Not too long ago, a bowler in a Los Angelesarea league got frustrated over a shot that he felt deserved a better result.

"Frustrated" may be putting it mildly.

After leaving the dreaded 7-10 split, this player picked up two bowling balls - one in each hand and slung them one after another at the two pins as his fellow bowlers looked on in astonishment.

His first shot landed safely in the gutter and his second shot crashed into the sweep bar – fortunately bouncing off and causing no damage.

This show of disrespect for the game happens more often than people realize as anger takes hold - especially during the course of league play when end-ofthe-season payouts serve as incentive to bowl consistently above one's average.

Bowlers Journal Names Jason Belmonte Player of Decade

Colie Edison Named 2019 Person of Year

ternational magazine has selected Australia's Jason Belmonte as its Male Bowler of the Decade for the 2010s and new PBA CEO Colie Edison as its 2019 Person of the Year.

In what was arguably the most dominant decade by a bowler in PBA history, Belmonte set a number of records, including winning 11 major championships including four USBC Masters titles (three of those in a row). He won 21 of his 22 career titles in the 2010s, earned PBA Player of the Year honors five times and joined the PBA "Millionaire's Club" in a record-shattering 131 tour-

But maybe Belmonte's most impressive feat was establishing the two-handed delivery as a dominant

technique that has been mimicked by thousands of young bowlers in the wake of his success.

Edison rose to prominence in the bowling world when Bowlero Corp purchased the PBA in September, and the Bowlero Chief Customer Officer was named PBA CEO. Within two months of becoming the first woman to hold the

PBA's top executive position, Edison won the favor of PBA players and fans by announcing the 2020 Go Bowling PBA Tour would receive a nearly \$500,000 boost in prize money, including \$100,000 first prize checks for winners of the 2020 PBA Tournament of Champions, PBA World Championship and PBA Playoffs.

Costa Rica's "Torneo La Raza"




again except for one big event, an event that was the highlight of their 2019. An event that will probably be the highlight of their 2020. That event is the "Torneo La Raza".

A Christmas Mazey Miracle

Over the past 35 years I've always looked forward to the Christmas holiday, not only to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ, but also to reflect upon the joy and blessings that this unique holiday brings to just about everyone in the USA. It's also a time to carry on with my custom of creating a unique one of a kind Christmas cards, in the tradition that began with an AMF marketing genius named John Mazey.

Every year Mr. Mazey would come up with a distinctive holiday card, sometimes quirky or peculiar, but always completely different from previous years and in a class by itself. I have carried on this unwritten passage of Mr. Mazey's for the past 35 years, often resorting to just a color variation or typeface change. In other years I succumbed to time and monetary constraints and sent out extras (of which I have many!) from previous years.

When I arrived on the scene at AMF Headquarters in 1982, John was one of the first executives that took a shine to me and my knowledge of bowling, which was lacking among the brain trust inside the ivy-covered hallowed halls along the Jericho Turnpike in Westbury, New York. Not long after I secured an efficiency apartment inside a home in North Massapequa, John put me to work on nights and weekends, whenever I was not traveling as part of the AMF Bowling Centers management team.

Our adventures took us to an old converted factory in Queens, or to a film designer's basement in Bethpage, or even to the residence of a famous New York City advertising agency executive in the heart of Manhattan. I learned from these sessions that just about any effect could be realized by utilizing a solid colored background or green screen.

One of my favorite examples of this took place at an old pencil factory in Brooklyn that had been abandoned since the 1960's. John and I arranged to meet with the filming crew on the fifth floor of the factory, and came only with a red 10 pound AMF Strikeline Bowling Ball that had been drilled for me with a conventional grip.

Like most of my "Mazey adventures," I had virtually no idea what the topic of the commercial was to be until we arrived on the set. In this particular instance, I was to replicate the approach of a bowler releasing a ball towards the pins. But aside from a wooden floor, my bowling shoes and the red bowling ball, there was no other resemblance to a bowling center! Now it is well documented that I have had my share of run-ins with film producers, and this day was no different. My attire consisted of a red Angle Winning-Wear Shirt with blue trousers to match the contrasting blue inner collar of the shirt. The producer decided that this was not the desired look, so he began asking for gray trousers to complete my ensemble. One of the stagehands came forward with his own trousers, a 32-inch waist, by 30-inch length.


