Mike Fagan Wins PBA “One A Day” Dick Weber Open For First Individual PBA Tour Title

FOUNTAIN VALLEY—In his eighth season on the Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour, Mike Fagan of Patchogue, N.Y., finally won his first individual Tour title in the PBA One A Day Dick Weber Open Sunday at Fountain Bowl.

It will be an especially memorable win for Fagan as he defeated PBA Hall of Famer and all-time win leader Walter Ray Williams Jr. 241-213 in the championship match to earn the \$25,000 first prize.

It was just a year ago that Fagan finished second in the Dick Weber Open after losing to another bowling great, Hall of Famer Norm Duke 278-168 in the championship match.

“I think I learned a lot from that experience last year,” the 29-year-old Fagan said. “The key for me was just to bowl the way I know I can and the results will take care of themselves.”

Fagan’s only other Tour ti-

tle was the PBA Exempt Doubles with partner Danny Wiseman in the 2007-08 season.

“I’ve had a lot of experience bowling on TV so I knew it would be just a matter of time before I got another win,” Fagan said. “If I have a weakness bowling on TV, it’s probably selecting the right equipment, but I made the right decisions today.”

For Williams, who was trying for his 47th title, it was a matter of pin carry. He earned \$13,000 for second.

“I just didn’t have the carry and Mike did,” said the 50-year-old Williams, “but he had a better angle to the pocket and he bowled a great game—it would have been tough to beat that.”

In the semifinal match Williams defeated Hall of Famer Pete Weber 234-178 to advance to the championship match. Weber, who ranks in a tie for third in all-time Tour

wins with 34, finished third for the second consecutive year in the tournament named after his legendary father.

In the second match Weber defeated fourth-place finisher Bill O’Neill of Southampton, Pa., 214-202, and in the opening match O’Neill defeated four-time Tour titlist Ryan Shafer 226-200 who finished

fifth.

The Dick Weber Open featured the traditional open qualifying format used in the PBA’s early years with 15 games of qualifying determining the top 24 advancing to three eight-game blocks of round-robin match play. The top five players after match

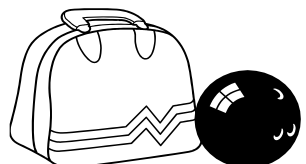

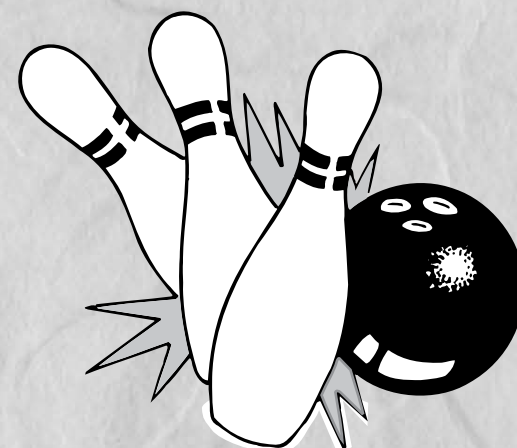
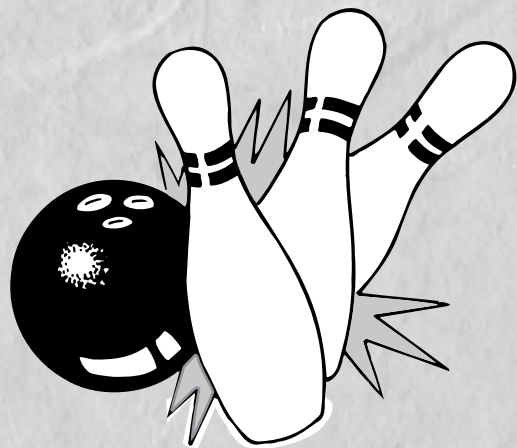

LAS VEGAS — The South Point was the Host of our January Las Vegas Open. The ABTA Bowlers converged on the beautiful property, Lanes, Hotel-Casino and in spite of the bad weather (rain) 525 entrants entered the Event producing sweet payoffs, and lots of fun and excitement.

