



Monacelli Leaves Ebonite, Returns To Brunswick

Amleto Monacelli has left Ebonite and signed with Brunswick in a move that bolsters Brunswick's already deep roster of legendary PBA stars.

Monacelli, a 20-time PBA Tour champion and PBA Hall of Famer, confirmed to FloBowling today is the first day of a new two-year contract with Brunswick. The native of Venezuela had been with Ebonite since 2012.

At Brunswick, Monacelli, 57, joins PBA Hall of Famers Johnny Petraglia, Parker Bohn III and Walter Ray Williams Jr. to create a world-class team of bowling's biggest stars.

"I'm really grateful to Ebonite for their support through the years and extremely happy to be with Brunswick," Monacelli said. "In the back of my mind. I always wanted to finish my career with Brunswick because I had some of my best years with them."

Monacelli joined Bruns-

his PBA Player of the Year awards (1989, 1990) while on staff with Brunswick.

"My first contract was with Brunswick when Johnny Petraglia brought me in," Monacelli said. "They did my green card and helped me with the process to become legal to stay in the United States. To me, that was a big thing and it meant a lot those years with Brunswick. I won more titles with them than anybody."

Monacelli continues to be active on both the PBA Tour and the PBA50 Tour. His most recent PBA Tour title came in 2016 at the DHC PBA Japan Invitational. He has also won eight PBA50 titles, including four majors, since turning 50 seven years ago.


During the 2018 U.S. Open, Monacelli made news when he was excluded from the exempt list from the event and was forced to bowl the qualifier. He went on to advance to not only advance through

Bill O'Neill Becomes Hall of Fame Eligible with Win in PBA Hall of Fame Classic Go Bowling! PBA Tour makes its 2019 debut live on FOX Sports' FS1 channel

ARLINGTON, TX Bill O'Neill of Langhorne, Pa., defeated top qualifier Jakob Butturff of Tempe, Ariz., 199-194, to win the Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Fame Classic title at the International Training and Research Center Sunday and in the process became title-eligible for election to the PBA Hall of Fame in the future.

The finals aired live on FOX Sports' FS1 channel in the 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour's debut event in its new multi-year television agreement with FOX.

O'Neill, after throwing 17 strikes on 22 attempt in eliminating Sweden's Jesper Svensson, 258-219, and

Australia's Jason Belmonte, 268-188, struggled through his first four frames of the title match before throwing four strikes in a row to take the lead against Butturff, who missed two spare attempts. Butturff's failure to

convert the 4-7 in the ninth frame proved to be the difference.

"It might have appeared on TV that I got super nervous (early in the title match), but actually I was really calm," O'Neill said.



High-Rollers Put On a Show

WINNETKA - Sure, they're a bunch of highrollers, but this was absolutely ridiculous.

Let's just say that a few members of the "Missed It by an Arrow Left" team enjoyed a rather impressive night last month during the top-caliber "Mixed Classic Handicap" league competition at Winnetka Bowl.

The five-man team was paced by anchorman Karl Kurtz, who crushed a 300 in his first game - his 51st in his career – and he stayed hot the rest of the way. Kurtz, who carries a 226 average, finished with

crushed a 784 series (277-265-242). "Chuck needed just a spare in the 10th [in his final game] for an 800, perlative 758 series, which still ranked only as the third-highest on his team. Englehart averages an out-

wick in 1988 and left in 1996 but during that stretch he won 15 of his PBA titles. He also won both of the qualifier but made the first cut and narrowly missed match play, finishing in 28th place.


NEWLY RE-DRESSED PBA SEMI TRAILERS Ready to Roll Across America

If you are cruising America's interstate highways in the months ahead, you may get a glimpse of the PBA's newly re-dressed 18-wheel billboards, a pair of rolling tributes to the stars of the PBA, the major media outlets that will bring the world's best bowlers to the public in the months ahead, and some of the PBA's key business partners.

The PBA semis will travel from Maine to California, making 19 stops in between for Go Bowling! PBA Tour events and visiting another 12 cities for PBA50 Tour tournaments. The pair of 53-foot trailers each will transport roughly 25 tons of players' equipment and resources necessary to conduct a professional bowling tournament. The trailers also include the PBA's mobile pro shop which serves between 150 and 300 bowlers each week, drilling between 200 and 300 bowling balls per event.

2019 PBA Power Rankings

Ranking the top players on the Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) Tour throughout the 2019 season.

Introducing the FloBowling PBA Power Rankings, a new weekly feature in which we will rank the top 20 bowlers on the PBA Tour based on how well they're bowling at this very moment. As such, the rankings can—and likely will—change drastically from week to week and, even better, will be fodder for debate.

