Tri-Senates to Host \$10,000 Weekend Tournament at Cal Bowl

LAKEWOOD — Saturday and Sunday, April 14th and 15th, The Los Angeles Bowling Senate of the National Bowling Association (TNBA) will be hosting the newest edition to the Tri-Senates tournaments: The Tri--Senates of So CA Championship Tournament!

There will be five big squads to choose from and this tournament will be paying a whopping \$10,000 (based on 100 teams) to the first place team with only a \$65 per bowler entry fee! In addition to the grand prizes, there is an added incentive to attract "the average bowler" (teams with an entering average of 900 or less) as well as "seniors" (teams with all bowlers aged 55 and over) as this tournament will be paying a bonus prize to the top team in each of those two categories!

The tournament will be held at the 68 lane Cal Bowl in Lakewood, CA. As with all of the Tri- Senate tournaments the first squad on Saturday will feature a special match up between the four core senates of the Tri-Senates for bragging rights and trophy.

All the other squads will be open to TNBA members from

any senate. Each squad will also have an optional round robin sweepstakes doubles event as well as lots of side pots, brackets and the exciting "Team Eliminator" to start off each squad. Nothing but pure fun and lots of prize and side monies to be earned!

With this tournament the Tri-Senates of So CA is reaching out to all bowlers from everywhere to participate - all you need is to be a current TNBA and USBC member, both membership must be purchased prior to bowling in the tournament.

The Tri-Senates of Southern California was founded in 2006 with the goal and purpose of creating match game competition originally between the three bowling senates of the National Bowling Association located in the Southern California area: Los Angeles, San Diego and the Inland Empire. Since then, the Antelope Valley (Palmdale) Senate has been added.

These four bowling senates rotate the hosting of these match game tournament four times per year. These events have grown to become very popular events show casing

Mike Fagan Tops Chris Barnes to Win First Major in Alka-Seltzer Plus Liquid Gels USBC Masters

HENDERSON, NV — Mike Fagan of Dallas won his first career major title Sunday, defeating Chris Barnes of Double Oak, Texas, 246-213, to win the 2012 Alka-Seltzer Plus Liquid Gels United States Bowling Congress Masters.

A three-time winner on the Professional Bowlers Association Tour, Fagan completed a 30-pin comeback in the back half of the game to pull off the upset over the top-seeded Barnes at Sunset Station's Strike Zone Bowling Center.

"All week long I really wasn't thinking about majors, matches or what my opponents were doing. I just wanted to do what I do to the best of my ability," said Fagan, a two-time Team USA member who earned \$50,000 for the victory. "Now the fact that it has paid off feels amazing. Sometimes you can bowl your best and not come out on top. I know how few and far between these opportunities can be, so for me to take advantage of it is amazing."

Fagan failed to strike in the first four frames of the championship match, while Barnes started with four out of five strikes to start the match. Fagan then rattled off seven consecutive strikes to take control.

"I really didn't like any of the first couple shots off my hand because they were a little fast or a little bit too aggressive," Fagan said. "The next few shots I really just wanted to get my body position right and let the swing follow and the pins cooperated thankfully."

Barnes was hoping to become just the third player in PBA history to complete the career Grand Slam with victories at each of the PBA's four majors. Only two players in bowling history have accomplished the feat - Mike Aulby and Norm Duke.

"This one hurts; it was a difficult day," said Barnes, who has now lost the Masters as the top seed three times. "I was more nervous today for

the final than I have been in a long time. There were a lot of legacy things on the line, and I'm not confident I will get another chance to win this tournament because it's so hard to get through all the matches."

Fagan advanced to the championship match by defeating 2003 Masters champion Bryon Smith of Roseburg, Ore., 228-180. Smith never led in the match and failed to get through all the matches."

LOS ANGELES — The fourth annual Chris Paul PBA Celebrity Invitational, presented by Sheets Brand, provided enough all-new story lines to create a script that will make Hollywood proud. The Chris Paul Celebrity

Invitational is the second time the PBA has used an upscale "boutique" bowling center as host for a special event. In the summer of 2011, the PBA visited 10pin bowling lounge in downtown Chicago as host for its GEICO Team Shootout, a summer series of made-for-television singles, doubles and team competitions pitting bowling ball companies against each other.