One of our pretty ladies surely had a lot of fun and that being Cecile Cruz, of Rancho Cucamonga who has been with us six years. She really bowled well to claim her first ABTA Title and a nice \$5,100. She won the event on the final Ball edging likeable Je Je Gabriel in the title game 204-203. The economy didn't seem to slow down these bowlers who came to the South Point as the 525 entrants established a \$25,000 + Prize Fund, Much Much More in Optionals, and Drawings with Cut scores on a medium side daily for our bowlers.

Due to the great turn out we saw 114 Bowlers advance to a full house of semi finals. After skipping 16 lanes each game each bowler had a taste of each area of the house. Although all 114 are going to cash, their goal is to advance to the top 32 Single elimination finals which includes 7 guaranteed Women.

After the three game semis we had Men, and 7 guaranteed Women making +54 to make the top 32 Finals. Topping the field was the pretty Cecile Cruz of Rancho Cucamonga with a great +157. Narate Junthondum was in second at +131. Cecile gets the advantage of sitting out and bowling for the title. Narate will enter in round two of the Single elims.

The Matches were on and losers in round #1 received \$210 in 18-32nd place.

Round two saw Julie Nguyen, Tim Austin, Val Wise, Deborah Sanders, Cecilia Lung, Jason Chiu, Galindo Chavez, and Narate Junthadom lose out and get checks for \$225 finishing in 10-17th places.

Round three got contentious with Chae Kim downing Le Star Walker, Fel Garcia getting to Jerry Fagan, Je Je Gabriel getting top Anthony Martinez, and Jimmy Wong downing Beth Borci. They got \$250 in 6-9th Places and bowled very well.

Round four saw Fel Garcia run out of gas falling to Chae Kim 222-195. Jimmy Wong was upset by Je Je Gabriel in a close one 186-184. Jimmy and Fel cashed in for \$500 each in 4th and 5th places with Je Je and Chae to meet for the right to bowl Cecile Cruz for the title.

This match was also a good one and so close until Je Je pulled away at the in a 222-207 win and the Pretty Lady was 3rd \$1,250 and Je Je off to the title game vs Cecile.

The Title Game was on and Je Je lead off. He opened with the 3-10 split. Cecile also opened and then spared. Both clean til Cecile opened the 5th frame and again opened in the 7-8 frames. Je Je got the big 4 split in the 8th and this match was going down to the wire. In fact Je Je has a one pin lead two frames to go. Cecile finished the 10th with a strike and a 9 count for a 151/204. Je Je now got an 8 count and spared. He now needs a strike to win and 9 will tie. He then performed and definitely seemed to throw a great shot and the ball went dead into the pocket, a great shot but he got a real bad break as the 5-7 stood and he loses by one pin 164/203 He was unlucky on that shot to say the least — great shot, but Cecile with her sweet finish is our Latest Champion and the deservedly so. 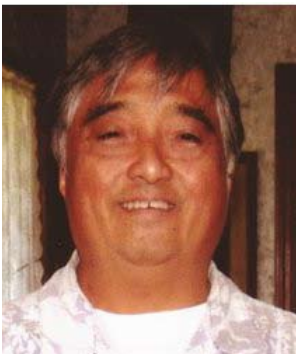

ABT “REGIONAL” TOURNAMENT

PAYS OUT OVER \$65,000.00

LAS VEGAS—The recent Amateur Bowlers Tour (ABT) “REGIONAL” event held at the Gold Coast Hotel Casino and Bowling center in Las Vegas was extremely successful despite the treacherous weather that was encountered by all over the extremely rainy weekend. Special thanks, also goes out to PBA member Randy Peterson for stopping by. Randy who is recovering from recent knee surgery is a 13 time PBA champion and was recently voted as the 35th greatest bowler of all time.

