continued from page 1 unfortunately I didn't. But luckily he was down early and I was able to hang in there."

Page, who had struggled early in the season, was making his first televised finals appearance of the season.

"I can't tell you how much confidence this brings," the 25-year-old said. "Three weeks ago I was pounding my head into the wall. But I went back to what made me, me. I didn't realize I had gotten away from it. But just because I won, doesn't mean I can let up know."

In the second match, Malott, who was making his fourth TV finals appearance in eight events, had a near-perfect game, defeating last week's champion and Sunday's No. 3 seed Parker Bohn III, 290-204. In the first match, Bohn III of Jackson, N.J. advanced by defeating defending champion Patrick Allen of Wesley Chapel, Fla., 244-233.

In the PBA Women's Series, sponsored by the United States Bowling Congress (USBC), No. 2 seed Jodi Woessner of Oregon, Ohio defeated last week's champion and top seed Carolyn Dorin-Ballard of Keller, Texas, 247-189 in the championship match. Woessner struck in the first six frames and jumped out to a quick lead en route to her first career PBA Women's Series title. It was Woessner's second televised finals appearance of the season, previously losing to Michelle Feldman in the championship match of the Chameleon Championship in Taylor, Mich. on Nov. 16.

"I just tried to make good shots and kept my arm swing loose," Woessner said. "Last month when I was on the show, I think I pressed too hard. I've bowled Carolyn several times and I've had success against her. I don't know if I bring my game up a notch when I play her, because she's an amazing player." The Lumber Liquidators Shark Championship is the fourth event in the PBA's six event "Versatility Swing," in which players can earn separate points based on their performance in each of the six events. These events include the five events on the named "animal" patterns (Viper, Chameleon, Scorpion, Cheetah and Shark) as well as the Earl Anthony pattern that will be used in Medford, Ore. Much like tennis has a "Clay Court Championship" or a "Hard Court Championship," the PBA features these events on different oil patterns. Today's event marks the only time all season the Shark pattern will be used as the sole pattern for an event.

The Shark pattern is the longest of the five patterns, measuring 44 feet of oil. Typical to the length and design, professionals will migrate more towards the center of the lane as the ball normally will not hook back to the pocket if it strays too far outside near the gutter. This pattern usually requires extreme inside angles to get to the pocket after five or six games. The scoring pace is normally low for this pattern. With her appearance in Sunday's finals, Woessner also qualified for the Women's Series Showdown, in which the winners (and runner-ups if there is a multiple winner) will participate in a season-ending dedicated broadcast on ESPN, sponsored by the United Stated Bowling Congress (USBC).

The PBA will travel next to Reno, Nev. for the National Bowling Stadium Championship with the finals airing live on ESPN on Sun, Jan. 11.

#### 25TH ANNIVERSARY SN-CDBA TOURNEY SET FEB.14-15 AT SUNSET STATION

LAS VEGAS—Southern Nevada-California Deaf Bowling Association secretary-treasurer Stan Booth mailed out to deaf bowlers the flyers, entry forms and general information of the 25th anniversary SN-CDBA tournament held at Sunset Station in nearby Henderson on Presidents day week-end Feb. 14-15, 2009. Booth will accept entry fee before Jan.1st to hold your team's spot and the average verification forms by Jan. 15.

Also he added, this time if you bowl in two or more leagues, make copies of the average verification form and have the secretary of each league sign the forms. That will make sure you have the highest average as of January 1 to avoid disqualification.

Time certainly went fast as it seems like yesterday, 25 years ago the 3 founding members Larry Murray of San Gabriel Valley Deaf Bowling Club, James Barton of So. Calif. Deaf Bowlers and Sammy Sain of Las Vegas Deaf Bowling Ass'n met one day with Murray and Sain lamented to Barton about their smaller club's financial inability to bid for host-ship of Pacific Coast Deaf Bowling and National Deaf Bowling tournaments. That lead to a discussion about forming a smaller deaf bowling organization to run an annual regular tournament along with a Masters-like competition in southern Nevada and California region. So they decided to ask this writer to join in and to make up the rules for the organization and 4 men team, doubles and singles tournament.

As for the Masters-like tournament this writer suggested a smaller version of the NDBA's World Deaf Championship and to call it the Deaf Eliminations.

With Murray as pro-tem president and host chairman for his club for the first tournament, Barton and Sain as vice-presidents and this writer as pro-tem Secretary Treasurer, it was decided to ask the deaf bowling clubs of southern California and Nevada to put in one-time refundable \$100.00 fee as charter club members to have the bidding rights. Then Murray with San Gabriel Valley Deaf Bowling Club as host arranged with then Manager Carol Mancini of Village Bowl in El Monte to hold the first SN-CDBA tournament on Thanksgiving week-end 1984.

Nine deaf clubs chipped in \$100 each as charter members and

Nine deaf clubs chipped in \$100 each as charter members and they were Angel West Bowlers, Downey Deaf Bowlers, Golden State Deaf Bowlers, Intercity Deaf Bowlers. Las Vegas Deaf Bowling Ass'n., Riverside Silent Bowlers, San Gabriel Valley Deaf Bowling Club, South Bay Silents and So. Calif. Deaf Bowlers. From this SN-CDBA had a solid start with \$900 in its bank account. In later years the numbers grew to 14 with addition of San Diego Deaf Bowlers Ass'n, Long Beach Beachcombers, Hi-DAD Bowlers, Moreno Valley Silents and Southwest Bowlers.

The inaugural tournament hosted by San Gabriel Valley Deaf Ass'n was a success as it drew 16 teams and 53 bowlers in its Deaf Eliminations. South Bay Silents #3 foursomes won the team event with 2093 handicap score, Las Vegas' Gary Landry and Sammy Sain took the doubles with 1253 and a surprise last day substitute Lance Blessing won both singles and all-events with 651 and 1949 handicap scores. The first prestigious Deaf Eliminations was taken by Billy Spears defeating Jerry Mullenix in the finals.

Through the years the team entries went as high as 27 in it's 10th year, then it went on a downward trend to as low as 7 teams in 1998 that necessitated a change from Thanksgiving week-end to President's day week-end in February. The change boosted the entries to its all time best 42 teams in 2004. Also there were other changes like from a men's tournament to a mixed one permitting

deaf women bowlers and interpreters for the deaf to compete.

From the first year President Larry Murray there were many others presiding in the years between to Howard Sultan at present. Stan Booth is only the 4th secretary-treasurer with Ira Krauss, Howard Sultan and this writer before him.

Highlighting the 25th anniversary as Las Vegas is a gambling town, there will be Texas Hold-em Poker tournaments on both evenings for deaf bowlers and fans who want to play.

The cold did not deter the 1500 present soaking up the accolades of all branches of the service, POW/MIA's and Patriot Ancestors for their love of country and service. A wreath was laid around a massive flagpole for each branch. Loved ones who had family buried here received wreaths first and then the mass moved forward covering the 3700 graves and place a wreath on each one.


