

Southern California Junior Grand Championships Wrap Up \$173,300 In Scholarship Awards

Tristan Perham, Christopher Koehler, Aiden Starr and Travis Ward Take Titles


LAKEWOOD - The Bowling Proprietors of Southern California hosted the finale to the Summer Shootout series of scholarship events at Cal Bowl this

The Southern California Junior Grand Championships saw 129 junior bowlers take the lanes with their eyes on some big scholarship money.

The tournament consisted of three 5-game blocks contested on three distinct patterns. Block A was a 35' light volume pattern, Block B was a 47' medium volume long pattern and Block C was a 40' Challenge

The finals were contested on a different 40' Challenge pattern. The bowlers' skills were definitely tested on the challenge of the low-ratio conditions. Scholarship money was awarded to every participant, with the top-5 bowlers earning an amount for their qualifying position, as well as an amount for their finishing position, putting more weight on the achievement of the 15-games of qualifying.

In the A Division (Bowlers over 185 average), after 15 games of qualifying, the Top-5 rolloffs were set with Daniel Hong at +336, Brandon Rother at +297, Tristan Perham at +206, Bryce Nakunz at +176 and Kaven Massey taking the last spot at +73. Evan Magsino was just 2 pins shy finishing in 6th for a \$900 scholarship. In the stepladder finals, (4) Bryce Nakunz d. (5) Kaven Massey 217-140, (3) Tristan continued on page 5

PBA Tour Finals Returns to CBS Sports Network for 2024, 2025

A two-year media rights extension keeps the superstar-filled PBA Tour Finals on CBS Sports Network

RICHMOND, VA — The PBA and CBS Sports Network have agreed to a twoyear media rights extension to continue televising the PBA Tour Finals in 2024 and 2025.

The 2024 PBA Tour Finals will be held June 8-9 at Steel City Bowl and Brews in Bethlehem, Pa. Each event will consist of nine hours of live bowling on CBS Sports Network.

"CBS Sports Network delivers one of our most action-packed weekends every year with the PBA Tour Finals," said PBA Commissioner Tom Clark. "We are excited to continue building upon this relationship over the next two years."

The top eight PBA Tour players, as determined by competition points earned over the previous two seasons, qualify for the PBA Tour Finals. Points can be earned during the 2024 season through April's PBA Tournament of Champions.

The format rewards the PBA Tour's premier players, who annually produce historic performances at the PBA Tour Finals.

During last season's event, Jason Belmonte rolled a perfect 300 game for the second consecutive year while becoming the first player to record three career televised perfect games in their career.

Kyle Troup, who also shot a perfect game in the 2022 Tour Finals, won the 2023 event for his 10th career PBA Tour title.

Qualifying rounds for the 2024 PBA Tour Finals will take place on June 8, with the players divided into two groups based on their seeding.

On June 9, each group will compete in a stepladder to determine the two finalists. The championship match will air following the group stepladders.

Johnny Petraglia Deserves A Lifetime Community Service Award

A recent article by Nolan Hughes at the pba.com website caught my eye when I learned that Johnny Petraglia would be receiving the 2023 Community Service Award. I guess my first reaction was... What took so long? The award recognizes a current PBA member who exemplifies extraordinary community service, charitable or educational contributions over the course of a PBA season.

The award has been in existence since 2013, and I was surprised to see in the list of recipients that Petraglia has never won. My immediate thought is that the PBA should create another award that exemplifies those same contributions over a career, and then just give it to Petraglia every year!

What Johnny has done in his career, both on and off the lanes, is a textbook model for any professional athlete to follow. I remember meeting him for the first time while I was still in high school, in 1968. He had just returned from Vietnam and was doing an exhibition at Fairfield Bowl, near Travis Air Force Base in Fairfield, California.

Word came in the form of a flier at L & L Lanes in Sebastopol, and one of the parents asked if we would like to go with him to see this young pro bowler. There were four of us that jumped at the chance, and we made the two hour trip, cutting directly across the state on some back roads to Fairfield. I'm sure those roads are all engulfed with vineyards now.


