### Did You Know?

Dick Weber won titles in his first two career telecasts, going 4-0 in televised matches in 1961. His first career televised finals came in the 1961 Benesch Open, where Weber narrowly defeated future fellow PBA Hall of Famer Harry Smith, 211-201, in the semifinal match before defeating Ralph Brunt in the title match, 221-210.

The following week, Weber defeated two fellow legends to win the 1961 Puerto Rico Invitational. He beat Billy Welu in the semifinal, 213-198, before dropping Don Carter in the title match, 237-216.

Weber was the first of 10 bowlers in Denny's PBA Tour history to win titles in his first two career televised finals appearances.

### This Week

The Denny's PBA Tour returns to Fountain Bowl in Fountain Valley, Calif., for a very special event - the 2006 Dick Weber Open. The week features a "throwback" format, with the entire field bowling 15 games of qualifying after which the top 24 qualifiers will advance to round robin match play. The televised finals will follow a stepladder format with the final five bowlers battling for an exemption for the 2006-07 Tour season.

Many veterans are motivated to make a statement this week. Pete Weber (St. Ann, Mo.) returns from a three-week break looking to win the event named in his father's honor while Walter Ray Williams Jr. (Ocala, Fla.) tries to build off the momentum of last week's 6th place finish in the 2006 Earl Anthony Medford Classic at Lava Lanes in Medford, Ore.

Meanwhile, Mike Scroggins looks to rebound from his worst finish of the season after taking 37th place last week. He still holds the lead in the 2005-06 PBA World Point Rankings, but "young guns" Wes Malott (Austin, Texas) and Tommy Jones (Simpsonville, S.C.), sitting 2nd and 3rd, respectively, are creeping up on the left-hander.

### Last Week

Brian Himmler won his fourth career Denny's PBA Tour title, defeating Mika Koivuniemi (Hartland, Mich.) in the title match of the 2006 Earl Anthony Medford Classic, 214-204. The Cincinnati native jumped out to an early lead, striking on his first three shots. After an open 6th frame, Himmler spared in the 8th and 9th frames. Needing to mark in the 10th frame, Himmler converted a difficult 3-6-10 spare to earn the \$40,000 top prize and an exemption for next season.

Himmler advanced to the title match by beating "The Turtle" Tim Criss (Bel Air, Md.) in the semifinals, 259-242. Criss, making his first televised appearance since the 2003 Storm Las Vegas Classic, was looking to snap a 132-event winless streak.

Koivuniemi advanced to his third title match in his last four televised finals appearances by dispatching of Ritchie Allen, 237-215, in the semifinals. Allen (Columbia, S.C.) was making his second career televised finals appearance and his first since winning the 2002 Dallas Open.

### This Week's Schedule

The 2006 Dick Weber Open features a "throwback" format, beginning Tuesday, Jan. 10 with official PBA Practice Sessions throughout the day. Qualifying begins Wednesday, Jan. 11, with two squads bowling two five-game sets of qualifying. The first two sessions take place at 8 and 11 a.m. PST, after which the lanes will be re-oiled before both squads hit the lanes again at 4 and 7 p.m.

Thursday, Jan. 12 begins with another five-game qualifying session for both squads followed by the top 24 qualifiers advancing to round robin match play. The first eight-game round robin match play session begins at 6 p.m. Friday, Jan. 13 features two more eight-game qualifying sessions at 11 a.m. and 6 p.m. When the dust settles, just five bowlers will remain in the hunt for the title.

Saturday, Jan. 14 is a day for the fans with PBA Pro-Ams at Fountain Bowl at Noon and 4 p.m. The five-bowler ESPN live televised finals take place Sunday, Jan. 15 at 10 a.m. PST.

## Pluhowsky Sets Eight-Game Record at USBC Team USA Championships

RENO, NV — Shannon Pluhowsky of Phoenix set the record for the highest eight-game qualifying block in the history of the United States Bowling Congress Team USA Championships on Monday at the National Bowling Stadium.

Pluhowsky, a left-hander and three time U.S. Amateur champion, had an 1,874 total, topping the previous record of 1,869 by Missy Sullivan of Coon Rapids, Minn., in 1996.

