Canyon Lanes of Morongo Will Open Soon

BANNING—I recently spent some time with manager Randy Johnson taking a tour of the new Canyon Lanes of Morongo. No date has been set for the grand opening, but construction is nearly complete. The lanes are located at Morongo Hotel and Casino, just east of Banning on Interstate 10.

There will be twenty-four lanes to start, with a possible expansion to sixty, if demand warrants. Decor will be “modern-retro” with lively color schemes and the newest furnishings AMF has to offer. The new AMF 90 XLI pinsetters have been installed along with thirty-two inch plasma scoring screens, and an extreme lane lighting system which includes flashing string lights all the way down each channel.

The use of multiple aluminum circular air vents, a curved aluminum ceiling, and the rectangular shape of the building gives one the impression that he/she is on a cruise ship.

Randy is not your conventional manager. He has years of experience in the industry, having been manager of Cerritos Lanes and AMF Riverside Lanes. He likes to think out of the box. During the hour I spent with him he described a half-dozen unique promotions he was planning. The bowling industry needs more innovative thinkers like Johnson.

Johnson plans to make his center a party place, available for group, business and corporate events. Anyone will be able to rent the whole building for a private party. Because the center is split, with twelve lanes on each side of a central concourse, smaller groups may rent half of the lanes. No leagues are planned for Friday or Saturday evenings, which will make the center available for open events on week-ends.

Johnson has plans to host tournaments, parties and sweepers from other bowling centers. With the bowling center next to the Morongo Hotel and Casino, there will be plenty of special bowling/hotel/casino promotions.

On Top of the World

HENDERSON,NV—Jason Couch has done just about everything in his 15-year Denny’s PBA Tour career, but he can now add back-to-back titles to his already impressive resume.

Couch defeated 41-year-old rookie Billy Oatman, who was attempting to become the second African-American in history to win a Denny’s PBA Tour title, 236-228, Sunday at Strike Zone at Sunset Station in a match that came down to the final shot.

Couch, who earned his 15th career Denny’s PBA Tour title, captured his second title in as many weeks after winning last week’s Dick Weber Open, becoming the first since Tommy Jones in 2005 to win back-to-back. A four-week hot streak has seen Couch go from 27th in the PBA World Point Rankings to 1st.

“I don’t think I’ve ever had a run like this. In 1999 I made a show and two weeks later won my first Tournament of Champions, but never have I gone third, sixth, win, win,” Couch said. “I had an opportunity to put a lot of heat on (Oatman) in the 7th frame and I left a 6-pin. Either way, I knew I’d have to get up in the 9th and 10th and do something big. Billy is a phenomenal talent and I have no doubt in my mind he’ll end up in the winner’s circle.”

Couch trailed early against Oatman, a Cinderella story who earned an exemption for this season only after exempt bowler and cash in the sidepots. Brackets will be available for the hardy.

According to Tom Cristi (who always offers good stuff), bowling should be over by 1:00 P.M. in time for Super Sunday Part II.

Ritchie Allen deferred his exemption due to an injury. Oatman had finished 11th at the Denny’s PBA Tour Trials, one spot shy of an exemption.

He showed a lot of poise in the title match, striking four consecutive times in frames 6-9 while Couch had a nine-spare in the 7th to let Oatman take over the lead by two pins. Showing why he’s a future PBA Hall of Famer, Couch stepped up and struck twice in the 10th to put the pressure back on Oatman. Needing two strikes to win, Oatman struck with his first shot, and hit the pocket with his second shot, but the 10-pin stood up, giving Couch the win.

Couch advanced to the title match with a 238-230 win over Mike Scroggins. Couch struck in five of the first six frames to take an early lead but Scroggins struck three times in frames 6-9 to force Couch to double in the 10th for the win.

Oatman advanced to the title match with a 207-181 win over Brad Angelo. Oatman took the early lead with three strikes in the first four frames while Angelo had 2-10 splits in the 1st and 4th frames. Oatman left a pocket 7-10 split in the 5th frame giving Angelo an opening, but he could not capitalize and Oatman struck with his first ball in the 10th to clinch the win.

Couch (Clermont, Fla.) earned \$25,000 for the win, while Oatman (Chicago) took home \$13,000 for second. Angelo (Lockport, N.Y.) earned \$6,500 for third and Scroggins (Amarillo, Texas) earned \$5,500 for fourth.

Next week the Denny’s PBA Tour heads to El Paso, Texas for the 2007 Sun City Classic, Jan. 31 – Feb. 4 at Oasis Lanes. The nationally televised ESPN finals take place Sunday, Feb. 4, at 2 p.m. EST.

Jowdy's Journal

The greatest honor than can be bestowed on any bowler is induction into a Hall of Fame.

How can a bowling Hall of Fame be best described? A Hall of Fame is like a Pulitzer Prize; the ultimate recognition of an individual's contribution. A Hall of Fame is a sanctuary dedicated to specialists in their chosen professions.

Our country doesn't want for bowling Halls of Fame. There are city, state, and county Halls of Fame, all honoring individuals who have contributed, in one way or another, to better the game. However, the ultimate bowling honor is induction into the USBC Hall of Fame (formerly the ABC/WIBC Hall of Fame).

How are worthy nominees selected? Presently, USBC Hall of Fame nominees are selected in three categories. Two of them are in the performance category; professional and amateur and the third in meritorious service.