The 40 lane Fairfield Bowl was packed for the Petraglia event. I'm not sure if it was because he had just returned from Vietnam, or because of the close proximity to Travis Air Force Base, or just what it was, but the place was completely filled with bowlers and onlookers for the better part of a day. It was set up like a Pro-Am event, but the only real star that I remember seeing was Johnny, along with a number of top local pros and semi-professionals that were paired with amateurs on each pair of lanes.

At one point Petraglia did roll a three game match against the top bowler in the area, Reno Soucy, who had rolled a sanctioned 868 in league play at Fairfield Bowl, which was among the highest series in the history of bowling; that is, until the limited distance dressing rule changed everything in 1988.

Johnny Petraglia is now approaching 60 years as a member of the PBA, with 14 career titles. His best years came in 1994, when the 47 year old rolled a perfect 300 game on national television, valued at \$100,000; and in 1971, when he was embroiled with Don Johnson in a battle for the top spot in earnings on the

PBA Tour. Both Petraglia and Johnson broke the former single season earnings record, but it was Johnny coming out on top with total earnings of \$85,065 (Johnson's total was \$81,349).

Many of Petraglia's years on the tour were lean in terms of tournament earnings, but he always had Brunswick there to back him up. One of the greatest things that ever happened to Johnny was the LT-48 Bowling Ball which carried his signature. The ball was actually developed by Lou Trier, a chemist, at the age of 48 (three years later he developed the LT-51 with another staffer, Tommy Hudson, providing his signature).

Jim Mailander was the product manager in those years at Brunswick, and he later came to work for AMF as an acquisitions manager, where he had the office right next to mine. Jim would often joke at lunchtime about how he made Petraglia a very wealthy man because under the terms of the agreement, Johnny received a 50 cent royalty on every ball sold. Hudson also received the same 50 cent royalty, but the LT-51 never enjoyed the popularity of the LT-48.

Hughes reports in his article that Petraglia has worked countless hours with military veterans and helped to raise millions of dollars through his work with Bowlers to Veterans Link (BVL), a charity dedicated to funding recreation therapy programs for veterans. Here's an interesting excerpt from the Hughes piece:

Petraglia said his inspiration began shortly after returning home in 1968. He said a group of United States senators organized one athlete from every sport to visit patients in Veterans Health Administration (VA) hospitals. As the least heralded athlete, Petraglia said they paired him with perhaps the most prominent athlete in attendance — Jesse Owens.

"I learned so much from him in those couple of days about how to talk to the patients, especially the patients in intensive care wards," Petraglia said. "He was just this wonderful and gentle man and he knew exactly how to talk to everybody. He really inspired me. I found out about the BVL soon after and thought to myself that I've got to stick with this and do what I can."

In November, Petraglia celebrated his 50th year working with BVL. The organization has raised more than \$56 million supporting veterans by funding recreation therapy programs, clinics and community based counseling centers since their inception in 1942. In addition to his work with BVL, Petraglia said that he also coaches youth bowlers and helps them to earn college scholarships. There's even a scholarship bearing his name in partnership with the Bowl4Life foundation.

What an amazing man, and story...

Tristan Perham had control of the match with a 10th frame split keeping the score close as he took the title 188-186. Kaven Massey earns \$1500 for 5th, Bryce Nakunz \$2000 for 4th, Brandon Rother \$2750 for 3rd, Daniel Hong \$3500 for 2nd and Tristan Perham \$3250 for the win.

In the B Division (averages 161-185), after 15 games of qualifying, it was Christopher Koehler leading the pack at -146, followed by Eddie Torres -215, Noah Chargualaf -239, Dylan Ingram -239 and Joshua Yamauchi at -243. In the finals, (5) Joshua Yamauchi d. (4) Dylan Ingram 186-160, Joshua Yamauchi d. (3) Noah Chargualaf 148-126, Joshua Yamauchi d. (2) Eddie Torres 186-171 to set up the Championship Match of (1) Christopher Koehler vs. Joshua Yamauchi. The match was close until a stone-8 derailed Joshua Yamauchi's comeback as Christopher Koehler struck out to a 222-172 win. Dylan Ingram earns \$1750 for 5th, Noah Chargualaf \$2250 for 4th, Eddie Torres \$2750 for 3rd, Joshua Yamauchi \$2250 for 2nd and Christopher Koehler \$4000 for the win.

