Holman, Terrell-**Kearney Elected to USBC** Hall of Fame

ARLINGTON, Texas – A pair of two-time U.S. Open champions, one from the 1980s, the other from the 2000s, have been elected to the United States Bowling Congress Hall of Fame in a worldwide ballot of the Superior Performance category.

Marshall Holman, 55, of Medford, Ore., and Kim Terrell-Kearney, 44, of Grand Prairie, Texas, will join John Handegard and Betty Barnes, who were elected in November by the USBC Hall of Fame Committee in the Veterans and Meritorious Service categories, respectively. All will be inducted May 12 at the International Bowling Campus in Arlington, Texas. It will be the first outdoor induction ceremony in USBC history and will be preceded the previous night by a special dinner in downtown Fort Worth. The public is invited to both events with free admission to the inductions.

Holman won all but one of his 22 Professional Bowlers Association titles between 1975 and 1988. Among his victories were the Firestone Tournament of Champions in 1976 and 1986 and the Bowling Proprietors' Association of America U.S. Open in 1981 and 1985.

'This is something," said Holman, now owner of sev-

eral income tax franchises in Southern Oregon. "It really feels good because it comes at a time when I can look back and reflect on what I did as a bowler. It seems so long ago that I made my living as a bowler.'

"I knew I would receive the news one way or another around the first of the year. While my credentials in the nationals, the old American Bowling Congress and now United States Bowling Congress championships were not stellar, my body of work as a professional was pretty good."

He earned more than \$1.7 million during his 23 years as a PBA touring player. He won the George Young High Average Award in 1982, 1984 and 1987, the latter year also being named the PBA Player of the Year. He was inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame in 1990 and also is a member of the International Jewish Sport, Oregon Sports and Medford Halls of Fame. He has bowled in 15 American Bowling Congress/ USBC Open Championships and Masters, averaging more than 200. His best finish in USBC competition was fourth in the 1986 Masters.

"I'm very appreciative," said Holman. "This is something that I can say at age 55. I was 35 when I was elected into

Scroggins Wins Pepsi Red, White and Blue Open for Seventh Career PBA Tour Title

WICHITA-Mike Scroggins of Amarillo, Texas, flirted with a perfect finish, but settled for an easy victory in winning his seventh career Professional Bowlers Association Tour title in the Pepsi Red, White and Blue Open presented by the United States Bowling Congress at Northrock Lanes.

Scroggins ruined 42-yearold rookie Wayne Garber's bid for his first PBA Tour title, 278-229, to conclude the highest scoring tournament in PBA history. The finals aired Sunday on ESPN.

Scroggins, who struggled in two preliminary matches leading up to the title contest, started the championship match with nine strikes before leaving a 7 pin on his first shot in the 10th frame. He made the spare and left another 7 pin on his fill ball, but the match may have been decided before it even started because the inexperienced Garber made a decision that played right into Scroggins' hands.

Garber, making his first television appearance, earned his berth in the title match by upsetting PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Ocala, Fla., 9-7, in a one-ball, sudden-death roll-off after they had tied at 237-237 and threw matching strikes in the first roll-off frame. As the highest ranking survivor in the ESPN finals, Garber then had the right to select which pair of lanes would be used for the championship match.

Normally, one pair of lanes is used for all TV matches, but because of the unusual sixplayer format used in the Red, White and Blue Open finals, two pairs of lanes were in use. Garber decided to remain on the right pair of lanes where he had just defeated Williams,







The third game was rocky with two solid 7 pins and an open frame split in his first 5 frames and managed to put a string for strikes toesther to and un with his 913. strikes together to end up with his 813.

So that is Malucci's 42nd career certified 300 and 18th career certified

800, the most ever by a deaf bowler in U.S. or in the world.
Surely it is amazing that Malucci finished his fantastic 2009 year with the honor scores to go with his entry in USBC record books which included his two records, most consecutive 700 series in two leagues 17 and most consecutive in one league 17. He was also the top average bowler 247in his Las Vegas USBC Association for the 2009-2009 season.

She also has finished in the top 10 of the WIBC/USBC Women's Championships 16 times, nine of them in the 2000s. And she has placed in the top 10 in the Oueens nine times.

"It's always been dream of mine to be elected to this hall of fame but I wasn't sure if it would be a reality," said Terrell-Kearney, the assistant coach at the new International Training and Research Center. "Staying active certainly helped my cause and getting to 10 wins helped my chanc-

es. I'm entirely proud of what I've done.
"To go in with Marshall given what he's done and being such an icon in our sport is special. It's almost surreal being mentioned in that

Terrell-Kearney first came onto the national bowling scene in 1987 as a collegiate All-American at San Jose State University. That same year she qualified for Team USA, repeating the feat the next year. She was a collegiate All-American in 1988 and later that year was all-events champion in the Federation Internationalé des Quilleurs World Youth Championships. She joined the Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour in 1989 and was named Rookie of the Year. The USBC Hall of Fame was created in 2005 by merging the former ABC and WIBC Halls of Fame. With the two new inductees selected by the committee, there are now 379 members of the USBC Hall of Fame -249 in Performance, 111 in Meritorious Service and 19 Pioneers.