"I was comfortable, didn't have to change balls at all and things just fell into place," said Pluhowsky, who only had one open in the block. "We've got a lot of games left, though. I'll just start over tomorrow. It's a different day and a different pattern. I'll have to keep making good shots and try to stay clean."

On the men's side, three-time Junior Team USA member P.J. Haggerty of Clovis, Calif., took a narrow lead with 1,828. Steve Weber of Chalmette, La., a member of Team USA in 2005, sits in second at 1,816.

"I had a great look the whole day," Haggerty said. "It's nice to get off to a good start, but I can't get comfortable. I have to keep working hard and making shots."

Qualifying continues Tuesday with eight games on the short oil pattern. The final eight games of qualifying will take place Wednesday on the long oil pattern. The top 32 men and 24 women will advance to match play on Thursday and Friday.

Nearly 225 of the best amateur bowlers in the United States are competing for spots on Team USA this week. The top five men and women are guaranteed spots on Team USA with the National Selection Committee selecting three more men and women from those who advanced to match play.

Team USA 2006 members will participate in events such as the World Tenpin Bowling Association Men's World Championships, Tournament of the Americas and QubicaAMF World Cup.

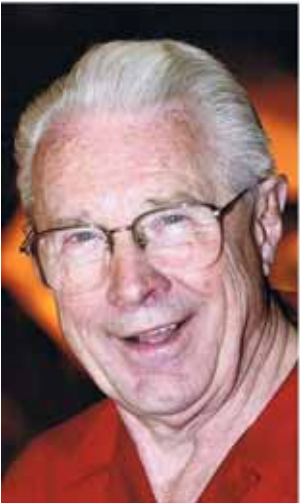

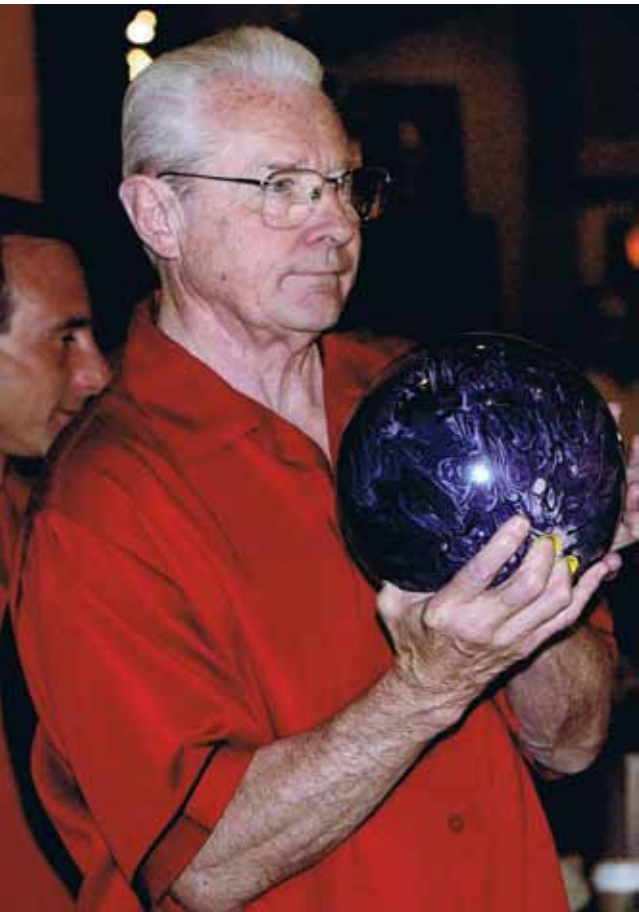
These two photos appearing in this issue were taken by Hero Noda in Las Vegas.

# USBC Rejects 900 Series by New York Youth

GREENDALE, WIS.—After a thorough investigation, a 900 series bowled Nov. 5 by 17-year-old Robert Mushtare in Fort Drum, N.Y., has been administratively rejected by the United States Bowling Congress.