The ABT “Regional” Tournament approved by USBC and sponsored by *Storm* and *Roto Grip* product paid out in excess of **\$65,000.00** and offered something for bowlers of all ages and skill level. Along with the **KING OF THE HILL** main event format where the winner received a check for **\$5,000.00** and if they purchased the Bonus option for \$20.00 and won the main event the bowler would receive another check for additional **\$5,000.00**. Our side action tournaments included **CROSS OVER DOUBLES** Tournament, a **Seniors (50 & Older)** Tournament and for our more skilled members we offered a **SCRATCH** Tournament. All of these side action tournaments had a **guaranteed** first place of **\$1,000.00** and if the bowler paid for the Bonus pot of only \$20.00 and won the side tournament they received an additional **\$1,000.00**. As mentioned the **KING OF THE HILL** format allows bowlers from the **CLASSIC** and **MASTERS** division to compete in separate qualifying. This tournament also featured block qualifying instead of the traditional qualifying by day. Another popular side action event at this regional was the two game sweepers. Bowlers took there highest two game handicap totals and competed by blocks for additional money. The winners were paid at the conclusion of each block. The two game sweepers generated a combine prize fund payout of over \$3,700.

The Salt Lake City branch of the ABT recently started a Junior ABT program. This program allows the Junior bowler to bowl in a fair and competitive environment. All money won by a Junior bowler is set up in the USBC’s “SMART” account. As the word spreads, ABT hopes to have all of its branches participating in this unique program. The only ABT Junior division member to bowl in the events was Alex Hoskins, winning over \$1400 in scholarship monies.

Our winner in the Main Event was Jeff Batchelor from Payson Utah. Jeff is married to his lovely wife Karry. Jeff has 8 children, Shannon, Tracy, Dena, Brady, Mike, Dixie, Katie, and K.C. Jeff was using one of the newest ROTO GRIP balls, the Mutant Cell drilled by Adam Pierce at South County Lanes. Jeff plans on using his winnings for future ABT events. Jeff wanted to make sure that he thanked Elden and Adam Pierce, all of his friends at South County Lanes, along with the Gold Coast Bowling center and all of the ABT Directors. Jeff commented that “This win is for the Salt Lake City ABT Members.” The main event had 229 entries and we paid 49 places showing a cashing ratio of 1 in 4.6 entries. Much better than the advertised 1 in 6.

Our winner in the Senior Division is from here in Southern California. Arnie Schroeder who is a multi-time champion and is a charter member of the ABT. Arnie who is 78 years young is married to the love of his life Maybelle and has a son Steve. Arnie does his league bowling at Cal Bowl in Lakewood California. Arnie is a retire college professor and taught math at Long Beach State. Arnie is a weekly supporter of the ABT Orange County branch and one the finest gentlemen you will ever meet. Again Congratulations to Mr. Arnie Schroeder. The senior event had 63 entries and we paid 15 places showing a cashing ratio of 1 in 4.2 entries. Again better than the advertised 1 in 6.

Our winner in the Scratch Division is also from Southern California. Spud Brown who is also a multi-time champion and a life time member of the ABT. Spud is married to Leah and has three children Nicholas, Mia, and Keaven. Spud was using a Columbia equipment drilled by Andy Needman. Spud another of the fine gentleman bowls leagues at Vista and Parkway Bowl in the San Diego area. When we ask Spud what would he do with his \$2,000.00 winnings he replied “Alcoholic Beverages” Spud wanted to thank his mom (Go Go Brown) for here love and support, and all of the other family members who were here. Spud is a true gentleman and our latest ABT Champion. There were 40 entries in the scratch event and we paid 12 places. This is a cashing ratio of 1 in 3.3 entries. The best of all the events.

Last but not least our Doubles Champions are Arnie Schroeder and Alex Hoskins. Alex was our only Junior Division member taking advantage of the opportunity to bowl for the large guaranteed prize funds offered by the ABT. Under our rules for this event Alex was not able to participate in the Progressive Pot, so what he would have won was added to the general prize fund for the other ABT members. This rule will change with the next regional event. All side tournaments and the progressive pot will be available for all ABT members that meet entry eligibility. There were 99 doubles teams and we paid 24 places for a cashing ratio of 1 in 4.1. This is a great cashing ratio.

