Liz Johnson Makes PBA History

RENO, NV – It was huge. It was inspiring. It was historic. And people yawned. Well, that part may not be totally accurate. Many sports fans just didn't seem to be aware of it.

When Liz Johnson defeated Anthony Pepe of Elmhurst, N.Y., 220-206, to claim the Professional Bowlers Assn. Chameleon Championship on November 18th at the National Bowling Stadium, she chalked up another treasured victory for women athletes.

Johnson, of Palatine, Ill., joined Kelly Kulick as the only women to claim titles on the PBA Tour.

Kulick won her championship amid considerably more fanfare, scoring a spine-tingling 265-195 victory over Chris Barnes in the finals of the 2010 PBA Tournament of Champions in Las Vegas. Tears were flowing at the end of Kulick's match.

Even Barnes showed his appreciation by standing and clapping as Kulick finished her meaningless 10th-frame shots, which happened to be two strikes and a nine count.

"History has been made in women's sports," Kulick proclaimed to herself as she prepared to throw her final shot. Seven years later, Johnson's victory didn't quite get the same public reaction. Most media outlets didn't mention her memorable triumph.

Eric Forkel, who has won five national PBA Tour titles and 27 PBA regional championships, weighed in on Johnson's victory and the paltry coverage in the media.

"When it comes to Liz, she could possibly be the greatest woman bowler of all time," said Forkel, who co-hosts Bowling Evolved videocasts with Dustin Markowitz. "Nothing surprises me when it comes to her."

"Sadly in bowling, just like when Kelly won the TOC, the media coverage was OK, but nothing earth-shattering. It's sadly the nature of the way the sport of bowling is perceived in the regular sports world."

"The World Series of Bowling is a big event but, to me, because it's not carried on a major network, it gets lost. So when an oddity like a woman winning an event happens, the coverage is minimal."



Liz Johnson scored a historic victory in the Professional Bowlers Assn. Chameleon Championship, but it got scant attention.

Although Johnson's title didn't match Kulick's in newsworthiness (Johnson's championship didn't come in a major and it wasn't the first women's triumph on the PBA Tour), it still represented a colossal accomplishment for women bowlers – and women athletes overall.

"The sad part or irony is that [Liz] will get more noise from the fact that she now has come out as an openly gay

And it was another big-time laurel for Johnson, the three-time reigning Professional Women's Bowling Assn. Player of the Year.

And Johnson acknowledged it.

"It feels absolutely amazing," said Johnson, who also has won three Professional Women's Bowling Assn. titles this year (including two majors). "It's officially one of the best bowling days of my life and probably the icing on the cake as far as my career goes."

"I've been very lucky to have the career that I've had. I never thought having the chance to win a PBA title would come when it did. It's been an awesome journey.'

Twelve years ago, Johnson also made history by becoming the first woman to make a televised appearance on the PBA tour. That took place at the PBA Banquet Open and she finished second to Tommy Jones.

What's interesting about Johnson's Chameleon Championship victory is that it occurred in the same year as the movie release of "Battle of the Sexes" – a biographical sports film that is based on the celebrated 1973 tennis match between Billie Jean King and Bobby Riggs at the Houston Astrodome. At the time, the 29-year-old King was a top women's player and the 55-year-old Riggs was a far-over-the-hill former men's champion.

King gave women's sports a huge shot in the arm by controlling the match and delivering a 6-4, 6-3, 6-3 victory.

The nationally televised match was viewed by an estimated 90 million curious people – unsure whether King could play with a male opponent, even one who was much older and out of shape.

In the case of Liz Johnson, sports fans are now accustomed to women playing close to the same level as men in certain sports.

So Johnson's victory over Pepe didn't resonate the same way as King's and Kulick's triumphs.

It's a sign that the gap between men and women in many sports is closing.

Liz Johnson proved it again last month.



If any of the invitees is unable to attend, the "alternate" list is headed by Bill O'Neill, Langhorne, Pa., and Francois Lavoie, Canada.

In addition to the 11 players from the earnings list, the international field also will include three PBA members, one woman and one Korean PBA player invited by tournament sponsor DHC. Those players will be announced as soon as they have confirmed their intent to participate.

