"MAJOR MIKA" KOIVUNIEMI WINS PBA TOURNAMENT OF CHAMPIONS, RECORD \$250,000 FIRST PRIZE

LAS VEGAS - Finnish native Mika Koivuniemi of Hartland, Mich., defeated top qualifier Tom Smallwood of Saginaw, Mich., 269-207, Saturday to win the \$250,000 first prize in the \$1 million Professional Bowlers Association Tournament of Champions at Red Rock Lanes.

After rolling a 299 game against Tom Daugherty of Wesley Chapel, Fla., in the semifinal match, Koivuniemi threw another 10 strikes on 12 tries against Smallwood to become the first international player ever to win the PBA's signature tournament.

"I can't even say what this title means right now," Koivuniemi said. "It was my third major and I have nine titles now. I hope I can win a few more and secure a spot in the Hall of Fame. And my oldest daughter is starting college next year, so the money will help.

"It helped to get past my first match," he added. "I haven't had a lot of breaks on TV lately. Even after I shot the 299, I held myself back and stayed focused. It would have been nice to shoot 300, but it's more important to win the title.'

Koivuniemi earned the nickname "Major Mika" after winning the 2000 United States Bowling Congress Masters and the 2001 U.S. Open both major championships - for his first two PBA titles after a highly successful international career where he won titles in 15 different countries.

"Mika bowled great. He won," said Smallwood, who earned \$100,000 as runnerup. "He out-bowled all of us. He had a great look at the lane condition and he made the shots. And winning \$100,000 can make you a good loser."

In the semifinal match, Koivuniemi came within a wobbling 10 pin of becoming the first player in PBA history to shoot two nationally-televised 300 games. The 42-year-old right-hander rolled a perfect game against Jason Couch of Clermont, Fla., in Windsor Locks, Conn., in 2003.

Koivuniemi easily defeated Daugherty, 299-100, because Daugherty's television debut was a disaster. The 35-year-old Floridian left seven difficult if not unmakeable - splits in rolling the lowest nationallytelevised game in PBA history. Daugherty converted two pins after leaving the 4-6-7-10



"But I still had the most fun I've ever had in my life this week, including today. I'd rather shoot 100 today than earlier in the week. I made \$500 a pin today. That's more than Mika made, pin for pin."

Koivuniemi began his march to the title with a 224-220 win over Gomez in the opening match when Gomez failed to double in the 10th frame. Both players showed early jitters - Koivuniemi leaving a pocket 7-10 split on his first shot and Gomez misscontinued on page 9





BOB JONES 845, S F VALLEY 634 TOP DEAF TRAVEL AT KEYSTONE

NORWALK-Almost every time So. Calif. Deaf Traveling League hit the lanes at Keystone Lanes, the bowlers did well as like last Sunday nine bowlers made the honor roll and the new league leader S. F. Valley hit the season high team game, 634. S. F. Valley's anchor Bob Jones rolled all 2's (213-200-211-221) for the day's top series 845 top other 800 by Gorman Low (818) and Bob Taylor (804)

Low's 818 had games of 213-196-195-214 and teammate Taylor, (yes! no misprint here, the Bob Taylor the same league secretary-treasurer who last October had a heart problem and went through a successful stent procedure on his heart) now returned with games of 190-215-228-171 in his 804. Your heart beating better, Bob?

The rest on the roll list were Ed Abakumoff 781 with 170-169-206-236, Pablo Yoma 782 from 187-202-171-202, Bob Bergan 751 with 214-192-172-173, Gardy Rodgers (214) 727, Robert Audette (201) 725 and Emad Aranki with a 203. Valley's first game of 634 which replaces Riverside's 620 made last September, came with Aranki's 203, Bergan's 214 and Jones' 213. The team finished with games of 536-583-545 for its best 2248 series, just 3 pins short of the team high 2251 by LA City.

Powered by Jones' 845, Bergan's 751 and Aranki's 203, 2nd place S.F. Valley made a near sweep 17-3 win over Abakumoff's Riverside, enabling Valley to move up into first place. Former leader LA City although with Low's 818 and Taylor's 804 could only muster a 13-7 win over Rodgers' Mid City and fell into 2nd, 1.5 points back of Valley. Yoma's Lake Elsinore once again got out of the cellar with a 12-8 win over Audette's Chino. Riverside being near swept for the 2nd time went back in the cellar.

The league thanked Keystone's GM Dave Piazza and his staff for the good scoring conditions and next travel date is February 6 at Jewel City Bowl. There, Riverside will avenge its 1st half loss from LA City to get out of the cellar. S.F. Valley will also get over its 1st half loss to Chino to stay in first place and Mid City will be against Lake Elsinore. Do not forget that the schedule had been changed to bowl the following week February 13 at AMF Cerritos Bowl instead of February 20.