For as long as I can remember, dating back to about age 13, my waist had always been 34, with a 32-inch length. But to appease the director, I somehow managed to fasten the waist band and we were ready for the filming to begin. That's when things really got interesting! Rather than using a standard filming procedure, the producer wanted to provide a stroboscopic effect that would create a series of short samples for a magazine layout.

"Here's all that you have to do," the film director said, as I held in my tummy and took small sips of air. "Each time that you see the light flash and hear a click, move slightly forward with your approach." Now it became apparent why Mr. Mazey had the foresight to have me drill a 10-pound bowling ball!

Thankfully the producer didn't ask me to swing the ball higher in my approach, and instead was more interested in the circular motion created by the ball in the first couple of steps. Until this day, I never understood what walking past the ball in your approach meant, but in slow motion if made perfect sense. The series was never used until AMF moved to Richmond, Virginia, and a new advertising agency dug it out of the mothballs and utilized the unique strobe light approach to introduce HPL 9000 Lanes by AMF. If you look closely at my face after releasing the ball, you will see that I'm actually grimacing in pain! But looking back on it almost thirty-five years later, it's one of my fondest memories of the association that I developed with one of the brightest minds in advertising at AMF.

Here's to you, John! Another year, and another Christmas card, in the Mazey Miracle Tradition!

(John Mazey died in 1997, at the age of 73. He is survived by his wife Diane, age 97, of Syosset, New York)

TOMMY JONES WINS BOWLERO ELITE SERIES FOR \$100,000 PAYDAY

Nineteen-time PBA Tour champion Tommy Jones of Simpsonville, S.C., who will be inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame in Arlington, Texas, on Jan. 18, defeated Bowlero league bowler Garrett Shovan of Denver, Colo., 266-200, to win the \$100,000 first prize in the final Bowlero Elite Series tournament of 2019 at Bowlero Jupiter in Florida to conclude the season.

Jones, 41, defeated 2019 PBA Player of the Year Jason Belmonte, 279-216, to win the professional side of the pro-am bracket and advance to the championship match where he equaled the largest payday of his career, matching the \$100,000 he collected for winning the 2006 U.S. Open.

Shovan, a pro shop operator and former Saginaw Valley State collegiate bowler, won the right to bowl against Jones by winning the league bowler side of the 16-player invitational field. He defeated Chicago's Luis Gonzalez, 236-202, in the amateur bracket final match. Shovan won \$25,000 as runner-up.

