Bohn Pulls Off Fairy Tale Victory in PBA World Championship

PBA Hall of Famer follows unlikely path to claim 33rd career title, second major

LAS VEGAS – Parker Bohn III of Jackson, N.J., completed one of the most impressive, if unlikely, victories in his hall of fame career, defeating four opponents including top qualifier Jason Belmonte of Australia, 254-227, to win the PBA World Championship at South Point Hotel and Casino.

The concluding event of the GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling IV, and the first major championship of the 2012-13 PBA Tour season, aired Sunday on ESPN.

Bohn, who had not won a title in more than four years, captured his 33rd PBA Tour title – and second major – with a stunning performance that began when he claimed the 24th and final position in match play by only three pins, followed by qualifying for the stepladder finals by only nine pins.

In the championship round, he defeated Canada's Dan MacLelland, 226-218; Rhino Page of Dade City, Fla., 200-170, and reigning PBA Player of the Year Sean Rash of Montgomery, Ill., 278-231, to advance to the title match where he defeated Belmonte.

In winning the World Championship, Bohn became only the third ever to win a major championship after qualifying 24th for match play (Mike Aulby won the 1989 U.S. Open and Pete Weber won the 1991 U.S. Open after qualifying 24th), and the 15th overall to accomplish that feat. At age 49 years, 122 days he

also became the second-oldest player ever to win the PBA World Championship (Tom Baker was 49 years, 192 days when he won in 2004).

"Dreams do come true if you wait long enough, I guess," Bohn said. "It was a lot of destiny, a lot of things working in my favor."

Bohn, who almost cancelled his plans to attend the World Series after Super Storm Sandy devastated his home state, began his miraculous title quest with seven strikes in his first nine frames en route to his victory over MacLelland. In the second match, he got help in overcoming a 10-pin deficit when Page missed a 7 pin spare attempt in the eighth frame and opened again in the ninth

The veteran left-hander started the semifinal match against Rash with seven strikes and never trailed. In the title match, he struck on eight of his first 10 shots against Belmonte, but didn't break away until Belmonte left 10 pins in the seventh and ninth frames.

"When I look at everything that's gone on this week," Bohn said, hesitating. "I looked at (my wife) Leslie the night before I left and said, you know, it's a tossup over whether I even go. The only thankful grace at that point was we had our power back a couple of hours before I left.

"When I got here, I missed the first practice session, but lo and behold, I kept going throughout the week. I never made the top 16 in any of the

events, but still found myself fortunate enough to sneak in to match play in 24th. I just kept plugging along.

"The only pin I threw away all week was on one fill ball, when I threw a 7 pin away. That's the only pin I can remember throwing away the entire week. Every pin mattered. I only made the top 24 by three pins, and then I made the TV show by less than 10 pins as well."

When he got to the ESPN finals, Bohn believes divine intervention came into play.

"I do believe my old friend (the late Tony Reyes) was looking down on me and letting me stand tall. The biggest key was going through the nose in the seventh frame against (Rash). A pin rolls out of nowhere and takes out the 4-7, and I get a strike. Usually whoever wins has one or two breaks and I'm

here to tell you, I had my share of breaks today."

Throughout the World Series, Bohn said he was bowling for more than himself.

"My wife and I have created a Striking Out Sandy fund. We're trying to raise funds for kids who unfortunately lost everything," Bohn said. "I know there are families that lost everything, but hopefully there will be other people who can take care of them. We had people who were donating money for every strike during qualifying. All of the money we're raising is going to buy kids backpacks and things they need for school so they can hopefully put the past behind them.

"My heart always goes out to kids," he added. "I've got five children myself and I want them to be able to live life as normally as they can. I had one guy compute all of the strikes I threw in qualifying and match play – 415 or 420 – and he put up \$1 a pin himself. We had another guy who lives in upstate New York near my brother-in-law Doug Kent and his wife Chrissie who had a 25-foot trailer. He saw what we were doing on our website, and filled the trailer with clothes and supplies, and delivered it to our area."

