**All the Right Moves**



Wes Malott captured his third career Denny's PBA Tour title.

MEDFORD, Ore.—As the only right-handed bowler in Sunday's championship round, Wes Malott thought he might have an advantage against his left-handed opponents. Turns out, he was right.

Malott defeated rookie Rhino Page, 255-193, to win the 2008 Lumber Liquidators Earl Anthony Medford Classic at Lava Lanes to capture his third career Denny's PBA Tour title.

The 31-year-old had finished second in his last three championship rounds and four of the last five, but he finally put it all together, striking in 17 of 22 frames in his two matches. The outcome of the two matches were never really in question, a contrast to his recent losses on TV. In three of his last four title-match losses, his margin of defeat was eight pins or less.

"Once we got to the show I knew the lefties would have to go through a transition," Malott (Argyle, Texas) said. "In that first semifinal match, neither of them struck from the fifth frame on so I knew it was starting to transition. I still had to bowl well and thankfully I did and brought it home."

In the title match against Page, who was making history as the first rookie since Mike Durbin in 1967 to make three championship rounds, Malott jumped out to an early lead with strikes in the first four frames. After looking dominant in his first match, a 230-190 win over Patrick Allen, Page never caught up to the transition and failed to string two strikes together after starting the match with a double. It was another disappointing finish for the 24-year-old phenom, who has finished second twice and fifth in his three championship round appearances. He is still well on his way to the PBA Rookie of the Year award as

he sits in the top 10 in the PBA World Point Rankings, all while having to go through the Denny's PBA Tour Qualifying Rounds each week.

Malott, meanwhile, moved up to third in the PBA Player of the Year race behind Allen and leader Walter Ray Williams Jr. Page moved into seventh on the list.

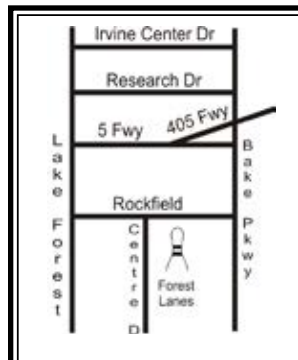
Malott advanced to the title match with a 245-235 win over Parker Bohn III. Malott started the match with six consecutive strikes and never looked back, striking in the eighth and ninth frames to clinch the match.

In the first semifinal, Page jumped ahead of Allen early with strikes in the first five frames which turned out to be enough as neither bowler struck in the final five frames. Allen, who was making his fourth consecutive championship round appearance, had just three strikes in the match and an open in the fourth frame.

Malott earned \$25,000 and an exemption for the 2008-09 season with his win. Page (Topeka, Kan.) earned \$13,000 for second while Bohn (Jackson, N.J.) and Allen (Wesley Chapel, Fla.) took home \$6,000 each for third and fourth, respectively.

## O'Keefe Named Finalist For Oregon's Top Athlete in 2007

*Breakthrough year for Team USA member nets Oregon Sports Awards nomination*

GREENDALE, Wis.— Team USA's Shannon O'Keefe, a native of Oregon City, Ore., has been named a women's finalist for the 2007 Harry Glickman Professional Athlete of the Year Award, an honor bestowed upon Oregon's top athlete for the calendar year.

The winner will be announced on Jan. 27 at the 56th annual Oregon Sports Awards show, which air live from 7-9 p.m. Pacific on Comcast SportsNet in Oregon from the Tiger Woods Center on the Nike World Campus in Beaverton, Ore.

O'Keefe, 28, had a breakthrough year in 2007 - highlighted by her singles gold medal at the Women's World Championships in Monterrey, Mexico, and runner-up finish at the U.S. Women's Open. In the U.S. Women's Open quarterfinals, she rolled a 299 game - nationally televised on ESPN - to defeat fellow Team USA member Stefanie Nation.

"It's nice that all the hard work and dedication I've put into the sport, along with the support I've received from my teammates and family, is being recognized with this honor," said O'Keefe, a former softball standout at Portland State University who is enter-

ing her fourth consecutive year on Team USA in 2008. "Not only is it an honor for me, but it's also an honor for our sport to be recognized alongside other sports and athletes. This year has helped me grow, as a better bowler and as a better person."

More highlights for O'Keefe in 2007 include a fifth-place finish at the prestigious United States Bowling Congress Queens and helping lead Team USA to the team silver medal at the Women's World Championships for the second time in her career.

Other women's finalists for the Harry Glickman Professional Athlete of the Year Award are Kara Braxton of the WNBA's Detroit Shock and Christine Sinclair of the Canadian national soccer team as well as track and field athletes Kara Goucher and Maria Mutola, who won the award in 2003.

The Oregon Sports Awards, which are voted on by a statewide media panel, annually honors the state's top athletes, coaches and teams. Emmy award-winning sportscaster Ahmad Rashad will be the master of ceremonies, and numerous sports celebrities will present the various awards.

