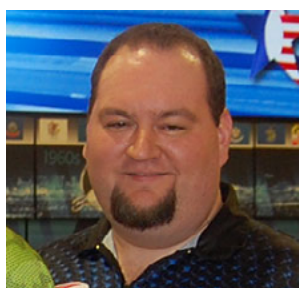
Vermont State USBC Hall of Famer Jon Wilbur Shoots 900 Series

The center's manager on duty, Michael Forth, told BJI today that Wilbur, who has won several New England Bowlers Association titles and is listed as one of NEBA's "Ambassadors," works both the front desk and the pro shop at the center.

"He's grown up in the center," said Forth. "I've known him since I was a kid. If there was anybody that was going to [shoot 900] it was going to be Jon. He's that special of a bowler. He's in the hall of fame already and he's only, I think, 35 or 36 years old. Last night, along with his 900 series, he bowled his 129th 300.

"He's a great guy, totally deserving of everything he's accomplished," Forth added. "He can talk to anybody. He's a lovable guy, always laughing. There's not a bad thing to say about him. You should have seen

it last night. As soon as it happened, his phone just would not stop going off. He got about 200 text messages and phone calls from people all over the country congratulating him."

Along with partner Todd Lathrop, Wilbur won the Open Doubles title in the 2015 Bowlers Journal Championships. In the 2017 USBC Open Championships, Wilbur's 746 series helped HoF Silver Lanes 1 become the first team to break the 3200 barrier that year.

Pending approval from USBC, Wilbur's series will be the 35th certified 900.

PBA Announces Multi-Year Agreement to Add USBC Masters, U.S. Open to PBA on FOX Schedule

ARLINGTON, TX – The Professional Bowlers Association, United States Bowling Congress and Bowling Proprietors' Association of America today announced a multi-year agreement to include the USBC Masters and U.S. Open as major events on the Go Bowling! PBA Tour television package on FOX Sports.

FOX Sports will televise

the U.S. Open live on FOX from 2020 through 2022 and the USBC Masters live on FS1 from 2019 through 2022. The announcement was made today at the BPAA Mid-Winter Summit in New Orleans.

"The PBA is thrilled to have these two major professional events as part of the PBA Tour television package on FOX Sports for

Sean Rash & Matt Ogle Win PBA Mark Roth-Marshall Holman Doubles

SHAWNEE, OK – Doubles partners Sean Rash and Matt Ogle won all four Baker format stepladder matches to win the 2019 PBA Mark Roth-Marshall Holman Doubles Championship aired Sunday on FS1 from the FireLake Bowling Center.

Rash, who won his 13th career Go Bowling! PBA Tour title, and Ogle, who won his first title in his first TV appearance, beat Missourians Brad Miller and Kyle Sherman, 213-200, in the title match.

The Baker format requires each player to alternate frames in a game to combine for one score.

After Rash opened with a 4-7-9 split in the first frame, he and Ogle got back on track by striking in the next four frames to take

a 13-pin lead into the sixth frame. Miller and Sherman, also making their first telecast appearances, tried to make a challenge by striking in the fifth, sixth and seventh but when Miller

opened in the eighth by missing a four pin, it enabled Rash and Ogle to stay in front for the rest of the match.

It was an emotional win for both Rash and Ogle

who qualified fifth for the stepladder finals. It was Rash's first win since 2017 and after what he described as his worst season of his year career in 2018.

Butturff Has A Chance To Make History In Lubbock

LUBBOCK, TX – The PBA's best will head to Lubbock, Texas, next week for the PBA Lubbock Sports Open, where Jakob Butturff will look to make some history.

The 96-player field will battle two different lane conditions throughout the event and Chris Barnes will look to defend his title live on FloBowling.

Here are a few key points to get you ready for next week's event:

It's no secret that Butturff has been on fire lately. After earning the top seed at the 2018 season-ending U.S. Open, Butturff has



earned the top seed in both events in 2019 so far.

No player in the history of the PBA Tour has earned the top seed in four consecutive tournaments, so it would be a milestone week

for Butturff if he can accomplish the feat.

When Butturff earned the top seed last week at the PBA Oklahoma Open, he tied bowling legends like Walter Ray Williams Jr.,

Earl Anthony and Johnny Petraglia as the only bowlers to ever earn the top seed at three consecutive tournaments. Butturff went on to win the PBA Oklahoma Open for his first victory during that stretch.

And if last year is any indication, it's certainly possible. Butturff led last year's PBA Lubbock Sports Open and earned the top seed for the finals, where he lost to Barnes, 207-206.

