Closed Bowling Alley Emphasizing "Service" Former Regal Lanes May Become Service Bays For Toyota Dealership

ORANGE—Regal Lanes at one time one of the largest bowling centers in the country with 72 lanes — may be turned into 42 service bays for David Wilson's Toyota of Orange, across the street.

The former 'king' of OC bowling closed in January 2003; it had been open nearly 30 years, but the land became more valuable than the bowling — the 'highest and best use,' as they say, went for real estate. Toyota of Orange bought the closed bowling center and the land, and has used the parking lot for overflow for its car inventory.

Recently it sought the expansion of its service business — Toyota of Orange is one of the largest dealers in the county. Last fall, the Orange City Council has approved a plan for the dealership to turn the long-shuttered center into a massive service operation for its car dealership, which is on the other side of Tustin Avenue, at Katella Street, in Orange.

Some see this as a way to revive the shopping center just south of the parking lot. Though it was a big deal when the bowling center opened, and a developer built housing between Regal Lanes and the Newport (55) Freeway. Now those apartments are 30 years old, the bowling center shut down, and the Ralph's Grocery shuttered after the last supermarket strike in Southern California. The increased business could be good for the shopping center.

David Wilson's Automotive Group owns by one estimate a dozen dealerships — among them are Toyota, Honda, Ford, Lexus, and Acura — with \$230 million in revenue, in Orange, Riverside, and Los Angeles Counties, as well as in Scottsdale, Ariz.

However, entities connected with that closed Ralph's have a banner up saying it's going to become an Office Depot — and they oppose the Toyota of Orange plan.

Thrill of Victory, Agony of Defeat

LAS VEGAS—Michael Haugen Jr.'s chances to win his first career Major title looked bleak in the sixth frame of Sunday's H&R Block Tournament of Champions. What followed next may go down as one of the greatest comebacks in Denny's PBA Tour history, and was the most heartbreaking moment in the career of a man who has had many.

Haugen overcame a 50-pin deficit to defeat Chris Barnes, 215-214, Sunday in a title match that was as much about Haugen's guts as it was about the crucial mistake Barnes made to miss out on his third career Major title.

The top-seeded Haugen had an adventurous week, which started in urgent care Wednesday night due to a sickness. He bounced back to make match play by qualifying eighth and went 15-3 in round robin to earn an automatic berth in the title match.

Barnes came into the finals riding a seven-game losing streak, the second-longest streak on his career, but he had a history of breaking losing streaks with a flair for the dramatic: he broke a career-worst eight-game losing streak in 2005 by winning his first career Major title in the 62nd U.S. Open.

Things looked to be heading that way again when the No. 2 seed Barnes breezed past No. 3 Ryan Shafer, 257-205, in the semifinals and started the title match with strikes in the first three frames while Haugen left the 4-6-7 in the second and the 4-7-10 in the fifth giving Barnes what seemed like an insurmountable lead.

The match started to turn in the seventh when Barnes lost his carry and left three consecutive single pins, the third of which set off a stunning turn of events. Barnes whiffed the 10-pin in the ninth frame, giving Haugen the slightest of openings. Haugen, who had struck in the seventh and eighth frames,

took advantage by striking in the ninth and then doubling in the 10th to force Barnes to double for the win.

The eight-time champion left a 2-pin with his first shot in the 10th and picked up the spare which still gave him a chance for the tie with a strike. Instead, he left the 4-pin this time, leaving Haugen to celebrate from the bench for the second time this season.

"You can't give up, you just can't. There's a lot of pressure and prestige in this event and you just want to make good shots and not embarrass yourself," Haugen (Cave Creek, Ariz.) said. "I looked at the scoreboard around the seventh frame and knew if he didn't strike the rest of the way and I did, the most he could get was 220s and I could get to the 210s. I knew I could at least make him think about it. Anything can happen, a 7-10 or a 4-9, but I never thought it would be a missed single pin."

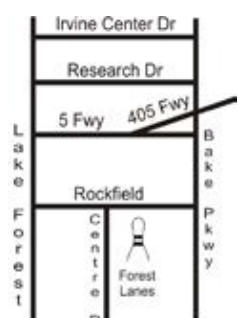
This week marked Haugen's first career Tournament of Champions event. He won his first career title in the 2007 Lake County Indiana Classic in November, defeating Wes Malott, 247-239. That day, Malott needed a strike in the 10th frame to win but left the 10-pin to give Haugen his first taste of victory. On Sunday, he became just the second bowler

in history — and the first since Joe Joseph in 1962 — to win their first career title and the Tournament of Champions in the same season.

