Rash Wins Petraglia Division Joins Palermaa, Shafer in PBA World Championships Finals on Jan. 15

LAS VEGAS - Sean Rash of Montgomery, Ill., the runaway qualifying leader in the Professional Bowlers Association World Championship preliminary rounds, advanced to the Jan. 15 final round with a victory in the Johnny Petraglia Division finals that aired Sunday on ESPN.

Rash, who won his only major title in the 2007 United States Bowling Congress Masters, defeated PBA Hall of Famer Pete Weber of St. Ann, Mo., 246-222, to capture the third of four berths in the World Championship finals at South Point Hotel Exhibition Hall.

The divisional finals consist of three one-game rounds, starting with four players. The lowest-scoring player after each game is eliminated.

Rash will join Finland's Osku Palermaa, winner of the Don Carter Division; Ryan Shafer of Horseheads, N.Y., winner of the Billy Hardwick Division, and the winner of next Sunday's Mike Aulby Division finals in the World Championship finals on ESPN

Rash, a four-time PBA Tour winner who is trying to Left-hander Ryan Ciminelli of Cheektowaga, N.Y., was second with a 267 and Rash posted a 257. Nathan Bohr of able 236 in his PBA television

debut, but was eliminated.

Rash took command in game two, starting with nine strikes before leaving the 6-10 on his first shot in the 10th frame and finishing with a 278 game. Weber was right behind, starting with eight strikes on his way to a 268. Ciminelli was ousted after rolling a 219 game.

In the final game, Weber lost the strike pocket for four frames, allowing Rash to jump into a 34-pin lead after five frames, and he never let the 35-time PBA Tour titlist back into the match.

"I think we broke down the lanes extremely well," Rash said. "Ciminelli was all by himself on the left side. Nathan played a little right of where Pete and I were playing. We were in the track area and



just chased the transition to the left. Pete's got a phenomenal ball roll. He can do things the rest of us can't. But I got into a little groove and my confidence got higher and higher."

Rash said beating Weber was a "special thing" because of a bond the two have develcontinued on page 12

In the bracket, the top-4 bowlers took first-round byes while the other 8 battled in best-of-three matches. Justin Sims took Robert Page 2-1, Oscar Chan knocked out Chris Hefner 2-1, Joshua Taylor swept Joseph Grondin 2-0 and Kevin Jones needed three to eliminate Vincent Bravo. In the quarterfinals, top-seed Steven Manier fell to Kevin Jones 2-1, 2nd seed Jerome Jordan Jr. got past Justin Sims 2-0, 5th seed Joshua Taylor d. 4th seed Wesley Low Jr. 2-1 and Adam

Dubia got to the semifinals 2-1 over Oscar Chan. In the semis, Jerome Jordan Jr. swept out Adam Dubia and Kevin Jones needed three to advance to the finals over Joshua Taylor.

In the finals, Jerome Jordan Jr. came out striking and took Game 1 - 226-192. 



LAKEWOOD — We returned to Cal Bowl where we saw 237 entries come out for the final event of 2011. We had a semi tough shot for the tournament making the consistent cut scores of +59 for the men and +40 for the women on Friday night, and +56 for the men and +24for the Women on Saturday. The Super Seniors added to the board (3 men and 1 female) were Sierrie Herradura (-6), Roger Romero (+56), Tim Austin (+53), and Sun Sundara (+42). Super Seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 56 bowlers making it to the semi-finals this week with a chance to cash checks from \$55 to \$2,900.

Top qualifier for the men was Nghiem Tran with a +173, and for the women it was Deborah Sanders with a +102. They will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Each week our top seed overall draws the Match Series, and this time it was worth \$1,096. Nghiem drew a 639. We had no bowlers that bowled this score during the qualifying squads. We will estimate the Match Series at \$1,500 at Foothill Lanes event. The last bowler for the 3-6-9 roll-off this week was John Licauco. He needed to get five 9 counts or strikes to take home the \$1,300. John was not able to pull off this feat so he took home a consolation of \$50.We will add \$100 to the pot, and it will be at \$1,400 next week at Foothill Lanes.

In our optional doubles, finishing in first were Nghiem Tran and Tomas Chavez with a 1544 for \$130. Finishing second was Nghiem Tran and Rey Josafat Jr. with 1527 for \$110. There were a total of \$1,270 paid out in doubles and 21 paid spots with low to cash of 1341.

