

LAS VEGAS—Steve Smith a long time ABTA member, and very fine bowler finally won his first ABTA title and a nice \$5,500 1st Place Check winning from the top seed of the top 32 single elims and finally downing upstart Jo Jo Mateo in the final game for the first ever Orleans Title.

Steve topped 500 entrants which generated great payoffs for the bowlers who enjoyed it there at the Orleans to be sure. 




