PBA HALL OF FAMERS STEVE COOK DOUG KENT ELECTED TO USBC HALL OF FAME

NORWALK — PBA Hall of Famers Steve Cook of Granite Bay, Calif., and Doug Kent of Newark, N.Y., have been elected to the United States Bowling Congress Hall of Fame in the Superior Performance category.

The two were among six bowlers on the men's national ballot and none of the candidates received the 70 percent of the votes cast by USBC's panel of veteran bowling writers, hall of famers and board members needed for election. In such cases, USBC's procedure calls for leading votegetters to be re-considered by the USBC Hall of Fame Committee where they can be confirmed by 70 percent approval of the committee members.

Also on the Superior Performance ballot this year were PBA stars David Ozio of Beaumont, Texas; Danny Wiseman of Baltimore; Larry Laub of, Lincoln, Calif., and Randy Pedersen of Clermont, Fla.

Cook; Kent; previouslyelected John Gaines of Orlando, Fla.; Dale Traber of Cedarburg, Wis., and the late Woody Woodruff of Long Island, N.Y., will be inducted on April 24 during the USBC Convention in Reno, Nev.

Cook, 56, a 15-time PBA Tour champion, was inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame in 1993. His titles include the 1981 Tournament of Champions, 1983 Touring Players Championship and the 1986 U.S. Open. Kent, 46, owns 10 PBA titles including the 1991 and 2006 USBC Masters plus the 2002 and 2007 PBA World Championships.



England's Dom Barrett Wins PBA World Championship

British star joins Finland's Palermaa as second international player to win World Championship

LAS VEGAS - England's Dom Barrett became the second international player ever to win the PBA World Championship when he held off reigning PBA Player of the Year Sean Rash of Montgomery, Ill., 238-235, in the title match at the South Point Hotel and Casino complex.

The 55th World Championship, which aired Sunday on ESPN, was the fifth and final PBA Tour championship event held as part of PBA World Series of Bowling V.

"Right now I couldn't be happier," Barrett said after joining Finland's Osku Palermaa, the 2011 World Champion, as the second international player to win the event. "It's a very special feeling, one you don't often get in bowling, so I'm going to make the most of

Barrett, the leading qualifier over 52 games of qualifying and match play, locked up his third PBA Tour title with three strikes in the 10th frame, although he prematurely began to celebrate after his second strike, thinking that shot had clinched the victory.

"I tried to stay calm all week, not get ahead of myself, trying to keep my heart rate the same and my emotions in check," the 28-year-old British star said of his emotional outburst. "I know some Americans come across as a bit brash, but I consciously try not to do that. I try to stay very much in the moment, but I guess that was two weeks' worth of joy and

excitement coming out.

"I couldn't see the scoreboard from where I sat. I thought I had enough, but my corner man said I needed some more, so I got myself composed again. I knew I had count in my favor, so it was a matter of hitting the pocket one more time."

Needing eight pins on his final ball to shut out Rash, Barrett threw another strike.

Barrett, who lost to Ryan Ciminelli of Cheektowaga, N.Y., in the title match of the Chameleon Championship earlier in the World Series, and failed to advance to the television finals in the 2012 World Championship after leading the tournament going into the final round of match play, said he put those disappointments to good use.

"I was pretty disappointed in the Chameleon, but I really didn't have a chance because (Ciminelli) bowled so well," Barrett said. "You always

than your successes, but it's still important to have success. If you go around losing all the time, you're not going to want to do this much longer.

'Last year's World Championship really hurt, too. The pain makes you go home, knuckle down a little more, try a little bit harder, and bowl for days like today.'

Rash, who needed the title to bolster his chances for a second straight PBA Player of the Year award, is one of those emotional players Barrett was referring to, so he didn't fault Barrett for his emotional dis-

"Dom made some great shots toward the end," Rash said. "He apologized (for his outburst) because he thought he had shut me out and he got a little excited.

"He bowled good, I bowled good," said Rash, who finished the match with six strikes, but couldn't overcome a missed 6-10 spare conversion in the continued on page 6

CAROL MOERS INDUCTED IN NDWBA HALL OF FAME AT LAS VEGAS

LAS VEGAS — Last October during one of the events of Deaf Senior Bowlers of America an important action was made at the Orleans Hotel and Casino Bowling Center toward a deserving woman. In full audience of the bowlers and fans, Carol Moers of Denver, CO co-founder of DSBA was honored of being inducted in National Deaf Women's Bowling Association Hall of Fame. The President of NDWBA Judie Cronlund, AZ formally presented Carol her NDWBA Hall of Fame plaque.

Carol Moers co founded DSBA with Vernon Jones, NV in 1997 with Jones serving two terms as president and Carol serving as secretary treasurer for 16 years. She retired last year but still come to bowl in DSBA.

That is not all. Carol had served on NDWBA Board of Directors and bowled in NDWBA tournaments. The best she had done was 2nd place in its 1981 Deaf Queens and was on the 2004 team and doubles champions.

In addition, Carol was inducted in 1988 Pacific Coast Deaf Women's Bowling Association Hall of Fame as both leader and bowler. She served 6 years in each President and Vice-President offices and was selected on six PCDWBA All Stars Teams including three PCDWBA Bowler of Year.

