2019 JBT Las Vegas Main Event

LAS VEGAS – Solomon Salama, Los Angeles, Adel Wahner, Las Cruces NM, and Nathan Tang, Richmond BC, were crowned champs of the 2019 JBT Las Vegas Main Event, hosted by the beautiful South Point Bowling Plaza in Las Vegas. \$43,628 was earned by a sellout field of all ages and averages from all over North America.

Junior Team USA member Salama beat New York resident and Webber college bowler Adam Glickman in the scratch final for the \$4,000 top scholarship prize, while Glickman earned \$2,500. Tang became the first international winner here, beating

Albuquerque's Jared Basey in the handicap final. Tang earned \$2,500 while Basey racked up \$1,500. In a battle of New Mexican ladies, Wahner beat Alvarez for the girls scratch title, good for \$1,500 for Adel and \$1,000 for Yarelis.

Salama and Wahner join Brent Bowers and Elise Bolton as two-time Main Event singles champions. 300 games were rare on the challenging patterns, and were fired by Austin Gilbert, Jacob Mullen (his 2nd at Main Event), Chris Mayes, and Jeremy Cardines. 17 spots were earned to Junior Gold Finals this summer, and 7 bowling balls were raffled off court-

Suelee generally averages 200 but the Women's Club competes on a more challenging oil pattern then most leagues and the bowlers roll each game on a different pair of lanes. No matter, Suelee is up for the challenge.

The Women's Club features a Match Play Format for good money, for "BUCKS". The ladies

bowl one game on a pair of lanes then move to another pair of lanes for each following game. Each game won is worth a point. The competitive format and competitive nature of the league attracts some of the top female bowlers in the area. Suelee is one of those top bowlers.

Rash "Shocks Industry" By Signing With 900 Global

In a major offseason move, Sean Rash, who had spent his entire his entire 15-year PBA career with Brunswick, has signed a multi-year deal with 900 Global heading into the 2020 season.

The move represents a significant investment by 900 Global to enhance its brand awareness through one of the PBA Tour's biggest stars.

"I'm extremely excited about this," Rash told FloBowling exclusively. "It's going to shock the industry. I personally believe it's one of the biggest changes our game has ever seen."

Rash, 37, has been one of the most successful players of his generation, winning 14 titles, including two majors, and is still at the top of his game. He enters 2020 ranked No. 2 in the FloBowling PBA Pre-season Power Rankings.

"What is unique about Sean is he's one of those few players out there that we feel can really move the needle in the bowling industry," 900 Global Vice President of Sales Wes Pye told FloBowling. "He's got a great fan base, he's a great player, he's really come back around and worked on

his game and he's a family guy. He's a little bit like 900 Global. We are out here trying to prove ourselves in this marketplace, and he really fits on our team."

Pye would not confirm the length of the deal with Rash but said the door is open for him to have a long-term future with the

company.

"It's a multi-year commitment and there are a lot of options for Sean," Pye said. "As long as he wants to be a part of this team he's got an open window with us to help us grow 900 Global and be a part of this team for a long time."

2020 Go Bowling PBA Tour Season on FOX Sports Begins with PBA Hall of Fame Classic January 15-19 in Arlington, Texas

ARLINGTON, TX – Bill O'Neill, a two-time winner in 2019, will defend his PBA Hall of Fame Classic title when the 2020 Go Bowling PBA Tour season begins with the tournament named in honor of the sport's immortals Jan. 13-19 at bowling's International Training and Research Center in Arlington, Texas. The FOX Sports finals will air live on FS1 Sunday, Jan. 19 at 10 a.m.

The 38-year-old O'Neill kicked off the 2019 season with a 199-194 championship match win over top qualifier Jakob Butturff. It marked O'Neill's 10th career tour title that appropriately made him title-eligible for inclusion on the 2025 PBA Hall of Fame ballot.

In the PBA Tour's first visit to the ITRC, the FS1 finals telecast marked the debut of its new multi-year television agreement with FOX Sports.

After convincing wins in the second step ladder match against Jesper Svensson (258-219) and



semifinal match against 2019 Chris Schenkel PBA Player of the Year Jason Belmonte (269-188), O'Neill overcame a slow start and took advantage of two open frames by Butturff later in the finale to win his first singles title in nearly three years.

Belmonte's third-place finish in the event was the beginning of his journey to a fifth Player of the Year crown, capping a landmark season in which he won the PBA Tournament of Champions and PBA World Championship for his 10th and 11th major titles, respectively, surpassing Hall

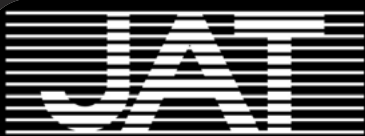
of Famers Pete Weber and Earl Anthony for the lead on the all-time PBA Tour major titles list.