Information about the Striking Out Sandy program can be found of parkerbohn. com. "It'll be there for a long time to come, because I can't tell you how much the people back east have gone through," Bohn said. "It's not going to get corrected by tomorrow."

While the hardships friends and family faced were fresh on his mind, Bohn might have been the happiest he has ever been after winning a PBA title.

"I'm as happy as I can be," he grinned. "Now I can say that I'm the world champion." ESPN's coverage of the 2012-13 PBA Tour season continues next Sunday with the finals of the Round1 Japan Cup from Tokyo, Japan, at 3 p.m. ET. The all-new PBA League then makes its debut with a live two-hour ESPN telecast from Thunderbowl Lanes in Allen Park, Mich., at noon ET on Sunday, Jan. 27.



MARK FISSER 967 WINS SCDB CLASSIC AT AMF CARTER LANES

FULLERTON — Southern California Deaf Bowlers held its 50th Deaf Bowlers Handicap Singles Classic last Saturday at AM Carter Lanes and the winner is Mark Fisser for his 4th title. The event drew 36 entries and left-hander Fisser who is the first and only deaf bowler honored for the USBC 1987 Chuck Hall Star of Tomorrow, made good on the last (4 PM) squad with score of 967. Previously Fisser, Aviso Viejo had won in 1995, 2000 and 2005.

Fissser's four games were 227-278-233-181 for 919 plus 48 handicap 967 for the first place prize of \$320. He was just 13 pins ahead of Francisco Navarro's 954 which was rolled on the first (12 Noon) squad with games of 279-172-215-204 for 870 plus 84 handicap. Navarro got the 2nd place prize of \$160 plus \$25 special prize of high handicap score on the first squad. Although Navarro's 279 was the high game of the tournament, he did not enter the optional high game prize. So Fisser's 278 got the \$30 prize.

Third place \$75 prize went to Simi Valley's left-hander Bob Jones with his all twos games of 237-225-211-211 for 884 plus 64 handicap for 948 rolled on the last squad. Fourth place \$65 prize claimed by left-hander Jeff Stansell, South Gate for his 931 from 264-201-185-161 for 811 plus 120 handicap made on the first squad.

Former champion (2011) Ken DeGroff, Sunland bowling with zero handicap, made a gallant attempt to win again. But he was stymied by his 2nd game 195 after games of 244-255-236 for 930 in his try in the last squad. However DeGroff cashed in 5th place for \$55 and also the high scratch series on the last squad special prize of \$25.

One of 3 women who cashed in this Classic, Anita Lorenzo, Thousand Oaks scored 699 for her 4 games plus 224 handicap for 923 placed 6th for \$40. She also got the women's special prize of \$25 for the high handicap series.

The last year's champion Robert Audette, Chino had one bad game of 166 in his 755 plus 164 handicap for 919 to place7th for \$35. Dennis Hoffman, Hemet who last October won the Deaf Senior Bowlers of America Match Play Title, rolled 750 plus 160 handicap for 910 to get 8th place \$30 prize. Patricia Morford started with the women's high game 218 in her 664 plus 236 handicap for 900 to place 9th \$25. Pablo Yoma, Lake Elsinore rolled his high game 256 in 3rd game of 803 plus 88 handicap 891 for 10th place \$25. The last place \$25 went to Linda Salcedo, South Gate bowling in this Classic for her first time with 541 plus 340 handicap for 881. Club President Ed Abakumoff got \$20 for his 268 optional high game.



The cut scores were High +108 for the men and +66 for the women, on a medium shot this week. The Super Seniors added to the board (two men and one Woman) Bob Selner +100, Robert Ricketts + 75, and Patti Brode +33. Super seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 52 bowlers making it to the semi-finals. During the 4 pm squad, we had ABTA Veteran Le Star Walker bowl a perfect game, 300, at Linbrook, Congrats to Le Star. He is One of the Good Guys!!

