EL PASO, TX—Parker Bohn III reached another milestone in his storied career Sunday, becoming just the fifth bowler to collect at least 30 PBA Tour titles when he defeated Robert Smith, 288-235, in the title match of the PBA El Paso Classic at Oasis Lanes.

Bohn, the PBA Hall of Famer from Jackson, N.J., earned the \$40,000 top prize and an exemption for the 2005-06 season by striking on his first 10 shots against Smith, who failed to convert an 8-10 split in the opening frame.

After striking to start the 10th frame, Bohn left the 3-9 spare on his next shot. All told, he struck on 20 of 24 frames on the day.

Today's win is a big monkey off my shoulders, said Bohn, who was winless in his past 51 events. "Everyone in life wants to say that they're 29 and holding. I've been saying '29 and holding' for too long. I've upped it a notch and got to 30."

Bohn beat Chris Barnes, Dallas, in their semifinal match, 279-258, as the PBA Hall of Famer struck on nine consecutive shots from frames 2-10 to advance to his second title match in as many weeks.

Smith defeated Joe Ciccone, Buffalo, N.Y., in the first semifinal, 268-247. Smith matched Ciccone shot-for-shot through eight frames with both bowlers striking seven times. Smith struck in the 9th frame while Ciccone converted single-pin spares in the 9th and 10th frames.

Smith, Thousand Oaks, Calif., collects \$20,000 for his 2nd place finish while Barnes and Ciccone tied for 3rd and take home \$10,000 apiece.

The PBA Tour heads to Dallas, Texas next week for the PBA Dallas Open. ESPN will televise the four-bowler finals live on Sunday, Jan. 23 from 1-2:30 p.m. ET. Top prize will be \$40,000 and an exemption for the 2005-06 PBA Tour season.

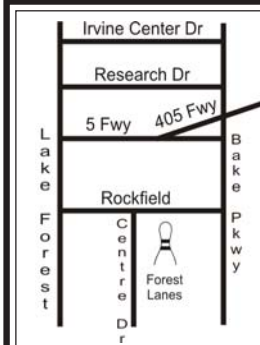

National Deaf Bowling News 20th Deaflympics at Melbourne, Australia Ends USA Athletes Gathers Total of 32 Medals

MELBOURNE–The 20th Quadrennial Deaflympics ended last Sunday at Melbourne and the best the deaf and hearing-impaired USA teams and athletes did was a total of 32 medals competing in the 15 different sports with a record 80 different countries. In that total of 32, USA gathered 9 gold, 11 silvers and 12 bronze.

Of those numbers, in the sport of Tenpin bowling, Team USA men and women won the most medals 10 with 4 gold, 4 silver and 2 bronze. The USA women team, the best ever assembled, led by fabulous Lindy Decker, PA with 3 individual gold (Singles, All-events and women’s Masters) and 2 silver (each shared in Trios and 5 players team). The other gold was won by Sharon Rutherford, PA and Patty Brothag, OH in Doubles.

Rutherford and Brothag also shared 2 silver with Decker in Trios and the 5 players team along with Cheyenne Rogers, LA , Jerilyn Keller TX and Debbie White, VA. Rutherford earned her 3rd silver in individual All-events and Rogers, Keller and White shared a bronze for 3rd place in Trios.

That leaves a silver and a bronze which were won by the men’s team. Darrell Stogryn, CA got the silver as runner-up in the men’s Masters and he also shared the bronze with Joe Ed Thompson, TX in men’s Doubles.

Team USA was tied with Taiwan in most medals 10 but Taiwan won 5 gold, 3 silver and 2 bronze. Taiwan, which entered in Deaflympics as Chinese Taipei, led by its top bowler Li-Hsiao Chang with 4 gold and 2 silver.

LI-HSIAO CHANG SETS DEAFLYMPICS RECORD 6 GAMES 1446 IN MEN’S TRIOS

Taiwan (Chinese Taipei) won its first Deaflympics gold in a record setting fashion in the men’s Trios event. With its star bowler, Li-Hsiao Chang spinning out games of 268-235-223-279-195-256 for a new Deaflympics individual record 1446 series and Ching-Ling Chiu and Chung-Chin Cheng helping with 1203 and 1190 respectively, Taiwan scored a new Deaflympics record 3839 total.

The silver went to Sweden which closed with the event’s high 721 Trios game with help of Ulf Andersson’s event’s high game 290 and 1293, Anders Nordell’s 1275 and Kent Johansson’s 1136 for 3704 total. Italy took the bronze with 3556 led by Lorenzo Salamone’s 1217.

USA#2 with 16 years old Rai Doblmeier’s 1231, finished in 4th place with 3491. Robert Ellison had 1099 and Gregory Olson 1161. USA#1 with Darrell Stogryn’s best 1258 placed 12th with 3413. Ed Abakumoff had 1065 and Joe Ed Thompson 1092. SWEDEN GOLD AND USA SILVER AND BRONZE IN WOMEN’S TRIOS

Sweden which won this event in the 1997 Deaflympics in Denmark took the women’s Trios’ gold with Ann-Charlotte Dahlberg’s 1184, Eva Ulfsparre’s 1076 and Annelie Karlsson’s 1109 for 3369 total. USA#1 struggled with 3336 for the silver from Brothag’s (263) 1125, Decker’s 1070 and Rutherford’s 1141.

Surprisingly more than 100 pins back was USA#2 with 3221 good for the bronze. Rogers scored (255) 1222, Keller 1010 and White 989 in this one. Republic of Korea placed 4th with 3160.