For the second consecutive season, the Hall of Fame Classic will be the first competition points event in a 13-tournament series where players will pursue 24 berths in the second PBA Playoffs that will be begin in April and will culminate with the PBA Playoffs finals at Bowlero North Brunswick May 16-17 in New Jersey. Kris Prather won the inaugural PBA Playoffs and the \$100,000 first prize last June at Bayside Bowl in

Portland, Maine.

For the Hall of Fame Classic, players will face the added challenge of competing on a dual lane condition scoring environment with the 45-foot Dick Weber lane condition applied to the left lane and the 38-foot Mike Aulby condition to the right lane throughout the event.

Qualifying on Wednesday, Jan. 15. Half of the field will bowl at 11 a.m. and the other half will bowl at 5 p.m. Qualifying continues with second-round qualifying on Thursday, Jan. 16 also at 11 a.m. and continued on page 5

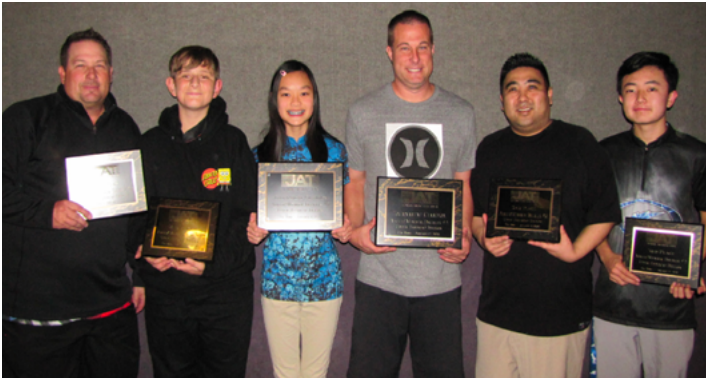

PBA Announces 15-Tournament Schedule for 2020 PBA50 Tour Season

Walter Ray Williams Jr. to defend PBA50 Player of the Year crown

CHICAGO – The Professional Bowlers Association today announced its 15-tournament schedule for the 2020 PBA50 Tour season, providing bowlers 50 and older with four major championships and a new year-end bracket elimination event for 24 PBA50 and PBA60 players.

PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. will defend his PBA50 Player of the Year honor (the third of his career) as a 60-year-old when the season kicks off in Florida with the PBA50 Johnny Petraglia BVL Open presented by Lucas Magazine & Brunswick at Maple Countryside Lanes in Clearwater, Florida, April 19-22. Williams, the all-time Go Bowling PBA Tour titles leader with 47 wins, also will be trying for his 15th career PBA50 Tour title which will give him sole possession of the all-time titles lead on both PBA national tours. He is currently tied with John Handegard for the PBA50 Tour career titles lead with 14 wins. Among the newcomers joining the all-star cast of PBA Hall of Famers expected to compete on the PBA50 Tour in 2020 will be PBA Hall of Famer and 13-time PBA Tour winner Jason Couch.

After the season-opening Petraglia BVL Open, the season’s first major returns to Spanish Springs Lanes in The Villages for the Florida Blue PBA50 National Championship April 26-30. The PBA50 Tour’s newest major will be familiar to Go Bowling PBA Tour fans when South Plains Lanes in Lubbock, Texas hosts the PBA50 Lubbock Sports Cup presented by South Plains Lanes May 16-19.

The season’s other two majors will return to Las Vegas for the USBC Senior Masters May 31-June 7 at Sam’s Town and the Suncoast PBA Senior U.S. Open presented by Storm June 7-12 at the Suncoast Bowling Center.

The PBA50 Tour will also make return trips to Mooresville, North Carolina; Brentwood, California; Monticello, Minnesota, as well as Indiana stops in Hammond and Anderson before concluding the season in Michigan with visits to Wyoming and Jackson.

Two PBA60 events open exclusively to players 60 and older include the USBC Super Senior Classic May 27-31 at Sam’s Town and the season-ending PBA60 Dick Weber Championship in Jackson Aug. 23-25.

New for 2020, 13 events on the schedule conducted by PBA will include a special “bracket” side event competition for both the PBA50 and PBA60 divisions that will pay additional prize money for the first three bracket finishers within each tournament. The bracket program, which requires no additional entry fee, will also have its own year-long points list which will determine the top 24 players from each division for an end-of-season bracket championship. Details on the new PBA50/PBA60 bracket elimination program and season finale will be announced later.

All PBA50/60 events will be covered start to finish by PBA’s online streaming partner FloBowling. For subscription and schedule information visit www.flobowling.com.

Belmo's \$288,290 Top PBA Earnings For 2019

There were more six-figure winners on the PBA Tour in 2019 than any other point in the decade as Jason Belmonte led the way with \$288,290.

In all, nine players earned more than \$100,000 last season, the most since the 2012-13 season when eight players eclipsed the milestone.

For Belmonte, it’s the third consecutive year and fifth out of the past six seasons he has topped the earnings list. His total in 2019 far exceeded the \$110,500 he earned in 2018. In 2017, Belmonte took home \$238,912, his previous career best.

