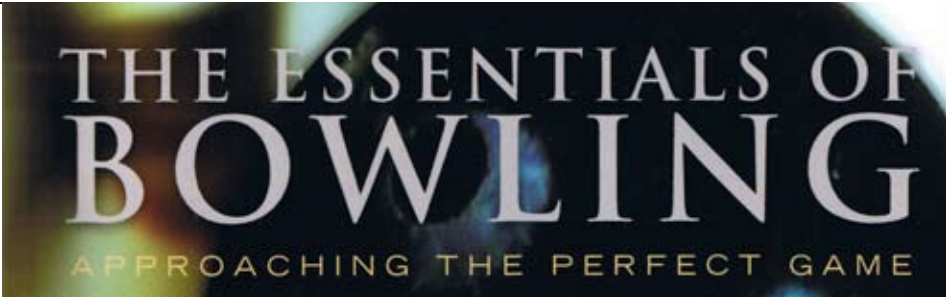

CHAPTER 8

Making Basic Adjustments

Note: Consider this chapter to be a bonus. *The Essentials of Bowling* is about teaching you the best *basic skills* that will enable you to become an accomplished bowler, but it would be negligent on my part to arm you with fine techniques and not prepare you to apply them to varying lane conditions.

Conditioning lanes is an art. Reading those conditions is a highly advanced skill. For in-depth information on this subject, refer to bowling books written by professional bowlers and coaches. They cover this subject much more deeply than either my ability or intent allows.

Bowling in a league means competing on nearly identical conditions week after week. You will become comfortable applying your skills to playing a particular line because it produces the results you expect from yourself. That’s human nature and it’s a good thing. It means that whenever you go to *any* bowling alley, you have a starting point. You have a place to stand, a target to aim for, and a result to expect. You have established what can be called “your standard shot,” and that’s important! It allows you to “read” the lanes.

At some point, it could be the next game on your home alleys or at a tournament in a strange “house,” you will deliver your standard shot and the ball will not react as predicted. These are the times when your ability to be consistent is so important. Now, only lane conditions make your ball misbehave. Figuring out what your ball is telling you about the lane conditions is not difficult. There are only three basic messages it can send you:

- If the ball doesn’t make it to the pocket, it’s telling you that there is *more oil* on the lanes than you are used to. This is a common occurrence on freshly conditioned lanes. Possible adjustments include:
 - Right-handers, move your stance to the right. Lefthanders, move to the left.
- Slow the ball down by using a lower end point to your pushaway. This allows more time for your ball to hook.
- Set the ball down on the lane sooner. Less “loft” means the ball is in contact with the lane for a longer period of time. This allows the hooking action to carry it further up into the pocket.
- If the ball hits the pocket, it’s telling you that the conditions are well suited to your skills. No adjustment is necessary.
- If the ball goes up on the head-pin or crosses over to the “Brooklyn” side, the ball is saying that there is *less oil* on the lanes than you are used to. This is a common condition on alleys late in the day, especially those that have seen a lot of use. To adjust:
 - Right-handers, move your stance to the left, Left-handers, move to the right. For every two boards that you move your stance, move your target one board in the same direction. You want to get your ball onto the oil so your shots don’t go out of control.
- Play an “inside” line. The most used line on any bowling alley is the second arrow because this is the most effective shot for the average bowler. Any ball played between the second arrow and the gutter is referred to as an “outside line”. Any ball played between the second arrow and the middle of the alley is referred to as an “inside line.” Whenever the ball hooks too much because the lanes are too dry, always move inside. That’s where the oil will be.
- Increase the speed of your shot by raising the height of your pushaway. This will cause the ball to slide further down the lane, resulting in less hook at the back end.
- Loft the ball further out onto the lane by standing up straighter during your delivery. Using less of the lane decreases the hook of the ball.
- Rotate your wrist clockwise (counterclockwise for left-handers) at the “explosion point” to reduce the hook of the ball. This is an advanced technique, but if you’ve made it this far, you are certainly entitled to try it.

There you have it - very basic but standard adjustments every bowler should be able to make once they have achieved *consistency*. There are a few things to keep in mind to make adjustments effectively:

- Two lanes are rarely identical. When you are on a pair of lanes, as in most league play, pay attention to how the ball acts on *each* lane. Many bowlers don’t realize this and are unable to “string” strikes together because they habitually play both lanes exactly the same. If one lane is “giving you grief” adjust to that one and *only that one!*
- Lane conditions change gradually, but they do change, Remember, if you are competing on a team with five people, a nearly complete game is rolled on each lane before you bowl on it again.
- Three bad shots in a row tell you it is time to adjust.
- Make your adjustments small one.
- Never adjust more than one skill at a time.
- Don’t make any adjustments until your hand is stretched out and your muscles are loosened up. You can’t accurately read the lanes until you can successfully deliver your “standard shot,” so take full advantage of “shadow ball” time!

