

The Viper Championship, presented by Xtra Frame, was the second of four "animal pattern" championships contested during the GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling VII presented by Silver Legacy. The finals aired Sunday on ESPN.

Ciminelli, 29, jumped out to a 33-pin lead on the strength of three strikes and a spare while Bolleby opened in his fourth frame, and Ciminelli never gave Bolleby a chance to get back into the game.

sure of revenge over newly-crowned PBA World Champion Gary Faulkner Jr. of Memphis, Tenn., with a 245-225 victory in the semifinal round while Bolleby eliminated PBA Tour rookie Jakob Butturff of Chandler, Ariz., 222-181, in the other semifinal

All four players are lefthanders. It was the first alllefty field in a PBA Tour event since 2007.

Ciminelli saw his dream of a third consecutive PBA Tour title and a second maior win in 2015 when he lost to Faulkner, 247-237, in the Rolltech PBA World Championship finals on Dec. 17, so he knew a win in the Viper Championship was important if he wanted to challenge Australia's Jason Belmonte in the Player of the Year chase. Belmonte, the 2013 and 2014 Player of the Year, staked himself to a big lead earlier



in the year when he won the USBC Masters and Barbasol PBA Tournament of Champions, both majors.

"That was the hardest show I've ever been part of. knowing Player of the Year was on the line and I had to have this win," Ciminelli said of the Viper finals. "I knew I had another chance after the World Championship even though that one was heartbreaking. I felt like I bowled one of the best games of my life in that one, but this was do-

"My legs were jello," he

added. "I was comfortable where I was playing the lane, but I was using a new ball and it didn't feel quite right. I just kept it in play and fortunately (Bolleby) didn't shoot a big game against me."

Ciminelli believes his third win will make a big difference in the PBA Player of the Year voting, which will take place early in January.

"I think three titles says a lot, with one of them being the U.S. Open," he said. "I think I had some votes before this one, but now I think I deserve it. It's something I never thought I'd have a chance to win, so when you get the chance, you have to seize it. It could be 10 years before I ever have another chance.

"Belmo and I talked

about (POY) yesterday, and he told me I would be deserving if I win, and I feel the same about him. I think he's the best in the world, but if he doesn't win again this year, he'll probably win it again next year. I told him, 'Hey, bro, I just want





The PBA Meets The "FASHION POLICE"

RENO, NV — What would JOAN RIVERS (comedian) and JOHNNY WEIR (skater and fashion designer) have to say about today's PBA stars and their wardrobes? Are today's professional bowlers hip or not?

From what I'm told mixed matching colors are in and plain is out. So how do today's PBA stars stack up according today's "FASHION POLICE"? Let's take a closer look at the bowlers who competed on the Cheetah Championship television show. I will give you my and my wife's opinion and then tell you what Joan Rivers and Johnny Weir probably would say about our PBA stars.

In my opinion England's PAUL MOOR was the best dressed PBA bowler on the Cheetah Championship TV show. From head to toe he was in black with big, bold white letters spelling his last name on his back. If he added a tuxedo jacket he could attend a Presidential dinner party.

While Moor's look is my favorite and may be the best I've ever seen on television some might feel that a few minor changes could be made to add a little pizzazz. According to these critics a white belt and white shoes or white collar and trim are all touches that would make Moor's ensemble memorable. I don't agree.

My wife, Therese, isn't a fan of Moor's formal look and felt he should have added touches of red to his black and white ensemble. Maybe a red collar or buttons. Again, I disagree. His classic pure black look was stunning.

My sources tell me that Rivers would take my side. She always said that when wearing black "less is more" and one should limit one's ensemble to one accompanying color. While white is preferred some of the other acceptable colors are red, yellow or orange. I believe an entire wardrobe of black enhanced with the aforementioned colors would be memorable and gain any bowler a reputation. We need our own "MAN IN BLACK". Bowling needs it's own Johnny Cash. A good guy with a tough side and an edgy past. The perfect look for PETE WEBER.

If Weber isn't interested, I suggest someone else make a name for themselves as the "Man In Black" by wearing all black. While black letters on black might be difficult to read at first, before long everyone would know your name just because of the all black ensemble.

So what would Johnny Weir think of Moor's outfit? "BLAH"! Too bland. Johnny prefers bright colors with a preference for all shades of pink and fuchsia. Johnny's friend TARA LAPINSKY, fellow skater and critic, loves bright colors on herself but prefers her men in classic, conservative ground shades. She would prefer to see Moor in earth tones, matching his hair and coif.

My second "best" wardrobe choice of the Cheetah finalists is NORM DUKE'S baby blue jersey embossed with white letters and black trousers. Norm's ensemble made Him easily identifiable to the television audience, especially those fans not familiar with the current crop of PBA stars.

While I would have preferred to see Norm in a darker blue jersey with those black trousers or navy blue trousers with his baby blue shirt, his look was fine. Norm's signature black leather belt with silver metal trim is posh but better suited for ensembles dominated by dark tones.

