Baltimore's Rich Jerome Jr. Rolls 900 Series

ARLINGTON, TX—Baltimore's Rich Jerome Jr. became the 12th bowler to roll an approved 900 series Dec. 22. The 29-year-old right-hander had three consecutive 300 games in the Monday Night Mixed League at Brunswick Perry Hall Lanes in Baltimore.

He was the first bowler in two years with 36 consecutive strikes in the same series. The last 900 was rolled Dec. 23, 2006 by P.J. Geisfeldt in Milwaukee.

"I started realizing I might have a shot at it in the seventh frame of the last game," said Jerome, now in his 11th year on the lanes.

"It seemed from then on that people started standing around my lanes but I tried to watch the pins. I also tried to watching the football game on TV to take my mind off it.

"After I finished, I looked around and it seemed like everyone there was on the settee area with me. It was very exciting."

Hoffman Joins World Bowling Writers Hall of Fame

ARLINGTON, TX—Former Team USA member Bill Hoffman of Columbus, Ohio, has become just the second American male elected to the World Bowling Writers Hall of Fame.

Hoffman joins Les Zikes of Chicago, who was inducted in 1999, among an elite group of international players selected for the honor. To be eligible for inclusion in the World Bowling Writers Hall of Fame, players must have earned a minimum of 20 points based on medals won in international competition.

Hoffman was on the ballot the past two years and believes helping Team USA to the gold medal in team event at the World Men's Championships in Bangkok, Thailand, last year helped his case.

"I'm truly honored to have been elected to the hall of fame," said Hoffman, who

Jerome had 10 previous 300 games and five earlier 800 series.

Two of his perfect games came as part of his previous career-high 857 series Nov. 3 in the Drug Trade League, also at Perry Hall. The Drug Trade is USBC's oldest certified league dating back to the 1896-97 season.

was selected by earning two-thirds of the votes of the World Bowling Writers selection panel. "What I am most proud of is that in each of the four World Championships I have participated, we have won two silver and two gold medals in the five-man team event. A lot of the credit for that goes to my coaches and teammates over this 10-year journey."

A nine-time Team USA member from 1999-2008, Hoffman has won dozens of medals in international competition. In 2007, he became the first American male to win the prestigious QubicaAMF World Cup in more than a decade. He also was the U.S. Amateur champion in 1999 and 2003. Hoffman now serves as the International Development team leader for the United States Bowling Congress, helping to grow the sport of bowling around the world.

This writer recalled one time, he wrote a story John Segafredo reported to him that John Weydahl’s team and Segafredo’s team were going head to head with Segafredo tossing a 279 game but in the next game Weydahl came up with a matching 279 and won the series. That was the first time Golden West Deaf League had two bowlers tied with the season high game. We all missed this admirable and well-liked guy.