In that championship match, Barnes won his 19th career PBA Tour title by throwing all three strikes in the final frame to edge Butturff.

Jon Wilbur Speaks with USBC Following His 900 Series

ARLINGTON, Texas – Jonathan Wilbur owned the record for the highest three-game series ever bowled in the state of Vermont for nearly a decade, before his friend and teammate visited the Green Mountain State and beat his set by a single pin.

Wilbur reclaimed the record Monday and guaranteed himself a permanent spot atop the list by rolling the state's first 900 series, which included 36 consecutive strikes during the Commercial men's league at Rutland Bowlerama in Rutland, Vermont.

The perfect set makes the 36-year-old right-hander the 34th bowler overall to record a 900 series. His achievement is pending approval from the United States Bowling Congress and would be the 35th USBC-approved 900. It marks the first perfect set of the 2018-2019 season and first since October 2017.

Wilbur, of North Clarendon, Vermont, surpassed the 888 series he rolled at Rutland Bowlerama in March 2004. That performance included games of 299, 289 and 300.

In 2012, Todd Lathrop of Colchester, Connecticut, visited and rolled games of 300, 289 and 300 for an 889 set, also at Rutland Bowlerama. It was just a small piece of the special history between the two competitors.

"I probably was the second-happiest guy in the center the day Todd broke the previous record, and it was extra special because I was bowling on the same pair of lanes at the time," Wilbur said. "We've joked about me getting it back, and I'm incredibly proud to have been able to do so. To shoot 900 is something I can't wrap my head around. I'm still pinching myself. It's something you dream about but never think can really happen."

In his career, Wilbur has rolled more than 100 certified perfect games, but despite all of the strikes and honor scores, the majority of which have come at the 32-lane Rutland Bowlerama, he only has rolled back-to-back 300s on one other occasion, and that came after a 246 start.

In 75 previous sets of 800 or better, he has eclipsed the 850 mark seven times and always wondered if 900 was a realistic possibility.

"I've bowled many 300s and some big sets before, but I've found myself shaking like a leaf going for back-to-back 300s before," said Wilbur, a three-time winner in the famed New England Bowlers Association (NEBA). "I didn't feel a lot of nerves the first two games last night, but I started to get really shaky and nervous about the seventh frame of the last game. I got away with a shot I didn't think was going to make it back, and that actually helped with the nerves." Rutland Bowlerama is one of 11 USBC-certified bowling centers in Vermont, a place that means a lot to Wilbur and the most special potential backdrop for his historic night.

As he closed in on his place in the record books, the venue grew quiet, while he still was surrounded by his closest bowling friends. The crowd included 12 three-player teams from his league, eight five-player teams from the women's league and some bowlers in for open play. He even got a special visit from his parents after the set concluded.

Wilbur has spent time in the national spotlight before, finding success at the USBC Open Championships and Bowlers Journal Championships presented by USBC.

In 2015, he teamed with Lathrop to claim the Open Doubles title and \$7,500 top prize at the Bowlers Journal Championships.

They made headlines together again in Las Vegas in 2017 when they helped HOF Silver Lanes 1 of New Hartford, Connecticut, into the lead in Regular Team at the Open Championships. The team went on to finish fifth in the 10,286-team field.

During that performance, Wilbur opened the night's final game with eight consecutive strikes, before an 8 pin ended his run at the first 300 of the tournament's debut at the new South Point Bowling Plaza.

The next day, Lathrop claimed that honor during his first game of singles. It was one of 10 perfect games at the 2017 tournament.

"Me, Todd and John Kirker bowl a lot of team and doubles stuff together, and we just vibe really well," Wilbur said. "We don't necessarily push each other, but we have the same will to win, and we just click."

Together, Wilbur and his fellow competitors have helped put Vermont and the Northeast on the bowling map, but even past success could not help Wilbur prepare for the attention that comes with rolling a 900 series.

"I definitely never thought I'd be the guy to do this, and it's incredibly surreal," said Wilbur, who still has his eye on an Open Championships Eagle and a Professional Bowlers Association title. "It's just little old me from a small town in a tiny state. It's overwhelming, but such a dream come true. And, I couldn't have picked a more special place to shoot it."

The first USBC-approved 900 occurred Feb. 2, 1997 when Jeremy Sonnenfeld rolled three consecutive perfect games in Lincoln, Nebraska.

Hall of Famer Chris Barnes to Defend PBA Lubbock Sports Open Title

Jakob Butturff to try to set new mark for consecutive No. 1 stepladder finals qualifying berths

LUBBOCK, TX – PBA Hall of Famer and defending champion Chris Barnes will lead a world-class field of established and rising PBA stars from around the globe who will return to South Plains Lanes for the 2019 PBA Lubbock Sports Open.

