Daugherty Finds Redemption in Winning PBA Scorpion Championship

“Thumbless” delivery proves the difference as Floridian wins first PBA Tour title



Tom Daugherty Bowlers Journal Scorpion Championship



The GEICO World Series of Bowling concludes on ESPN next Sunday at 1 p.m. ET with the finals of the PBA World Championship, the first major championship of the 2012-13 PBA Tour season. Finalists will include PBA Hall of Famer and 31-time PBA Tour titlist Parker Bohn III of Jackson, N.J.; Canada's Dan MacLelland; Rhino Page of Dade City, Fla.; reigning PBA Player of the Year Sean Rash of Montgomery, Ill., and top qualifier Jason Belmonte of Australia, a five-time PBA Tour champion who is trying for his first major title.

LAS VEGAS – After bowling a Professional Bowlers Association record-low 100 game in his only previous television appearance, Tom Daugherty of Wesley Chapel, Fla., redeemed himself in the Bowlers Journal Scorpion Championship, winning three consecutive matches including a 200-182 victory over top qualifier Osku Palermaa of Finland, to capture his first PBA Tour title at South Point Hotel and Casino.

The Bowlers Journal Scorpion Championship finals, the fourth of five GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling IV events, aired Sunday on ESPN.

Daugherty, who bowled his record-low game in a 299-100 loss to eventual champion Mika Koivuniemi in the semi-final round of the 2011 PBA Tournament of Champions, used his “thumbless” delivery to mow down an impressive

field of high-rev power players in the Scorpion finals, raising his television average by 88 pins in the process.

After sneaking into the step-ladder finals in fourth position by four pins over Rhino Page of Dade City, Fla., Daugherty ruined Jason Sterner's television debut, eliminating the McDonough, Ga., resident, 199-177. He then romped past Australian two-handed star Jason Belmonte, 256-187, and threw a critical double in the fifth and sixth frames of the title match to defeat Palermaa, getting help from the Finnish two-handed star when he had consecutive opens in the sixth and seventh frames.

Ironically, Daugherty put together the best performance of his professional career while glancing at a very large “100” in a graphic above the lanes promoting “Bowlers Journal 100th Anniversary.”

“I want to thank Bowlers Journal for reminding me all day of my 100 game,” Daugherty said with a grin at the conclusion of the match.

While all four finalists use power techniques that allow them to generate significant hooking power, the key was slower ball speed, a result of Daugherty not using his thumb in his delivery.

“The difference between me and the two-handers is my ball speed,” Daugherty said. “They throw it 100 miles per hour, so I can actually do something they can't and that's a slow hook. I knew if I could get by Sterner, I'd have a good chance. I knew (Belmonte and Palermaa) weren't going to bowl anything. They might say they threw some bad shots, but I didn't think either one of them could shoot 200 because of their ball reactions.

NORWALK — Word has reached our office that Joan Feinblum is recovering from foot surgery (Lost a toe?). I think it was from kicking — all these years.

