Keith Kolozsi Wins Senior WCST Ebonite Singles at South Point John Cocchi is Super Senior Champ

Keith Kolozsi (Las Vegas), won his 1st WCST, Ebonite Singles Tournament at South-point Bowling Lanes in Las Vegas, last week-end. It took the position match to determine the winner of the senior division 8 bowlers went to the finals, the leader Marc Levy with 2433 qualifying, and led the first 7 games of the finals, and a 64 pin lead over Keith, a 43 pin lead over Tim Schwerdtfeger, who Marc bowled in the position match, and only a 44 pin lead over a fast charging Mike Rodriguez, who at the end of game #5, was 180 pins behind Marc. It was a disaster for Marc, as he rolled a 168 game, getting beat by Tim's 208, and Mike, passed Marc also with a losing effort of

221 to the eventual champion Keith, who blasted a big 290 games to win the tournament by 61 pins, and Marc ended up in 4th. 46 pins separated places 2nd to 5th. A big turn out of entries of 80 bowlers total for both divisions, with a over-all pay-off of \$10,640.00 for both divisions. Totals for 2008, so far, 17 tournaments, \$155,177.00, and for 280 Tournaments, a total of \$3,300,738.00 paid out.

One 300 game rolled in the qualifying, new WCST member, Gary Johnson. Top 3: 1st, Keith Kolozsi, \$925.00, 2nd, Tim Schwerdtfeger (Las Vegas) \$675.00, 3rd, Mike Rodriguez (Lomita), \$545.00. 11 places paid out. Our thanks

Walter Ray Williams Jr. Earns 45th Career PBA Title

HAMMOND, Ind.—Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Ocala, Fla., took home his 45th Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour title Sunday at the Lake County Indiana Golden Anniversary Championship at Olympia Lanes. Williams defeated Bill O'Neill of Levittown, Pa., 246-202, in the televised championship round.

"When I first joined the PBA Tour years ago, I thought I'd win four or five titles," said Williams, who was recently selected to join Team USA in 2009 for the second consecutive year. "But now I've won 45 titles and I feel great. Anytime you can win, it's great."

With his 45th title, Williams continues his reign as the PBA's winningest bowler. In addition to being the all-time titles leader, Williams is also the money leader. With this week's win, his career earnings total \$4,030,116. He broke the \$4 million mark in career earnings at last week's Pepsi Viper Championship in Omaha, Neb.

"Things have been going my way, the pins have been falling down," Williams said. "I feel like I should be bowling with the seniors. My knee is sore, my wrist is sore, but it worked out OK."

To advance to the final Williams beat out Mike Scroggins of Amarillo, Texas, 258-222, in the semifinals.

O'Neill advanced to the final by defeating friend and amateur bowler Anthony LaCaze of Glen Ellyn, Ill., 235-214. The two bowled together at Saginaw Valley State University, and O'Neill served as LaCaze's best man at his wedding to wife Alaya. LaCaze's third-place finish is the highest

for an amateur in a non-Major event since the PBA switched formats to all all-exempt field during the 2004-05 season.

Senior bowler Timothy Kauble of Marion, Ohio, claimed his first career senior title Sunday at the Lake County Indiana Golden Anniversary Championship; additionally, Sunday's championship round marked his first career television appearance.

"It feels different than anything I've done before," Kauble said. "I got some tips from (PBA Hall of Famer) Carmen Salvino about looking at the crowd and such."

Kauble defeated Hugh Miller of Seattle, 235-185, for the win. Kauble barely made the cut for the senior tournament and was seeded eighth going into match play.

"It helped that Hugh didn't have anything on the lanes today," Kauble said. "I was seeded eighth, I didn't have anywhere to go but up."

Sunday's telecast marked the first time that a PBA Senior Tour event had been televised since 2001.

The 2008-09 Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour will air next Sunday at 1 p.m. EST with the Chameleon Championship, live from Taylor, Mich.