WESTMINSTER—Welcome everyone to the weekly edition of ABTA news. We returned to Westminster Lanes where 191 entrants came out for the 2 day Special Event and support the ABTA. We had a decent semi tough shot for the tournament. The Super Seniors added to the board (2 men and 1 female) were Jack Trongale (+72), Romy Cajucom (+54), and Bobbie McCollum (+29). Super Seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 47 bowlers making it to the semi-finals this week.

Top qualifier for the Men was Jaime Perez with a +176, and for the women Dana Fong with a +76. Each will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Perez, our top seed drew the Match Series score. This time it was worth \$336. He drew a 696. We had no bowlers that bowled this score during the qualifying squads. We will estimate the Match Series at \$850 at West Covina Lanes. The roll-off for for the 3-6-9 went quickly and we finished with two bowlers missing on their final shot. They will share the \$50 consolation. They were Cezar Marcella and “Easy Ed” Abarca. At West Covina Lanes, we will

have \$2,500 in the pot.

In our optional doubles, finishing in first were Nghiem Tran and Teddy Villaroman with a 1443 for \$110. Finishing second was Vuong Do and Mike Moore with 1396 for \$90. There was a total of \$1,040 paid out in doubles and 21 paid spots with low to cash of 1336.

Then it was off to semis/finals. In this event (due to the Pacquiao Fight) we had a Beat the Board semis instead of match play, 3 women would be guaranteed to finish in the top 16. Game One, was only 10 pin separation between 1st place and 7th place. Leading after game 1 was Bedell Vasquez with a +49. Close behind him was Pengsean Chea with a +48. In 3rd was Henry Hoang with a +46. In 4th and 5th was Nghiem Tran and Beth Borci with a +41, while 6th belonged to Steve Benavente with a +40. Jack Trongale was in 7th with a +39. The top 16 saw a low of +20 for the men and a -2 for the women for the top 16. By the way, all 47 will cash checks!. During game 2 we would see some changes at the top. Jack Trongale would jump up 6 spots and tie Bedell with a +75 for 1st. In 3rd was Pengsean with a +71. 4th would now belong to Nghiem

Tran by himself with a +67. 5th went to Fel Garcia with a +57. 6th went to Teddy Villaroman with a +53, and 7th now belonged to Steve Benavente with a +46. The low for top 16 was 33 for the men and +23 for the women. It was going to be a close one Folks!!

That would bring on the 3rd and final game with 12 bowlers having a shot at the title. Again it would come down to the 10th frame between the top 4 bowlers. They kept it close during this game and took it all the way. In the end, finishing in 7th place was our top female pretty Vianey Gutierrez with a +62 for \$110. Finishing in 5th and 6th place tie at +69 was Holden Au and Fel Garcia for \$115. Finishing in 4th place was Pengsean Chea with a +74, he would get \$120. What Happened To Bowling?

NORWALK — On November 17th, 1990, a four-year-old boy threw his first sanctioned shot in league play. As he stood on the approach, he stared wide-eyed in admiration at the sport that was around him. His local center was full of happiness, competition and wonder and it wrapped him with an ideal that bowling was a sport that could transcend generations. Even at that young age he knew that he wanted to compete to the best of his ability and become a part of the legacy that was bowling.

Over the next 20 years the boy followed his passion. From youth to adult he set records, won tournaments and engulfed himself in the sport. He became involved in bowling center management, sat on the board of his local association and became a contracted bowler participating on the regional and national stage. But even as his love for the sport continued on, it became apparent things had drastically changed.

When he walked through the bowling center he no longer experienced the idealism of his youth but instead heard the rantings from a generation of bitter individuals. From equipment and lane conditions to handicap and averages, no subject seemed to go untouched by the hostile mentality. No longer did people respect the legacy of the sport but instead belittled and mocked what it represented. So as the 21st year of the boy's bowling career comes upon him he is forced to ask the question "what happened to bowling?"

For the last several years bowling has become a shell of what it once was. Participation is down and simple respect for the sport has seemingly gone by the wayside. Some may argue that it's the influx of technology or the inability to properly govern the associations. However I firmly believe the rapid decline of bowling lies on the shoulders of those who have become cynical and acidic towards bowling in general.

Approximately two months prior to the writing of this article I was injured and forced to sit out for the season. Recently, I was asked if I missed bowling and to this I said no. Judging from their shocked reaction I was forced to clarify that I missed the sport of bowling immensely but found it incredibly refreshing not to have to hear the constant bickering and whining from the majority of league and tournament bowlers. It was at this point I began to wonder if I was the only one who felt that this attitude was what was killing competition bowling.

