanes to make this 51 years old traveling league bounce back from its dismal showing last week at AMF Bowling Square. At Del Rio, Ed Abakumoff led two other 800 shooters with his 847 from games of 230-227-211(668)-178 to top the 8 bowlers honor roll. Gorman Low outdueled Pablo Yoma 822 (206-151-264-201)to 818 (174-215-245-184).

The third game was an exciting duel with Low and Yoma starting with 5 strikes and Yoma left a single pin in 6th and spared. While Low continued to strike 4 more, Yoma struck, spared and struck again but in 10th left a 4-pin and missed the easy spare for a 245. All Low had to do was to strike out in 10th for his first 300 but he left a costly split on his first ball and picked up two for his 264.

Oldster Glenn Cissna bounced back mightily from his bad showing last week with way over his average games of 172-188-213-202 for 775 and ditto for Gardy Rodgers with yo-yo games of 215-158-215-147 for 735. Bob Jones closed with a 225 for a 708 and the roll list ended with Robert Audette's 235 and sub Andy Lorenzo's 211.

Second place L A City with Low's 822, Cissna's 775 and Lorenzo's 211 beat Yoma's Lake Elsinore 16-4 to move up to first place, half point ahead of former leader S F Valley. Jones' S F Valley, which lost 7.5-12.5 to Rodgers' Mid City, fell to 2nd place. Dispute Abakumoff's top scores, Audette's Chino defeated Abakumoff's Riverside 16-4 to remain in 3rd place two points behind Valley.

The league thanks Del Rio management and staff for the good scoring conditions.

Next travel date is November 21 at Brunswick Covina Bowl and Covina Management asked President Abakumoff to start an hour earlier so they could have their Cosmic Bowling at 3 PM. Saturday is Beat the Board Semi-Finals/Finals Last Squad at 5 pm

COVINA — In our long awaited return to Covina Bowl, bowlers came out for a Fair and Semi tough shot this week. We had a very decent 190 entries this week. Cut scores were a +39 for the men and +23 for the women. This week, our three Super Seniors added to the board were Phil Magno (+19) and Vic Paolucci (+17) for the men and Anita Smith (-29) for the women. That would give us a total of 46 bowlers making it to the semi-finals this week. We added 1 bowler to the semi-finals this week that was a high qualifier in one of the earlier squads but was below the +39 for the men. Remember if you are a high qualifier in a squad, you are guaranteed into the semi-finals no matter what the cut score ends up being for the overall. So it is sometimes wise to come out and bowl those earlier squads.

For all qualifying squads our top qualifier for the Men was David Emrich with a +153, and for the women it was Bobbie McCollum with a +77. Each will get paid entries into a future regular ABTA event. Each week our top seed overall draws the Match Series, and this week it was worth \$822. The top seed drew a 378 but we had no one that bowled that score. Next week at Upland Bowl we will estimate the Match Series at \$1220, and for only \$2.00 to enter!

For the 3-6-9 qualifying this week, there were not a lot that qualified for the roll-off, but those that did saw Dana LeCount, yes a female, was the final person standing to go for the \$1900 pot. Being it was a female she would only have to get any combination of 4 nine counts or strikes. She

missed on her second shot and received a \$50 consolation. We will add another \$100 at Upland Bowl for a total of \$2000 in our 3-6-9.

In the doubles this week, we had 153 groups get into the doubles, with 22 spots being paid out. The top prize this week went to Jhun Tan and Minh Dang with a 1415 for \$160. In 2nd place it was Deborah Sanders and David Emrich with a 1372 for \$140. The low to cash was 1289, we paid out \$1530 in doubles.

We had 45 bowlers qualify for the semis at Covina and we saw pretty Angela Lung lead the field with a +114 to sit out and bowl for the title. Ryan Nam came in second at +113 and would sit out the first round. It took a +20 for the men and women combined with 4 women making the finals this week. At the +20 we had a tie between Romy Cajucom and Jeremy Paulsen and they would bowl a 9th and 10th frame pro-rated handicap roll-off to determine who would make it into the semi-finals and who would finish in 17th place. Jeremy would beat out Romy and advance into the semi-finals.