That would bring us to our semi-finals/finals as we had to be off the lanes early for New Year's Eve parties. A total of 59 bowlers went out to bowl the semis with one no-show in Ed Abarca. As an added special this week, you could still bet on "Horses" where you picked the bowler who you thought would finish in first place. There would be a total of \$405 in bets made this week. During our semifinals, in the first game we had one bowler who jumped out to the early lead throwing the first 9 strikes, coming up short on the tenth shot, but still finished with a 279 scratch and a +112. that was Reno Pignotti. The 2nd place belonged to Donovan Chung with a +74. In third was Jeff Taino at +65. Still close behind in 4th was Thomas Licauco at +57. Rounding out the top 5 for the first game was Korng Ngow at +44.

During the second game there would be a change for the top five. The 5th spot went to Korng Ngow at +88. 4th place was Roger Romero at +101, 3rd place now belonged to Reno Pignotti at +110. 2nd place was Donovan Chung at +121. Jeff Taino jumped to the lead with a nice 257 and +155.

After the 3rd and final game, finishing in 5th place for \$115 was Donovan Chung with a +117, 4th place for \$115 was John Licauco at +118. 3rd place for \$205 was Reno Pignotti with a + 131, 2nd place for \$500 was Korng Ngow with a +144. Finishing in 1st place this week was Jeff Taino with a +183 for his 5th ABTA Championship. Jeff would take home \$1,500 for 1st place and \$1,700 for max. Cash and Carry, \$100 for using a Global 900 ball for a total of \$2,800. It was Beat the Board finals but we still had our "horses". One very lucky young man, Josh Koch who works the desk at Cal Bowl, took home \$405 on a \$5 hunch. (On Jeff of course:)

After bowling the semis/ finals, our champion Jeff Taino had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$3,500. He drew a 179. After a review of all the scores bowled, we had four bowlers who shot that score. WOW! Jeff Taino (himself was lucky), Annaliza Agoncillo, Miriam Galluzzo, and Leo Silva. They got \$875 each. We will have \$3,500 at Foothill Lanes, and start a new back-up pot.

oped ever since Rash arrived on the scene.

"Pete and I have been friends since I came out on tour," he said. "A lot of people figure I'm the new bad-(boy), the role Pete played for 25-or-so years. He has given me a lot of great advice, to be who I am, not worry about what people think and not try to change. When I'm on the lanes I'm by myself. The only people I care about are my wife and family. But to beat Pete is a special thing."

Rash also will head into the PBA World Championship finals with a dark cloud hanging over his head. He has not won a title in his last eight television appearances.

"I've had some mental issues over the years. Everyone knows that," he said. "I've had some things come up bowling-wise, family-wise that get in the way of the sport sometimes. And some personal things. Physically, I bowled well for several years, but I remember Chris Barnes made 12 shows in a row and never won. Look at Amleto (Monacelli) and Walter (Ray Williams Jr.) and they had years between titles. Chris Barnes told me a long time ago – and Parker Bohn the same thing – that you have to put yourself in position to win. No one remembers who bowled Friday night in the Round of 32. You remember the guys who got to TV on Sunday and had a chance to win. And now I'm in position to win again."

Rash also noted he was inspired during the Petraglia round by the presence of new-found friend Dan McCarty, an 8-yearold who was born with a medical condition commonly called "brittle bone disease." Rash met the youngster during a "Best Buddies" gathering in Las Vegas prior to the PBA World Series of Bowling, struck up a friendship and invited McCarty to attend the television show.

"It was a thrill to have Danny at the show," Rash said. "When you realize what that kid's been through, what he lives with his entire life, he's such an inspiration."

The Petraglia finals were conducted on the PBA's Scorpion lane condition, selected by Rash as the high qualifier.

The Mike Aulby Division finalists will be the final group to bowl, on Sunday, Jan. 8, at 1 p.m. ET on ESPN. Australia's Jason Belmonte is top qualifier for that group which also includes Brian Kretzer of Dayton, Ohio; PBA Tour rookie Josh Blanchard of Gilbert, Ariz., and Mike Fagan of Dallas.

Special pre-game shows for each World Series of Bowling telecast will be webcast beginning on the Wednesday preceding the ESPN finals on pba.com's Xtra Frame and a post-game Xtra Frame interview with the winners will immediately follow the Sunday telecasts.
