USA Wins 50th QubicaAMF Bowling World Cup Chris Barnes Wins Men's Title

POLAND — The champions of the 50th QubicaAMF Bowling World Cup in Wroclaw, Poland, are Clara Juliana Guerrero from Colombia and Chris Barnes of the USA.

Clara, now 32, first bowled in the World Cup as a young 17-year-old in 2000 in Lisbon where she came in 2nd. "It's taken me a long time to come back to win it!" she said after her three game victory against Li Jane Sin of Malaysia. "This is such a historic tournament and so many great players have won it in the past and I really wanted to make myself part of that group."

Clara did not have the best preparation as she did not arrive in Wroclaw until 1pm on the first day of the event and she was bowling at 5.30. She missed the practice sessions and struggled a bit to start with. But she steadily improved until today she hit a new 8-game record and her 747 over the three games in the final (239, 243, 265) is also a new World Cup record.

In the semi-final Li Jane

had beaten Brittni Hamilton of the USA by 2 games to 1: 181-235; 236-234; and 213-204. Li Jane's set in the final was 702 (234, 257, 211).

The men's games were no less exciting. In the semi-final Chris beat Mykhaylo Kalika of the Ukraine by two games to one but the excitement was his 300 game, the second time we

have seen a perfect game in the finals. He moved on to play the young man from Germany, Tobias Börding who had led the tournament all week. Tobias did not bowl badly at all but lost game one by 248 to 269. It was nip and tuck all the way in the second game but Chris ran out the winner by 231 to 216. Asked afterwards about competing in an event where all he wins is a trophy and the prestige, Chris said: "I've come to appreciate how many great international players have won

this title and winning was definitely on my bucket list. I had come 2nd in the qualifiers five times, but then this year I actually won my way here. "I am really pleased to win but I do feel for Tobias. He dominated us all week and I've been the guy who led by a lot but lost in one game so I do know how he feels. But he has a great future in bowling ahead of him"

The Bent Petersen trophy for top nation goes again to the USA with Brittni finishing 3rd and Chris winning.

MURRIETA — Dewaine West was presented with his Citrus Belt Hall of Fame ring at Cal Oaks Bowl last week. The presentation was made by THERESE LLOYD (Citrus Belt Area Director) with the assistance of Frank Weiler (Citrus Belt Vice President).

West has been bowling for 50 years. He started his winning ways as a junior JAT Champion and continued when in the Army. He was a member of the Army and Interservice bowling teams. His championship ways while in the military allowed him to bowl full time six months a year and travel throughout the world. Nice work if you can get it.


Since returning home to the Citrus Belt Dewaine has been phenomenal.

His current ten year composite average is 230 for 3,665 games. In 2005-06 he led the Citrus Belt Association with a 239 average. His high average outside the Citrus Belt is 241. He has 72 perfect games and 44 eight hundred series.

West is also a successful tournament bowler. His favorite wins are his two Citrus Belt All-Events titles. He also has Super Senior Tour (SST) titles to his credit.

Now that Dewaine is bowling as a senior he is taking the time to help others with their game. He is currently working with three senior bowlers and it makes his day to see them succeed on the lanes.

So much for the PBA League controversy

The controversy surrounding the Professional Bowlers Assn. League’s unpopular decision to completely shake up its rosters for the 2015 season has definitely runs its course.

The eight-team league continued to find some order in the disorder it created when it announced more than a month ago that it planned to draft its players for its third season from scratch.

That ostensibly meant that players such as Jason Belmonte, the face of the Los Angeles X for the league’s first two seasons, would most likely be headed elsewhere.

But the chaos that was expected to ensue from the Oct. 31 draft never took place as many of the franchise and key players were re-drafted by their former teams.

And earlier this month, the league consummated its first trade since last month’s draft, further bridging the 2014 teams with the 2015 ones. The BROOKLYN STyLES brought back PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. (shown in photo) in a trade that sent Finland two-handed star Osku Palermaa to the Pittsburgh Jack Rabbits. Palermaa was the Jack Rabbits’ franchise player the first two seasons.