This year, the Lubbock Sports Open will be in the national sports spotlight when FS1 televises the stepladder finals of the fourth stop of the 2019 GoBowling! PBA Tour season live at noon on Sunday, Jan. 27.

One of the PBA’s young stars competing in Lubbock will be last week’s PBA Oklahoma Open winner and last season’s Lubbock Sports Open runner-up Jakob Butturff of Tempe, Ariz., who will be trying to break a record he currently shares with PBA greats Walter Ray Williams Jr., Earl Anthony and Johnny Petraglia.

If Butturff can qualify first for the stepladder finals in Lubbock, he would become the first player to be the No. 1 seed in four consecutive singles PBA Tour tournaments.

Butturff finally broke through to win from the No. 1 stepladder finals qualifying spot in last Sunday’s Oklahoma Open on FS1 for his fifth career tour title after losing the title match in two previous tournaments. He lost the season-ending 2018 U.S. Open as No. 1 qualifier to winner Dom Barrett of England and the 2019 season-opening PBA Hall of Fame Classic to winner Bill O’Neill before beating Jesper Svensson from the top spot in the Oklahoma Open.

Barnes, a 2018 PBA Hall of Fame inductee who also will join the USBC Hall of Fame on May 1, won his 19th PBA singles title in Lubbock last year, striking out in the 10th frame to defeat top qualifier Butturff, 207-206. Lubbock was also the site of Butturff’s first PBA Tour title victory in 2016.

The Lubbock Sports Open will also feature a mixed (or dual) lane condition which will add to the challenge for the 90-player field.

The tournament officially gets underway at 8 a.m. Wednesday with the first of two seven-game qualifying squads on the PBA’s 32-foot Wolf oiling pattern. The other half of the field will bowl its first qualifying round at 1:30 p.m. The two squads reverse order for

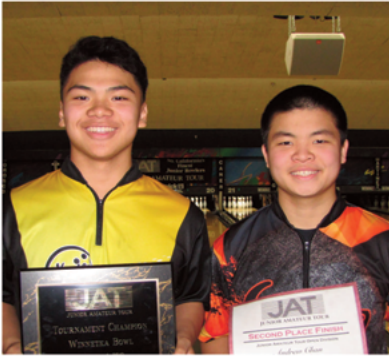

RED SOX STAR MOOKIE BETTS TO RECEIVE BPAA MEDIA AWARD

Boston Red Sox star Mookie Betts, after an American League Most Valuable Player season that included earning his first World Series championship ring, also will be honored by the bowling family in late June when he receives the Bowling Proprietors' Association of America Media Award for the significant mass media coverage he has generated for bowling over the past three years.

Betts, an accomplished bowler, participated in the 2015 and 2017 PBA World Series of Bowling in Reno, highlighted by a 300 game he bowled in the 2017 Scorpion Championship. That unique accomplishment led to an on-field presentation of a PBA 300 ring by PBA CEO and Commissioner Tom Clark at a Red Sox game at Fenway Park last summer.

Ever since he began competing in PBA-level competition, Betts' athletic skills as a bowler have accompanied almost every media conversation about his talents on television, radio, social media and in newspaper and magazine stories. He also has participated in NBA star Chris Paul's popular CP3 PBA Celebrity Invitational bowling event that airs on Super Bowl Sunday. Betts will be a participant for the third consecutive year when the 2019 event airs for the first time on FOX on Sunday, Feb. 3, at 2 p.m. Eastern.

years to come," PBA CEO and Commissioner Tom Clark said. "It is terrific for the bowling industry to rally behind the PBA Tour on FOX Sports and collaborate on a long-term commitment for these major events."

As a result of the agreement, the 2020 U.S. Open will move up in the calendar with the televised finals set for Sunday, Feb. 23, 2020. The current U.S. Open format will continue, with a host venue for the 2020 event to be announced later.

The USBC Masters will continue to be conducted in its traditional time window in conjunction with the USBC Open Championships.

"The PBA Tour move to FOX Sports is fantastic for bowling and everyone associated with the U.S. Open and USBC Masters is excited to be part of it," USBC Executive Director Chad Murphy said. "The media attention and investment in competitive bowling keeps growing and this partnership is another great win-win for the sport."

Known as the BPAA All-Star from 1941-1970, the U.S. Open now is a collaborative effort of the BPAA and USBC.

"Elevating the U.S. Open to FOX provides a new level of exposure for a tournament with a rich BPAA history," BPAA Executive Director Frank DeSocio said. "The launch of the PBA Tour on FOX has been extremely impressive and we are proud to be involved."



