Wounded Warrior Participates in His First PBA Tournament

LAS VEGAS — Duty.... Honor.... Country! Those are not just words to Colorado's Chris Helton, one of thousands of wounded warriors back in the United States after serving their country in Iraq and Afghanistan. Chris spent nine and a half years in the U.S. Army, joining two days after 9-11-01.

Chris, the soldier, is also a bowler, and a good one with a high series of 842. In November, he chose to take on the toughest tasks in bowling, the PBA World Series of Bowling featuring 204 of the best bowlers in the world. The roster included PBA Champions and international stars representing 16 countries.

Chris competed on four different and difficult lane patterns. It would be a challenging experience for anyone, much less someone who has never competed at the professional level; and someone who is still

fighting physical injuries from his war wounds.

In the war, Chris was severely wounded and almost died. Surgical complications led to a stroke for the now 27-year-old, who is 40 pounds lighter than his fighting weight. He has lost a lot of strength, but not his desire to be the best he can be.

In the WSOB in Las Vegas, Chris did not finish near the top on any of the qualifying days, but he met his goal of learning what he has to work on in the future. As word about Chris spread throughout the bowling community assembled at the South Point Hotel, Casino and Bowling Center, PBA members such as Sean Rash, Diandra Asbaty, Jason Belmonte, Parker Bohn, and Stevie Weber came over to him to offer help and encouragement. PBA officials and representatives of bowling products companies thanked him for his service; all offered

words of encouragement and bowling tips.

One of the first companies to substantially assist Chris was Brunswick, with an offer to supply him with equipment for the entire Tournament. Ball Specialists Robert Lawrence and Billy Orlikowski spearheaded that effort and also worked with Chris on lane play and his physical game. They have promised to continue their association with him beyond the World Series of Bowling. Before the Tournament, Del Ballard, a member of the PBA Hall of Fame, and two-time USBC National Coach of the Year Susie Minshew helped Chris with his physical game.

Chris and Alisa, his wife of six years, now live in the Colorado Springs area. Alisa will graduate in December with a degree in nursing from Colorado State University, Pueblo. Chris is now medically retired from the Army, does software

applications and is majoring in physics and math at the University of Colorado, Colorado Springs (UCCS)

But he still has his dream of bowling and winning against the best in the world. Here's hoping that his dream becomes a roadmap to reality.

BOB JONES' 822 TOPS DEAF TRAVEL AT BRUNSWICK COVINA LANES

COVINA — So. Calif. Deaf Traveling League bowlers on their stop at Brunswick Covina Lanes were surprised to see the new updated telescope screens replacing the old ones. The screens are magnificent in brightening the place up. Also they may have some effect on the travel league bowlers as almost a third of them made the day's honor roll list.

For 2nd time in row Bob Jones led the honor roll of nine bowlers including two who made the league's season highs. Jones rolled games of 224-167-228-204 for 822, the only 800 of the day.

The league President Ed Abakumoff started off fast with the day's high game 253 but he finished 9 pins short of 800 with a 791. Jeff Stansell had 778 with 200 and 216, Bob Bergan 756 with 15, Robert Audette 753 with 221, league Secretary Bob Taylor 712 with 208, Gorman Low with 701 with 205 and Andy Lorenzo hit a 208.

The 9th on the list was Anita Lorenzo who came short of 700 with her (200) 692 which replaces her previous women's season high series 670. Also Abakumoff's 253 is the new men's high game replacing the 250 made earlier in season by Francisco Navarro. Jones had a higher game, 277 but he has the high series of 928 made earlier in season.

As this scratch Travel league uses match points for each game and series won, the top 3 teams had losing points but the top two held their positions and the positions from 3rd down to 8th had changed after the action this day. The leader Covina which had 13 points lead over 2nd place S.F.

Valley, lost 7-13 to last place 8th Glendale. Glendale's win enabled the team move out of the cellar into 7th place. Although S. F. Valley lost 9-11 to 4th place OC County, Valley retained 2nd place cutting Covina's lead to 11 points while OC County dropped down to 5th place.