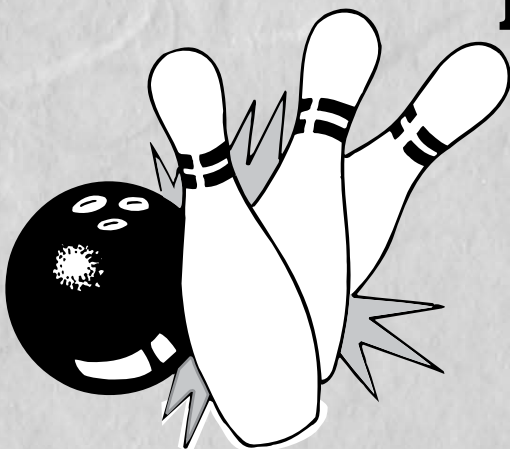

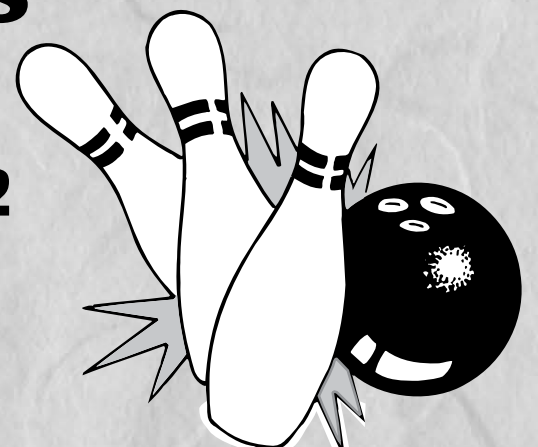

SANTA PAULA—Since I moved to Santa Paula—a small (pop. 29,100) agricultural community located 15 miles east of Ventura—I don't get to see some of my friends as often as in years past.

Santa Paula, by the way, is like living in paradise. No smog. No traffic. No crime, to speak of. And best of all, no stress or strain.

After living in Los Angeles most of my life, I moved to Santa Paula—"the Citrus Capital of the World"—almost four years ago. Since then, I've gotten a new lease on life. I tell my friends that I feel better now than I did 20 years ago.

But that's enough about me. As I was saying, I don't see some of my friends as often as before. Instead, I call them every once in a while to touch bases. I also called some of them during the Christmas season.

One of the guys I called was Red Pfeiffer, who founded the Northern California-based Bowling World. Pfeiffer eventually sold the fine monthly tenpin publication to Donna Hazel, and retired, sort of.

I also called Chuck Pezzano, the USBC and PBA Hall of Famer who lives across the country in New Jersey. It seems that everyone in bowling knows him.

Pezzano was a star bowler at Rutgers University. He was a charter member of the Professional Bowlers Assn. He was the PBA secretary and historian. He was the PBA Eastern Regional tournament director. And he is a multi-award-winning syndicated bowling columnist.

That's not all. Pezzano was the PBA television coordinator for many years during the "good ol' days," when the Pro Bowlers Tour got record TV ratings as the lead-in show for "The Wide World of Sports."

I happened to mention to Pezzano that I had just talked with Red Pfeiffer. "Funny you should mention Red," Pezzano said. "He's just been nominated for the Flowers for the Living Award."

This award, originated by onetime Associated Press sports editor Fritz Howell, is presented annually by the Bowling Writers Assn. of America. It has been given to some of the biggest names in bowling...and is highly coveted.

Pezzano and I both agreed that Pfeiffer was a worthy candidate for the award. "I can't believe that Red has never received an award—any award—from the BWAA," Pezzano said.

Pfeiffer has an extensive—and rather amazing—background in the sport of bowling. Here are just some of the things he has done...

1) In addition to the Bowling World, he published a newspaper for junior bowlers in Northern California; 2) founded the Rosy Duval Memorial Tournament 27 years ago; 3) past president (seven years) of the Bay Area Sportswriters & Sportscasters; 4) sportscaster for the TV Channel 42 bowling shows; 5) sportscaster for Radio KKIS bowling shows; 6) did seven live bowling shows with "Whispering" Joe Wilson; 7) radio announcer for the Miller's Doubles Tournament in Reno; 8) exceed many local men's and women's association dinners; 9) assisted in publishing the Golden Nugget magazine for the California Women's Bowling Assn.; 10) was the general manager of Monument Bowl (40 lanes).

There's more. Pfeiffer is a member of both the Diablo Assn. men's and women's Halls of Fame and the Alameda Men's Assn. Hall of Fame. And he's been a BWAA member since 1967.

When the PBA Tournament of Champions is held Jan. 23-27 at the new Red Rock Lanes in Las Vegas, Chuck Pezzano is hoping to be there. "If I can't make it, it'll be the first Tournament of Champions I've ever missed," he said.

If Pezzano does find his way to the T of C, he will be reunited with his two old Hall of Fame cronies, John Jowdy and Dick Evans. In years past, this terrific trio was known as "The Three Musketeers of Bowling."

Tenpin Slants also will be on hand at the T of C, and in the interest of investigative journalism, I will report any raucous behavior by these three movers and shakers of bowling.

FINAL ITEM: Hall of Famer Jeanette Robinson reminds eligible bowlers that it's time to send in your entries if you hope to compete in the 18th edition of her National Golden Ladies Classic.

This annual funfest takes place March 10-13 at the Orleans Hotel/Casino/Bowling Center in Las Vegas. Entry fee is \$150, all of which goes into the prize fund—plus added monies from The Orleans, tournament cosponsor Storm Products, and other patrons of bowling. First place is worth \$2,000.

New faces this year will include a couple of Hall of Famers and touring pros, Robin Romeo and Jeanne Naccarato. Although many in the field will be bowling for the fun and camaraderie, the competition is always first class.

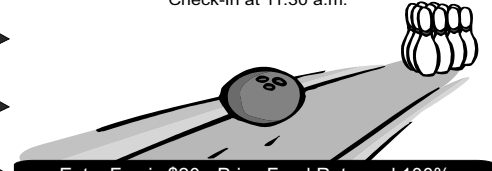