The tournament itself will feature a new format, beginning with the invited field and 32 Japanese players (a starting field of 48) bowling two six-game qualifying rounds on Saturday, Jan. 27 to cut the field to the top 16 for 16 games of head-to-head match play on Sunday. The top five after 28 games will advance to the stepladder finals on Sunday beginning at 5 p.m. Japan Standard Time (3 a.m. EST). FEAN LAVERY-SPAHR WINS The Perfect Game

The Perfect Coach: Part 8

BEAUMONT, TX – Sean Lavery-Spahr from Pasadena, Texas, defeated former PBA Southwest Region Player of the Year Shawn Maldonado of Houston, 221-211 in their decisive position round match, to win the 16th annual PBA Beaumont Southwest Open at Crossroads Bowling Center in Beaumont, Texas, Sunday. The victory was Lavery-Spahr's fourth career PBA Regional title.

Lavery-Spahr led the tournament after qualifying and through most of the match play finals, before Maldonado grabbed a 13-pin lead entering the final game. With the 30 bonus pins awarded for winning the match, the title was in doubt until the final frame when Lavery-Spahr left a 7-10 split, seemingly handing Maldonado the victory. However, Maldonado failed to convert the 2-4-5-8 spare in his 10th frame and Lavery-Spahr claimed the \$3,000 first place

Nathan Bohr of Austin, Texas, moved into second place when he defeated Anthony Lavery-Spahr (Sean's twin brother), 255-207, in their position round match to pass Maldonado. Sean Lavery-Spahr finished the event with 4,986 total pins, including the match play bonus pins. Bohr followed with a 4,791 pinfall total, 12 pins ahead of

Earlier, we mentioned that coaching is a process and is synonymous with changing. This article will deal with the basics of that process, which involves asking the proper questions of yourself before modifying your technique.

Begin by answering the following question: Does my equipment fit well? It's nearly impossible to develop consistency if it doesn't. Shoes should be snug for secure footwork, and always make sure the soles are clean and dry. Clothing should be comfortably loose for freedom of movement. The ball must be able to roll smoothly off your hand. A proper fit is essential, so make this a priority above everything else*. When you can answer the above question with a "Yes," it's time to go bowling.

Once at your favorite bowling center, take a few moments to warm up prior to actually rolling the first shot. A few stretches, swings of the ball, and slides at the foul-line (to check for problem areas) will go a long way toward prepping for your first delivery. Even with these exercises, it still takes a few frames to "work out the kinks." Don't take things too seriously until the third or fourth frame of the first game. At this time, it is extremely important to ignore scores; they are meaningless during practice sessions. Remember, you are there to learn about modifying your delivery; nothing


Now, take a few shots using the skills learned from the previous articles. Remember to be smooth and deliberate. Ideally, you want to maintain your balance and posture after releasing the ball. If you can't, you are throwing the ball too hard. Tell yourself to, "Slow down!" To be consistent, you must bowl within your own abilities. Trying to perform beyond them is a recipe for disaster.

Once you are "warmed up," it's time to get serious. Pick up your ball, take your starting position and get into the stance you have developed. As you take the first step, remember to push the ball directly toward the target-arrow you have chosen. Continue this push-away until the elbow is straightened. As soon as the arm is fully extended, initiate the arm-swing by letting the ball just DROP**. As it does, maintain a firm grip and keep the hand under, then behind the ball. Do not let the wrist rotate throughout the arm-swing. When the ball begins to move forward, focus on the release point***. The instant the arm is perfectly vertical, relieve the pressure exerted by the thumb against the ball. You will feel the weight of the ball transfer to your fingers. Use the strength in your fingers to lift the ball out onto the lane. Keep your eyes glued to your intended target until the ball is beyond it!

The next question you must ask yourself is, "Did I make a good shot?" How would you know? If you think the indicator is whether or not the ball rolled over the chosen target, you might be mistaken. The true indicators of a successful shot are: the ball came off the hand cleanly, you maintained good balance/posture at the foul-line, and the follow-through did not waver from the target-line****. It's possible your new delivery chose a different target than the one at which you were staring. That's not unusual after making any modification to your approach. Don't fight it; change your focal point to that target. Adjustments become much easier if you do, and those will get the ball where you want. You are "golden" when you can make a good delivery AND the ball rolls over its intended target.



- ** This initiates the arm-swing.
- *** This is the point in the forward-swing at which the arm becomes perpendicular to the floor.
- **** The arm-swing consists of four parts. The down, back and forward segments are a crucial skill. Once the ball is gone, the final segment, which you know as the follow-through, becomes an indicator. It indicates whether or not the entire swing kept the ball on its target-line. Consider this; the arm should swing in an invisible plane which rises up from the target-line. If the follow-through remains in that plane, the whole arm-swing did as well.