The third event in the Bowlero Elite Series aired Sunday on NBC. Other PBA stars who were invited to participate in the special event were Marshall Kent of Yakima, Wash.; Anthony Simonsen of Little Elm, Texas; Kyle Troup of Taylorsville, N.C.; and Kyle Sherman of O'Fallon, Mo. - Front page picture was CAL BOWL's GM Jon Shoutla presenting Paul Varela with an entry into the AC Delco Classic. CAL BOWL was a favorite spot for the Seniors on tour.
- Always a surprise to see the headline "It's time for a Kwikie!" The 1993 Doubles versionw as held at BUENA LANES in Ventura.
- There were 18 ads for Christmas Club leagues (started in January, and paid off the
 first week of December, just in time for Christmas shopping!) was in the first issue of
 the year. It was a great way to save up the bucks for 11 months and be handed cash
 in December.
- Results of the FRESNO Championships took up two whole pages in very small type.
 There were 133 places in men's singles, 114 in women's singles plus team events, doubles and all events. All compiled without computers.
- The San Gabriel W.B.A. ad for the 42nd Championship Tournament listed the 13 centers that had entry forms. As of 2019 there were only five of those centers left. At one time they had 23!
- Dan Mueller was the "head master" at BUENA LANES. He ran a tight ship, but, you
 always felt welcome when he greeted you. His center was clean, employees helpful
 and he always had something new cooking. Thanks Dan for your years!
- I'm not listing all the 300s! There wouldn't be room for anything else. You know you did
- 1993 Player of the Year: Walter Ray Williams, Jr.
- Senior Player of the Year: Gary Dickinson.
- A total of 696 members voted.
- Mark Baker won his 12th PCB title at MENIFEE BOWL. Other cashers? Remember
 Mike DeVaney, Larry Stephens, Lee Taylor, Doug Kempt, Gip Lentine, Dan Chovan, Eric Forkel. The best on the lanes. Lots of stories to remember.
- Remember when CANOGA PARK BOWL was renamed WINNETKA BOWL? Ask Mike what a job that was!
- New slogan: "A ball for every condition." Strange thing. The more 300 games and easier conditions, the fewer sanctioned bowlers. Go figure!
- President Clinton was given a ball, bag, shoes and an ABC Lifetime membership by the ABC in Milwaukee.
- Norm Duke was crowned King at CAL BOWL. His AC Delco win produced a nice pay day. First place: \$44,000 for defeating Robert Smith. \$10,000 from Columbia 300, and \$5,000 for wearing a Columbia 300 shirt. Both Duke and Smith were using the new Piranha ball by Columbia 300.
- Wheelchair bowler Al Uttecht won the "chair" competition at **CAL BOWL** Pro Tour.

- Must mention big night for Kurt Osterheldt at CORBIN BOWL. Heart attack time! How about 299, 245, 299 for an 843!
- The Macho Mule ball carrier had spaces for 12 TWELVE 12 balls!
- Junior leagues at KEYSTONE LANES received tickets to Disneyland in lieu of trophies.
- Bob Knipple "checked" his check for winning the WCST at KEYSTONE LANES. He
 had plans to join the PBA Senior Tour. He won the 1973 PBA Kansas City Open, a
 \$17,000 check.
- High Roller win-a-spots were the hot item to shoe up for. Seven centers had one in Feb. '94. Ask anyone who ever bowled a High Roller about it. Ain't easy!
- Dennis Bowan won the GRANT CLASSIC and cashed in for \$10,000. Corey Groth won the Scratch Division for \$1,600. There were 1,709 entries.
- Harry's report took up four pages!

- Due to the earthquake, Rusty was forced to move his Pro Shop from MATADOR BOWL to MISSION HILLS BOWL.
- The first two months of 1994 was all about shake, rattle and bowl.

Showing grace and good humor during his semifinal match of the Professional Bowlers Assn. Tournament of Champions exactly nine years ago, Daugherty had the crowd eating out of his hand at the end.

JANUARY 9, 2020

Splits on frames one, three, five, six, eight, nine and 10 would have had lesser people kicking the ball return. Instead, the right-handed Daugherty kept chucking his ball down the lanes the best he could, hoping his string of misery would end – at some point. It never did.

But the unshakeable Daugherty celebrated when he knocked down two pins of his 4-6-7-10 split on his last shot to allow him to reach an even 100. And the fans celebrated with him, as he traded high-fives with much of the gathering with a big smile on his face.

And speaking of money, the Tournament of Champions winner that year earned a \$250,000 bonanza, so Daugherty missed out on a spectacular payoff.

Mika Koivuniemi defeated Daugherty, 299-100, in that semifinal match. Koivuniemi went on to win the Tournament of Champions title. (Daugherty still won \$50,000 for finishing third.) It's worth watching the video of the Koivuniemi-Daugherty match online to see how someone can handle big-time adversity — without testily dribbling his bowling ball off the floor.

After watching the match, one can conclude that Koivuniemi was not the only winner in that tournament.

Postscript: In 2019, Daugherty finished second in Gene Carter's Pro Shop Open, losing to Dom Barrett, 217-209, in the title match. In 2016, he won the PBA Wolf Open for his second career PBA Tour title by defeating rookie Francois Lavoie, 212-192, in the championship match.