The series, which was submitted as having occurred during a pre-bowling session for the Pine Plains Junior/Senior League at Pine Plains Bowling Center, was denied because Mushtare did not have a valid USBC Youth membership and the league was not USBC certified on the date the score was rolled. Mushtare is appealing the decision.

The Watertown USBC Youth Bowling Association did not receive Mushtare’s membership card and league certification applications until Nov. 18. USBC rules require such information be submitted within 30 days of the start of the league’s schedule. Since Mushtare’s league started on Sept. 17, the 30-day grace period ended Oct. 16. According to USBC rules, because the information was received after the end of the grace period,

services such as award recognition began the date the information was received.

# Dave Frame Wins Regular Division WCST Ebonite-Luster Cote Singles At AMF-Bowlm Lanes in Montclair Jim Zimmerman Wins Super Senior Title

MONTCLAIR—Long time bowling veteran Dave Frame (Temple City) won his 7<sup>th</sup> WCST Title at AMF-Bowlm Lanes in Montclair, CA. This was a tough battle for the winner, as the lead changed places many times in the 10 games bowled in the finals. Only 96 pins separated the 1<sup>st</sup> 5 places at the end of the finals. Dave started the finals in the 7<sup>th</sup> position, and worked his way up, and after the 1<sup>st</sup> 5 games rolling 1078, was in 3<sup>rd</sup> place. In games 6 to 9, Dave rolled 1009, to put him 1<sup>st</sup> place by 62 pins going into the position round against Lee Patterson, who had taken over 1<sup>st</sup> place after 8 games. In the position match Dave and Lee both tied with 211, and Dave ended winning the tournament by 62 pins. 2<sup>nd</sup> to 4<sup>th</sup> was separated by only 7 pins.

The two WCST All Time Money Leaders were both in these finals. With the #2 leader, Super Senior, Vaughn Doody, who bowled two 277 games, and finished a strong 3<sup>rd</sup> place. #1 leader, Kevin Gannon, ended up in 7<sup>th</sup> place. Eddie Katz, who ended up in 4<sup>th</sup> place, started in 10<sup>th</sup> place, and bowled the 2<sup>nd</sup> highest score of the finals with 2290, to lose by only 2 pins to 3<sup>rd</sup> place and 7 pins to 2<sup>nd</sup> place.

TOP 3: 1<sup>st</sup>, Dave Frame, \$1000.00, 2<sup>nd</sup>, Lee Patterson (Fresno), \$700.00, and 3<sup>rd</sup> to Vaughn Doody (Las Vegas), \$600.00. 56 entries for the tournament, with \$7,580.00 paid out to 20 bowlers.