High qualifiers for the tournament were Kurt Valmonte for the men with a +221 and for the women it was Tess Dizon with a +121. They will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Each week our top seed draws the Match Series, and this time it was worth \$1,092. Kurt drew a 536. We had one bowler that bowled the score and it was Faye Josafat, she took home \$1,092. Faye was buying the beer:_))) We will estimate the Match Series at \$1,400 at South Point Hotel & Casino event. David Emrich outlasted the field in the 3-6-9 pot. He would miss on his first shot. He will get a \$50 consulation. We will go for \$2,200 next week at South Point Hotel &

In our optional doubles, finishing in first were Kent Maruyama and Matt Garcia with a 1565 for \$140. Finishing in second was Le Star Walker and Vuong Do with a 1558 for \$120. There was a total of

\$1,880 paid out in doubles and 34 paid spots with low to cash of 1426.

The semi-finals took the floor and, finishing in first was Mark Fisser with a +193 to sit out and bowl for the title. A close second was Jon Baraca at +156 so he would sit out the first round of the Single elim finals. Fisser, our top seed had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$3,500. Mark drew a 169. After a review of all the scores bowled, we had three bowlers who shot that score. The winners were Matt Garcia, Shelly Maxey, and Chonthida Athiprayoon. They each took home \$1,166. We still have two full pots, so it will be \$3,500 at South Point Hotel & Casino with a third pot started that is at \$140.

This would bring us to our top 16 Match Play finals. In the first round, the seven losers were Beth Borci, Le Star Walker, Wai Li, Stan Por, Kent Maruyama, Anthony Ta, and Thomas Licauco, each will get \$100. In the second round, the four losers were Deborah Sanders, Rachel Macias, Rithy Ath, and Angel Hilvano with each getting checks of \$105.

This would get us down to the final five bowlers. The weekly horses are paying a low of \$35, Vuong Do, to a high of \$94, Joey Nepomuceno. In one match, the tenth seed Kurt Valmonte versus Joey Nepomuceno (the eleventh seed) was another of Kurt's run at trying to get to the title match. He would take down Joey and advance to the semi-final match. In the other match, it was Vuong Do the sixth seed versus Jonathan Barraca the second seed. This match saw Vuong who was on his game and took down Jonathan to advance. Joey and Jonathan finished in fourth and fifth getting checks for \$110 each.

Our semi-final match was all set now, and would pit the tenth and sixth seeds from the semis against each other. In the weekly "horses", we would see Kurt paying \$47 and Vuong paying \$35 if they would win their match. This was again another good match that would go down to the tenth frame before it was decided. Kurt started out with a spare and that brought up Vuong who opened up with a double. Kurt would miss the four pin in the second frame and then get a spare in the third. Vuong came up in his half of the third with another strike to pull within seven pins. But an open in the fourth put Kurt back in control. Kurt would come up with a couple of strikes in his two frames, but Vuong would come up and match that. Kurt in the sixth got a third strike and then an open in the seventh, he led by 26 pins at that point. Vuong would come up with a strike in the seventh and a spare in the eighth would pull him within 3 pins. Kurt came up with a spare and strike his eighth and ninth frames. That would bring Vuong up in the ninth and tenth frames. Vuong started out with strike in the ninth to match Kurt to stay within 3 pins. But he left the 4 pin on his first ball and got the spare .That would bring Kurt up just needing a mark to advance. He would get a strike and then a spare to finish out with a 200/238 to Vuong's 223/244 and advance to the title match. Vuong would take home \$200 for his third place finish. For those lucky "investors" that had Kurt as a horse. he paid \$47.

Kurt came up in his 3rd & 4th frames with spares, while Mark would come up in his 4th & 5th to spare. But still trail by 45 pins. Kurt would open in the 5th & 6th frames, while Mark came up with strike in the 6th & 7th frames to pull within 15 pins. Kurt would match and double to pull back out to a 22 pin lead and not look back. He would finish out with a 185/243 to Marks 191/215 and take home his first ABTA title. He would take home \$1,000 for the victory and an additional \$1,700 for Cash and Carry, to give him a total of \$2,700. Mark (One of the Good Guys) would take home \$500 for his second place finish.