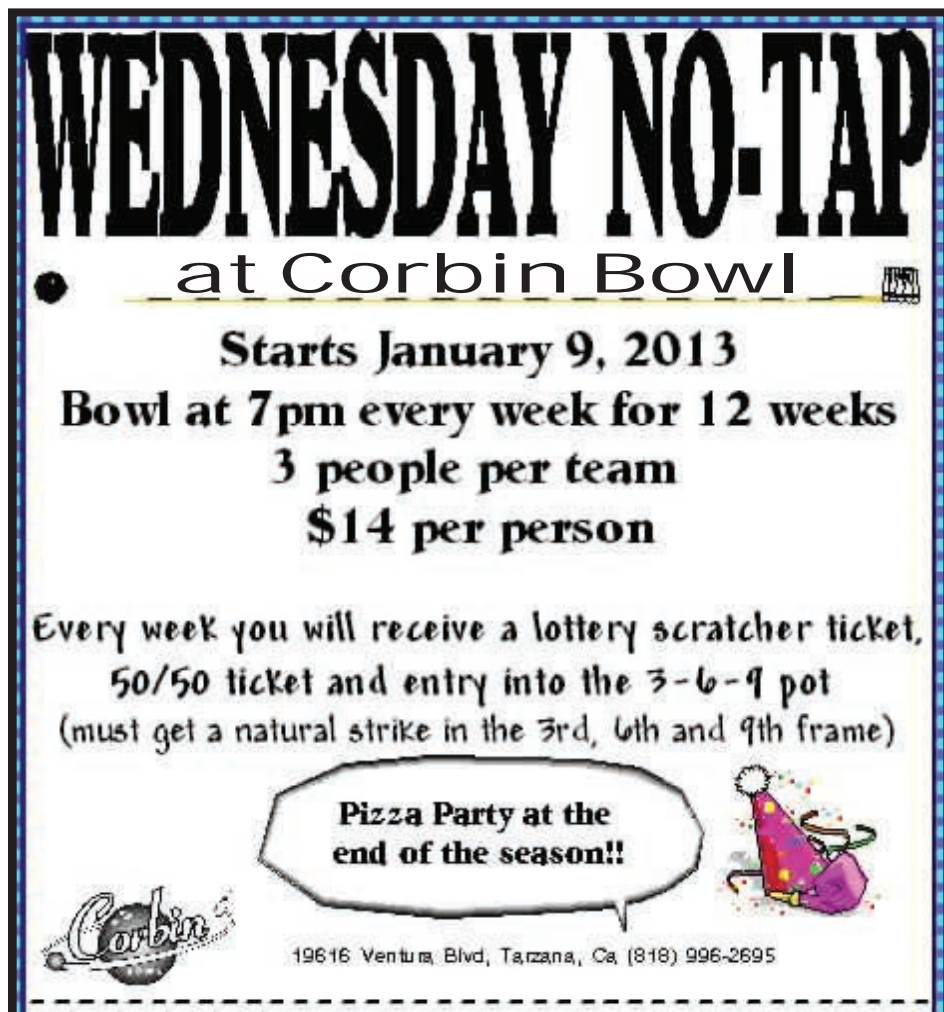

Sports Icon Billie Jean King Becomes First Woman PBA League Team Owner

SEATTLE (JAN. 2, 2013) – Sports icon and World TeamTennis co-founder Billie Jean King is the first woman owner of a Professional Bowlers Association League team.

PBA Commissioner Tom Clark announced that King, the winner of 39 Grand Slam singles, doubles and mixed doubles tennis titles, including a record 20 championships at Wimbledon, will be the owner of the New York City WTT KingPins which includes franchise player and PBA Hall of Famer Pete Weber, 13-time Tour winner Tommy Jones, 2010-11 Rookie of the Year Scott Norton, two-time Tour winner Jack Jurek, John Szczerbinski and supplemental pick Brad Angelo.

“The model for the Professional Bowlers Association League closely matches the format of World TeamTennis, my core business,” said King. “I am a big believer in the team concept and excited this is definitely not your typical bowling league. It’s new, it’s groundbreaking and it is definitely going to be competitive.”

King joins Los Angeles Clippers star Chris Paul, former Pittsburgh Steelers Super Bowl champion running back Jerome Bettis, former NFL all-pro receiver Terrell Owens, actor/comedian Kevin Hart, comedian Chris Hardwick, and Pittsburgh Steelers all-pro linebacker LaMarr Woodley as owners in the ESPN-televised PBA League which debuts as part of the PBA Detroit Winter Swing Jan. 19-27 at Thunderbowl Lanes in the Detroit suburb of Allen Park, Mich.

“Billie Jean is an icon, a transcendent figure not only in sports history but American history and bringing her competitive spirit, ideals for sport and brilliant mind to our new professional bowling league as a team owner is a very proud moment for everyone at the PBA,” said Clark. “While we know the League will benefit from her presence, the other teams should also be well aware that above all else, she is in this to win it.”