Duke's get-up wasn't one of Therese's favorites but she did give him a passing grade. Her suggested changes include dark blue trousers accented with a red belt and shoes. She also thought designer jeans would be great if they are PBA "SANCTIONED". Joan would be agreeable.

I believe Weir would have an entirely different take. He would prefer Norm in earth tones because his hair and skin coloring dictate woodsy pastels. Weir would love to see Norm strut his stuff in a beige jersey and bark brown trousers. A matching beige belt and shoes would be "STRIKING". A shirt collar with a fringe of bark brown thread would add a stunning touch. Other acceptable colors include shades of green and tan, but "SPARINGLY".

My third wardrobe choice of the Cheetah finals was PARKER BOHN'S multi-colored jersey and black trousers. His jersey featured green and yellow streaks on a white backdrop with the colored streaks dominating the white. His name was prominent and easily read. Name recognition is important to fans and Parker's lettering is the best I've seen on today's multi-colored jerseys.

While black trousers match well with most every jersey color, when a bowler wears a multi-colored shirt I prefer trousers in the predominant color of the shirt. I would have preferred Parker in dark green trousers. Therese agrees with me and I'm sure Joan would. Not Johnny.

Weir would love Parker's jersey but not his trousers. While Johnny would agree that trousers with dark colors were more appropriate than black his preference would be livelier. Johnny's probable choice: trousers the exact color and pattern of Parker's shirt. I'm sure ERNIE SCHLEGEL and GUPPY TROUP would agree with Johnny.

ANDREW CAIN'S ensemble is my fourth wardrobe choice of the show. His multi-colored jersey was too busy and swallowed up the lettering on his back. The shirt favored shades of dark blue which made his choice of a black belt and trousers acceptable but not exciting. Therese agrees with my assessment.

While I am sure Joan Rivers would agree with us I am just as sure that Johnny Weir would not. While Johnny would love Andrew's use of multi-colors he surely would want Cain to go with lighter shades of those colors and matching pants.

To sum up, I prefer solids while the ladies and Johnny lean towards multi-colors. Since PBA rules (as far as I know) do not preclude the use of any particular colors or designs it is time for players to develop their own identities. It will be good for the PBA if there is a "Man in Black", more "ARGYLE ASSASINS" (MICHAEL FAGANS) and more KYLE TROUPS.

I love Pete Weber's edginess and Kyle Troup's posh threads. Individuality, outrageousness and controversy are what the PBA needs more of. MORE ATTITUDE, MORE PIZZAZZ, and MORE NOTORIETY means more ratings, more profits and more prize money.

Here Comes Bowling Standout Chris Paul

(Who Also Plays Basketball)

CALABASAS – Don't be surprised if you happen to run into L.A. Clipper point guard Chris Paul at a neighboring San Fernando Valley bowling center.

There's a good chance that particular bowling center will be AMF Woodlake Lanes in Woodland Hills.

The Los Angeles Times reported that Paul, an eight-time NBA all-star and avid bowler, has purchased an estate in a guard-gated community in Calabasas, just west of Los Angeles

Paul will have Khloe Kardashian as his next-door neighbor and one of her sisters, Kourtney, will be around the corner. Paul paid \$8.995 million for the Mediterranean-style two-story home, which comes with a resort-style swimming pool and tennis court, according to The Times. Three years ago, Paul bought the Bel-Air home of singer-song-writer Avril Lavigne.

Several Kardashians have made frequent visits to Woodlake Lanes to bowl so it figures Paul might do the same. Perhaps Paul will accompany his Kardashian neighbors to Woodlake Lanes

It would take Paul just minutes to travel to Woodland Hills from Calabasas . . . or he could travel 10-15 minutes longer and wind up at Corbin Bowl in Tarzana or Winnetka Bowl. Paul might face a difficult choice here. He's a skilled veteran bowler so he might have to decide between the party atmosphere of Woodlake Lanes and the more competitive and serious atmosphere at Corbin Bowl and Winnetka Bowl.

In an interview with ESPN early this year, Paul said "I've never bowled a 300. That's my goal. If you bowl a 300, you get a ring. If you win a [basketball] championship, you get a ring so it's kind of ironic that I ain't got neither one of them."

He added that bowling is his "other passion. Some guys have other hobbies but I've been bowling since senior year of high school. That Christmas my mom and dad got me a bowling ball that looked like an ABA basketball – it was red, white and blue. They got my brother a bowling ball that looked like a regular basketball. I just love bowling. My family bowls all summer long."


Paul took up bowling while he was growing up in North Carolina and he maintained his ties with the sport through his days at Wake Forest and with the New Orleans Hornets and Clippers.

On Feb. 23, Paul will host his seventh annual fund-raising bowling event – the 2016 CP3 PBA Celebrity Invitational. It will take place at Lucky Strike LA Live in downtown Los Angeles and will feature an all-star list of Professional Bowlers Assn. Tour players and celebrities.

Perhaps a couple of Kardashians might be invited. That could be a good way for Paul to curry favor with his new neighbors.