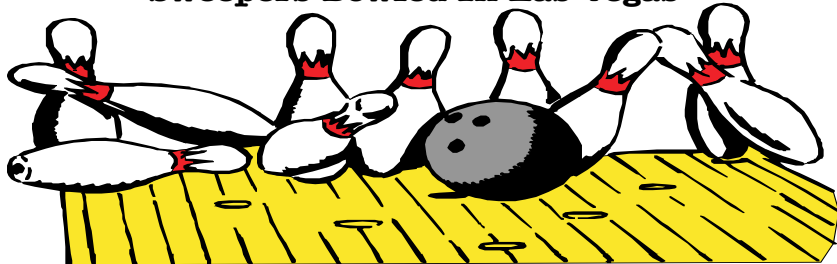

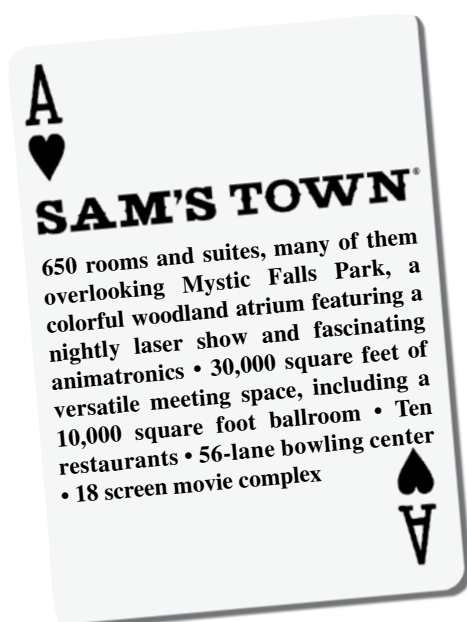

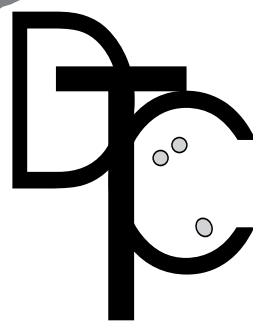

NATIONAL DEAF BOWLING NEWS
BOB JONES HITS 298-856 IN DEF
TRAVEL AT ACTION LANES

EL MONTE—It was two decades ago So. Calif. Deaf Traveling League last stopped at Village Lanes in El Monte and later the name was changed to Indian Hill Bowl. Many had recalled as the place where So.Nevada-California Deaf Bowling Association began its first tournament 24 years ago. Now the center's name is Action lanes, a bigger and beautiful place in a strip mall with stores and business places on each side of the center.

Last Sunday the nation's oldest deaf traveling league returned to "sample" Action's lanes and found them a tough undergoing. The only bright spotlight was on Bob Jones who missed his first 300 game by a heartbreaking two pins (7-10) on a solid pocket hit after 11 strikes in row.

A jubilant Jones was returning from missing the last travel session at Keystone Lanes to tell that during his absence he was in Fresno helping his hearing team to first place in the State Seniors tournament (see story below). And at Action the smooth stroking lefthander found himself in a good start with 247 in his first game.

That was the only 200 in the league's first game. In his 2nd game Jones made strikes after strikes with precision with all 11 in the pocket and the 12th was exactly the same but fate did not let the other pins touch the 7 and 10 pins. So it is his 2nd 298 game this year after hitting a 298 last June in another league and that hurts. Afterwards, Jones struggled and finished with 183 and 157 for 856 good enough for the league's season high series.

Jones' 856 broke the league's three straight sessions without a 800 series and led the league's honor roll of only 4 bowlers. Ed Abalumoff matched against Jones had 192-206-193-184 for 774, Andy Lorenzo had (201) 740, Pablo Yoma 839 and Darrell Stogryn struggled to make a 201 in his last game.

Despite Jones' heroics and his Los Angeles team beating league leading Abakumoff's Riverside 11-9, Riverside retains' its lead.

Second place Lorenzo's Glendale climbed closer with a near sweep 18-2 of Stogryn's El Camino Village.

The league thanks Shawn and the staff of Action bowl for their courtesy of hosting us. The next travel date is Nov. 23 at Cal Bowl in Lakewood.

BOB JONES' 729 HELPS 2 WRONGS &
1 RIGHT TO 1ST PLACE IN STATE SENIORS

PBA format; that is, qualification scores that advance either 16 or 24 bowlers to the finals for single game matches that reward each bowler with a 30-pin bonus. From the bowler's standpoint, it is the fairest format. But most important, it is, by far, the most popular format for fans in attendance. It affords the fans who are seated in a certain area to have the opportunity to watch ALL the finalists, rather than be subjected to sit through a four out of seven match that can exceed two hours. In addition to this, automatic scoring machines scores from surrounding matches are extremely difficult to see

Additionally, many fans that are unable to attend tournaments until later in the day are deprived of seeing some of their favorite bowlers who were eliminated in the four out of seven match play earlier. One of the saddest situations occurred in a Southern California tournament in which a father brought his son in to see Walter Ray Williams in the afternoon session, only to learn that Walter Ray had been eliminated in his first match that morning.

Let's examine the two different formats... the 24 man finals with bonus pins and the four out of seven elimination. First, Jason Belmonte, the sensational two-handed thumbless Australian star, finished close to 300 pins ahead of second in the recent PBA World Championship Tournament at Wichita, Kansas. The top 32 qualifiers advanced to the finals, with the top eight qualifiers awarded TWO BYES in match play into the 16-match-game finals.

In my humble opinion, TWO BYES are too many.

One bye is enough of an advantage. Nonetheless, despite the two byes, Belmonte was eliminated in his first match in a four out of seven game contest by Chris Barnes. Barnes probably finished close to 500 pins behind Belmonte in the qualifying rounds. Had the 16 or 24-man finals bonus format been applied, chances are, Belmonte would have easily made the TV show and most likely, won the championship. The Australian star overwhelmed the opposition for three days, then succumbed to a rival he outscored by almost 500 pins...in less than three hours!

That being said and, again, in my opinion, TWO BYES are too many. For example, suppose the ninth place finisher ended up only one or two pins behind eighth. This means, he averaged the same score as the eighth place qualifier, yet he was obligated to bowl two extra usually grueling matches to advance to the top 16.

To sum it all up, here are the two issues I believe should be addressed.

1. Bowlers should be limited to only ONE bye in formats that seed the top eight qualifiers in the PBA World Championship tournament

2. I believe ALL major tournaments should be conducted under the original PBA format with 24 finalists bowling single game matches with 30 bonus pins to the winner. AND, in view of all the sophisticated electronic devices that are featured in the TV arena settings, I would hope that the computer-savvy owners of the PBA would devise a LARGE electronic computer on each pair of lanes, whereas, fans would be able to see scores from other lanes

These are not only my personal convictions. I base my opinions on comments I hear from bowlers and fans alike.

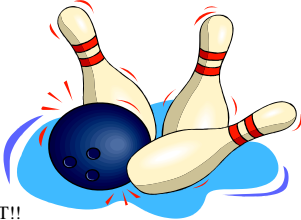
