Mookie Betts, Tommy Jones Win CP3 Invitational

CONROE, TX – Boston Red Sox star Mookie Betts was still in the midst of celebrating a stunning baseball season in which he won almost every key award possible, including helping his team to a World Series victory. But stuck in the back of his mind was the fact that in two previous appearances, he and his Professional Bowlers Association partners had finished second in NBA star Chris Paul's annual CP3 PBA Celebrity Invitational.

Betts was determined to end that streak, and in the 10th anniversary CP3 benefit bowling event that aired on FOX on Sunday just ahead of the Super Bowl, Betts found his stroke just in time as he and 18-time

PBA Tour titlist Tommy Jones rolled to a convincing 101-86 victory over 2017 CP3 champions Pete Weber and Pro Football Hall of Famer Terrell Owens in the modified five-frame title match at Bowlero at the Woodlands.

"I finally got one," Betts said after hoisting his Heisman-style trophy. "Now I'm going to enjoy it and get ready for baseball."

The doubles competition involved a modified five-frame format in which the PBA partner bowled

the sixth, eighth and 10th frames while the celebrity bowled the seventh and ninth frames.

Betts, a life-long bowler who has demonstrated his skills on the lanes as a competitor in the PBA World continued on page 1

Imperial Valley Seniors Tournament January 26-27 at Strikezone in El Centro, CA

EL CENTRO – A trio of ladies rose to the top and were the cream of the crop in singles competition as the 2019 Senior Bowling Tournament was conducted at the Strikezone Bowling Center in El Centro and sanctioned by the Imperial Valley USBC recently.

The handicapped-based tournament was held over a two-day period with singles, doubles, team and all events categories slated. A minimum age of 50 was the lone requirement for USBC members to compete.

In all three games to post a 670 handicapped series (123-126-130). Joyce Ingram and Roberta Dale's handicap total of 1,380 pins would take runner-up honors.

Debi LeMert won the singles with a handicap total of 739 and edged Roberta Dale by just 4 pins. Debi's scratch series of 577 (201-179-197) nipped Roberta's 591 (192-215-184) to the Singles title. Estella Minor was a close third with a 724 handicapped total (192-186-196 for 574 scratch).

In Doubles competition, David Conley rolled his all-time best series with a 696 scratch (248-245-203) and teamed up with wife Marlene to top the field and take the Doubles title. Marlene was above average in

The four-person Team competition was taken by Karen Love, Mike Angulo, Debbie Angulo and John Denault with a handicap total of 2,720 pins. Debbie's series of 156-206-226 and 714 total was key to the 7-pin victory over the team of Susie Ludlow, Debi LeMert, Dan Hilburn and Danny Maring, who posted a handicap total of 2,713 pins.

Maring's scratch 729 series with games of 240-233-256 led all bowlers on an individual basis in the weekend tournament.

In the All Events category, Richie Urrutia was best overall with series total of 682 in Team, 643 in Doubles, 646 in Singles and a handicap total of 2,178. Maring and Dale shared runner-up honors. Roberta had 511 in Team, 559 Doubles and 591 scratch singles for a total of 2,093 handicapped. That matched Maring's 729 in Team, 650 Doubles and 633 in Singles.

'Phantom' to Take Spray Gun Out of Moth Balls

INDIANAPOLIS – A tournament that epitomizes collegiate team bowling in the 21st century will take a page from the past when it makes its Indianapolis run this month.

The Hoosier Classic has invited Len Nicholson to personally condition the lanes in the Round of 8 in both the men’s and women’s divisions. And he’ll use his iconic spray gun to lay down the oil.

“We wanted to do something special for the 50th anniversary of the tournament,” said director Nick Hoagland. “Since 1998, the tournament has always bowled on ‘tough, unique oil patterns.’ This will just add to the legacy and brand of the event.”

Nicholson has long been affiliated with Kegel, whose lane machines will put down the pattern for qualifying and Sunday’s Baker games. During the Round of 8 competition, a Kegel Flex machine will strip the old oil, and “The Phantom” will apply the new coat using the spray gun.

Nicholson was the PBA’s lane maintenance supervisor for years, and is considered an expert in making lanes as fair, and challenging, as possible.