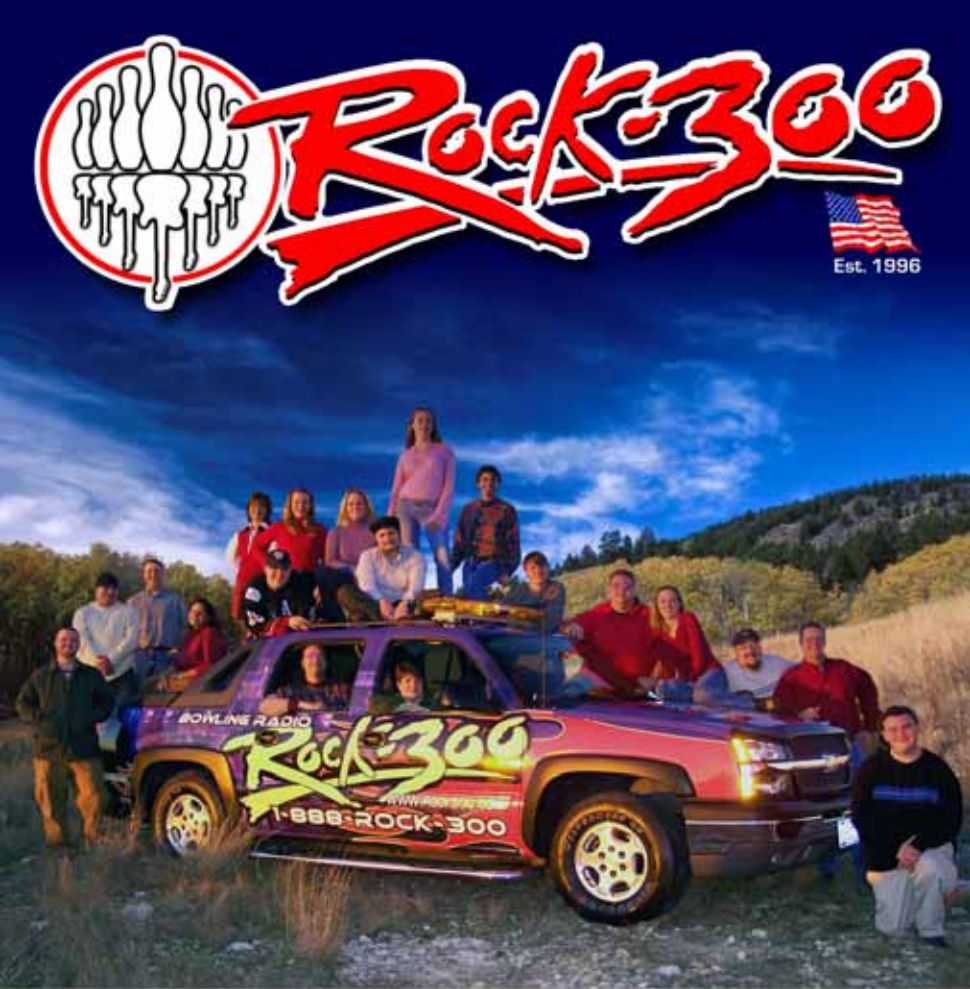

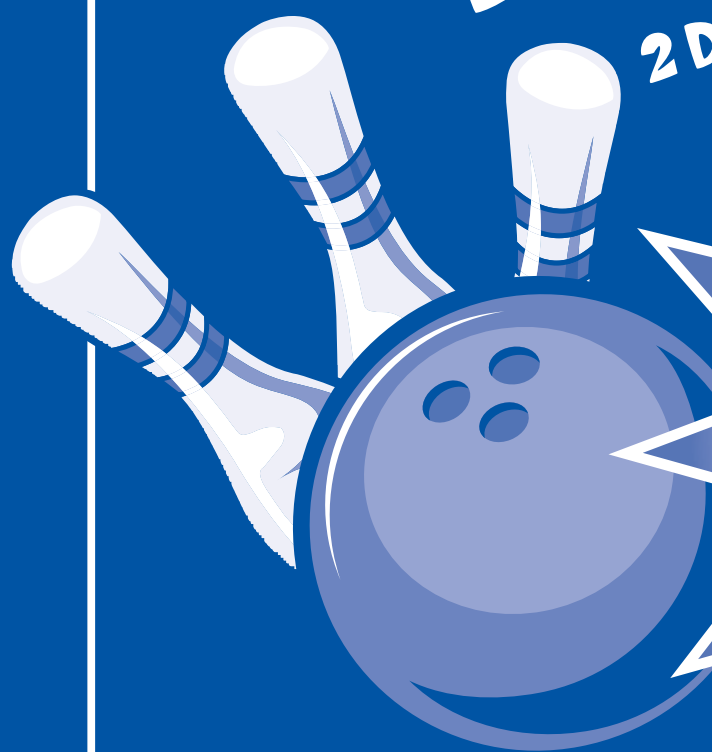

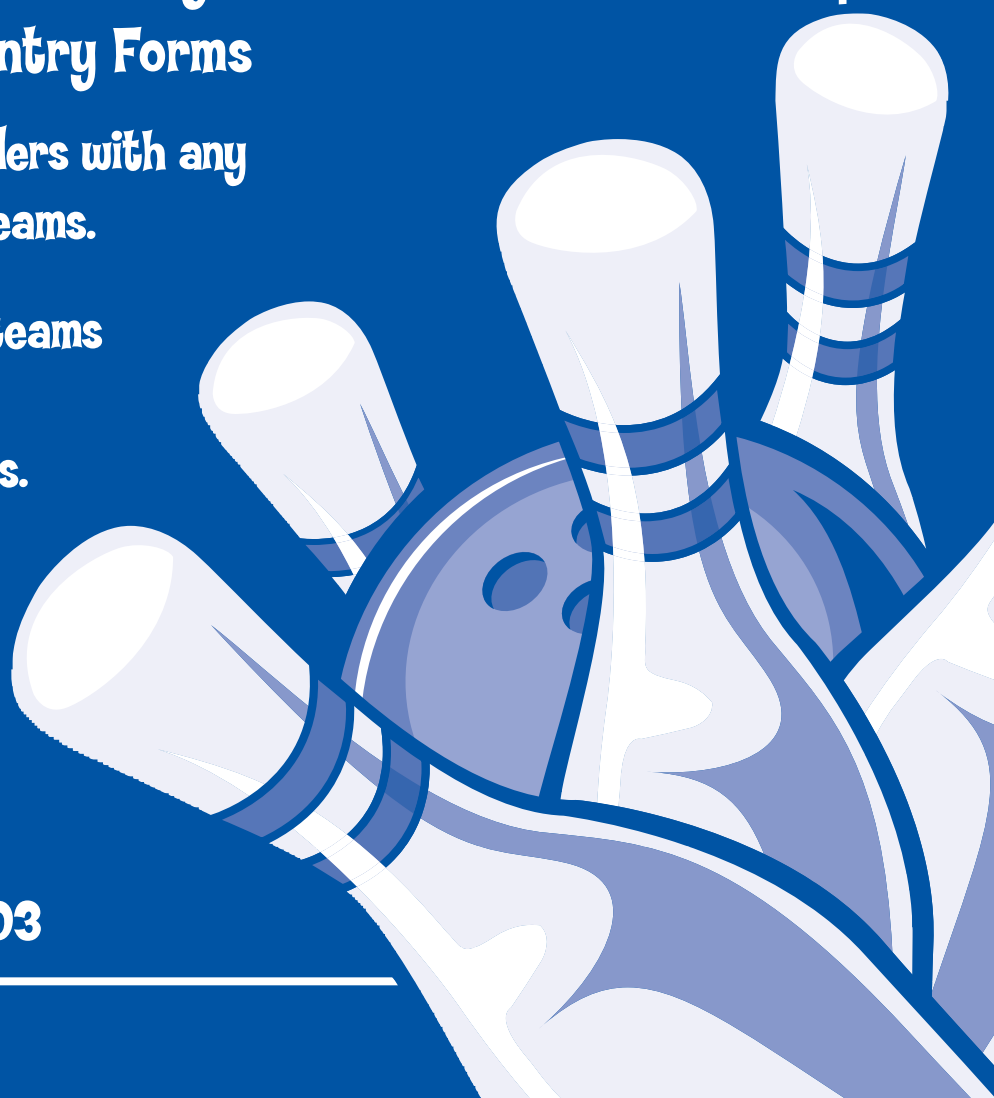

Southern California Deaf Bowling News

First Deaf Tournament of 2006, So. California  
Deaf Classic January 21st at Keystone Lanes

NORWALK...Deaf and hearing impaired bowlers take notice of the first Southland deaf mixed handicap singles classic of the new year 2006, the long running So. Calif. Deaf Bowlers Classic is having its 43rd annual tournament on Saturday January 21 at Keystone Lanes. As in the past decade, the first place prize is \$1,000 based on 100 entries.

As usual in the past, this Classic has been certified by United States Bowling Congress (USBC) as for only the deaf and hard of hearing bowlers.

The entry fee is the same as in the past \$35.00. You have a choice of 3 squads, 12 Noon, 2:00 PM and 4:00 PM and you can re-enter again at \$35.00 more. Enter at 12 Noon, the highest man and woman bowlers with handicap scores will get \$25.00 each.

Enter on the 4:00 PM squad the highest man and woman with scratch scores will get \$25.00 each. More important as you may notice for the past few years the So. Calif. Deaf Bowlers Classic takes pride in advertising its winners' names for the last 25 years.