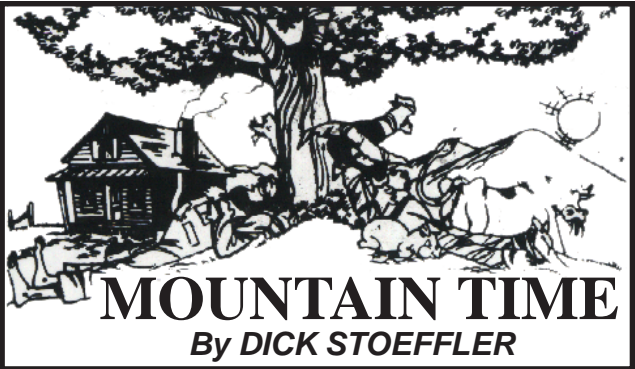

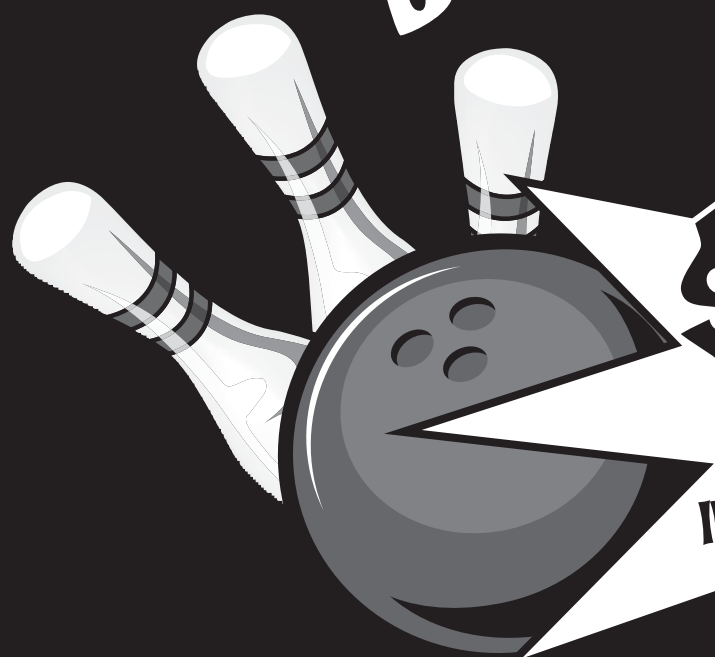

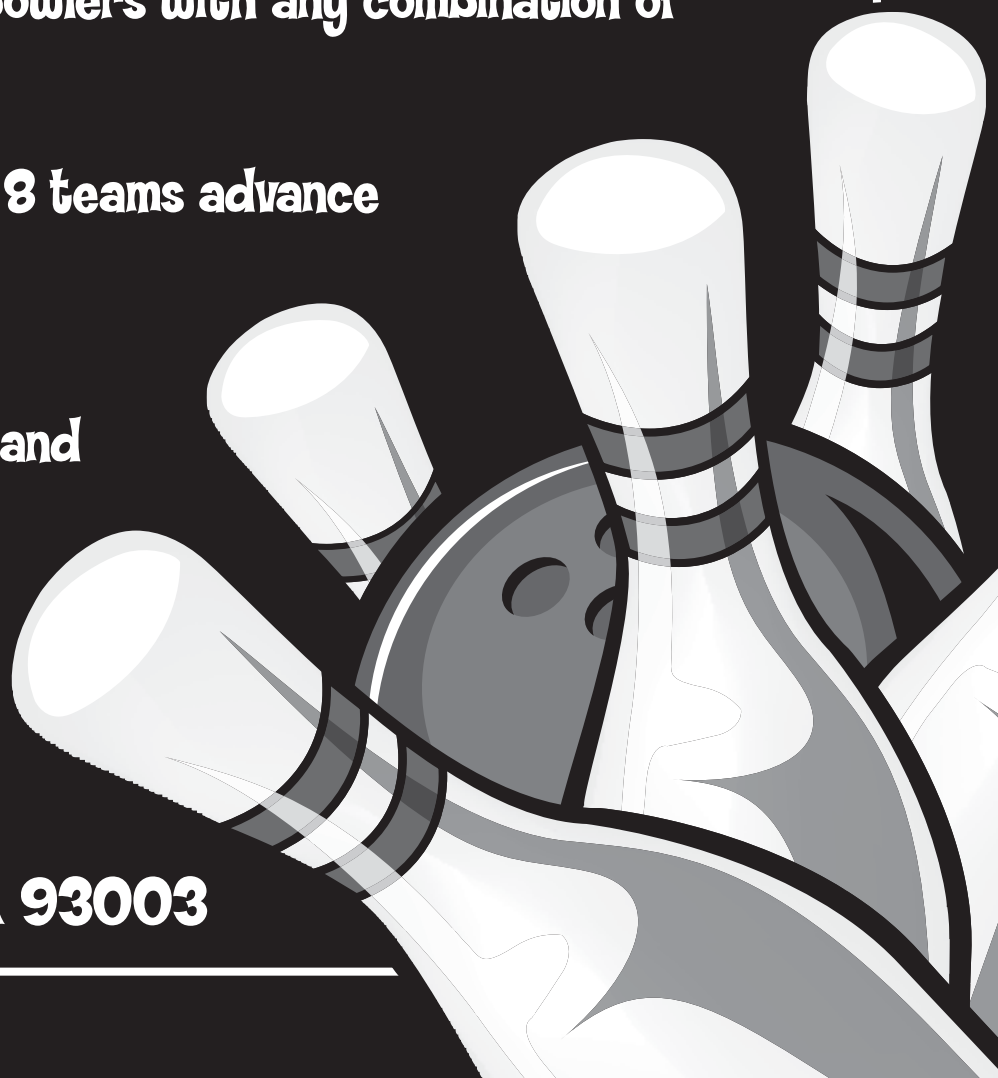