"A lot of people say your career doesn't start until your first title and that the first one validates you as a bowler. What you do after that really defines your career," Haugen said. "That first win definitely gave me confidence but mostly I'm just in a better place in my life. I made a commitment to just worry about myself and not worry about anything else. If I keep my karma good, things will be just fine."

Haugen earned \$50,000 and a two-year exemption through the 2009-10 season for his victory. Barnes (Double Oak, Texas) earned \$25,000 for second and Shafer (Horseheads, N.Y.), who defeated PBA Hall of Famer Pete Weber in the first match, 215-213, took home \$10,000 for third. Weber (St. Ann, Mo.), who was looking for his record-breaking ninth career Major, earned \$7,000 for fourth.

The Denny's PBA Tour will take a one-week break before heading to El Paso, Texas, for the 2008 Bayer Classic at Oasis Lanes, Feb. 6-10. The live ESPN-televised finals take place Sunday, Feb. 10 at 12:30 p.m. EST.

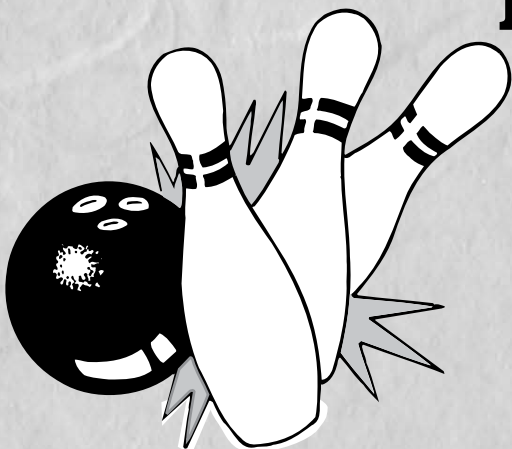

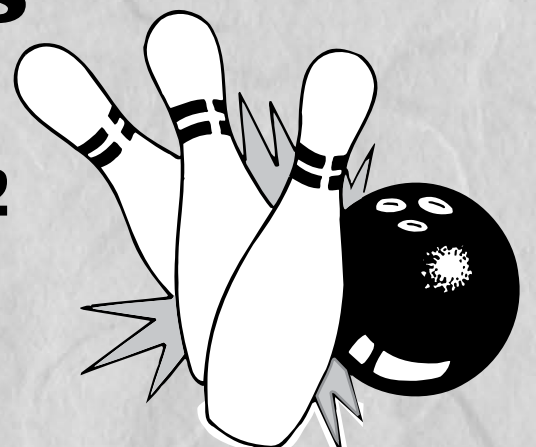

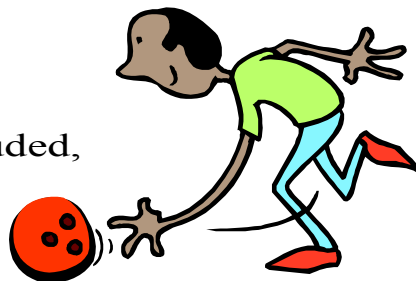

Yorba Linda Renovates Interior, Adds New Scoring System Center Continues Refurbishing Project; More Work to Come?

YORBA LINDA—Yorba Linda Bowl completed a remodel recently — with more work planned. It's part of a multi-year refurbishing of the lanes, and the current results look real good.

The biggest element of the most recent work completed last fall is a new scoring system, a Brunswick Vector Plus, and moving the service desk to the other side of the concourse, flipping the entire layout of the cash register and shoe area.

The result is better customer flow, and a better view.

"Before this, we had our backs to the lanes all the time," said Butch Hesketh, junior director at Yorba Linda. "The double-plus advantage is that we also get more seating."

Once they're seated, they get the cool new scoring system, and a view of the TV monitors.

Customers also get a better view of the entire layout because moving the welcome desk 'opened up' the center of the interior — much like a great room does in a house, creating a sense of open space and expanse.

Other work included moving the ball return area forward

onto the lanes; the system isn't new, but this act also expanded the seating area. There are also more tables and chairs. The service counter has a faux granite top. Work started in September and ended around Thanksgiving.

Décor still mixes blues, purples, and reds, with the exterior sporting the familiar dark red roof.