I took the time to ask several bowlers who had dropped out of leagues why they were no longer bowling. With financial problems being the primary answer, unsurprisingly the secondary answer is that they simply did not enjoy themselves because of the people. They told me horror stories of young bowlers kicking ball returns and cursing them because of bad shots. They told me of older bowlers complaining about the current state of the game and accusing them of sandbagging and cheating. I was told many things and it soon boiled down to them paying money to be miserable, and frankly, it wasn't worth it.

There needs to come a point where bowlers, both young and old, realize that in order for our sport to survive they have to change. To the young bowlers I say we need to stop being angry, immature and oblivious to where the sport came from. Accept that we're not always going to be perfect and that there is room to learn and adapt. There is a long history of bowling and to ignore what the sport was is to destroy what the sport can become. Respect the game, respect those around you and most importantly, respect yourselves.

To the older bowlers I say times are going to change whether we like it or not. We need to accept that the sport is constantly changing as well and that we aren't going to stop technology from growing. Instead of pining for what was, concentrate on improving what is. Show the younger generation where we came from and groom them to take the sport to the next level. Don't push them away and let bowling continue to deteriorate.

There will come a time when bowling is going to live or die and that choice won't be made by the bowling ball manufacturers, the financial sponsors or even the bowling centers themselves. The choice to save bowling is going to rest squarely on the bowlers and we can still make a difference. From young to old, we are all part of the same family and I sincerely believe we can still save this great sport.

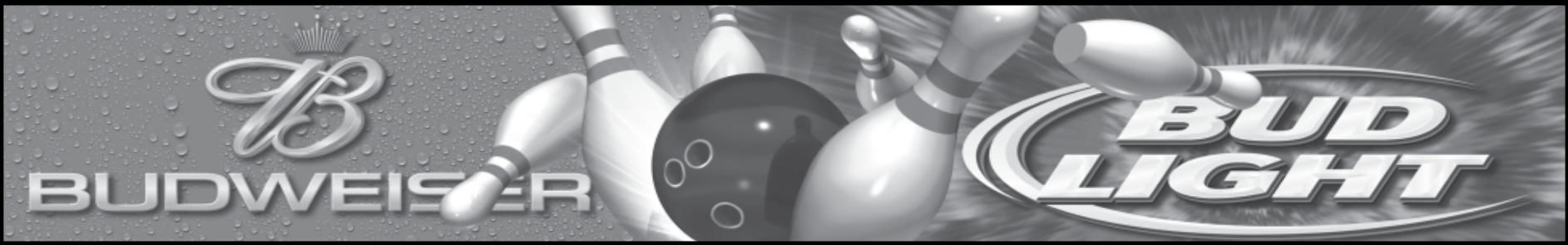

SOLA Lions Open the Lanes for Special Olympics Keglers

WAIT! You may be a little curious about the word “kegler”! According to Webster’s dictionary, a “kegler” is “A person who bowls; a bowler.” The word comes from the German word kegle which is a bowling pin. So, SOLA Lions held a Kegler Tournament, AKA, a bowling tournament this past Saturday.

The SOLA Lions Club, in association with Special Olympics Southern California and Southeast Los Angeles along with the LEOS Club from Bell Gardens and volunteers from a local church, Light and Life Christian Fellowship, held its very first Bowling Tournament at the Del Rio Lanes in Downey. Sixteen bowling lanes were busy with keglers ranging in age from 12 to 60. The Del Rio Lanes is a modern marvel equipped with big flat screens showing a score card for each lane with each bowler’s name in bright lights. Each lane is controlled by a computer that not only keeps score for each bowler but lets the bowler know when it is his or her turn on which of the two lanes shared among 8 bowlers. In addition after the first of two balls is bowled the scoreboard shows a graphic on the screen that depicts the pins remaining after the first throw. A real automated wonder that was most impressive.

The tournament was divided into 16 Divisions based on a bowler’s ability. Each bowler earns a bowling handicap score during the season and this is used to place the bowlers into the various Divisions. These handicaps range from a high of 170 to a 53. Thus, each bowler competed with their peers in the same handicap range.

Enough technical talk - the Opening Ceremony started on time with one of the bowling athletes leading all in the Pledge of Allegiance and the Special Olympics Athletes' Code. Then...the tourney began with sixteen 15 pound bowling balls hitting the lanes in unison! What a sound and vibration followed by the cheers from the spectators as the balls found their way to the pins – I mean kegles. Over the course of the next two hours each bowler rolled 3 games and a cumulative score was kept automatically by the great bowling computer in the sky. The cheers were contagious and were heard every time a ball rolled down the lane rather or not a pin was knocked down.