ESPN will televise five weeks of PBA League competition beginning Sunday, Jan. 27, plus the PBA League Elias Cup finals in April. The celebrity owners will not compete on the lanes as part of official PBA League competition.

During the first four days of the Detroit Winter Swing, the PBA will conduct a series of open-field tournaments (the Carmen Salvino Classic, Mark Roth Classic, Don Carter Classic and Earl Anthony Players Championship). Those four events will award individual PBA Tour titles and the qualifying scores posted by each PBAL team member will be combined to produce the team qualifying scores for the ESPN telecasts. All PBAL matches on ESPN will be Baker Format matches, where each team member will bowl two frames in each game.

This year will mark the 40th anniversary of King’s historic match against Bobby Riggs and the 40th anniversary of her founding of the Women’s Tennis Association. King also founded the Women’s Sports Foundation in 1974.

King is also the owner of the Philadelphia Freedoms, one of the professional teams in Mylan World TeamTennis. She co-founded the league, which showcases the best in professional team tennis competition playing an innovative team format based on a concept of gender equity.

In 2009 King was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom, the nation’s highest civilian honor. She was the first female athlete to receive that honor which was presented to her at the White House by President Obama. In 1990 Life Magazine named her one of the “100 Most Important Americans of the 20th Century.”

Currently she serves on the boards of the Women’s Sports Foundation and the Elton John AIDS Foundation.

Two made the roll with their 200, Connie Marchione with 210 and Joe Gonzales with 209. NOTE: Audette’s only 204 in first game broke the league’s infamous 96 games no 200 famine last December 9 at Cal Bowl.

Mac’s 818 and Wesley Kay’s sweep of 5 points helped their league leading Orange County win 15 points from 2nd place Audette’s Whittier. The only change in team standings is third place LA County falling to fourth place after losing 7-13 to 5th place Navarro’s Covina and 4th place Golyer’s Anaheim moving up to third when Anaheim beat Jones’ S F Valley 13-7.

In spite of the sticky approaches the 53 years old league thanks Chaparral Lanes management for hosting. Next travel date on schedule is January 20 at long time host Keystone Lanes at Noon.

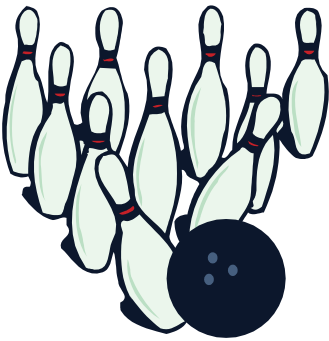

ABTA at Linbrook for "Frozen Handicap" Special Event

MONTCLAIR — We returned to Bowlum where a huge last squad gave us 189 entries last Saturday for a fun day of bowling. The cut scores were +70 for the men and +44 for the women, on a medium shot this week. The Super Seniors added to the board (two men and one Woman) were Jack Trongale +65, Manny Loria +56, and Sierrie Herradura +11. Super seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 47 bowlers making it to the semi-finals.

The High qualifiers for the tournament were Leo Tartamella for the men with a +170 and for the women it was Debra Sanders with a +98. They will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Each week our top seed draws the Match Series, and this time it was worth \$712. Bernie drew a 556. We had no bowler that bowled the score this so we will estimate the Match Series at \$1,400 at Linbrook event. This week it was Jesse Boquiu that would go for the 3-6-9 pot. He would miss on his second shot. He will get a \$50 consultation. We will go for \$2,100 this week at Linbrook.

In our optional doubles, finishing in first were Leo "Horseman" Tartamella and Deb Sanders with a 1468 for \$140. Finishing in second was Leo and Marvin Crowder with a 1463 for \$120. There was

a total of \$1,810 paid out in doubles and 32 paid spots with low to cash of 1347.