Paul, who joined the L.A. Clippers at the start of the 2011-12 season, has made a lot of friends during his brief stay in Los Angeles, and several of them joined the special fundraiser benefitting the CP3 Foundation. Among the

celebrity bowlers were former Southern Cal and current Miami Dolphins running back Reggie Bush, L.A. Clippers teammate and NBA Rookie of the Year Blake Griffin, former New York Giants star defensive end and current Fox NFL analyst Michael Strahan, actors Jesse Williams (Grey's Anatomy) and Jerry Ferrara (Entourage), comedian Kevin Hart and Grammy Award-winning recording artist Ciara. Comedian and "The Price is Right" host Drew Carey also was in attendance. "Mindless Behavior," one of the hottest groups on the contemporary music scene, provided the mu-

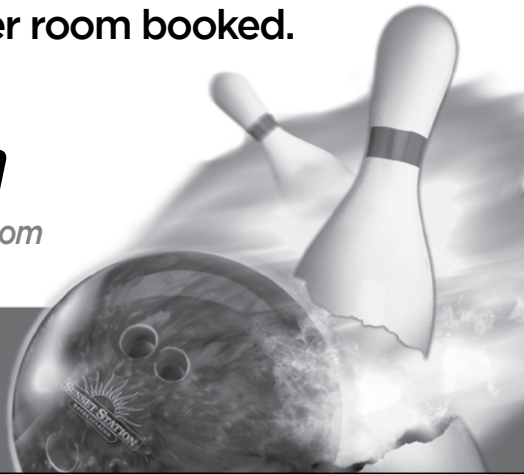

COVINA — We returned to Covina Bowl and their friendly, efficient staff where we saw 178 entries come out and support the ABTA. We had a decent shot making the cut scores of +48 for the men and +26 for the women. The Super Seniors added to the board (2 men and 1 female) were Ely Cruz (+47), Robert Ricketts (+41), and Janine Ditch (-33). YES Minus 33!!

Super Seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 44 bowlers making it to the semi-finals at Covina.

Top qualifier for the Men was Art Windsor with a +141, and for the women it was Natalie Perenishko with a +77. They will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Each week our top seed overall draws the Match Series. This time it was worth \$312. Art drew a 629. We had no bowlers that bowled this score, so we will estimate the Match Series at \$750 at Westminster Lanes Saturday.

The last bowler up for the 3-6-9 roll-off this week was Darrow Tiongco. He needed to get five 9 counts or strikes to take home \$1,600 this week. Darrow was not able to pull off this feat so he took home a consolation of \$50. We will add \$100 to the pot, and it will be at \$1,700 next week at Westminster. There is \$900 in the reserve pot.

Our optional doubles!

Finishing in first were Samson Kong and Michael Kong with a 1449 for \$100. Finishing second was Samson Kong and Wilson Cheung with 1405 for \$80. There was a total of \$790 paid out in doubles, 17 paid spots, with low to cash of 1327. Bubbles is going to have sum good Dog Chow this week Adrienne, hehe.

After bowling three games in the semi-finals, the leader was ABTA Veteran Javier Avila with a huge + 144. Right behind was Michael Kong with a +138. Javier, had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$1,580.

Javier Avila drew a 246. After a review of all the scores bowled, we had no bowlers who shot that score. We will estimate the pot at \$3,200 at Westminster.

This would bring us to our top 16 Match Play finals. In the first round, the seven losers were Andrew Toro, Je Je Gabriel, Ely Cruz, Maelinda Gehrke, Bobbie McCollum, Art Windsor, and Henry Hoang. They received checks of \$100 each. In the second round, the losers were Ricardo Baca, George Covarrubias, Marina Suos, and Michael Kong. They received checks of \$107.50 each.

This would get us down to the final four bowlers. At this point, our horses would be paying anywhere from a low of \$41 (Kmel Cunanan) to a high of \$95 (Salvatore Galluzzo) depending on who would win.

In this round we saw Salvatore Galluzzo (12th seed) bowling Kmel Cunanan (6th seed) with each bowler coming in hot having bowled good games the match before. It was Sal that would continue bowling good while his opponent Kmel had trouble finding strikes on this pair and could only get spares. Sal would finish with a 248 to 195 and advance to the semi-final match. In the other match we saw John Armenia (3rd seed) bowling Manuel Laygo (4th seed).

In this match it would be another fairly close match that would see John edge out Manuel with a 219 to 209 and advanced to the semi-final. Both Manuel Laygo and Kmel Cunanan finished in 4th and 5th getting checks for \$115 each.