Third place Riverside lost 6-14 to former 5th place Whittier, enabled Whittier to jump up to 3rd place while Riverside dropped down to 6th place. Former 6th place LA City won 14-6 over former 7th place Mid City, moving LA City up to 4th place and dropping Mid City in the cellar.

WEST COVINA — Welcome everyone to the weekly edition of ABTA news. We returned to West Covina Lanes where we saw 223 entries come out, have some fun, and support the ABTA. We had a semi tough shot for the tournament making the cut scores of +54 for the men and +30 for the women. The Super Seniors added to the board (2 men and 1 female) Ping Tubera (+45), Thomas Smith (+44), and Carla Sanchez (+12). Super Seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 61 bowlers making it to the semi-finals this week.

Our top qualifiers were for the men Teddy Villaroman with a +148, and for the women it was Kristine Soliman with a +98. Each gets a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. The top seed Villaroman for the Match Series, and this time it was worth \$728. He drew a 464. We had one bowler that bowled this score during the qualifying squads. It was Michael Leung who happily will accept the Cash. We will estimate the Match Series at \$800 at Cal Bowl event.

The roll-off for the 3-6-9 this week went to Dennis Kelsey and he would get to

go for \$2,000. Unfortunately, he got four 9's or better, but missed on the final shot and received a consolation of \$50, which will make the pot \$2,100 at Cal Bowl. Tough Luck Dennis!

In our optional doubles, finishing in first were Teddy Villaroman and Armand Garcia with a 1429 for \$150. Finishing second was Teddy Villaroman, and Je Je Gabriel with 1423 for \$130. There were a total of \$1,650 paid out in doubles and 24 paid spots with low to cash of 1354.

In the semis we would see a couple of different leaders in all three games. During the first game the high was a +67 and the low was a +29, with a +48 tie in 2nd place. During the 2nd game we would see a lead change again and the leader this time was sitting at a +83 with second place only a couple of pins behind. During the 3rd game we would see 1 more lead change and Teddy Villaroman would finish on top with a +117. In second was Kmel Cunanan with +105. Low for the three guaranteed women was +30 and low for the men was +66 to make it into the match play finals.

Our top seed in semi-finals Villaroman again:) had the honor of drawing the Match

Game worth \$3,500, which is maxed out. He seed drew a 248. After a review of all the scores bowled, we had no bowlers who shot that score so it will be carried over. We will have \$3,500 at Cal Bowl, and continue to build on the 4th back-up pot.

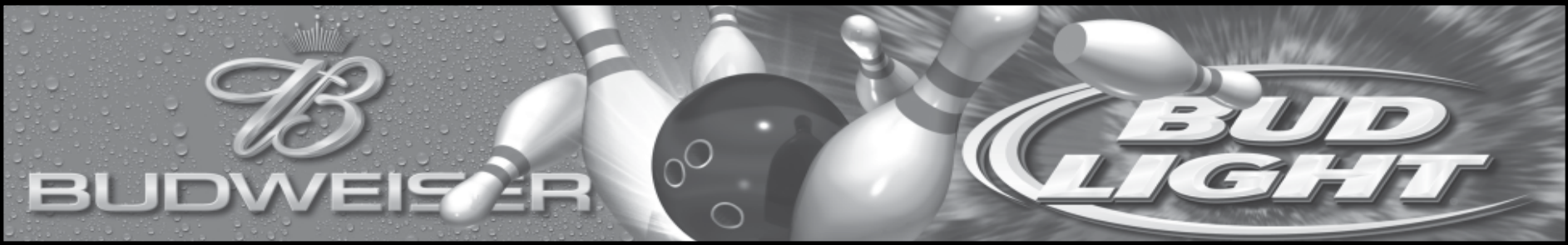

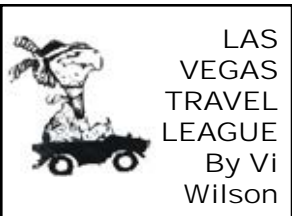