Who's bowling the best? Who's the most intimidating? Underrated? Here's where we stand going into the 2019 PBA Hall of Fame Classic.

1. Andrew Anderson

The 2018 PBA Player of the Year qualified for the stepladder finals in all three events at the FloBowling PBA Fall Swing, cashed at the U.S. Open, then went to Hong Kong for the World Championships and won a gold medal (in trios with Kyle Troup and EJ Tackett), three silver medals (all-events, doubles with Tackett and team) and shared a bronze (singles). While those medals don't factor into his PBA career at all, they show he's still at the top of the game. He's the man to beat moving into 2019.

2. Dom Barrett

Barrett is the most recent winner on the PBA Tour, overcoming the absurd difficulty of the U.S. Open's length and lane conditions to get to the stepladder, then winning four difficult matches to earn the green jacket. He also finished second in the PBA Clash, although he could've finished dead last there and still be ranked second here. Barrett will be spending a lot of time a long way from home in early 2019, and he won't squander his time in the United States.

3. EJ Tackett

Tackett qualified for each of the last three PBA Tour stepladder finals in 2018, winning once and finishing fourth twice, including at the U.S. Open. Joining Team USA for the World Championships, Tackett earned gold medals in all-events and trios and also collected silver medals in the doubles and team events.

4. Jakob Butturff

Leading the most recent tournament, the U.S. Open, by nearly 600 pins guarantees a topfive power ranking going into this season. Butturff is a legitimate contender to win any tournament he enters and could quickly move up this list.

5. Kris Prather

Yes, he's still without a PBA Tour title to his name. However, a player can't qualify for four consecutive stepladder finals (all three events at the Fall Swing plus the U.S. Open) and not be considered one of the top threats moving into this season.

6. Anthony Simonsen

Two titles in the back half of the season and an eighth-place finish at the U.S. Open solidify Simonsen as a top-10 threat moving into 2019. He followed up his much-talked-about backup-ball victory in the Gene Carter's Pro Shop Classic with a more conventional championship in the PBA Wolf Open at the Fall Swing.

7. Stu Williams

The winner of the Tulsa Open who finished second in the PBA-WBT Thailand event just prior, Williams is already sharp and looks to be one of the players who benefits most from the week-to-week schedule that opens 2019.

8. Jason Belmonte

Belmonte missed the cut at the U.S. Open and failed to qualify for any of the stepladders at the Fall Swing. Still, the mere fact we need to list his failures to justify how low he is on the list shows most people—his opponents included—feel he should be ranked higher. He will likely make sure that happens sooner than later.

9. Marshall Kent

Kent rolled the first hambone of the new FOX era, and it was a clutch hambone late in the championship match at the Clash, which he won. Kent qualified for five stepladders in 2018, including the U.S. Open, and although he didn't win any titles (the Clash was an exhibition), he's a top contender heading into this season.

10. Richie Teece

Teece qualified for two of the three stepladders at the Fall Swing and made match play at the U.S. Open. He's already committed to spend the first quarter of the year in the United States and will look to take as many trophies home as he can.

11. Jason Sterner

Look out for Sterner. He barely missed the show at the U.S. Open and the man known for constantly practicing will now get to do so under real-game conditions... because they'll be real games.

12. Kyle Troup

Troup won the Lucky Larsen Masters in August but didn't have a great finish to his season, cashing only once—at the Tulsa Open—in the last four events. At the World Championships in Hong Kong, Troup won three silver medals and a bronze.

13. Tom Smallwood

An 11th-place finish at the U.S. Open capped a decent year for Smallwood, even if he only bowled 12 events. If he bowls more often in 2019, he'll contend nearly every week.

14. Ryan Ciminelli

The top non-Butturff lefty at the U.S. Open (Ciminelli finished 12th) has been vocal in praise of the upcoming PBA Tour schedule. Now's his chance to take advantage.

15. Rhino Page

Page finished right behind Ciminelli at the U.S. Open and will look to pass Ciminelli and everyone else—as 2019 gets going.

16. Sean Rash

Several decent finishes to close out the season, even with injuries few knew about.

17. François Lavoie

A good performance at the U.S. Open to close the season.

18. Tommy Jones

10th place at the U.S. Open and just two titles away from 20 in his career.

19. JoJoe Yannaphon

Finished seventh at the U.S. Open.

20. Tom Daugherty

14th on the 2018 points list and excels in week-long events.



Will 2019 Be The PBA's Best Season Ever?

The 2019 PBA Tour season starts this week with more optimism from more places than any season in recent memory.

Here are six reasons this may be the best season in PBA history:

1. FloBowling begins its first full season

With coverage of every round leading up to the TV shows, including pick-a-pair options whenever possible, PBA fans get the most complete coverage in history.

