Remembering Beckie Miller

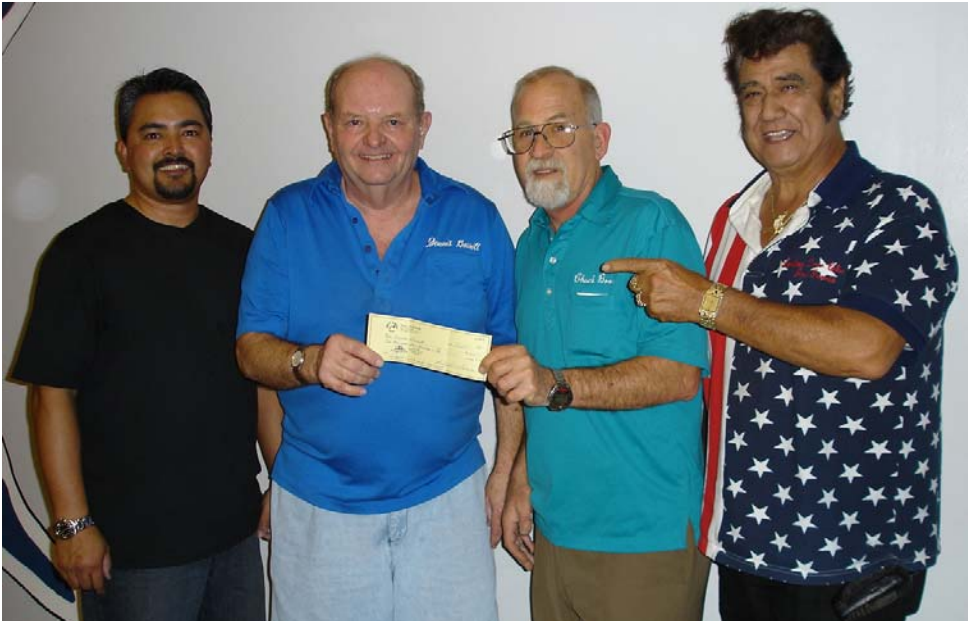

LA HABRA— More than 100 friends and family members were present at La Habra 300 Bowl on Saturday, January 15, to view and participate in the Orange County Women’s Bowling Hall Of Fame induction of Marge Miyoda.

Joy McGregor, Hall Of Fame chairman, presented an outstanding ceremony that included members of the OCWBA Board Directors.

Cindy Miles, OCWBA President, presented the WIBC congratulations certificate and CWBA President Linda Johnson personally presented the CWBA Certificate. Secretary Chreyl Huntington assisted in presentation of a lovely photo-trophy and the “hanging” of Marge’s photo on the Hall of Fame wall.

The spectacular wall space was donated by LA Habra 300 Bowl GM, Mickey Curley, and features photos of Orange

County’s elected Hall Of Fame men and women for Meritorious Service and Superior Bowling categories.

It was obvious McGregor did her home work well as she spotlighted Marge’s achievements, which began in 1961 at Kona Lanes.

Marge learned to bowl at Kona in 1961, via instruction by Jane “Tiger” Randel, and in 1962 she became interested and involved with the Orange County Womens Bowling Association. She became a Director for Kona and Mesa Lanes and then advanced to the office of O.C.W.B.A. secretary for eight years. In 1995, she retired and was awarded Life Membership. Marge was inducted into the Southern California Bowling Writers Hall of Fame in 1998.

When Orange County hosted the WIBC Tournament and Convention in 1986, Marge met Mr. Noda, BPA member of Japan and proprietor of a 32 lane center. Mr.Noda extended an invitation to American bowlers to travel to Japan and Marge recruited 24 bowlers to make a “Good Will Group” tour to Tokyo, Osaka and Kyoto.

Marge’s special talents are of great value to ABC, WIBC, Masters and Queens tournaments as translator and tour guide in the USA and Japan. Also, she is a great photographer. Throughout the induction ceremony, Marge displayed that incredible smile that can light up a room. George, her beloved husband, stood by beaming with pride and Marge appreciates how much he has supported her through the years. They have four daughters, seven grandchildren and a multitude of friends.

The festive day of colorful balloons and picture taking concluded with hugs, congratulations, and refreshments of cake, coffee and punch being served on the oncourse. She was presented kodak moment album.

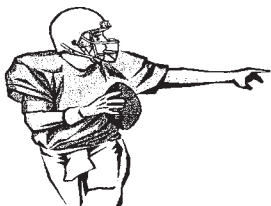

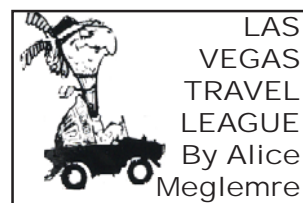

Great bowling by Jason Choi who almost got to the title game and is improving on the lanes for sure. Sonny will smile if he reads this! He is part of a contingent of bowlers from the north who bowl with us! Joy and Noel Espiritu also cashed in this one from the bay area. Jason is a fine young man and on the improve! Great Bowling!

There were many fine matches in this top 32 finals and all bowlers can be proud to have made it this far and next time hopefully to the title as Steve.

The Optional Doubles were taken by two of the "Bowling Romero's" Chris and Gil and their fine 1443 got them \$200 and we paid 16 places, and \$1,530 in the doubles.

Last up in the 3-6-9 roll off was Bobby Galvan and he missed the \$1,300 so we will go for \$1,500 this Saturday at West Covina Lanes in our One day event there.

The Match Series was drawn by Larry Spires, and it was matched by ABTA regular, the affable Peter Arsenault of Carlsbad and he collected a cool \$1,022 for his \$2.00 entry and Pete was buying the beer. We will estimate the Series to be \$275 this week at West Covina.

The Match game 3 was Un matched as the 299 drawn by Smith was unmatched. Bill Figueroa's 299 game was in game #2 so with the carryover of \$2,570, the Match Game will be worth the cap at West Covina and \$3,500 this Saturday.