You may notice that Ed Abakumoff was the first bowler to win it twice, followed by Mike Moore, James Stuard, and Mark Fisser. Carl Malucci was first to win back to back also first to roll a 300 and holds the record high score 1049. Last year's winner Mark Fisser became the first three-time winner. The first woman to win was Jackie Goins when she was Mrs. MacMonagle back in 1980 and since four other women, Sharon Caldwell, Helen Davis, Wendy George and Dierdre Alkire had won too.

This Classic is the oldest deaf singles tournament still running consecutively on the West Coast. It started back in 1963 when two new members of the young So. Calif. Deaf Traveling League, George Forfar and Ernest Holmes (both deceased) asked the league officers for permission to start a once a year handicap singles tournament. They wanted it open to lower average bowlers because the league itself was a scratch league and limited to 150 and over average. The following year Holmes and the late Bob Grinde as co-chairmen ran the 2nd tournament.

Two years later this writer as the founder and secretary-treasurer of So. Calif. Deaf Traveling League, organized So. Calif. Deaf Bowlers as a parent organization of the traveling league to take over the annual singles tournament. Also in addition to bid for hosting national, regional and state deaf tournaments. It had done all three. For the past 40 years So. Calif. Deaf Bowlers Singles Classic had been ran by the officers and dedicated volunteers from So. Calif. Deaf Traveling league. The club realized no profit from any of its classics and any left over from previous year went into the following year's expenses. The club used to donate to the prize fund but not any more because of decreasing entries, but it did paid for all losses it occurred in each tournaments in the past. Come to Keystone Lanes and take your chances. Enter in the Classic and be a winner and get your name on the list for the next 25 years.

Stogryn 941 Jones 255-891 Sherwood 814  
at Canoga Park Bowl

WINNETKA...For the new year's second half of the season, So. Calif. Deaf Traveling league finally exploded out of its shell in its stop at Canoga Park Bowl. All through the first half season there had been no big scores unless you count Ed Abakumoff's high 839 series and Dan Flores' high 244 game as big ones. Darrell Stogryn finally showed himself as the last year's Masters silver medal winner in the Deaflympics at Australia when he broke out of his own shell with games of 247-224-226-244 for a terrific 941 series. His big 941 led the league's honor roll of 11 bowlers as the league averaged season best 175.5 per bowler and three teams broke the previous season high team series 2212.

Also bursting out was Bob Jones who led the honor roll several times when Stogryn was in scoring doldrums. Jones whose previous high was 242/833, rolled 192-218-(new season high)255-225 for 891 to lead his S. F. Valley team to a new season high 2346 team series. The 2346 replaces it's own former high 2212.

The surprising third on the honor roll was the 814 rolled by Jones' legally blind teammate John Sherwood who proved that his 299 game made in November 2004 was not a fluke. In his first ever 800 in this league Sherwood rolled strings of strikes in his 243 and 235 and with a 178 he had a 656 series, which is 100 pins over his average series. Then he closed with a 158 for his 814.

Their 2346 team series had a season best 661 in third game with Jones' 255, Sherwood's 235 and Jim Mohr's 171. The other team games were 591-555-539. Stogryn's 941 helped his El Camino Village to a 2nd best 2262 series from 595-564-559-544. The league leader South Bay hit the third best 2251 made with Pablo Yoma's (198-2003-226)788, Don Millwee's (203-196-190)744 and Connie Marchione's (192-196)719.

South Bat hit a 612 team game in its 4th game. The balanced South Bay team beat hapless struggling Los Angeles 19 to 1 to stretch its lead to 15 points over S. F. Valley. Valley beat Hollywood 16 to 4 to take over 2nd place by one pin over El Camino Village. For Hollywood Rick Pennington made 3 of its 4 points with 222/704 and Gloria Chavez, subbing for Dan Flores, won the other point with her 201-195/722.

Although Village had the big series, Riverside managed to win 7 points while losing to Village's 13. Riverside's Emad Aranki and Robert Audette each won 3 points of the 7 points while the team took the 2nd game. Audette had 199-222 for 733 while struggling Ed Abakumoff had 191/713 in losing all his 5 points to hot shooting Stogryn.

