Couch's House

FOUNTAIN VALLEY-The streak is over. Jason Couch became the first No. 1 seed to win a stepladder final since February 2005 and he did it in style, repeating as the Dick Weber Open champion with a 258-236 win over Patrick Allen at Foun-

The left-hander became the first bowler to successfully defend a Denny's PBA Tour title since Tommy Jones in the Dydo Japan Cup 2005 and just the fourth in history to do it in two different events. The three-time Tournament of Champions winner captured his 14th career title, pulling him even with PBA Hall of Fame left-hander Johnny Petraglia.

In a tournament dominated by lefties – four of the five finalists were southpaws - Couch was far and away the most dominant. He led the field from the end of qualifying through three rounds of match play, breaking a nine-match losing streak by top seeds in stepladder finals.

"We all know the problems the top seeds have had and I said last night 'I'm going to shoot 250 and win tournament.' I didn't think I was actually going to (shoot 250) but I certainly did," Couch (Clermont, Fla.) said. "To win the Dick Weber Open last year was just an honor because the Weber's are such a great family. To win two consecutive years is very special. Pete and Tracy treat me like family."

Couch has rebounded from a lackluster first half of the season when he did not make a TV appearance and was 27th in points to make the finals in two of the three events in the second

"I wasn't very pleased with myself the first half of the season," Couch said. "I had a couple good weeks but I didn't bowl like I expect myself to. I told my wife at the break I was going to come back with a positive attitude and it's paid off."

In the title match, the two fiery lefties traded strikes through the first three frames before Allen had trouble in the middle frames. The 2004-05 PBA Player of the Year had four

spares in frames 4-8, while Couch had a big strike in the 8th after a nine-spare in the 7th. Couch then struck in the 9th and 10th to clinch his first title this season.

The No. 2 seed Allen advanced to the title match with a 249-245 win over all-time titles leader Walter Ray Williams Jr. Williams had a chance to win with a strike in the 10th, but he left the 4-pin, giving Allen his second win over the PBA Hall of Famer on TV in three weeks.

The fifth-seed Williams advanced with wins over No. 4 Parker Bohn III, 227-225, in the first match and No. 3 Andrew Cain, 216-205, in the second match.

Couch earned \$25,000 and an exemption for the 2007-08 season, while Allen (Wesley Chapel, Fla.) took home \$13,000 for second. Williams (Ocala, Fla.) earned \$7,000 for third, Cain (Scottsdale, Ariz.) earned \$6,000 for fourth and Bohn (Jackson, N.J.) earned \$5,000 for fifth.

Next week the Denny's PBA Tour heads to Henderson, Nev., for the 2007 Motel 6 Classic, Jan. 24-28 at Strike Zone at Sunset Station. The live ESPN televised finals take place Sunday, Jan. 28 at 9:30 a.m. PST.

Weber Open Proves To Be Lefty Couch's Fountain Of Cash

FOUNTAIN VALLEY-Orange County bowling fans seemed to love Fountain Bowl's two past editions of the Dick Weber Open. They packed the 60-lane center 2006 and 2007 and lefty Jason Couch won both, pocketing \$30,000 and \$25,000. They loved his scoring, winning wireto-wire. He started with a 241 average, dipped to a 238 and back with a closing 241.

Even General Manager David Osborn loved those fans and volunteers. He said they will be back for two more years.

In the press room interviews, Couch said he loved the way the hosts treated the players. We were comfortable, healthy food, weather was great, Disneyland close-by and the lanes friendly.

Although the lanes met PBA specs, 13 of the 24 finalists were southpaws and four of the five TV finalists used their left hand and the left side of the lane.

The lane pattern was 45-feet of stripped, four boards of alternate oil and dry. It was equal on both sides. Couch said, "I tried my best to stay on the oily boards. I guess I did."

The righties tried to use the outside searching for oil with those high scores. A little mistake and out you go.

Fifth seed Walter Ray Williams Jr. was the lone right-hander in the finals. He defeated Parker Bohn III 227-225. Walter tapped three ten-pins, Bohn four corner pins.

Rookie Andre Cain of Arizona, got two unconverted splits; lost to Williams 216-205.

The fans were wild screaming for Williams, a Californian, turned

a "Cracker". He turned the third match with a turkey; in the fourth frame they were shocked, he missed a 4-9 split. Patrick Allen stayed clean, winning 249-245.

The finale, two Florida southpaw keglers, battling it out. Four pin difference in averges, Couch remembered where the oil was. He got 9 strikes to Allen's 8, however, Couch posted two fourbaggers, only three 7-pin taps winning the \$25,000 title, 258-





I Remember The **Empty Lot Also**

Carol,

I enjoyed reading your "empty lot" article in the 1-18-2007 edition.

I thought I could expand on it and include my personal experience at La Puente Lanes, as I remember the full cycle of empty lot to bowling center to empty

March 1959: I could hardly wait for La Puente Lanes to open and as I was an 18 year old who lived less than a mile from the place it soon became my hangout. I started bowling in a scratch league with my father and soon was bowling up to four leagues a week. The place had a great coffee shop and as I would later learn, a great bar.

Sometime in 1960 or 1961, Billy Myers arrived on the scene and I still remember approaching him to ask his opinion on a semi-fingertip ball. I had remembered him from the old television broadcasts from Chicago. As I was left handed, I had always looked up to him and as I got to know him realized what a great guy he was. It was Billy who asked me if I wanted to work the desk. I started my part-time career in the bowling business and now it is about 46 years later and I am still

working part time in the bowling business and employed at Brunswick West Covina Lanes.

In 1965 while I was in the Army, Melvin Hales took over the operation of the center. He had actually built the place, and became operator when he assumed control from Catalano Enterprises.

It may seem strange, but the sixties offer my fondest memories of the center, except for 1973 when I married Charlene, a member

of the bowling Wyer family. During this period I met some of my dearest friends, most of whom have passed

The seventies and eighties just flew by, but La Puente Lanes continued to be a stopping off place for me, and I worked there until the closing in August of 1993.

In 1992, I attended many La Puente city council meetings as La Puente was in the redevelopment mode and designated the area including the Lanes as redevopment territory. Mel Hales was against it and so was I. The threat of taking away my beloved second home was enough to encourage me to provide input to discourage the project. It went to the ballot and was turned down, but to my dismay Mr Hales closed the place the following year.

During the years, I had a great time at the center, as a bowler and as an employee, and cherish the memories. I was good at creating nicknames, and if any of you old timers are reading this you will remember: The Human Billiard Ball (Birney Flowers), The California Golden Boy (Spencer Cowley) and of course the Fabulous Fribee (Tom Friberg).

I might also point out that I bowled the last sactioned strike at the center. It was my proudest moment as I announced to the sparce crowd that I had bowled one of the first strikes at the center in 1959, and I was going to bowl the last one in 1993. Much to my satisfaction, it was a "run out" strike. One of the league members still jokes that it was like Babe Ruth calling his shot.

Yes, Carol, I agree 100% that we all remember the good old days.