Notes from the President of The Amateur Bowlers Tour:
Dear Members,
It was an honor and privilege to once again be involved with the regional events, this time hosted at the Gold Coast in Vegas. Even though there was only 229 entries in the main event, the ABT again paid the full Guarantee of \$10,000.00 for first place. We had one member not meet full eligibility so half of his prize money (\$1250.00) is being carried over to the May regional event. We are the only club that carries over bowler prize money that is not won. Other organizations keep monies that are not won for themselves. The average return to the bowler from ABT events nationally is over 90% of all entry fees paid. At this past weeks regional event the return was 93%. Ninety three dollars of every hundred was returned to the members in prize money. The rest went to expenses that included lineage, postage and advertising. This alone sets the ABT apart from all other tournament organi-

zations. Other organizations advertise better cashing ratios and larger prize funds, but none show you all the money you spend and how it is accounted for. Your local directors work for less than \$5 per entry in most cases. This again is well below the normal for tournament directors. Support your local clubs so the regional and national programs that offer such great benefits to the average bowler can continue on the large scale that is currently offered.

We certify our events with the USBC so your entry fees and prize money are covered.

Remember to enter the upcoming national events at Sam’s Town in April. The next regional event will be held Memorial weekend, also at Sam’s Town.

The ABT is for the average bowler. We take care of your interests first, by making sure your money is properly accounted for!



here as well.

When we learned that Kelly had surged into the final four averaging 231 for the final block of match play we were overwhelmed with emotion at the possibility of this being a history making moment. The news spread throughout those gathered for the opening and our BWAA meeting was postponed a half hour so we could all watch the show. Our group was hunkered down in a room at the Sheraton. We were cloistered in an almost fetal position on the couch hugging a pillow or coat – as though that made things more secure (this is what girls do) - TV set on. It felt like we were in the stands at Red Rock Lanes in Las Vegas.

Kelly was in 2nd spot and would bowl the winner of the first match who happened to be Mika Koivuneimi – known for his ability to win in big events. Poised, and in control, she struck out to shut Mika out of the match 227-225. We could sense a purpose in each delivery. Now she would face 2009 Bowler of the Year Chris Barnes.

We had to have some wine to calm our nerves.

We roared and clapped right along with the crowd at Red Rock our stomachs doing flip flops with every strike. We had all seen pro tournaments before but this was definitely different!

Kelly was focused, she was ready. Her signature smooth approach, perfect balance – the same every time – she was like a machine. She started with a four bagger and seemed cool and then a pocket 7-10 popped up. She seemed unruffled and returned, seemingly steely, to the strike brigade and struck all the way out with nine on the final ball to defeat the struggling Barnes 265-195. Had she been intimidated? She says her opponents are just that – she bowls the pins. Although not obvious, she admitted her legs were like jelly but to us, it appeared the adrenalin took over. Maybe it was Chris who was intimidated.

All week long through the 54 games of qualifying and match play the crowd was with her. Even her opponents wanted her to succeed. It was the wind beneath her wings. She had trained for this moment – the gym five days a week, Yoga – working on mental focus and stability and she had become a student of the game bowling with the pros in the men’s arena. She never blamed anyone or anything – she just learned from each experience. She said as she bowled with the men she became smarter and learned to adjust and make moves faster. Her coach, a ball expert, and had counseled her on ball changes.

She had been training for this day since she began bowling on Saturdays with her family at Linden Lanes in Union City, New Jersey – a center where she says she has done most all of her bowling. She loved it and decided at a young age that she wanted to make bowling a career.

We all jumped up and cheered as it became obvious that Kelly Kulick of Union City, New Jersey had become the first women in the 51-year history of the Professional Bowlers Tour to capture a title - and it was a biggie.

She raised her hands in victory and gave a loving hug to her mother and then handed her the trophy. Her mantra had been “Nothing to Loose” and when she was asked if this historical victory would change Kelly Kulick she said, “I don’t think so. I am who I am and I stay grounded – or my mom keeps me grounded!”

