Granados needed a mark to win and struck on his first shot to secure the victory
As the No. 4 seed following 16 games of qualifying, Granados earned a bye into the best-of-three round of 16 , in which he eliminated Brandon Runk, two games to one. Granados then took out Tom Adcock, 2-0, in the round of eight, and No. 1 seed Graham Fach, 267-237, in the one-game semifinals.

In addition to the Walter Ray Williams Jr. trophy and the $\$ 20,000$ first prize, Granados also earned a spot in the 2022 PBA King of the Lanes series taking place later this year.

Granados, originally from Venezuela and now living in Orlando, Fla., will next compete in the PBA Players Championship South Region qualifying taking place January 15 and 16.
"I plan to go full-time on the national tour this year and see what I can make of it," he said.

# The PBA Year In Review

I always enjoy reading Jef Goodger's column in the International Bowlers Journal Magazine. He has a way with words that is reminiscent of the immortal Chuck Pezzano. While Pezzano was a master at using antonyms and homonyms, Goodger is by far the ultimate writer in the realm of the bowling world when it comes to double entendre (aka, a word or phrase with two different meanings, one often humorous).

Goodger also writes news releases for the Professional Bowlers Association (PBA). It must be difficult for Jef to contain himself as he sticks to the subject and writes within the parameters of the more stoic nomenclature of the PBA. Such was the case in his most recent article posted on the PBA website, the "2021 Guaranteed Rate PBA Tour Season in Review."

One of the things that I found most refreshing about Jef's recap of the 2021 season was an acknowledgment of the leading money winners, a fact that was sometimes completely omitted from news releases during the year. Or was this another of Goodger's subtle uses of double entendre? No matter, because it was effective, and refreshing to finally see a listing of the leaders in tournament earnings.

To no one's surprise, Kyle Troup was the runaway leader with a record total of $\$ 496,900$. That was $\$ 126,570$ more than his closest competitor, Canada's own Francois Lavoie, with a second place haul of $\$ 370,330$. Lavoie's total was $\$ 172,930$ ahead of the number three professional, Tom Daugherty, with $\$ 197,400$ in earnings. To say that Troup and Lavoie dominated the 2021 PBA Tour season is neither an antonym or homonym, and certainly not double entendre... it's a self-evident statement of fact!

## A Capacity For Recognizing Talent

I have always prided myself in an ability to recognize bowling talent. The first time that I noticed this ability was when I witnessed Dave Husted as an eighteen year old practicing at an AMF bowling facility in Portland, Oregon. The crack of the pins when the ball hit the pocket made your head spin. I said to myself, "That young man will one day be a star on the PBA Tour."

Looking back on Goodger's 2021 season in review article, I could not help but notice that my ability to pick 'em must still be with me, as I penned articles way back in March about Troup ("Kyle Troup - A Chip Off The Old Block") and Lavoie ("Francois Lavoie, The Face-Masked Crusader of Bowling"). I followed up with another article about Lavoie in April ("Face-Masked Crusader of Bowling Wins Again... Without a Mask!").

It could be a coincidence that I chose to write about those two bowling super stars so early in the year, but I like to think that I still have that gift of recognizing exceptional talent when I see it. Speaking of coincidence, I also wrote an article about the number four money winner, Anthony Simonsen, although it was much later in the year ("The Coincidence of Interest Between Anthony Simonsen and Billy Hardwick"). Those were the only articles that I wrote focusing on current PBA stars, so I guess you could say that I can still pick 'em.

It should be noted that I did write one other story about the current PBA Tour, but it was my annual drubbing of the format employed in the PBA Strike Derby that was published in July ("PBA Strike Derby Still Did Not Impress"). That's no offense to Andrew Anderson, who admitted practicing the format in his home alleys in Holly, Michigan. Kudos to you, Andrew!

## The Most Valuable Player

While Kyle Troup most definitely earned the Chris Schenkel Player of the Year Award, I can't help but mention the fact that the Most Valuable Player in the PBA is a woman - Colie Edison, the CEO of the PBA, who also doubles as the Chief Customer Officer for Bowlero Corporation, owners of the PBA.

What the PBA has done under Edison's leadership in the past two years of COVID-uncertainty is phenomenal. I first wrote about Colie's incredible determination in April of 2020: "On March 12, 2020, most of the sports world came to a grinding halt when both the National Basketball Association (NBA) and Major League Baseball (MLB) announced cancellation of their games 'until further notice.' Then on March 15, 2020, the Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) not only elected to move forward with the televised finals of the PBA World Championship from Las Vegas, but they added a cool $\$ 100,000$ to the televised finals purse, making the first place prize $\$ 150,000$ !"

Wow. That's leadership. Edison then elected to broadcast most of the remaining events from Florida, where the COVID-hysteria had strangely not affected the economy or human psyche. Her actions reminded me of PBA Hall of Fame member Frank Esposito, as I mentioned in an article a month later: "All of the demonstrations will take place in the same location, Bowlero Lanes in Jupiter, Florida. This was another of Esposito's recommendations, where an entire campaign could be filmed in a weekend and then spread out over an entire season to save costs. Many of Esposito's ideas remain relevant today from the early days of the PBA, which is most likely why he was one of the original eight members enshrined in the PBA Hall of Fame. Take a bow, Colie Edison - Frank Esposito would be proud of what you have done."

In 2022 an incredible 29 telecasts are to be aired on either Fox or Fox Sports 1 (FS1). There has to be a reason for all of this success, and I think that it's Colie Edison.