This week, our top seed in semi-finals had the honor of drawing the match game worth \$1135 and drew a 288. After a review of all the scores bowled, we had no one that shot that score, so it will carry-over to next week and we will estimate the pot at \$2600 at Upland Bowl. This week we had 6 new bowlers join us, and no returning member. Let's welcome these new bowlers to the club, Emily Yeung, Brian Caadoy, Brian Aflaque, Denise Olinger, Mike Wilson and Robert Lim, and we would see 1 of the new bowlers Aflaque

make the semi-finals in his first event.

This would bring us to our Match Play finals now. In the 1st round the 7 losers were Henry Hoang, Brian Aflaque, LeStar Walker, Bryan Moore, Roger Amparo, Dom La Guardia and Steve Brode. They would receive checks of \$100 each. In the second round, the losers were Tom Dahl, Sonia Coronado, Dana Le Count, Cecilia Lung and each would get checks of \$110. This would get us down to the final 4 bowlers. At this point, our horses would be paying anywhere from a low of \$38 (Ryan Nam) to a high of \$84 (Bobbie McCollum) depending on who would win. In this round we saw Jeremy Paulsen (16th seed) bowling Bobbie McCollum (4th seed). In this match, Jeremy would get the better of Bobbie with a 223 to 210 finish. In the other match we saw George Covarrubias (12th seed) bowling Ryan Nam (2nd seed). In this match, George would get the better of Ryan in this match with a 228 to 158 final score, Ryan was fighting an injury to his finger during the Match Play and it would get the better of him during this round as he was not able to get his fingers into the ball. Ryan and Bobbie finished in 4th and 5th getting checks for \$120 each. Our semi-final match was set to be bowled on 47 and 48; we had our 12th and 16th seeds into the top 16 bowling each other. In our horses this week we would see George paying \$71 and Jeremy paying \$54 if they win their match. In this match we would see both bowlers stay clean the entire match. But it was George who was staked to a 12 pin advantage based on handicap difference that would take a

commanding lead with strikes in the 5th thru 7th frames putting him up by 32 pins and he would never look back, finishing with a 215/260 to 195/228 final score. For those lucky "investors" that had George as a horse, he paid \$71. Jeremy finished 3rd and received \$200.

The title game is set and would be bowled on lanes 45 and 46 this week. Angela being the top seed elected to have George begin the match. George would strike on his first ball and that would bring up Angela. She would get a strike and her large following would let out a big roar for her. She would leave the 2-4-5 in the 2nd and only get 1 pin on her pick up. As the match continued, George got hot and start off with a "ham bone" (4 strikes) and put him up by 54 pins after the 4th frame was complete, as Angela would open in 2 out of the first 4 frames. George continued to lead in this match all the way to the tenth frame. With Angela finishing first she would punch out in the 10th frame with 3 strikes to finish with a 180/226 score. That would bring George up in the 10th frame, and he was working on a spare, so all he would need was a total of 9 pins on the 2 balls to win his first match. He would leave a 7-9 split on his first ball but that was enough and he finished with a 189/234 to win by 8 pins. This would be George's 1st ABTA win, he would take home \$1000 for first place and another \$1700 in cash and carry, plus he was wearing an ABTA shirt for another \$100, giving him a total of \$2,800. Angela would finish in 2nd for \$500. Angela finished strong, but George had enough pins to stay ahead for his win. Champion George Covarrubias one of our most faithful members is from Covina and used an "old" urethane Columbia 300 drilled by Roy at Western Columbia. He is married to wife Jessica. He would like to thank his wife, Jessica and ICU Bowling where he is currently taking lessons from Ray Gaunt and those lessons have paid off for him now. Ray an ex ABTA Member was on hand for the win and a great guy!

The pins are set at the far end of the lane in the regulation 10 pin format. You get 2 chances per frame to knock the pins down. (Sounds familiar?)

Here comes the good part. Say you knock down 6 pins —these 6 pins are pulled up into the pinsetter by strings, one string attached to the very top of each pin. Now the other four pins are set on the deck for your second shot.

Well, I can tell you first hand that a 120 game is pretty darned good. Splits pop up on great hits and strikes are at a premium.

Is it fun? You betcha! Not only do you get to bowl in your street shoes, but you receive tickets every time you hit pins. These tickets can be redeemed for fun merchandise or saved to trade for the “super prizes”.

The Game Arcade at Cal Bowl just installed four lanes and they are seeing plenty of action. It’s worth the ride for a new bowling game experience.