The Semis took the floor and the leader was Bob Ricketts with a +126. Finishing in a close second was Donovan Chung at a +117 so he would sit out the first round. Our top seed had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$3,500. Mr. Ricketts drew a 232. After a review of all the scores bowled, we had no bowlers who shot that score. We still have two full pots, so it will be \$3,500 at Linbrook, and now a third pot started that is at \$2,430.

This would bring us to our top 16 Match Play finals. In the first round, the seven losers were Sonia Coronado, Kelly Wynn, Sierrie Herradura, Greg Velarde, Linh Lai, Freddy Zamora, and Richard Luu, each will get \$100. In the second round, the four losers were Jeff Taino, James Chambers, Tim Tran, and Donovan Chung with each getting checks of \$105.

We are now down to the final five bowlers. The weekly horses are paying a low of \$58, Giang Huynh, to a high of \$86, Danny Eguielos. In one match, 7th seed Giang Huynh versus Danny Eguielos 5th seed. This was another of Giangs "no stopping me this week" matches where he took down his third opponent to advance to the next round. In the other match, it was Steve Brode 9th

seed versus Gil Gissendaner 4th seed. In this match it was Gilbert who was on his march as he took down Steve to advance. Steve and Danny finished in fourth and fifth getting checks for \$110 each.

Our semi-final match was all set, and would pit the seventh and fourth seeds from the semis against each other. In the weekly "horses", we would see Giang paying \$58 and Gil paying \$70 if they would win their match. This was another one of Giang's matches where he would not be out done. He would never trail in this match. Gilbert started out with a three count on his first ball and opened. Giang would get two marks, and jump out to a 19-pin lead. Gilbert would come up, got a strike, and then follow that up with an open. Giang came up, but opened, so he had a 21-pin lead after three. He would spare in his half of the fourth. That would bring Gilbert up and come thru with a double. Giang would open in the fifth and sixth frames. Gilbert came up in the fifth with a chance to take the lead but a solid six pin and a miss would give us a tie after six frames. Another open in the seventh by Gilbert would bring Giang up with a chance to jump back out in front, and he came through. Gilbert spared the eighth. Another open in the ninth did him in. Giang won 161/212 to Gilberts 148/291 and advance to the title match.

Gilbert would take home \$200 for his third place finish. For those lucky "investors" that had Giang as a horse, he paid \$58.

The title game was set at Bowlum. It would be top qualifier Robert Ricketts vs Giang Huynh. Robert would start out with an open. Giang came up with two spares. Robert came up and marked twice. Giang would come up and get two more marks to give him an 18 pin lead. Robert would open in the fourth frame and mark again in the fifth with a strike. Giang would open in the fifth and then get a strike in the sixth; he would hold a 15 pin lead at this point. Robert came up in the sixth and would open, then mark again in the seventh. Giang came up in the seventh and eighth with a double to jump out to a big 36-pin lead. Robert would double in the eighth and ninth frames, but could not get a strike in the tenth. That would be enough for Giang to finish out with a 199/250 to 161/203 to take his second ABTA championship. He would take home \$1,000 for the victory and an additional \$1,700 for Cash and Carry, to give him a total of \$2,700. Ricketts would take home \$500 for his second place finish.

Champion Giang Huynh is from is Duarte and used a Motive drilled by ABTA member Jimmy Wong. He is single and would like to thank his family, friends, ABTA Staff, friends in the Bowlmania league, and the Super staff at Bowlum.

Robert Ricketts, Second Place, is from Corona and used a Roto Grip drilled by Mike Wahl. He is single and has two children, David and Natasha. He would like to thank Mike Bousquet for all his support.

Bye Bye Bye

Sunday's PBA World Championship Finalists to Battle for Season's First Major Title on ESPN Belmonte awaits challenger as final event of GEICO World Series of Bowling IV airs Sunday at 1 p.m. ET

LAS VEGAS (Jan. 7, 2013) –The stepladder finals of the Professional Bowlers Association World Championship, the final tournament of the GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling IV and the first major of the 2012-13 season, will air Sunday at 1 p.m. ET on ESPN.