FloBowling took over the PBA's live streaming on June 30 and 2019 will be its first crack at a full PBA Tour season.

2. FOX takes over the TV shows

This isn't necessarily about FOX being better than ESPN, but the fact FOX is new to and, apparently, passionate about the PBA means they're going to try new things.

They've "FOX-ified" every sport they've taken on and give life to all the sports they touch. Even the universally panned glowing puck from their NHL days shows they're willing to innovate.

If you don't have FOX or FS1, don't worry: the telecasts will all be available in the FloBowling archives as well seven days after each shows air. Also, for those international bowling fans, FloBowling will stream all the finals live for those outside the United States.

3. PBA League will get younger

The PBA League is already one of the highlights of the PBA season, but it'll be even better in 2019. There will be more roster turnover this year than any previous season. The big story last year was the snub of Andrew Anderson, who of course went on to win the PBA Player of the Year Award, and he will undoubtedly be drafted (probably first).

There will be snubs this year, too. That's the nature of professional sports. However, the bigger story this year will most likely involve how much younger the PBA League is going to get. That is, younger players replacing older players. That, combined with other younger players replacing different younger players, will lead to PBA League rosters that look quite a bit different than the past few seasons.

4. PBA Playoffs adds more drama

The PBA has done playoff-like events before, occasionally even calling them playoffs, but it's never been done this way: the top 24 players, based on all the events leading up to it, qualify for the PBA Playoffs, which will pit the players one-on-one, in a bracket format, until one player reigns victorious and earns the \$100,000 top prize.

Without the burden of qualifying (it will all have taken place over the course of the first several events, so it feels like there's no qualifying even if there technically is), we skip right to the excitement of head-to-head sporting competition. The players will care and the players will compete. Being in Portland, Maine, the fans will be rabid.

Plus, the players' desire to qualify for the PBA Playoffs will enhance the quality of all the previous events as well. Driven to qualify for the prestige and the payday, competition in every event that goes toward playoff qualification is going to be elevated.

5. February might be epic

There's no better time to be a bowling fan than February. Four consecutive weeks of nearly non-stop coverage on FloBowling, only resting to get from one venue to the next. Four consecutive weeks of live television. Four consecutive Sundays in which a player has a chance to earn a million dollars.

The Tournament of Champions, Players Championship, Indianapolis Open and Jonesboro Open should see some of the most spirited bowling by the entire field that we've seen in a long time.

After February, it's only a quick break before we're right back at it with the World Series of Bowling X and then the United States Bowling Congress Masters.

6. Summer Tour vastly improved

Each of the past few years, the PBA has run a summer tour exclusive to livestreaming, and in most of those years, there was a bonus prize fund to the players who performed the best over the entire summer tour.

The proximity and timing of the events, plus the prize money, may make it more enticing to players outside North America, who for the most part have not competed in the recent summer tours that have been predominantly scattered in location and timing. If people are crossing oceans to bowl, the competition is better and the events are better.

Plus, the PBA recently announced the top eight players in the summer tour points list will qualify for the PBA China Tiger Cup.

For an entity that's been around for 61 years and showcasing Don Johnson's 299 for 48 of them, it's not easy to predict any season can suddenly top all the others.

Regardless, for these six reasons and definitely more, 2019 is a legitimate contender to do just that.

erful team scratch series of 3,522 – a high for the Wednesday-night league. That averages out to a spectacular 235 scratch for each player per game.

In the first game, the team racked up 1,254 pins scratch – which comes out to a stunning average of 251 per bowler.

What was truly remarkable about the series is that "Missed It by an Arrow Left" did not win all three of its games. After scoring 230- and 116-pin routs in its first two games, "Missed It by an Arrow Left" suffered a 23-pin setback in the finale. "It's hard to win three games in that league," Kurtz said.

PBA Hall of Fame Welcomes Four New Members International Bowling Museum and Hall of Fame hosts first induction ceremonies



ARLINGTON, Texas (Jan. 5, 2019) – There was no more appropriate place to welcome the Professional Bowlers Association's four newest Hall of Fame members than the International Bowling Museum and Hall of Fame itself, and that's exactly what happened Saturday when Finland's Mika Koivuniemi; Patrick Allen of South Salem, N.Y.; Jim Doty of Indianapolis, and Bob Johnson of Las Vegas joined the PBA's elite.

The first induction ceremonies ever held within the IBM/HF itself were part of the PBA Hall of Fame Classic weekend which concludes Sunday with the PBA's first live stepladder finals telecast on FOX Sport's FS1 channel at 11 a.m. EST. The HOF Classic is the first tournament of the 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour season.