Nicholson, elected to the PBA Hall of Fame in 2011, earned the nickname “Phantom” because many pros found his conditioning regimens mysterious. For decades, he has hosted a podcast called “Phantom Radio,” speaking at length to top bowlers and industry insiders. He’ll “broadcast” the program at the Classic, set for Feb. 15-17 at Indianapolis’s Western Bowl.

For those who want to see how lanes were oiled prior to the introduction of the robotic lane machine, Nicholson will spray the Round of 8 lanes for the men at approximately 11:30 a.m. that Sunday, and for the women at about 3:30 p.m.

One hundred forty-four teams are entered in the tournament, the final Tier 1 event of the 2018-19 United States Bowling Congress Collegiate season. 1987 was so busy that we had to divide it into four parts!

- When the “Bumper Bowling” craze hit So. California, new products were in demand; lightweight balls, smaller rental shoes, and leagues bumper related with trophies, shirts, just to name a few. **WESTBROOK BOWL** signed up 150 new bumper bowlers the first week!
- Bouncy Bobbe North was inducted into Citrus Belt Hall of Fame. She also belonged to So. California Hall, Los Angeles Hall, and California State Hall. Some of her students were Donna Adomeh, Cindy Mason, and Paula Vidad. Her motto was “There’s not business like the bowling business!”
- **GAGE BOWL** in Huntington Park, owned by Ray Svela, had more 300 games registered in the 1986-87 season than any other center in So. California. Reason? Ray said “We keep our lanes in top shape and have great league bowlers.”

- **GRANADA LANES** offered a Cruise League. Where to? Nassau, San Juan, St. Thomas. Later came Hawaii or Alaska or Cancun.
- All writers were urging bowlers to attend their league meetings. Know Your Rules! Know Your Officers!
- Michelle Silver and Rick Barbaria won the Doubles Elims at **CANOGA PARK BOWL**. Mini-skirts were in (ladies only). No levis. Men had to wear collared shirts. They smiled for the camera.
- Question to the A.B.C. “If a center’s lanes are certified, the ball is certified, the bowler has a current ABC card, the pins are certified, the proper lane conditions are applied.... how can a 300 or 900 be denied???” The U.S. District Court upheld the ABC decision to deny Glenn Allison’s 900.
- Roy Bade passed away in Idaho in November. He could sell you a “square” bowling ball.
- Vince Dwyer was named “Manager of the Year” by the ARC Corp. What happened to him??
- **CANOGA PARK BOWL** had an “Old Trophy Day Tournament” for Junior Bowlers. They had a trophy for EVERYTHING! <All bowling centers! NOTICE! What a great idea! Put a smile on the kids face and make use of the old trophies.>
- WIBC gave out 29,030 triplicate awards in the last season. High triplicate was 258-258-258 by Steve Schnakenberg. Low was 43-43-43/ 1,150 were given for the 7-10 split.
- ABC Certified 8389 Centers in ‘86-’87. California had the most certified leagues.
- October 2, 1987-Page 6. Pictured on the lanes were Stan Musial, Mickey Mantle, Yogi Berra, Don Carter, Babe Ruth, Hank Aaron, Ted Williams, Dizzy Dean, and of course Andy Varipapa. On the East Coast baseball players bowled. On the West Coast, movie stars bowled. (And owned Centers.)
- Deaf star Carl Malucci tossed a 300 game at **FRIENDLY HILLS**. He was only averaging a 200 that season.
- Don Johnson owned **KEYSTONE LANES** in Norwalk.
- Chris Schenbel was elected to ABC Hall of Fame.
- 4’11” Betty Goulding, was the manager at **CLARK CENTER**. A tiger in high heels.
- A Bill Taylor quote, “We’ll get along fine once all the rest of you realize I’m God.”
- The director of the Westwing Bowlers Tour was Ben Samonte. How long did it last? No answer on this end.
- Well, another Tournament Club....Pyramid Bowlers Classic Tour. That makes 9 in October 1987 that was advertised.
- **CHAPARRAL LANES** broke ground on November 3rd. Their 48 lanes are under the partnership of Art Goddard and Dave Osborn. Those 48 lanes are still the fun center of San Dimas. Opened in April 1988.
- \$100,000 was offered for a 300 on T.V. by True Value. NBC Sports was excited.
- Gary Kowarsch was Southeast District ABC Secretary. (When he wasn’t at the Beach riding the waves.) Certifying all the lanes was a BIG job. Plus average books, awards, meetings, tournaments, protests, etc. Not an easy job!!
- A married couple that bowled at BOWLIUM won \$8.5 million dollars in the State Lottery. No, they didn’t buy the bowl!
- Very busy execs of the Bowling Proprietors association were Vince Calderon, Ray Svela, George Brandt, Mickey Cogan, Terry Butocao, Gary Ford, David Spiegel, Allen Shaw, Don Drocker, Rudy Leewaye, Milt Galik, Reed Freeman, Rudy Hinojosa, Ken Hubbard and Dick Steinbaugh.
- Virginia Norton was named to W.I.B.C. Hall of Fame.
- California passed a new law...”Volatile Organic Compounds.” Better known as solvents. New lane dressings and coating should have limited amounts of solvent fumes. Lacquer lane finishes were the target. Changed re-surfacing techniques 100%. No more fire trucks standing by.