She was asked if she envisioned herself winning and she said, “Yes, but not the Tournament of Champions.” The win gave her a two-year exemption and a \$40,000 pay check. She said she would compete in maybe two or three more tournaments this year – Colorado and Columbus among them - and her goal was to win again so people will know it’s not a fluke.

She works in her dad’s auto body shop doing clerical work when she’s not doing clinics or traveling. She is a coach at the Dick Ritger Bowling Camps and a student of his fundamentals.

She has enjoyed the men’s tour and says all have been courteous to her but she really prefers bowling on the woman’s tour. She says if her win does anything, she hopes it encourages corporate America to see the value in supporting a woman’s tour. The ESPN rating was the highest in five years with 1.7 million watching.

She is overwhelmed at the reaction to her win and says, “It’s not just bowlers across America.” ESPN has touted the show a “classic” which they did immediately following the show – something they rarely do. Her plans? Lots of prep before next year.

Our excitement consumed us. We had a front row seat – a room with a view. The wine was gone. We witnessed history being made. Today was Kelly’s day.

Bob Summerville...an unforgettable character

The prestige of Bowling This Month bowling publication has been nothing short of miraculous, particularly the impact it has had on fervent bowlers. With all due respect to other bowling publications, BTM has become the Bible among pro shop operators and bowlers who take the game seriously. It is the realization of a dream come true for its founder, Bob Summerville, the most passionate bowler-person I have ever met.

Summerville not only published the magazine but, in order to make an honest evaluation of various balls sent to him by manufacturers, he tested every ball personally.

I'll never forget the first time I spoke to Bob. Following a suggestion from my good friend David Husted, Mr. Summerville called me in September 1995. He phoned me at my home in El Cajon, Ca. from Houston, requesting an interview. The following month, I received a copy of BTM with my picture on the cover. True to Bob's character, the interview was written verbatim...in exact words, taped and unedited. I still have the copy and shudder at the words and adjectives I used to express my feelings and answers.

Bob and I had several conversations after that. He loved to talk bowling. Many of our conversations lasted from 30 minutes to an hour. Strangely, I never met him in person until he asked me to be one of the coaches at the first Super School in Taylor, Michigan in 1997. I'm honored to have coached at every Super School but, more important, it is gratifying to be apart of Bob Summerville's legacy.

I've been in the game over 60 years and can honestly state I've never met anyone with a greater passion for the game. I can't recall anyone who not only emphasized the importance of proper instruction...he supported his belief by striving to conduct the most comprehensive instructional programs ever attempted. Over the years, Bob's selection of top coaches/instructors for Super Schools included greatest names in the game. Fred Borden, Jeri Edwards, Palmer Fallgren, Susie Minshew, Rolf Gauger, Carmen Salvino, Bill Spigner, Bill Hall, Bill Holt, Susie Reichley, Mo Pinel, Dr. Dean Hinitz, myself and other highly qualified but lesser publicized instructors.

Bob and I did several bowling clinics together in Pinole, Ca., a short distance north of San Francisco. Bob drove from Houston because he refused to fly. Our clinics, were arranged by another passionate bowler and successful pro shop operator, Al Louie. We met every morning for breakfast and one thing stuck in my memory. Bob never drank coffee. Nor did he drink milk. He drank cokes for breakfast, lunch, and dinner and sipped many more in between. He never used alcohol and didn't smoke. He had energy to burn and never sat still.

Bob asked me to become a staff writer for BTM shortly after we became friends. At that time, I rejected his offer because I felt a loyalty to Bowling Digest, a publication my articles had appeared in for several years. Later, after consulting with the editor of Bowling Digest, I was permitted to write for BTM, as long as the articles were not written in identical form. As well as I can remember, I penned my first column for BTM November 1999. Since then, with the exception of several issues where I have been neglectful of datelines, I have been a regular columnist and feel privileged to be included among some of the best writers/instructors in one of the greatest publications in bowling. Most important, I feel extremely fortunate to have been associated with Bob Summerville, a sincere gentleman, a true bowling enthusiast, and a real credit to the tenpin sport.

