YORBA LINDA—The SST New Yorba Linda Bowl/Luster Cote Open saw Super Senior Division champion John Cocchi continue his bowling "hot streak" into the New Year. The Las Vegas resident won his 5th title and has made the finals in his last 12 of 13 tournaments. On Saturday, Jim Lee of Santee was high qualifier with 2263 and Cocchi trailing by only 16 pins in 4th. Both Cocchi and Lee posted a 6-2 match play record, but Cocchi's 32 pin scratch difference proved to be the winning total. Cocchi received \$700 for his efforts.

Guest bowler Fred Cole was crowned as a new Jr. Division Champion. The Visalia resident was Saturday's high qualifier with 2434 and local resident Ricky Corona trailed by 134 pins. On Sunday, Cole never relinquished his lead amassing a 5-1 match play record and a 199 pin win over Norm Black of Whittier. The new Jr. Champion took home \$600.

The traditional King of the Hill match saw John Cocchi defeat Fred Cole 247-236. The winner of each division squares off in a one game match for bragging rights and an additional \$50 prize.

Ron Gales of Las Vegas won the Storm/Dexter pre-paid entry prize.

GREENDALE, Wis. - Welcome to the dawn of the United States Bowling Congress - Bowl with US!

The changeover began with the lowering of the American Bowling Congress and Women's International Bowling Congress flags and the raising of the United States Bowling Congress flag in front of Bowling Headquarters in suburban Milwaukee. Members of the Bowling Headquarters staff, who become USBC employees, watched former ABC Executive Director and USBC Chief Executive Officer Roger Dalkin and outgoing WIBC Executive Director and incoming USBC Chief Tournament Officer Roseann Kuhn handle the ceremony.

"This is an exciting time in bowling history, but it also is with some sadness that we say goodbye to these grand organizations that have meant a great deal to all of us," Dalkin said.

USBC was created when the American Bowling Congress, Women's International Bowling Congress, Young American Bowling Alliance and USA Bowling agreed in May to merge into a single membership organization for the sport of bowling. The organization will serve

more than three million adult and youth bowlers nationwide.

One of USBC's major goals is to become the central brand for bowling in the United States. It plans to do this by positioning the organization to grow the sport, encourage more people to participate and increase the power of the brand. USBC also seeks to establish and maintain National Governing Body status with the United States Olympic Committee and hopes to receive USOC approval of its NGB application early in 2005.

USBC will stand for values that include: credibility, dedication, excellence, heritage, inclusiveness, integrity, philanthropy and sportsmanship.

USBC's brand promise is: Ensuring the integrity and protecting the future of America's biggest sport for competitive and recreational bowlers.

USBC's mission statement is:

The United States Bowling Congress, the national governing body, provides programs and services,

protects the integrity of the sport and enhances the bowling experience


Hank Brandt Passes


Harris Hits The Headlines

LAS VEGAS, NV. I waited impatiently in front of the TV. The start of the PBA's 2004/05 first telecast was only minutes away. (I'd watch football only during the bowling telecast commercials.) Bingo! 10 am ... here we go! Upbeat, wild opening... I kept waiting for Bugs Bunny or SpongePants Square Bob to show up. Pedersen and Ryan begin talking. So did damn near everyone else in the stadium. What the hell is this an infomercial? When's the bowling start?

Going back to the days when I actually qualified for the PBA telecast, only four players participated in FOUR matches in the hour-and-a-half telecast. When the PBA went to five finalists, they, too, managed to roll four matches to determine a champion during the same length telecast.

Aha! But in this magical opening Sunday live telecast ... THREE matches would be shown during the same length, 90-minute telecast on ESPN. It was pretty much like watching CNN. All yammering... little action. Boredom!

Yet, in spite of the shortage of actual bowling, the bobble-head braintrust still managed to have BOTH bowlers on the approach at the same time for the 10th frame, 3rd-game finish. Now, I can attest, first hand, to the fact that THREE-games can be rolled on TV in 60-minutes. (My late partner Dick Holst and I produced 344 one-hour telecasts in which we accomplished the feat, without both men rolling the last frame at the same time ... with pretty much the same advertising quotas and about 30% fewer time-saving strikes, in those days.)

PBA prexy Steve Miller, I'm sure, realized the show was a boring disaster. I don't know Miller personally, but he's obviously pretty shrewd. As I've heard his speeches as Bowl Expo, I get the feeling he doesn't give much of a Tinker's damn about bowling or even the PBA players... everything to him is wrapped-up in the PBA telecast. Yet, the show has been pitiful, so far, excluding the bowlers.

This initial show was a talkfest that sent many folks back to football games or QVC sales pitches. It was a funeral. Not much changed in the second show, which likely turned off more TV sets than a massive power outage.

Finally the PBA geniuses came up with this goofy trick-shot contest that is as exciting as watching paint fade. Why? They wanted to fill the air time with more bowling... less talk. Go back to the talk. The "tricky stuff" has made the current PBA show more like a Three Stooges reunion. The worst PBA presentation, ever, in their long history of championship bowling. Tough to do with such a great cast of players!

This year the PBA introduced "all match-game" competition, a fiasco which saw some of the pro's only bowling four or five games before being eliminated for the week in their first match. Of course, THEN they would have to hang around for the rest of the week to bowl the Pro Am on Saturday. Who's the genius producing this idea? It will wisely be corrected for the first tourney in January, with the opening round going back to total pinfall to determine the bowlers advancing.

But the show needs FAR more fixing. I, like everyone else, tune in to watch the best bowlers in the world do battle. Four in the TV finals is fine... one-game matches determine the TWO guys competing in the championship. MAKE THE CHAMPIONSHIP MATCH A TWO-GAME, TOTAL PIN-FALL BATTLE!!! Increase the excitement as the top two guys scramble for the big check ... grind it out over two-games for the title. Which would, time-wise, be equivalent of four matches. Dump the corny trick shots...real bowling with added drama!

See how simple the answers can be when you know something about the game and the people in it and the folks who watch it?

Puleston is 1st ABTA Champ of 2005 Title at Keystone

Long bowls perfect game and Bayro hits a \$3,040 Match game at Keystone Handicap frozen in this weeks event at Premiere Lanes

The cut scores on a very fair condition were +62 (men), and +29 for the ladies. We returned 49 bowlers to the Semifinals. Also added to the Semis were the Super Seniors Roger Romero, Arnie Schroeder, and Mable Williams who looks anything but a Super Senior :-) Leading the Semis was William Baskin of Long Beach with his fine +169 to be top seed and sit out and bowl for the title. He was followed by portsider Puleston of Torrance who would receive a first round bye in the single elims and enter in round two. It took a +44 men and +17 for the women to make the finals and the top 16 took to the floor.