The year 1987 was a record year for high scores, new centers, tournaments, clubs, awards, and “stars.” Hope you enjoyed the highlights and they brought back a few memories.(31 years ago!!!) - Carol Mancini.

Jakob Butturff Continues to Shine

Canadians Impact 2018 PBA Regional Awards

CHICAGO – Jakob Butturff of Tempe, Ariz., continued to be the player to beat in the PBA Northwest Region, winning another title and finishing second in his other three Northwest Region tournaments to retain his Player of the Year title in 2018. But across the PBA’s seven regions, players with Canadian roots made a major impact in 2018, claiming three regional Player of the Year honors and a Rookie of the Year award.

While the 24-year-old Butturff only bowled in four PBA Northwest tournaments in 2018, he also won PBA Regional titles in the Central, Midwest and West Regions while running his career titles total to 19 by the end of the year.

Butturff’s accomplishments in 2018 were among the highlights of the PBA Regional Award winners, announced today by Director of the PBA Regional and PBA50 Tours John Weber, recognizing Players of the Year, Rookies of the Year, PBA50 Players of the Year and Pat Patterson Award winners, for contributions to the regional program, in each of its seven domestic regions.

Award winners were selected by the PBA’s regional managers: Russ Mills, East Region; Sam Zurich, South Region; Bobby Jakel, Central Region; recently-retired Rich Weber, Midwest Region; Pete McCordic, Southwest Region, and Gary Mage, West and Northwest Regions.

Here’s a summary of the 2018 PBA Regional Award winners:

EAST – Darren Andretta of Wantagh, N.Y., bowled in six events, winning two titles and finishing second in a third to earn Player of the Year. Rookie of the Year is Todd Sigeti of Lititz, Pa., after a seven-for-seven record as a casher and a 13th place best finish. Rick Graham of Lancaster, Pa., won Senior Player of the Year after recording six top-five finishes in eight tries, including one title. Steve Pavlinko Sr. of Sewell, N.J., was recipient of the East Region’s Pat Patterson Award.

SOUTH – PBA Tour veteran Dick Allen of Lexington, S.C., won PBA South Region Player of the Year honors for the first time since the 2004-05 season, making match play in nine of 12 events, winning three titles and added three other top-five finishes. Former Teen Masters champion and two-time Junior Team USA member Mike Coffey of Melbourne, Fla., won Rookie of the Year honors after winning one title and recording two other top-five finishes in his first five tournaments. Veteran Stoney Baker of Canton, Ga., with three titles and six total top-five finishes in PBA50 events, was a dual honoree – winning Senior Player of the Year honors along with the South Region’s Pat Patterson Award.

CENTRAL – Ontario native Graham Fach, the first Canadian to win a PBA Tour title (2016 PBA Players Championship), repeated as the Central Region Player of the Year after finishing in the top five in six of 13 tournaments, including winning one title. Kyle Cook of Centerville, Ohio, captured Rookie of the Year honors after posting three top-five finishes including his first title. Harry Sullins of Chesterfield Twp., Mich., ended Brian Kretzer’s two-year hold on Senior Player of the Year, claiming that honor for the third time himself after winning a pair of titles and finishing in the top five on two other occasions. Bill Wammes of Bowling Green, Ohio, was recipient of the region’s Pat Patterson Award.