Summerville's Super Schools inspired others to conduct bowling clinics. Although Dick Ritger's bowling camps preceded all others, Summerville's Super Schools were designed for advanced students and were conducted by the most astute instructors he could muster. His magazine became, and continues to be, the Bible for bowling pro shops world-wide.

In my humble opinion, Bob Summerville is a prime candidate for the USBC Hall of Fame. He is certainly worthy of induction to the Texas Bowling Hall of Fame. His creative efforts set the standard for technical bowling publications. His super schools inspired others to follow suit.

Unfortunately, Summerville died in 2001 at age 54. But one thing is certain. Bob Summerville is looking down on us from the Great Beyond, content that his contributions have made bowling more interesting than ever.

Fortunately, his soul-mate, Alayne, continues to carry on the tradition. I can just see Bob bursting with pride at every Super School and every issue of BTM.

Long live the Bob Summerville legacy!

A Month Later Malucci Again Rolls 300/857 At Red Rock In Las Vegas

LAS VEGAS — Last Tuesday, January 26, in his other league at Red Rock Lanes, Carl Malucci shot 770 on games of 247-289-234. His second game had front 10 strikes before leaving a solid 7-pin and in his third game he missed 2 solid 7-pin spares to spoil his chances at getting an 800. He thought, Got to take what the game gives you and got to remain calm when it's good or bad. To stay calm, he did, because...

On the following night, Wednesday in his Mountainsiders League at Red Rock, Malucci had a strikefest in rolling this season's both second 300 and 800 in less than a month and his 800 being a BIG 857 series gem. His games were 278-279-300.

The first game had front 7 strikes before leaving a solid 7-pin in the 8th frame, spared and hit 4 strikes before leaving a 9 count (7-pin again) on his fill ball for 278. His second game had front 5 before leaving a solid 7-pin, spared then punched out for 279. The last game was all solid for 300 and 857.

That's now his 43rd certified 300 and 19th 800. Also that's his second series of 850 or better along with the 869 he hit a few years back making him the first deaf bowler with two 850 or higher series. His average in Mountainsiders League is at 245 at this point. That 857 is his 11th straight 700 series or better on Wednesday nights.

That's not all, his 857 helped his HAKA 888 II to a 2811 league high scratch series which merits another headline because his teammate Melchora Lee deserves one too.

Melchora Lee Hits 258/709 As Team Hits Deaf Record 2811 At Red Rock

LAS VEGAS — With the above article of Carl Malucci's 300/857 hogging the headlines, teammate Melchora Lee deserves one of her own because her 709 series also helped their HAKA 888 II team to a deaf record 2811 series. Melchora's 709 which took over Mountainsiders League women season high series, consists of games 204-247-258. (The 709 may be her first 700 as this writer could not recall her hitting a 700 before.)

This 2811 is the Mountainsiders League season high team scratch series and replaces their own previous high 2745 rolled last season at Red Rock. With Melchora leading off with her 709 (204-247-258) and Malucci anchoring with his 857 (278-279-300), in between teammates Joey Harris hit 212-184-227 for 623 and Barrett Lee 249-168-205 for 622. HAKA II had games of 943-878-990 for the record 2811.

Gallo Jr. from Cape Carteret, NC, the first deaf member of the PBA since early 1970s and Theyken from San Diego in his first season as PBA member did not do well in the first round 5 games averaging 175.

On Thursday Ed Abakumoff, Riverside and Robert Ellison El Cajon were there but both Gallo Jr. and Theyken did not improve their standings after 15 games. The Dick Weber Open ended Sunday and Michael Fagan beating the popular Walter Ray Williams Jr. for his first individual title.

Previously in the PBA South Regional tournaments, Gallo Jr. was doing so well that he may be the 2nd deaf PBA bowler to make the prestigious Regional Players Tournament this year. Detroit's Pete Kaczmarczyk was the first deaf bowler to bowl in the RPT about a decade ago.