In the performance category, the records and history books simplify the process. The facts and figures ease the task of separating the superstars from the less talented. Performance charts work wonders for the voters. Figures just don't lie.

However, the Meritorious Service category offers different challenges to the voter; greater degrees of concentration, study, and soul-searching. Unfortunately, in both the Performance and Meritorious Service cases, the popularity factor occasionally rears its ugly head.

I am, and have always been, a strong supporter of the USBC Hall of Fame. As a matter of fact, prior to the unification of the ABC/WIBC organizations, I served several terms as a member of the ABC Hall of Fame Committee, a position of honor that I cherished and took very seriously.

Now, for the second time in two years, I am mystified and confounded by the non-selection of Del Ballard to the USBC Hall of Fame. This is, in no way, a reflection on the Hall of Fame Committee. The committee again nominated Ballard and sent ballots to all eligible voters; yet Ballard failed to accumulate the necessary percentage for induction. Ordinarily, I do refrain from commenting or criticizing voters for their decisions or choices. However, I can't imagine any one voter associated with bowling overlooking Del Ballard's outstanding record, both in ABC and PBA competition.

I might have understood any voter by-passing Ballard for immoral or unprofessional behavior. For example, in the recent Baseball Hall of Fame voting, Cal Ripkin and Tony Gwinn were shoosins, despite the fact that a few irresponsible numbskulls failed to recognize their worthiness. Not too surprising though, over two thirds of the baseball writers declined to cast a vote for Mark McGuire...and understandingly so. McGuire's refusal to answer questions regarding the use of steroids made many writers wary and questionable of his worthiness to the sacred shrine.... at least for the time being.

But, for the life of me, I cannot imagine ANY writer not voting for Del Ballard. Have they checked his record? Has Ballard ever acted unprofessionally? Has he ever been accused of alcohol abuse, misbehavior, drugs, or anything detrimental to the sport? How can any RESPONSIBLE voter overlook Ballard's bowling feats; achieve-

ments that far surpass a majority of ABC Hall of Fame members.

For those who have neglected to cast their ballots for Mr. Ballard, his record includes **FOUR MAJOR TITLES.** In most sports, players are gauged by their performances in major events. Many PBA and USBC Hall of Famers have never won a major. The immortal Dick Weber only won four majors. As a matter of fact, Ballard has won more majors than 90% of all male PBA and ABC/USBC Hall of Famers, including such superstars as Ray Bluth, Nelson Burton Jr., Don Johnson, Dick Ritger, Mark Roth, Carmen Salvino, Brian Voss, Wayne Webb, Norm Duke, Dick Hoover, Bill Lillard, Ed Lubanski, and Andy Varipapa.

Ballard's four major titles alone would suffice as Hall of Fame credentials but his overall PBA and ABC record are further testimony for his worthiness. The following are Ballard's four major titles:

- *The US Open in 1987
- *The US Open in 1993
- *The 1989 Firestone Tournament of Champions
- *The ABC Masters in 1988

Ballard's performances in ABC Masters competition is nothing short of remarkable. Besides winning the ABC 1988 Masters title, where he averaged 219 for 25 games, he was 2nd in 1986, averaging 211 for 26 games, and finished 5th in 1989, averaging 232 for 28 games. His average for 142 games in match play is 216.

In addition to his four majors, Ballard has annexed 12 PBA titles (which does not include the Masters) He has over \$1,200,000 earnings

For the record, I'd like to unashamedly state... if Ballard isn't worthy of being an USBC Hall of Fame inductee, then NOBODY is!







TRIBUTE TO DICK STOEFFLER

ANAHEIM — I met Dick in 1958. He was the first manager at Linbrook Bowling Center, when I was applying for a porter position here at Linbrook, better known today as a customer service person.

Dick started the West Coast Match Game Eliminations, which was held here at Linbrook for about eight years. At that time it was the premiere scratch tourney in Southern California. Dick moved on to La Habra “300” Bowl where he continued the tournament for two years. Then it was on to Kona Lanes in Costa Mesa where the tournament found its greatest venue. Dick was the manager at Kona for at least the next 10 years. Not only did the W.C. Elims (as it became known) flourish, he added a Northern California Division with a home and home match between the two division champs. I can remember the crowds on Monday nights during the Elims. There was standing room only and during the Finals the fans were 10 deep on the concourse.

During this same time, Dick was the originator of a Saturday afternoon television bowling show featuring the best bowlers in this area. Not only did he start the show, he was the color man for the show, which lasted some 10 years. This very busy man also had time to build Kona Lanes into one of the most successful centers in the nation. Kona in 1975 had 5,000 sanctioned league bowlers (2,000 daytime, seven leagues started after midnight). The only complaint was there was no time for open play.

Dick’s first love was journalism. His column in the Pacific Bowler which occupied this space was a must read by bowlers throughout the Southland. He was also a contributor to this paper and other publications till shortly before his passing. His fights with the American Bowling Congress, the P.B.A. and numerous tournaments that he thought were unfair to the bowlers were legendary.

His bowling accomplishments were quite impressive. He bowled back to back 300 games in league play, made the T.V. show on the P.B.A. Tour and was a consistent 200 average bowler when that meant something. He was a true innovator and made many contributions to the bowling scene in this area. He was my employer, my mentor, and most of all a friend for 50 years and I have missed him very much.