The last player to earn more in a season than Belmonte did in 2019 was Mika Koivuniemi, who pocketed \$333,040 during the 2010-11 season. A big chunk of that came from a \$250,000 payday when he won the PBA Tournament of Champions.

Here are the top 50 in PBA Tour earnings for the 2019 season, provided by the PBA. The amounts only include prize money earned in events and do not include any sponsorship money players may have earned.

WINNETKA – It’s often said that the mark of a very good bowler is one’s ability to convert spares. If that’s true, then Carole Peire should move to the head of the class.

Carole, who bowls in the Funtimers senior league at Winnetka Bowl, has proved deadly in her spare shots.

Last month she did it again – another all-spares game (a spare in each of the 10 frames) that allowed her to win a patch for her efforts.

Carole, a right-hander, has bowled for 10 years and she honestly has no idea how many all-spares games she has compiled. But she knows one thing: It happens frequently – perhaps as often as one for every two or three years that she’s bowled.

She finished with an all-spares score of 181 in her latest outing, which she modestly termed “not very good.”

But she acknowledged that she was “elated” when she rolled the final spare of her 181.

Teammate Bev Zietz was more ebullient about Carole’s spare-making. Bev said she wasn’t surprised at all by Carole’s streak of spares. “I have total faith in her. I’m totally impressed,” Bev said.

Overhearing Bev’s comments, Carole shot back with a big smile: “We’re also best friends.”

Carole, who like Bev is a nurse, was asked what made her a top-notch spare bowler. “Confidence,” said a beaming Carole, who is averaging 154 this season with a high game of 191.

Carole added that her all-spares games don’t rank as the top highlight in her bowling career. Rather, she said, her memorable moments come “when I get multiple strikes.”

She said she’s had five strikes in a row for her best. “Spares I don’t feel is a big problem,” she said. “Strikes are difficult for me to get.”

For Carole, making spares is routine. And that definitely is a sign of someone who’s making her mark.

Rash won two titles in 2019 and had his best season in the past few years, finishing third in points and fifth in earnings.

Every win in Rash’s career has come while a member of Brunswick’s staff and that includes the 2007 USBC Masters and 2012 PBA Tournament of Champions, his two biggest career wins.

Early last season, he won the Mark Roth-Marshall Holman PBA Doubles Championship with Matt Ogle and went on to cap off the FloBowling PBA Summer Tour with a win at the FloBowling PBA Wolf Open. He also won the PBA China Tiger Cup, a non-title event that was the PBA’s first event in China.

Rash said he has been throwing 900 Global equipment for about a week as he prepares for the 2020 PBA Tour, which begins next week with the PBA Hall of Fame Classic. That event will be broadcast live on FloBowling.

“My comfort level is 100 percent,” Rash said. “I’ve been bowling with them for about a week now and they make great products. I have some favorites in mind already.”

900 Global, which is based in San Antonio, is owned by Storm’s Bill and Barbara Chrisman. Pye said 900 Global staffers aren’t able to throw Storm or Roto Grip equipment, but they do share ball reps on the PBA Tour.

Barnes has been the company’s biggest name on the PBA Tour in recent years and extended his contract last month. The 900 Global staff also includes Anthony Lavery-Spahr, Sam Cooley and Chris Sloan, among others.

Rash originally signed with Brunswick in 2002 when he was a collegiate player at Wichita State and reflected on his time with the company.

“I want to say thank you to Brunswick for an amazing 17 years,” Rash said. “I’ve had some tremendous bosses and built unbelievable relationships throughout the world. They basically got me to where I am now. I’m starting a fresh chapter in my life, and I couldn’t be more excited about it.”

DOWNEY – Two weeks into the third round of the Brunswick Invitational there were two teams with matching 9-1 records, Forest Lanes and US Foods, and they would square off on the top pair. DV8 has already locked a spot in the roll offs, by winning the first round, but total wins are important for seeding, so they'll be grinding for more all season long. Jon Huff topped DV8 with 237-211/636, leading them to the sweep.

Threadworks had no problem taking all five from **Century 21—PEAK** on the next pair, winning all three games by more than 100 pins. Chris Eguilos topped the pair by more than 80 pins, shooting 210-211-238/659.

Tito's Vodka took on **Bowlum** on the next pair. In this match, each game was fairly close, with the biggest win being 29 pins, but all of them fell in favor of Tito's Vodka for the 5-0 sweep. Tito's took the first game by 29, the second by 15 and the finale by 28. Brian Main led the way for Tito's with 214-221/595.

Captain Morgan beat **Team Hu\$tle** by 157 pins in the opener to take a commanding early lead for totals. Ramiro Garcia led Captain Morgan with 235. In the second game, they increased their lead by another 100, as Garcia stayed hot with 230. Donell Carter helped in this one with a 224. Team Hu\$tle rallied in the final game, posting a big 854 behind Jaime Carrington's 245 game. While they easily won that game, totals were never in danger as Captain Morgan won the match