As the second of the three games progressed, volunteers distributed cookies donated by the Church group and water donated by Del Rio Lanes to fortify the bowlers for the third and final game. The excitement grew as the last frames were bowled in the third and final game as ribbons and medals were on the line! There was even a bowl-off on one of the lanes to break a tie! After each of the tied bowlers bowled two additional frames, the best score was recorded.

As each Division finished, the scores were totaled and results announced and medals and ribbons were awarded. As an added award, each of the athletes were presented with a commemorative photo – this was a real hit with the athletes and has become a hallmark for the various athletic events the SOLA Lions Club sponsors.

A **BIG** thank you to Lions Ron and Carol Copley is given for taking the photos, placing each in a commemorative folder and handing them to each athlete. Lion Ron came up with this idea of individual photos of each athlete at the first SOLA softball tournament a couple of years ago and it now is a tradition for the Club at all tournaments.

As the awards were being announced, a pizza lunch was served to every athlete and volunteer along with their choice of soda – no one went away hungry!

There were smiles all around from the athletes and their parents and coaches. It was heard over and over again that this bowling tournament was the best organized and fun ever. And Lion Ruri “PEANUTS” Pierre, our Special Olympics Liaison, made it all happen with her marvelous organizational skills.

The SOLA Lions really lived up to their motto - “**WE SERVE**”!

CONGRATS TO WHEELCHAIR BOWLER AL UTTECHT

FOR HIS ELECTION TO USBC HALL OF FAME

When I got an email from USBC announcing the election of Al Uttecht of Anaheim, CA to USBC Hall of Fame along with 3 other deserving men and a gracious woman whom I knew, Joan Feinblum of Santa Rosa, CA, I was happy for all of them, especially Uttecht who I considered an Earl Anthony of wheelchair bowlers.

Injuries from Vietnam War put Uttecht in a wheelchair for life and he is honored in the Pioneer category for blazing the trail for wheelchair bowling. Two men are in Outstanding USBC Performance while the third man who is deceased and Feinblum are in Meritorious Service. All five plus a couple more yet to be elected in the Superior Performance will be inducted in USBC Hall of Fame on April 26 at the USBC Convention in Arlington, TX.

Back in 1980’s I got acquainted with Al Uttecht when Southern California Bowling Writers added another annual award for its annual All-Stars Awards Banquets, to honor handicapped bowler of the year using my name on the award. The first one awarded was to a deaf bowler Bob Broomfield and the following year to co-winners deaf bowler Don Millwee and a handicapped woman. The next was again co- winners deaf bowler Hugo Horn and wheelchair bowler Al Uttecht.

Then after some years Uttecht kept on as co-winner, the Writers decided to split the award into Connie Marchione Deaf Bowler of Year and Al Uttecht Wheelchair Bowler of Year. This was n excellent honor for Uttecht who preferred to have his follow wheelchair bowlers share his awards.

But unfortunately, after a few years lack of sponsorship compelled the Writers to cancel its yearly All Stars Awards Banquet and So. Calif. Bowling Writers went in limbo.

At one time, I asked Uttecht about having a match game or two of his best wheelchair bowers and my best deaf bowlers. He had a clever answer, okay and he has an extra wheelchair for my deaf bowlers to use. Hey that was not what I had in mind.

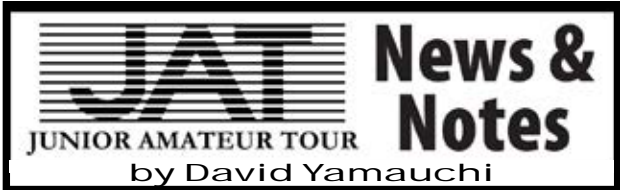

Josh moved to Gilbert, Arizona after marrying his beautiful wife AMIEE.

Gilbert is Amiee’s hometown and Josh loves it there. He still loves Upland, California and wants to thank all the bowlers at UPLAND BOWL for their support. He also sends special thanks to his parents CHRIS and JULIE, and former coach JOE STANTON.

When speaking to Josh in Las Vegas, he told me that the most important thing he learned about competitive bowling, while in college, was to watch every strike ball rolled by teammates and opponents. Doing so allows him to read the lanes faster and better. His tip to junior bowlers is to practice making spares. He feels too many young bowlers only focus on striking.

Besides becoming a PBA national competitor, Blanchard is competing on the WORLD BOWLING TOUR, and the ASIAN BOWLING TOUR. Now that he has qualified for a national PBA show, his remaining goals for the season include winning a national PBA title and being selected PBA rookie of the year.