That means that all but two teams – the Philadelphia Hitmen and the Motown Muscle – will start the 2015 season with their franchise player from 2014.

Last month’s draft pretty much squelched the uproar that was created after the league announced plans to revamp rosters. It was feared that the re-draft would break up the continuity of the rosters and lose the teams’ identification with their fans.

Los Angeles fans were absolutely reeling from the thought that Belmonte would leave the X and Chris Barnes would be headed away from the Silver Lake (Calif.) Atom Splitters, the 2014 league champion.

The outcry before the draft was so great that Scott Norton of the New York City WTT KingPins announced on his Facebook page that he had no intention of returning to the league if he wasn’t re-drafted by the KingPins.

But the league seemed to practice damage control when the X took Belmonte as the third pick of the first round and the Atom Splitters grabbed Barnes with the following pick. Norton was re-drafted by the KingPins as well.

The STyLES-Jack Rabbits trade was another positive step by the league. Perhaps another trade or two will be forthcoming.

After all, the league’s trade deadline extends to the end of this month. Here are the current rosters for the 2015 season:

BROOKLYN STyLES (manager Johnny Petraglia): Sean Rash, Tom Smallwood, Parker Bohn III, Jason Sterner, Walter Ray Williams Jr.

IDLE BOWLING THOUGHTS

...It is difficult to realize how difficult it was to convert bowling to an all person of all colors sport. It stated in the rules of almost all the bowling organizations that bowling was for the white race alone and though bowling was one of the first sports to break down race barriers it was still too long. Dedicated bowling pioneers worked long and hard to erase the early injustices and though the Professional Bowlers Association was founded just eight years after the rules were changed it was from the start a group that welcomed bowlers on how well they could knock pins down and applications for PBA membership offered no clues to color or origin.

...No matter how far back you go, the motto of "bring a friend" still stands as the best way to increase the number of competitive bowlers.

...At 6'-4" Mika Koivuniemi is one of the tallest pros in action these days. All-time tallest? I'd have to go with PBA Hall of Famer Steve Cook who is 6'-7" or higher—and made a bowling ball look small in his hand.

...Bowlers who scold their children for carrying useless things in their school bags should take a good long look at the contents of their bowling bags. One reason why two-ball bowling bags are so popular is that when all the clutter is in place, the bowler still had enough room for one more bowling ball.

...High school bowling rules which vary in almost every state, need plenty of research. Working with the schools and working out conflicts can add still more varsity teams to the rapidly growing high school list.

...When Johnny Petraglia rolled a 300 game on TV he received phone calls from around the world. Even though he didn't win the tournament he earned a perfect game bonus of \$100,000. The first call was from actor Michael J. Fox, who had received special bowling instructions for movie scenes from Petraglia. While answering one call Petraglia was told the White House was on the other line. "I took that call real quick", said Petraglia. "And it was the White House Tavern somewhere."

...Did you ever notice that the bowler who keeps reminding other bowlers that it is only a game is always the bowler who is winning.

...With so many tournaments around the world every year, all with their own special appeal, there's got to be a few that fit your bowling tournament profile. Read every entry blank carefully, including the fine print, and you should find an extra dimension to your bowling.

...A plane filled with bowlers suddenly developed engine trouble. The bowlers sat silently, fearing the moment when they might plunge to earth. Then a soft voice from the rear of the plane broke the silence: "Anybody want to buy a bowling ball cheap?"

...Some bowlers should stop using body English. It really doesn't do any good, and few bowlers have the body for it.

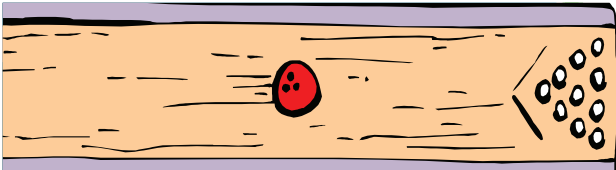