Hesketh and Chief Mechanic Tim Davis had primary responsibility for the work, which is part of ongoing improvements at Yorba Linda. About three years ago the center repainted its exterior — and that red roof can be better seen from Imperial Highway with some recent tree trimming.

Hesketh said the bar and lounge got a facelift last summer, and they might be putting in some new carpet this summer.

He said the main thing is serving the bowlers.

Weekends see tournaments, birthdays, and youth play; during the week, "we have a league in here every night," Hesketh said.

"Our bowlers are in love with what we've done," he said.

Jowdy's Journal

The USBC Masters Tournament.... A Truly Major Event

LAS VEGAS—The United States Bowling Congress Masters will reunite with the USBC Open Championships next season. The two events will be conducted at Cashman Center in Las Vegas with the Masters tentatively scheduled to be held February 8-15, 2009.

Chalk up another coup for Tom Clark, USBC Vice-President of Marketing and Communications who continues to exert all efforts to promote bowling in the right direction. The Masters is one of the most prestigious bowling tournaments of all time. Moreover, it has taken an even greater significance since becoming one of the "Majors" on the Professional Bowling Association tour. With the Masters now scheduled for February, the televised finals will no longer be pitted against the National Football League. This schedule time change will certainly gain greater media exposure, plus, consequentially, it will undoubtedly increase the all-important TV ratings.

Dick Evans, the most prolific bowling writer in the country, has often expressed his displeasure regarding the Masters being conducted in a regular bowling center; and rightfully so. With the exception of the last four or five years, the Masters held all qualifying and finals rounds in an arena setting, alongside the USBC Open Championships. Yet, despite the fact that the televised finals were conducted at Miller Park, home of the Milwaukee Brewers in 2004 and 2007, qualifying rounds were contested in a privately operated bowling center with limited space for spectators and bowlers alike. It hardly bore resemblance to a "major" event.

The original ABC Masters was conducted in 1951. The Masters complimented the ABC Open Championship Tournament, which, prior to the birth of the PBA, attracted the greatest bowlers in the country. Not too surprising, a great majority of Masters champions have achieved ABC/USBC Hall of Fame status, beginning with the initial champion, Lee Jouglaard. Four other Hall of Famers, Dick Hoover, Billy Welu, Billy Golembiewski, and Earl Anthony won it twice. Mike Aulby won it THREE TIMES!

Oddly, a number of less distinguished bowlers carted off a Masters championship but did little else to enhance their careers. For example, since the birth of the PBA, none of the following Masters champions ever notched a PBA title: Lou Scalia, (1967) Jim Chesney (1969), Doug Myers (1979) Neil Burton (1980), Mike Lastowski, (1983), Ken Johnson (1992), Jason Queen, (1997) Brian Boghosian, (1999) Brett Wolfe (2002) and Bryon Smith (2003) Even more astounding, look WHO they beat!

Jim Chesney beat Barry Asher,
Doug Myers topped Bill Spigner,
Neil Burton knocked off Mark Roth,
Mike Lastowski beat out Pete Weber,
Ken Johnson conquered Dave D'Entremont,
Jason Queen beat Eric Forkel,
Brian Boghosian knocked off Parker Bohn,
Brett Wolfe topped Dennis Horan,
Bryan Smith beat Walter Ray Williams.

With the exception of D'Entremont, Horan, and Forkel, all the above bowlers who lost to the non-PBA titlists are members of either the PBA Hall of Fame, the USBC Hall of Fame, or both Halls of Fame.

The sports world is replete with one-time wonders. Yet, no one can deny or erase the moment of glory of any of the aforementioned non-PBA titlists.

Nor can their names ever be dislodged from the USBC Masters record books.

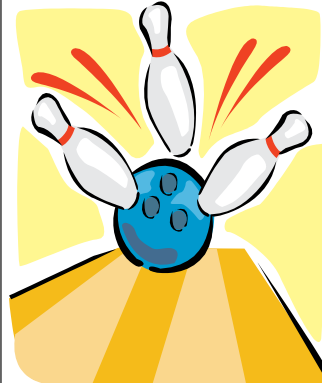

In the qualifying round we had some very good scores come in and to start us off is Darren Pascual 258-233, giving him the qualifying high game. Next in line was Justin Foster with his own 257-237-223 mix, Mark Myers posting 255-247, and Christian Hernandez 254-241-244 near the top. Then we have the leader of the round in Virgil Hilvano with 225-247-235-245, followed by Max Slevcove 247-233, Albert Fernandez 246, Brandon Pekins 220-234-237, Keyon Lemus 224-221, Esteban Llamas 234, Godfrey Galsim 233, Patrick Smith 233, Teddie Carter 233, James Bael 233, Kaprice Booker 232, Andrew Hilvano 226, Josh Gartrell 223, and Melissa Pena 221.