MIDWEST – PBA Tour player AJ Johnson of Oswego, Ill., retained the PBA Midwest Region Player of the Year award after a first-, second- and third-place season. Chicago’s Dakota Vostry won Rookie of the Year honors, cashing in six of 11 events with a season-best fifth-place finish. Jeff Johnson of Freeport, Ill., won Senior Player of the Year honors after posting four top-five finishes, including one title, in eight events. Kevin Kullman of Lockport, Ill., repeated as the Midwest’s Pat Patterson Award recipient.

SOUTHWEST – Two of the PBA’s Tour Canadian stars, Francois Lavoie and Mitch Hupé, won the Southwest Region’s top honors. Lavoie repeated as Player of the Year after winning a pair of titles and posting two additional top-five finishes. Hupé, a Wichita State University alum like Lavoie, earned Rookie of the Year cashed in four of five events with a fifth-place finish. Beaumont, Texas proprietor and PBA Hall of Famer Mark Williams won the region’s Senior Player of the Year honors along with the Southwest Pat Patterson Award.

WEST – The fourth native Canadian to impact the PBA Regional program was Quebec’s Ray Lussier, now living in San Jose, Calif., who won both Player and Rookie of the Year honors after winning his first PBA Regional title and posting two second-place finishes. Ron Mohr of Las Vegas won West Region Senior Player of the Year honors for the fourth time after second- and third-place finishes in a limited schedule of five events. Joe Goldstein Jr. of San Bruno, Calif., was awarded the Pat Patterson Award.

NORTHWEST – In addition to Butturff’s third straight Northwest Player of the Year award, Tanner Spacey of Burian, Wash., recorded second- and five-place finishes in the four tournaments he entered to earn Rookie of the Year honors. PBA Tour and PBA50 Tour veteran Hugh Miller of Mercer Island, Wash., repeated as PBA50 Player of the Year after one win and two other top-five finishes in three events. Darron Stanley of Vancouver, Wash., was selected as the Pat Patterson Award recipient.

The PBA’s regional program, founded in 1970, provides bowlers with a proving ground to develop their skills in high-level competition against some of the sport’s established stars. The PBA Regional program annually conducts roughly 150 events across the nation and in its Japan Region.

Series of Bowling twice – including bowling a 300 game in the 2017 WSOB – made a key speed adjustment in his delivery just in time to give Jones the help he needed. The 2018 American League MVP, batting champion, defensive player of the year, etc., thrilled the crowd inside Bowlero when he converted the challenging 2-10 split in his first frame of the doubles competition. Jones led off with a strike and then sandwiched two more strikes around Betts’ 10 pin spare conversion to record a 100-84 decision over Australia’s Jason Belmonte and NASCAR champion Aric Almirola in their opening match.

“I was just throwing the ball too hard but I figured it out,” Betts said. “It was fun. I don’t think Tommy missed, so I kinda rode his back.”

In the semifinal round, Betts struck in both of his frames, providing key support especially after Jones left a 4-10 split that he failed to convert in his second frame. Betts and Jones advanced to the title match with a 116-72 decision over the split-plagued team of Big Brother star Tyler Crispen and his PBA partner, Kyle Troup.

Betts again made a key contribution in the final match, following Jones’ first-frame strike with one of his own, and when Jones struck again, the outcome was all but decided after Weber and Owens started their game with back-to-back splits and open frames.

“The charity is first and foremost, but the competition is fun too, and seeing guys from other sports, different backgrounds and other professions, all coming together to play one sport is definitely fun. But I don’t like to lose; you never like to lose, so I’m glad we won this time.”

The 10th anniversary Super Bowl Sunday special, benefitting the Chris Paul Family Foundation, again featured a field of well-known athletes including a guest appearance by Houston Texans superstar defensive end J.J. Watt; a supporting cast of PBA stars and an opportunity for Teen Masters age-group winners Brandon and Justin Bohn, Tom Hankey Jr. and Jenna Williams, and collegiate All-American Gazmine Mason to rub elbows with the celebrity stars.

“We have a lot of great guys who come out for this event,” Paul said. “When Mookie doesn’t strike, we’re surprised, but this is the first year he’s won it so that shows that even if guys might be better players, when you get out here, things happen. It’s a whole lot of fun.”