Citrus Belt  
Great and War  
Hero Turns 88!

Citrus Belt bowling great Jack Stewart celebrated his 88th birthday on January 1, 2006. He was the second bowler in the history of the Citrus Belt to average 200 in league play. He averaged 202 for over 60 games during the 1959-1960 season, a record for our association at the time.

Stewart started bowling in 1928 when he worked as a pinboy in Pueblo, Colorado. He set candle, duck, and ten pins, earning four cents a game.

Those were the days when it cost just 15 cents to bowl a game.

Jack fought in World War II as a B-17 tail gunner. After flying 35 missions over Italy, he was wounded, receiving a Purple Heart and an Air Medal with three clusters. After the war, Jack worked at Covina Bowl as a desk man. Covina Bowl was the first "bowling palace" in the area.

When Jack started bowling he used a sixteen pound solid wood ball. In those days, ball manufacturers produced lighter weight balls by replacing wood with cork in the center of the ball. There were no pro shops. Balls were measured by desk personnel and sent to the manufacturer for drilling. Proprietors dressed their lanes with shellac. In the 1950s proprietors started using lacquer on the lanes and then switched to oil.

While working at Covina Bowl in the 1950s Jack got serious about bowling. In 1955 he graduated from Hall of Famer Joe Wilman's bowling school and became a certified bowling instructor. The following year he graduated from Buddy Bomar's bowling school. Before long, Jack was one of the top bowlers in the area. Then in 1959-60 he was Citrus Belt bowler of the year. That season he rolled his first sanctioned 700 series (711) and the first of many 279 games.

In the early 1960s Jack bowled in a San Diego scratch tournament outscoring bowling legends Don Carter and Ray Bluth. He also was a member of a local all-star team that bowled against a ladies all-star team from Los Angeles, which included Hall of Famer Laverne Carter.

Jack considers Don Carter to be the best bowler he ever saw. Locally, he says William Allen was the best. Allen is a Citrus Belt Hall of Famer who led the association in average six out of the first eight years such statistics were kept.

Incredibly, in 1998 at the age of 80, Jack won the Citrus Belt senior singles title with a scratch 279 game and 698 series. He also won the California "A" division ( 70 years and older) horseshoe pitching championship and went on to win the senior Olympics world championship. Remind you of someone named Walter Ray?

Good luck and God bless Jack. I hope to see you on the lanes in 2018 when you celebrate your 100th birthday.

My personal situation is over and I’ll be on hand to witness all the action. Start time is 2:00. See you then.

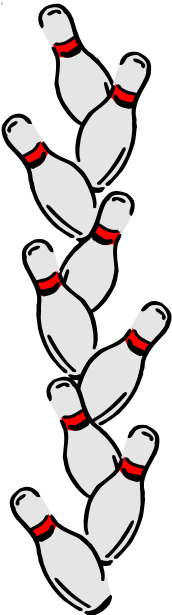
## Greater L.A. Junior Best-Stars At Action Lanes

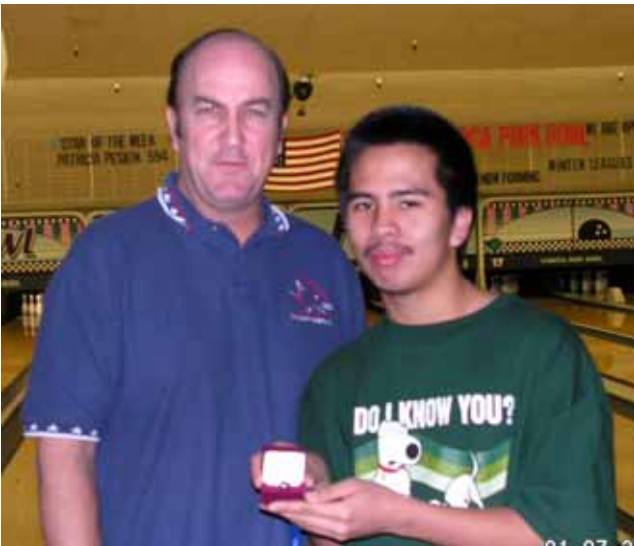