The finals, from the South Point Hotel and Casino, features five players who are hoping to add a PBA World Championship title to their resumes, including top qualifier Jason Belmonte of Australia. Belmonte, a 29-year-old two-handed player who won three titles during the 2011 WSOB III, averaged 240.27 for the 56 games of World Championship qualifying and match play to earn the top berth in the stepladder finals by 29 pins over his fiercest rival, reigning PBA Player of the Year Sean Rash of Montgomery, Ill.

In Sunday's opening match, PBA Hall of Famer and 32-time titlist Parker Bohn III of Jackson, N.J., takes on Canadian Dan MacLelland, who is trying for his first Tour title and who hopes to become the first Canadian to win a PBA Tour title. Bohn, a two-time Player of the Year, is trying for his second major.

Bohn made it into the stepladder finals after qualifying in the 24th and last spot in match play by just three pins. He is hoping to become just the 15th player in Tour history to advance from 24th to win a Tour title. The last player to do it was Walter Ray Williams Jr. in the 1995 Rochester (N.Y.) Open. A win also would end a four-year drought for Bohn, whose last title came in the 2008 Cheetah Championship.

MacLelland, a former All-American at Saginaw Valley State University, has a previous high finish of second place in the 2010 GEICO Shark Championship. He has done well in majors, finishing fourth in the 2012 USBC Masters and sixth in the 2011 Tournament of Champions and U.S. Open.

The winner of the opening match will take on No. 3 qualifier Rhino Page of Dade City, Fla., who will be trying for his sixth Tour title and first major. Page is also hoping to end a dry spell that has lasted more than three years. He won his last Tour title in September of 2009.

The winner of the second match will meet Rash, the No. 2 qualifier, in the semifinal match. Rash, a five-time Tour winner, won last season's Tournament of Champions for his second major. The victory helped propel him to Player of the Year honors.

The semifinal winner will battle Belmonte for the \$50,000 first prize. Belmonte, who has five Tour wins, will be trying for his first title of WSOB IV. He made the finals in both the Chameleon and Bowlers Journal Scorpion Championships, but failed to win either event.

If he happens to meet Rash in Sunday's championship match, both players will be looking for redemption. Rash lost head-to-head battles (in the 2011 Chameleon Championship at the World Series of Bowling and in the title match of the 2012 Australian Masters) in his two most recent battles with Belmonte while Belmonte will want to make a statement after losing last season's Player of the Year title to Rash in the closest vote ever.

Each ESPN telecast will be preceded by a special pre-game show on PBA's online bowling channel, Xtra Frame, and each will feature a post-game show on Xtra Frame with an interview with the tournament winner.

The seven celebrity owners and their team names are: Jerome Bettis (Motown Muscle); Chris Paul (L.A. X); Terrell Owens (Dallas Strikers); Chris Hardwick (Silver Lake Atom Splitters); Billie Jean King (New York City WTT KingPins); LaMarr Woodley (Pittsburgh Jack Rabbits), and Kevin Hart (Philadelphia Hitmen). The final PBA League team and its logo will be announced later.

The PBA League will begin competition during the PBA Detroit Winter Swing Jan. 19-27 at Thunderbowl Lanes in Allen Park, Mich. The first round of the PBA League will be telecast live on ESPN Sunday, Jan. 27 at noon ET. “The team owners were intimately involved with naming their teams, distinguishing their home location and designing their logos and team jerseys,” said PBA Commissioner Tom Clark. “When these teams of professional bowlers take to the lanes with their custom Gemini jerseys they will be reflective of their superstar owners.” Clark said each chose home locations that were important to them, such as Hart and Bettis’ hometowns of Philadelphia and Detroit (Motown) respectively, and LaMarr Woodley’s more recent affiliation with Pittsburgh where his Steelers play.