LANETALK'S WSOB IX SUMMARY ILLUSTRATES SKILL LEVEL

RENO – The overall skill level of the 195 PBA members who competed in GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling IX, presented by Eldorado Reno Resorts Properties, was illustrated in an end-of-event statistical summary by LaneTalk, PBA's stats partner for the event:

- Overall, tournament players bowled 9,041 games and knocked down 1,951,511 pins.
- For all four animal pattern events and the PBA World Championship, the entire field averaged 215.85.
- The full field threw strikes on 57.37% of all first shots, hitting the pocket 73.46% of the time.
- Players threw consecutive strikes 59.01% of the time.
- Of the non-strike shots, the field left "makeable spares" (non-splits) 33.03% of the time, and converted those leaves 86.97% of the time.
- As a group, the players left single pins 23.24% of the time. Within that stat were 6,366 10 pins which were converted 91.4% of the time and 2,810 7 pins which were converted 91.1% of the time.


PBA STARS CHRIS BARNES, TOMMY JONES WIN WORLD BOWLING DOUBLES GOLD MEDAL

LAS VEGAS – Long-time PBA competitors and friends Tommy Jones and Chris Barnes, who have combined for 25 appearances as members of Team USA, bowled as doubles partners for the first time in the World Bowling Men's Championships Tuesday at South Point Bowling Plaza in Las Vegas, and captured the World Bowling men's doubles gold medal with a 420-409 victory over Hong Kong's Lau Kwun Ho and Eric Tseng.

Barnes and Jones, who were members of the gold medal U.S. teams at the World Championships in 2008 and 2010, are competing in the multi-event World Bowling Men's Championships along with fellow PBA members Marshall Kent, Jakob Butturff, AJ Johnson and Chris Via. The team did not medal in singles earlier this week.

"Obviously, anytime you get to win for Team USA, it means a lot, and being able to win with one of my best friends makes it even more special," Jones said. "It's also really nice to get this gold medal early in the tournament to show the younger guys what it's all about and what it means to us and hopefully spark something for later in the week. We're here for one key thing, which is to win the team event, and it's nice to have that momentum."

Tuesday's doubles win was the sixth World Championships gold medal for Barnes, who will be inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame in Indianapolis in February. Barnes won World Bowling Masters gold medal in 2010 and allevents in 2013 to complement two team titles and a previous doubles victory.

LAKE ELSINORE - The Saturday Sport league members came back from the Thanksgiving bye this week to a new oil pattern: Mexico City. More specifically, the league is bowling on the 2017 World Bowling 43 foot version.

This pattern is made up of 25.5 ml. of oil in a wide. flat shape that resembles a Mayan Temple. Typically on this pattern, anything outside of about 8, 9 or 10 is out of bounds. However, at PnP, it was possible for rev-dominant players to get it back from 7 board.

As is usually the case, week one on a new pattern is about gaining experience to determine your best strategy for success over the next two weeks. By far, the most common experience among the bowlers was carry-down. Nearly every bowler I spoke with after league told me of noticing significant carry-down in game three usually between frames three and six. Our bowler of the week, Fred Casassa, killed it in games one and two but his scoring fell off a bit in game three as he battled the carry-down.

As mentioned previously, week one on a new pattern generally sees fewer over-average scores and this time was no different. Nonetheless, there were some notable games bowled this week: Jimmy Casassa +30, Shammon Williams +35, and Kira Sanders +55. Mike Pulsipher had a consistently good set with games of +27, +22, and +12 for a pins-over-average series of +61. Another consistent performer was Steve Lertpaichaiyon who was barely edged out for bowler of the week. Steve's games were +33, +16, and +50 to come up just shy of a century series at +99.

Now back to our bowler of the week, Fred Casassa. Fred was on fire shooting +51 (224), +47 (220), and +17 (190). Fred exceeded the century mark with a fantastic series of +115 (639). He came straight to bowling this week after working his graveyard shift job all night. Before we started, he expressed concern that he would be too tired to execute properly. Maybe he should always skip sleep before bowling. After league, he told me that he had found our previous oil pattern, Beijing, to be quite difficult. Apparently, he doesn't feel the same about Mexico City. Great bowling Fred!

The next 13-week Saturday Sport league begins January 6, 2018. The meeting will be at 9am with league play to follow. Weekly league fees are \$7. Member benefits include 4 free games daily (weekdays before 6pm; weekends before noon), free pizza and beverage on week 13, free coaching from USBC Bronze coaches Ken Clay or Cheryl Robinson, and, of course, the challenging fun of sport bowling!