The 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour season and the race to the PBA Playoffs heats up with back-to-back major championships (and Tier 1 points events), beginning with the PBA Tournament of Champions at AMF Riviera Lanes in Fairlawn, Ohio, Feb. 4-10, followed by the PBA Players Championship, Feb. 12-17, at Wayne Webb’s Columbus Bowl in Columbus, Ohio. FOX will air the TOC finals live at 1:30 p.m. on Sunday, Feb. 10 and the Players Championship finals will air live on FS1 on Sunday, Feb. 17 at 10 a.m. Preliminary rounds of both events will be live streamed by FloBowling.

nals will be televised live on FOX at 1:30 p.m. on Sunday, Feb. 10 and the Players Championship finals will air live on FS1 on Sunday, Feb. 17 at 10 a.m.

In addition to the PBA Playoffs race, the Tournament of Champions and Players Championship will be the first tournaments to feature a \$1 million bonus if a player bowls a 300 game in the title match of either stepladder final. While there have been 26 televised 300 games in the history of the PBA Tour, only two have been accomplished in the title match and neither of those took place in a major championship.

The two other opportunities to win the \$1 million 300 game bonus will come in the title matches of the live Go Bowling! Indianapolis Open finals Sunday, Feb. 24 at noon on FS1 and PBA World Championship that will air as part of the PBA World Series of Bowling X in suburban Detroit on March 21 at 5 p.m.

In the upcoming majors stretch, four-time PBA Player of the Year Jason Belmonte will again try to tie, and or break, the record for most PBA major wins. The nine-time majors champion made a run at the record in 2018 by finishing fourth in the Tournament of Champions and second in the Players Championship when he lost to Tom Smallwood, 259-239, in the title match. PBA Hall of Famers Earl Anthony and Pete Weber share the record for most major titles with 10. Weber also will bowl in both events, trying to take sole possession of the record.

Tournament of Champions defending champion Matt O’Grady of Rahway, N.J., made an incredible run to win the 2018 title, coming all the way from a pre-tournament qualifier to the stepladder finals where, as the No. 5 qualifier, he won all four stepladder matches culminating with a 207-193 title match win over Sweden’s Jesper Svensson to win his first PBA Tour title.

Competition points earned in both majors will be valuable for players who are competing for 24 berths in the inaugural PBA Playoffs. Players will continue to compile points through the USBC Masters which concludes April 1. The preliminary rounds of the PBA Playoffs will be held April 7-10 at Bayside Bowl in Portland, Maine, which will air on FS1 throughout April and May with the top four players returning to Portland to compete for a \$100,000 first prize – the richest in bowling – during the live finals that will air over two days (June 1-2) on FOX. PBA LEGEND CARMEN SALVINO TO COMPETE IN TOC AT AGE 85

There seems to be no stopping PBA legend Carmen Salvino



The 85-year old PBA Hall of Famer will compete in his 29th PBA Tournament of Champions, extending his record as the oldest player to compete in a Go Bowling! PBA Tour event.

PBA's most famous showman is one of the few remaining links to the storied tournament's origin dating back to the inaugural event in 1962.

"I'm in shape and ready to go," said the 17-time tour winner. "I'm working out and doing a lot of bowling to get ready. My weight hasn't changed in 63 years. I'm 195 (pounds) and haven't fluctuated five pounds either side of that."

Salvino began planning to bowl in the 2019 TOC after competing in last season's PBA 60th Anniversary Classic in Indianapolis.

"People have no idea of how it feels to go into the locker room of one of the great tournaments and see all the guys," Salvino said. "For me, it goes beyond bowling—just to be there with those guys is a thrill."


The 1962 TOC was held at Play Bowl in Indianapolis and was actually billed as the Indianapolis 500 Festival Tournament of Champions according to the Indianapolis Star's coverage of the tournament. It's an often-overlooked event because the tournament would not be held again for three years. In 1965, Firestone began its landmark sponsorship, the classic moved to Bowlarama in Akron, Ohio and then to AMF Riviera Lanes the following year where it remained for 29 years.

The first TOC was a two-day event featuring 25 PBA Tour champions – everyone who had won a title since the PBA's formation four years earlier. It was conducted immediately after the Indianapolis PBA Open, the final regular event of the Tour season, which also was held at Play Bowl. Salvino finished third in the inaugural tournament (his best finish in the classic). Joe Joseph won with a two-game total of 480 pins followed by fellow Michigan star Billy Golembiewski with 413 pins and Salvino with a 409 total.

"I'm an example of not letting your age stop you," Salvino added. "I'm looking forward to showing those young guns a thing or two."