Our semi-final match was all set now. This time we bowled on Lanes 43 and 44 as we were on the high side at Covina. In the weekly "horses" we would see John paying \$43 and Sal paying \$95 if they would win their match. This is another very close match that went down to the 10th frame as both of the bowlers had found their shots and were on a roll. However, it was Salvatore Galluzzo who was not to be denied in making it to the title match. He finished with a 209/240 to 185/205 and advanced to the title match. Javier converted his spare, but Sal is still leading by 7 pins going into the 10th frame. In the 10th, Javier left the 1-2-4-10 on his first ball and was not able to pick it up. Sal came up with a spare and strike to send him onto his 2nd ABTA Championship finishing with a

178/209 to 154/189.

John Armenia (3rd Place) is from Orange and used a Columbia drilled by Will Wilson at Barry Asher Pro Shop. He is married to Connie and they have 4 children (Sarah, Jacob, Joey and C.J.). John would like to thank his family for their support, specially his wife Connie, the ABTA and its staff, and Happy 40th Birthday to his lovely wife Connie, the love of his life.

BWAA Elects Mohr, Vidad as Senior Bowlers of the Year

ARLINGTON — The Bowling Writers Association of America has elected Ron Mohr, Eagle River, Alaska, and Paula Vidad, Sun City, Calif. as Senior Bowlers of the Year for 2011.

Mohr won four PBA Senior titles, including the Senior US Open and finished in the top five in all but one of the 10 events in which he competed. He is the first senior to win four titles in a single season, earning himself \$56,100 to top the earnings list. He finished second in the average rankings, surpassed only by Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr, Ocala, Fla., who finished runner-up in the balloting. Harry Sullins, Chesterfield Township, Mich., was third in the voting.

Vidad was the 2011 Senior Queens champion and had an outstanding showing in the USBC Women’s Championships. She also finished 16th in the Golden Ladies. Runner-up for the second year in a row was Char Hammel, Las Vegas, who finished third in the Golden Ladies and second in the Senior Queens.

Candidates for Senior Bowler of the Year must be 50 years of age by January 1 of the year of competition. The Bowling Writers Association of America instituted the male award in 1993 and began the female award in 2000.

Letter to the Editor

This is in response to William Waldo’s “Letter to the Editor” in the January 19 edition.

I do agree that it appears that no one in a bowling center knows how to really sell bowling. After all, selling bowling is an intangible. And an intangible is something you can’t hold in your hand. I have been involved with bowling, in one form or another, since 1955; and I also know how to sell. It’s not as difficult as one may think.

There are four basic steps to selling an intangible: greeting, determining what the customer wants, inform the customer and close the sale. But first, an individual must develop a positive attitude, no matter what. If you believe that business is bad, keep that negative attitude and business will get worse. You have no one to blame but yourself. So, let’s get started selling bowling. These are the “rules” no matter what position you have in the center. From the janitor to the general manager, this is for you.

Greeting: This is as simple as saying “hello” to every customer that walks in the door. And do it with a smile on your face and a cheery voice. If you know the customer’s name, the greeting is as simple as “Hi, John. How are you?”

Once the customer has been greeted, determine what the customer wants. If the customer wants to know where the coffee shop is located, guide them to it. Just telling the customer means that you have lost a potential sale. If you are a snack bar person, and the customer wants to bowl, guide them to the control desk.

This is where the control desk person takes over. Once you know what the customer wants, inform the customer about the products you’re selling. Since the product is an intangible, inform the customer about the center’s events and specials. And answer the customer’s questions with a smile.

The second part to this is if you’re the pro shop guy or gal. And remember, it takes 24 to 36 hours for that ball plug to harden properly; so, you aren’t that busy. Then again, you’re not selling an intangible; you’re selling an actual product. Know your merchandise. Know the specs of a ball you’re trying to sell to the customer. Know what additional colors those shoes come in. Let the customer know that the product will arrive late tomorrow, if possible.

Closing the sale is the easiest part of the job. For the desk person, it’s as simple as, “Can I sign you up?” For the pro shop person, it’s as easy as, “Can I drill it for you?”

Following up on your closing, thank the customer for visiting your business. And be cheerful through the whole sale. This is where the positive attitude really pays off. The customer will remember how they were treated, and will want to visit your center, probably on a regular basis. And remember, the customer has friends, and will tell them what a wonderful time they had in your center. Since the centers do very little in advertising, word of mouth is the best advertising money doesn’t have to buy.

Selling an intangible, such as bowling, isn’t as difficult as it appears; as long as you maintain a positive attitude and cater to the customer’s wants and needs.

sical entertainment.
