National Deaf Bowling News 17 Straight 700's Got Carl Malucci In USBC Bowling Records by Connie Marchione

LAS VEGAS—It was great news when I was told by Mark Miller of USBC Communication Dept. that Carl Malucci is now the bowler with most consecutive 700 series in league record at 17. A quick look at the USBC bowling records on bowl.com showed that most consecutive 700 series is 16 by Randy Chaat, Granite City, IL 1990-91 and 16 by Tony Buck, Grand Rapids, MI 2006-07. Chaat also had 13 in 1987-88.

This is surprising as I never expected Carl to make this record consecutive 700s when I was told during the Deaf Senior Bowlers of America tournament that Carl now resides in Las Vegas and on recent Sunday bowled his 41st career 300 and 780 series at the new bowling center in Red rock Hotel and Casino. That was the starting point as on the previous Sunday October 5, 2008 he rolled 695 series at Red Rock Lanes prior to his embarking on his unexpected fantastic 700 journey.

Being busy, I forgot about that until Carl contacted me with his career 17th 800, a 811 series in the same league and that was his 5th consecutive 750 plus series.

To bowl that high consistently in once a week league was astonishing and I told him to keep on reporting to me. Carl did, saying that his 750 plus streak was broken with 736 but he bounced back on the following Sunday with a 770.

Actually Carl's team, Team Nation started the season in Sunday Mixers Foursome League at Red Rock Lanes. When the Wednesday's Mountain Siders Mixed foursome League at the same place was short a team, Carl's Team Nation was asked to fill in the Wednesday league beginning on November 26, 2008. On that day Carl bowled a 762 to start and inquired if it could be counted in as consecutive. It can if he did not bowl in any other

The three already had a career 300 game each and Carl himself, 41 career 300s and 17 career 800s with a high of 879 in which was one of 4 800s he bowled in one month span in 2007.

Carl is now on another conquest, as he now has 13 consecutive 700 in his Sunday league, he aims to break his own record for one league.