In the C Division (averages 136-160), after 15 games the leader was Cameron Peterson -489, followed by Neel Kankariya -501, Aiden Starr -550, Sierra Terry -593 and Kaili Purugganan -644. In the stepladder, (4) Sierra Terry d. (5) Kaili Purugganan 207-170, (3) Aidan Starr d. Sierra Terry 171-146, Aiden Starr d. (2) Neel Kankariya 177-144 with Aidan Starr advancing to the Championship Match against (1) Cameron Peterson. The match went down to the final frames as it was the three-seed Aiden Starr taking the title 149-138. Kaili Purugganan earns \$1000 for 5th, Sierra Terry \$1200 for 4th, Neel Kankariya \$1550 for 3rd, Cameron Peterson \$2100 for 2nd and Aiden Starr \$1950 for the win.

In the D Division (135 and under), it came down to the 15th game as Johanna Earle took the last spot with a 142 game to hold off 6th place Connor Mazaras by 11 pins. The top-5 were Joseph Stanley -807, AJ Holland -953, Travis Ward -998, Madison Rodriguez -1005 and Johanna Earle -1006. The stepladder saw (4) Madison Rodriguez d. (5) Johanna Earle 128-119, (3) Travis Ward d. Madison Rodriguez 117-117 (Travis wins rolloff), Travis Ward d. (2) AJ Holland 151-95 sending Travis Ward into a championship showdown with top-seed Joseph Stanley. Travis Ward continued to roll as he defeated Joseph 143-121 for the title. Johanna Earle earns \$1000 for 5th, Madison Rodriguez \$1200 for 4th, AJ Holland \$1550 for 3rd, Joseph Stanley \$2100 for 2nd and Travis Ward \$1950 for the win.





Cal Bowl Sweeps To Leap Into The Round 3 Lead

DOWNEY – The Brunswick Invitational took to the lanes for the third week of the new 3rd round pattern. Bowlers continued the 50' long oil, medium volume pattern with their arsenals tweaked after considering their first week experience on the pattern. Scoring was big as the pattern fell victim to the strong equipment and solid lane play.

In the "A" match, US Foods (Gabriel Martinez) was looking to stay hot after a huge week 2 effort meeting up with second-round winner Bowlium (Billy Myers Jr.) who was coming off a 4-1 high-scoring win. US Foods took the first game by 18, but it was Bowlium closing the match off with two wins and totals for the 4-1 result. Gabriel Martinez continued to be hot for US Foods with a 610 series while Ramiro Garcia's 655 and Billy Myers Jr.'s 648 led Bowlium to the wins. Bowlium will remain in the "A" match next week sitting one game back.

The "B" match featured **Cal Bowl** (Leonard Ruiz Jr.) at 9-1 matched up with 8-2 Professional Approach Oak Tree (John Struckman). The match was all Cal Bowl including a close 2-pin win in game two en route to the 5-0 sweep. Ramon Torres paced Cal Bowl with a 602 set while Scott Silva led Pro Approach Oak Tree with a 552 series. Cal Bowl moves to 14-1 and will be atop the "A" match next week.

Threadworks (Eric Snow) was looking to bounce back, matched up with Forever Hope Foundation (Vernon Adams) with both teams sitting at 6-4. Both teams were shorthanded for the matches with half the pair being subs. The match was all Forever Hope Foundation as they rolled to a 5-0 win over the usually tough Threadworks. Vernon Adams was huge for Forever Hope with a 676 series while Stephanie Zavala finished big for a 586 set to lead Threadworks.

6-4 teams meeting 5-5 Forest Lanes (Jon Diso) who Vince Duarte (236) for \$9.50 each. SuperPot went to round on Monday at 8:00!