PBA TOURNAMENT OF CHAMPIONS WAS GOOD SHOW ON ABC TV

LAS VEGAS-It was good to see PBA Bowling back on TV ABC channel last Saturday featuring \$250,000 First Place PBA Tournament of Champions after absence of 14 years. The show was good with Mika Kiovuniemi winning the Biggest PBA prize ever, beating top seeded Tom Smallwood but the exciting part was prior match of Mika's 299 beating 2nd seeded Tom Daugherty's 100 which had 7 splits. Mika as 3rd seed beat 4th seed Andre Gomez, Columbia 224-220 in the opening match.

Deaf pro Frank Gallo, Jr. did not do well in this tournament. In Sunday's opening round of 7 games Gallo was 67th place with -20 of 200 average, Then in Monday's 2nd round of 7 games, he improved better to + 20 but placed 57th missing the top 50 by 60 pins for the cut to 50 top scores for the next round.. It was a good try for him as he was ahead of other PBA bowlers I know who carried better averages than Gallo does.

Will ABC carry PBA Bowling show again in future? It will depend on the ratings. Did the show draw more viewers than other sports in the same time slot? I doubt it because it was not advertised in LA Daily News and I did not get LA Times. In my Deaf league only 5 of 18 saw the show and some of them missed because they thought it was on Sunday which shown on ESPN in past.

Pedersen, Eagle and Nicholson Inducted into PBA Hall of Fame

Kulick, Duke and Vint earn Bowlers Journal/WBW Awards during ceremonies in Las Vegas

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (Jan. 23, 2011) -- The Professional Bowlers Association inducted 13-time PBA Tour titlist Randy Pedersen, Senior Tour standout Dale Eagle and former PBA Tour lane maintenance director Len Nicholson into the PBA Hall of Fame during post-Tournament of Champions ceremonies Saturday evening at Red Rock Casino Resort & Spa.

Pedersen, 48, is currently the color analyst for Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour telecasts on ESPN but he earned entry into the Hall based on his accomplishments on the lanes. The Clermont, Fla., resident had a break out year in 1987, winning the PBA National Championship and then winning the Fair Lanes Open the next week.

Called one of bowling's great clutch players by Hall of Fame emcee Nelson Burton Jr., Pedersen had 34 top-five finishes in 561 Tour tournaments during his career, finishing in the top 20 in earnings six times and the top 20 in average eight times. His accomplishments contributed to his ranking of 35th on the PBA's list of 50 greatest bowlers as part of the organization's 50th anniversary celebration in 2009.

"It's been a long time coming, but when you think about it, who would have thought a beach bum from southern California would end up here?" Pedersen said. "As a kid I spent a lot of time on the beach and played basketball, but bowling was always my first passion.

'I owe everything to the sport of bowling and to PBA. The friendships I made, my bowling accomplishments and announcing bowling on television are all thanks to the PBA and you can't put a price on that."

Eagle was the second player elected into the Senior section of the PBA Hall of Fame, following John Handegard, who was inducted in 2009. The Frisco, Texas, resident has 11 career Senior Tour titles which ranks tied for third all-time. Among his titles are four Senior majors – Reno PBA Senior World Invitational (1997); The Villages Senior World Championship (1999); PBA Senior National

Championship (2001), and USBC Senior Masters (2003).

Eagle was the PBA Senior Rookie of the Year in 1996 and Senior Player of the Year in 1999. In 171 PBA Senior Tour tournaments he has finished in the top five 40 times. He also won 10 Senior Regional titles and three PBA Tour titles.

'I'd just like to thank everybody from the bottom of my heart. It's been quite a ride," said the 64-year-old Eagle. "Bowling and the PBA have been my life and to be recognized as a great player has made my dream a reality."

Inducted into the meritorious service category, Nicholson's career was devoted to the science of bowling lane maintenance and for more than 20 years the Tucson, Ariz., resident was the PBA Tour's lane maintenance director. Nicholson, 70, gained worldwide industry recognition as one of the foremost experts on the subject of lane maintenance.

Nicholson was instrumental in developing the PBA Lane Maintenance Program in 1971 which is still referred to today. He was a founding member of the Bowling Foundation which was created to find solutions to scoring issues in bowling. An instructor, author of several bowling publications and host of the popular Phantom Internet radio bowling program, he also has served on the technical committee of the World Tenpin Bowling Association. He was a recipient of the bowling industry's Flowers for the Living Award and the John Davis Award in recognition for his contributions to the sport.

"This is absolutely hard to believe and just awesome," said Nicholson. "I made a lot of friends in this sport who had a tremendous influence on me and for that I'm grateful.

'You need friends, family and good co-workers because without their support I would not be here tonight. This is something I never expected but will cherish forever."

Other awards presented during the ceremonies were the Bowlers Journal Person of the Year, Glenn Allison Hero Award and World Bowling Writers International Bowler of the Year awards to 2010 PBA Tournament of Champions winner Kelly Kulick. Norm Duke also was presented with his Glenn Allison Hero Award for winning a record three consecutive PBA major tournaments over the 2007-'08 and '08-'09 seasons. Bowling writer Bill Vint was the recipient of the World Bowling Writers Golden Quill Award for excellence in bowling journalism.