“Chris Paul made his final decision on his team’s logo design just a few minutes after leading the Los Angeles Clippers to a win over the Milwaukee Bucks right at the Bradley Center,” Clark said. “Billie Jean King was calling in thoughts while on her way to a Christmas party at the White House, and Chris Hardwick took the logo designs to his massive legion of fans on Twitter for their unique opinions.”

Terrell Owens’ logo includes “TO” for his famous nickname, Hart’s includes red hearts, Bettis has his signature Bus 36 on the hood of a muscle car and King made sure the pro tennis league she founded ‘WTT’ was represented in her team name.

The top four teams after the five preliminary rounds will advance to the PBA League Elias Cup Finals, named after PBA founder Eddie Elias, which will be contested at Woodland Bowl in Indianapolis on Sunday, March 31 for telecast on Sunday, April 7 at 1 p.m. ET on ESPN. All preliminary qualifying rounds and match play will be live streamed on xtraframe.tv, the PBA’s official video service. Fans can stay tuned to pbastore.com for information on opportunities to buy PBA League team-specific merchandise.

IDLE BOWLING THOUGHTS

...It is difficult to realize how difficult it was to convert bowling to an all person of all colors sport. It stated in the rules of almost all the bowling organizations that bowling was for the while race alone and though bowling was one of the first sports to break down race barriers it was still too long. Dedicated bowling pioneers worked long and hard to erase the early injustices and though the Professional Bowlers Association was founded just eight years after the rules were changed it was from the start a group that welcomed bowlers on how well they could knock pins down and applications for PBA membership offered no clues to color or origin.

..No matter how far back you go the motto of "bring a friend" still stands as the best way to increase the number of competitive bowlers.

...At 6-4 Mika Koivuniemi is one of the tallest pros in action these days. All-time tallest? I'd have to go with PBA Hall of Famer Steve Cook who is 6-7 or higher—and made a bowling ball look small in his hand.

...Bowlers who scold their children for carrying useless things in their school bags should take a good long look at the contents of their bowling bags. One reason why two-ball bowling bags are so popular is that when all the clutter is in place, the bowler still have enough room for one more bowling ball.

...High school bowling rules, which vary in almost every state, need plenty of research, working with the schools and working out conflicts can add still more varsity teams to the rapidly growing high school list.

...When Johnny Petraglia rolled a 300 game on TV he received phone calls from around the world. Even though he didn't win the tournament he earned a perfect game bonus of \$100,000. The first call was from actor Michael J. Fox, who had received special bowling instructions for movie scenes from Petraglia. While answering one call Petraglia was told the White House was on the other line. "I took that call real quick", said Petraglia. "And it was the White House Tavern somewhere."

P.S. I'm only familiar with B.L.S. so if all sheet service systems have that capability I would like to be informed. Call Bowling News any Tuesday afternoon.

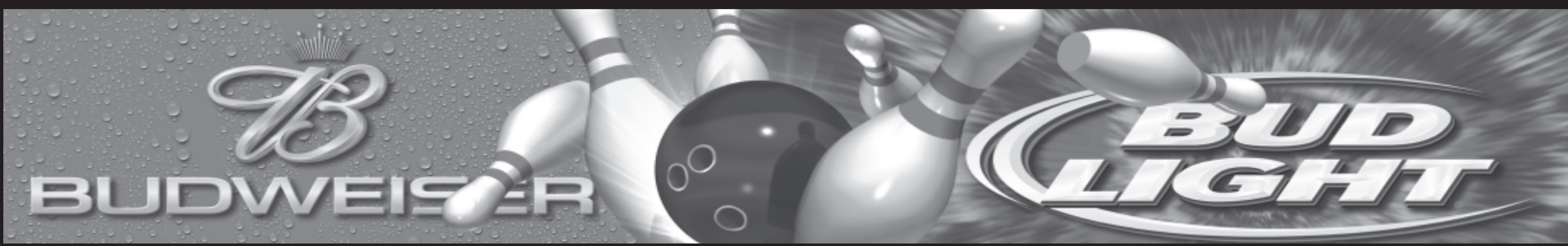