SHEDDING A LITTLE LIGHT ON THE SUBJECT

Jacques Darden has been providing the lighting services for professional bowling telecasts for 33 years, but like everything else in today's world, technology has changed his contribution to the sport.

Darden is in the process of converting his vast array of lights to LED, which veteran players have already noticed because LED lighting is much cooler and cleaner. Because LED lights don't generate heat, they don't affect lane conditions like tungsten lights did in the good ol' days. Observant television fans might also notice the lighting is much closer to "daylight white," and Darden said some of his new LEDs include color options that allow him to change lighting to red, blue, green or whatever special effect the situation might call for, just by making some subtle adjustments.

turrff by one pin. He'll be back again this week to try to successfully defend his title.

On the surface, it may look like just an ordinary week on the PBA Tour with qualifying and match play. However, if you dig a little deeper you'll quickly realize there's a lot more to the PBA Lubbock Sports Open than that.

Two seven-game blocks of qualifying on Tuesday and Wednesday will determine the top quarter of the field that will advance to the casher's round on Friday morning for seven more games. After the casher's round, the field is trimmed to the top 16 players for 16 games of round robin match play. With 37 games in the books, the top five players will advance to the stepladder finals.

Here's the catch. The players will be bowling on two different lane conditions this week - the 33-foot Wolf pattern and the 42-foot Scorpion pattern.

Wednesday's first round of qualifying will be on Wolf, while Thursday's second round will be on Scorpion. Starting in the casher's round and throughout match play, the lanes will be conditioned with Scorpion on the left lane and Wolf on the right lane for an added challenge.

You'll want to keep a close eye out on Friday and Saturday to see how the players attack the lanes differently throughout that portion of the tournament.

Oh, and in case bowling on television wasn't hard enough, the stepladder finals are also going to be contested on the mixed patterns.

The live action on FloBowling gets underway Wednesday with the opening round of qualifying and continues through match play on Saturday morning.

FloBowling subscribers will be able to watch the FloZone channel with commentary or select a specific pair to watch their favorite players.

The stepladder finals of the PBA Lubbock Sports Open will be broadcast Sunday live on FS1 at noon. International viewers can watch live on FloBowling. An archive of the show will be available on FloBowling seven days after it airs live.

"I was almost in a depression," said the 36-year-old Rash, whose last tour win came in the 2017 Xtra Frame Gene Carter Pro Shop Classic. "It got to the point where I wondered if I wanted to do it (bowl) anymore, but then I just had to force myself to do the things I needed to do to get better by getting in shape, eat right and make the changes with my game like going from a 16-pound ball to a 15". In 2018 Rash finished in a tie for fifth in the PBA Tour Finals for his best finish of the season.

"You hear a lot of chat in the background like, 'is he ever going to win again,' or people just generally writing you off," Rash added. "I finally saw some improvement at the end of last year but I was just hoping for the best when the new season started. You never know when you're going to get it back again."

For the 34-year-old Ogle, who is in his third season as a PBA member and bowls on tour mainly part-time, winning a PBA title fulfilled a lifelong goal in the sport.

"It's a dream come true, said Ogle, who has used a two-handed delivery since suffering from a carpal tunnel injury in his right wrist in 2006. "When someone like Sean believes in you and wants you to be his doubles partner that's an opportunity that's not going to come around too often".

"It was a situation where we have good communication and have a good understanding of each other's game so it was a natural fit from the start," Ogle added. "We had our ups and downs during the tournament but it's a sign of a good team when you can come back from adversity to make the adjustments to recover." Rash and Ogle started the finals with a 256-172 win over No. 4 qualifiers defending champions four-time PBA Player of the Year Jason Belmonte and Bill O'Neill, who won his 10th career title in the season opening PBA Hall of Fame Classic, to advance to the second stepladder match.

Rash and Ogle then defeated No. 3 qualifiers Canadians Patrick Girard and Zach Wilkins, 216-210, in the second stepladder match to advance to the semifinal match where they beat No. 2 qualifiers Sam Cooley and Anthony Lavery-Spahr, 258-216.

The five doubles teams reached the finals through their combined individual qualifying scores from the PBA Oklahoma Open after which the top 12 teams advanced to two Baker format match play rounds to determine the top five teams for the finals.

The next stop for the Go Bowling! PBA Tour will be the Lubbock Sports Open Jan. 22-27 at South Plains Lanes in Lubbock, Texas. The stepladder finals will be telecast live by FS1 at Noon on Jan. 27.