PBA League Finally Relents, Selects 2 Women Bowlers

To heck with charisma.

To heck with fun.

To heck with glamour.

To heck with entertainment.

That's been the Professional Bowlers Assn. League's posture about employing women bowlers on its teams since the circuit began operations in 2013.

But the league has finally awakened from its longtime slumber and its self-defeating policy. On Dec. 17 in Reno, Nev., the league conducted its 2016 draft to add the final two players for each of its eight teams, leaving each squad with five players for the league's fourth season.

And lo and behold, look who was selected - two women . . . finally!

The league has never had as many as two women bowlers in its previous three seasons – and typically has none.

Two rounds were held and both women – Liz Johnson of Cheektowaga, N.Y., and Danielle McEwan of Stony Point, N.Y. – were taken in the final round. The round doesn't really matter; the fact that they were taken and are part of the PBA League does.

Johnson will be bowling for the new franchise Portland Lumberjacks, managed by Tim Mack. McEwan is now a member of the Motown Muscle, managed by Del Ballard Jr.

This marks the second season there will be a woman presence in the league. In the league's inaugural season, highly decorated Kelly Kulick of Union Township, N.J., was a member of the New York City WTT KingPins, owned by tennis great Billie Jean King. But Kulick was relegated to a minor role on the KingPins as the team's supplemental pick.

Kulick didn't take a shot until the KingPins' Elias Cup victory over the Muscle when she racked up two strikes in two attempts. Both of Kulick's strikes came when the KingPins already had sealed the championship. Since then, the league has gone without a woman in Seasons 2 and 3 before opting to add Johnson and McEwan for Season 4.

Why did the league wait so long before giving some top women pros a shot?

Was the league terrified the men would be shown up by the women? That's probably unlikely, but always a possibility. The top women pros I've interviewed have shown amazing diplomacy by saying it's very competitive among the elite bowlers – meaning it was understandable that women would have a difficult time breaking into the league's rosters. And they also said they were pleased with the PBA's opening doors for the women with the new Professional Women's Bowling Assn. tour.

In truth, at least one top woman has been silently seething about not being given a chance to show she belongs in the same company as the elite men. Kulick showed how far women have come when she stunned her male colleagues by claiming the 2010 PBA Tournament of Champions. Kulick advanced to the championship match in that tournament by defeating PBA League regular Mika Koivuniemi in the semifinals and then routing Chris Barnes, 265-195, in the finals. Barnes happens to be the franchise player of the Silver Lake (Calif.) Atom Splitters, the league's two-time defending champions. Kulick's victory over Barnes was a watershed moment in women's bowling because she became the first women to win a PBA Tour event. But back to the PBA League.

It's been recommended frequently by this writer that it was time for the league to embrace women – and not just

for their skill. They have the potential to add an element to the game that is sorely lacking during ESPN's telecasts of league matches.

The competitions and telecasts, frankly, have generally been dull – even with such greats as Jason Belmonte (of the Los Angeles X), Pete Weber (of the KingPins) and Barnes taking part. The inclusion of Johnson and McEwan finally gives the league some Woman Power and the two bowlers promise to deliver a charge of electricity to a league that needs a jolt of energy. Johnson and McEwan certainly will be in the spotlight and they'll face considerable pressure. But the two are used to it. And should they happen to make an impression that impresses, who knows what the league would do next?

Is it possible the league could work up enough nerve to launch an all-women's team?

Here's betting that Johnson and McEwan might have some female company in future years if things work out – as I expect they will. Johnson and McEwan actually were just two of three women eligible to be drafted among more than 60 players who formally announced their desire to be considered. Missy Parkin of Laguna Hills was also among the eligibles. The 33-year-old Parkin was the first woman to win two PBA regional titles (Kelly Kulick also has won two.) and won the 2011 United States Bowling Congress Queens title.

Johnson and McEwan also sport strong credentials. The 41-year-old Johnson won this year's AMF U.S. Women's Open in September, successfully defending her title. It was Johnson's fourth U.S. Women's Open championship. In May, Johnson claimed the Queens title. Johnson, the only woman to advance to two PBA television finals, was the 2015 PWBA player of the year.

The 24-year-old McEwan recorded her first pro victory in September by winning the Smithfield PWBA tour championship in Arlington, Tex. Overcoming two 7-10 splits in the first six frames, McEwan turned back Stefanie Johnson, 233-205, in the finals. The fast-rising McEwan also won two gold medals (doubles, team) and one bronze at the 2015 World Bowling Women's Championships.

Johnson actually joined Portland after being acquired by the Lumberjacks in a trade with the Dallas Strikers. Ryan Ciminelli and Johnson were sent to Portland and the Strikers received Shawn Maldonado and BJ Moore III.

Johnson made it clear how she felt about the PBA League draft on her Facebook page, exclaiming "So excited to be a Portland Lumberjack!!!! Looking forward to 2016."

It's this kind of enthusiasm that the league wants. Now the league has it.