But Saturday night was for coats and ties, and cocktail dresses, as two decorated PBA Tour champions, a long-time PBA tournament host and an award-winning bowling journalist were honored for their highly successful careers contributions to professional bowling. It was a ceremony filled with good humor, serious appreciation and moments of emotion.

MIKA KOIVUNIEMI

Koivuniemi, who now resides in the United Arab Emirates where he is coaching the UAE national bowling team, is a 14-time PBA Tour champion who earned his nickname – Major Mika – after winning two majors before he won his first "standard" PBA Tour title. In his first PBA television appearance, he defeated PBA star Pete Weber by a single pin to win the 2000 USBC Masters. A year later he won the U.S. Open, and he claimed the crown jewel of his PBA career in 2011, when he won the \$250,000 first prize in the \$1 million PBA Tournament of Champions.

"I have sat in these ceremonies many times and don't remember what anyone said," Koivuniemi began, "so I thought, how can I do something people will remember? Maybe give my speech in Finnish. Or maybe with my accent, they won't remember anyway.

"I've very proud to be the first European elected to the PBA Hall of Fame," he continued on a more serious note. "In 1995, I decided to come to the U.S. to see how good I was."

He related how after one early failure, PBA member Mike Miller offered him some advice that stuck.

"Mike Miller said to me, you have to get better or you'll go back home in a year," Koivuniemi said. "I decided to work harder."

PATRICK ALLEN

Allen, a 13-time PBA Tour title winner, won PBA's 2004-05 Chris Schenkel PBA Player of the Year after becoming the second player in PBA history to finish among the top five in all four PBA majors during the same season – finishing second in the USBC Masters and U.S. Open, fifth in the PBA Tournament of Champions and winning the PBA World Championship.

BOB JOHNSON

Johnson began his journey into bowling journalism at age 15 and eventually served as editor of four national bowling magazines, winning 75 national writing awards for his news, feature and editorial compositions, many of which directly involved the PBA. Currently Senior Editor of Bowlers Journal International and editor of the BJI Cyber Report, he is a recipient of both the International Bowling Media Association's Luby Hall of Fame Award and the Mid-America Bowling Writers Golden Quill Award.

To mark the occasion, Johnson and his wife Michelle purchased a commemorative brick for the sidewalk outside the IGM/HF, wrote a check to the breast cancer charity of PBA staffer Mary von Krueger's charity of choice and donated the cost of his Hall of Fame ring to BVL, bowling's official charity in support of the nation's military veterans.

"I'm not a ring guy," Johnson said, "except for this one (pointing to his wedding ring)." "I learned that one of the secrets to bringing a story to life is what you put between the commas," he noted. "I've always tried to write the best stories I can. I doesn't always work... Telling PBA players' stories has been a real pleasure and I hope I can continue doing it for many more years."

Also recognized during the ceremonies were 2018 Chris Schenkel PBA Player of the Year Andrew Anderson of Holly, Mich.; Harry Golden PBA Rookie of the Year Kamron Doyle of Brentwood, Tenn.; PBA Steve Nagy Sportsmanship Award winner Tom Small-wood of Saginaw, Mich., and PBA Tony Reyes Memorial Community Service Award recipient Chris Barnes of Double Oak, Texas.

Televised 300 Game Means

"To make it into the hall of fame on the first ballot was a thrill," Allen said. "Seventeen years later, it was like it all happened in a flash. But here we are. The day comes when you have to say when. It's painful, but it's great to be back among my friends tonight."

Allen also had special words for his presenter, fellow PBA Hall of Famer Doug Kent.

"Doug was responsible for two careers: his own and mine," Allen said. "He told me I had to learn the technical side of the sport, and then he taught me."

JIM DOTY

Doty is general manager of Royal Pin Leisure centers, the Indianapolis chain that includes long-time PBA host Woodland Bowl. Under his leadership, Woodland Bowl has hosted PBA events over a span of 20 years, including the U.S. Open, PBA Touring Players Championship, USBC Masters, PBA World Championship, PBA Tournament of Champions and PBA League Elias Cup finals among other events. Woodland Bowl is the only center to host all five PBA major Championships.

"It's been close to 40 years we've been hosting tournaments, and I've got a lot of stuff on some of you," he said jokingly to the numerous PBA players in the room.

"It's been a labor of love," he said, "but if it wasn't for my dedicated staff, we'd never host the PBA. I can't put into words how important this is to me. It's amazing the talent the players have; you have to love having these guys come to our place.

"Randy Pedersen once called Woodland Bowl the Yankee Stadium of bowling, and he's right. The list of players who have grown up here is a long one. It's great to know all of the people who know us as the place where the pros bowl. I'm proud of that."