Also her PCDWBA record showed after being 2nd in 1975 Deaf Queens, she placed 1st in 1990 and 1993 Deaf Queens. In later years Carol placed 2nd in 1999 Senior Queens, then 1st in 2000 Senior Queens and 2nd again in three (2001, 2007, 2009) Senior Queens, setting a record 19 games in 2007 event.


Back in 1990 in White Plains, NY, as a 2nd level bowling coach, Carol gave the first ever deaf bowling coach training to 8 deaf want be coaches. All 8 passed and got first level coach cards.

Also as a bowling coach for Deaf Team USA, Carol took the Teams to Australia for the 2005 Deaflympics and returned with a couple medals.

For all the above, Carol Moers deserves to be in the NDWBA Hall of Fame.

The winning duo took a four-pin lead into the tourney's final position round match over Austin's David Anthony and his partner, Chris Hibbitts II of Fort Worth, Texas. With only the position round matches to go and 50 bonus pins available to winning teams, five teams were within 92 pins of the title.

Archer started the final game strong with four strikes while Hibbitts and Anthony were unable to create strings of strikes. After Archer split late in the game, Eagle continued to strike to secure a 433-395 win in the final match and lock up the title and the \$4,000 winners' check.

IDLE BOWLING THOUGHTS

One of the greatest entertainment shows of all time, hailed around the world, featured the three tenors, opera legends Jose Carreras, Placido Domingo and Luciano Pavarotti. In a TV interview Domingo explained that you need a certain kind of breathing to reach the high notes, and when Pavarotti was singing Domingo and Carreras would sort of breathe with him to help him along. It was like when you are bowling, and you are behind the bowler, and you move from side to side to help the bowler steer the ball.

... What happens when one bowler sticks on a lane and complains, and another bowler says he slides too much on the same lane and complains? A UN like debate ensues and the centers, league and bowling officials wished they had stayed home that night.

... Your bowling troubles aren't as bad as they seem. They couldn't be.

... Like it or not, we learn by looking, copying and repeating, and we naturally imitate winners, not losers. Almost every successful person you meet uses something from role models with track records of success of some kind. That's true of bowling too. Top pros, male and female, and top amateurs must realize that they are heroes to others, young and old, whether the stars like it or not.

... Needling and baiting can be fun, interesting and evven productive at times. That's fine, as long as you can take it as well as you give it.

... In the rush for entries some senior tournaments are lowering the minimum age to 45 or lower from the usual 50. There are super senior divisions for bowlers 60 and over and super senior divisions for 70 and up. Is bowling going to get like boxing? Boxing once had eight divisions period. Now there are junior and super groupings added to the original, making 24. And there are at least three sanctioning groups and that's why there are so many boxing champions, 72 and counting, as other newly created weight divisions and boxing associations pop up. In bowling, in most cases, youngsters and oldsters, what counts is average, not age.

.. Whenever a so-called unknown wins a bowling event just remember that many a nobody who isn't known by anybody becomes a somebody and is known by everybody, and everybody tells him they knew him when he was a nobody and they knew he would be a somebody someday. Huh?

... Pure fiction is the story of a head to head bowling match—as told by the participants two weeks later.

.. In the more than 50 years pro bowling has been on TV, the event that caused the most comment and excitement and got the most exposure was not a specific thriling match or a big money purse—it was Mark Roth's conversion of the 7-10 split.

. All bowlers have their bad outings. It has been said that those bad times will be matched by an equal number of good times. Most bowlers I know have a lot of good days coming. In the meantime have a good bowling day-or at least a good day—every day.

third frame over an otherwise error-free game. "It could have gone either way. I guess the good news is, I finished second instead of third like I have in four out of the last five World Championships, so maybe next year I can win this thing.

Another finalist who saw his PBA Player of the Year hopes fade was PBA Hall of Famer Pete Weber of St. Ann, Mo. At age 51, Weber fought his way into the final field as the No. 5 qualifier and struck on eight of his first nine shots to eliminate 2009 World Champion Tom Smallwood of Saginaw, Mich., 258-237, in the first match. Weber, trying for a record 11th PBA major championship, did exactly the same thing in edging Mike Fagan of Fort Worth, Texas, 258-246, in the second match.

Despite starting the semifinal match with six strikes, Weber's hopes ended when Rash struck on 11 of 12 shots on his way to a 279-249 victory.

Coverage of the PBA World Series of Bowling resumes on ESPN on Sunday, Jan. 5, at 1 p.m. ET with the World Bowling Tour Men's and Women's Finals presented by the PBA. Each final features the three point leaders from a two-year rolling points list based on tournaments held around the world. In the women's final, points leader Kelly Kulick of Union, N.J., will bowl for the title against the winner of a preliminary match between fellow Americans Liz Johnson of Cheektowaga, N.Y., and Missy Parkin of Laguna Hills, Calif. In the men's final, Rash is the top qualifier and will bowl the winner of a preliminary match between 2011 WBT Men's champion Mika Koivuniemi of Finland and Fagan.

A recap of the PBA World Championship and a preview of the WBT events, along with other features, will be available Monday on "The Bowling Center" on YouTube.com. Xtra Frame subscribers who may have missed Sunday's telecasts will be able to watch the finals "on demand" in the Xtra Frame archives three days after the original show airs.