Now there was a lot of complaining about the lower end scoring, but I just gave you 18 of the 29 bowlers that posted well. Need more convincing? Hilvano led with plus 159 and eight more bowlers making the cut was on the plus side. In fact, the cut line for match play was a mere minus 23. I

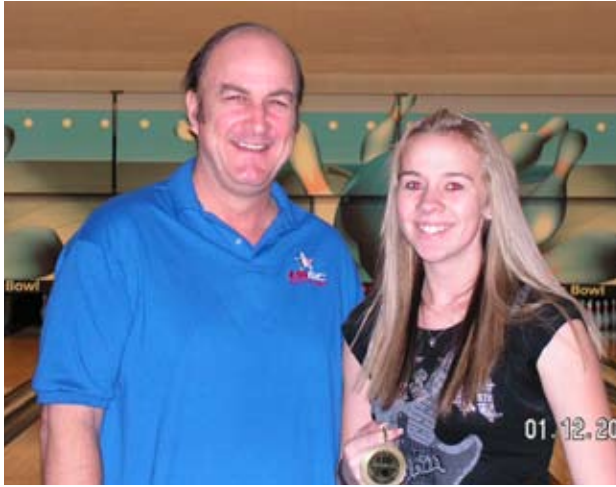
think the scoring and conditions were good, different but good. As junior bowlers learning and working your way up, you need to recognize this and that more learning to "properly" adjust, is still needed.

USBC MODIFIES AWARDS PROGRAM TO CONTINUE FOCUS ON RECOGNITION, CREDIBILITY, POSSIBILITIES IN THE FUTURE

GREENDALE, Wis.—The United States Bowling Congress has modified its awards program for the 2008-09 and 2009-10 seasons in a continuing effort to shift focus toward credibility in recognition of exceptional accomplishments.

Central themes in the revamped program will be the replacement of many honor score and special achievement awards, currently awarded on an annual basis, with once-in-a-lifetime awards, and development of a futuristic Internet-based recognition system.

"Organized bowling has wrestled with its awards programs for more than a decade," said USBC Chief Operating Officer Kevin Dornberger.

"After years of discussion, debate, research and opinion polls, USBC's leadership has concluded the awards program of the past simply does not serve the interests of our members today, nor does it serve USBC's mission to regain credibility for our sport.

"USBC and its predecessors have always placed a high value on recognizing outstanding personal achievement," he continued. "We are going to continue recognition of excellence, but rather than offering a token reward for individuals who accomplish the same feat year after year, we are going to recognize the fact that once a player has accomplished a specific feat, the special nature of that accomplishment has been realized."

For the 2008-09 season, the only major modification involves changing adult and youth honor score awards (300 game, 800 and 900 series, 11-in-a-row game) to once-in-a-lifetime awards.

For the 2009-10 season, USBC's wide range of emblem and pin awards for special achievements all will become emblem awards and all also will become once-in-a-lifetime awards. The list of special achievement awards ranges from 7-10 split conversions, all-spare games and Dutch 200 games to a variety of average-based high game and high series awards.

"The purpose of our average-based high game and series achievement awards is not to create a reward system, but to recognize members for improving their skills and advancing to the next level," Dornberger said. "Whether it's a youth or adult bowler, that remains the focus of these awards. Once a player has achieved a goal, there is no special thrill in earning another emblem for the same accomplishment. The goal is to get better. That's the point of our average-based awards program: to recognize improvement."

Beyond its tangible awards program, USBC also continues to expand its remarkable individual recognition system through the development of its National Database and the "Find a Member" feature on its official Web site, bowl.com. While bowlers will no longer earn awards for multiple 300 games, 700 or 800 series, etc., all of those accomplishments will be compiled as a part of their ongoing career files stored in the database.

"The era of emblems, coasters and trinkets is ending," Dornberger said, "but a new era of possibilities is on the horizon. We are just beginning to tap into the possible new ways we can recognize our members via the Internet. The future holds some amazing promise."

Blankenship 209, and Andy Betancourt 206.

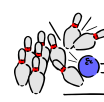
