Dick & Duke, The Developers

LAKE FOREST-People who build a community, real estate people, an example, developers. If they are successful, become hall of fame members, get lots of publicity, some wealthy, name streets after them and usually live the good life.

Recently, Dick Stoeffler and Duke McGraw passed away. They received most of the honors. Both worked hard developing ten-pin bowling. Both knew how to promote besides being classic bowlers; many titles as amateurs and pros.

For sure they were promoters. Duke and NBC's Art Baker sold stock on KNX-TV to build Downey and Anaheim WonderBowls, both centers prospered. Lots of leagues, tournaments, stayed open 24 hours a day, hosted many professional events — real pin spas.

WonderBowl profits, with the consent of the stockholders, was used to build hotels, a movie studio, a couple of films and some prime Arizona land.

Dick Stoeffler and Dick Holtz produced a local So-Cal competitive hour-long elimination style show on KTLA/Channel 5.

Baker and Holtz were not bowlers. Dick and Duke were the prime movers with the right pitch and roll.

In the California Bowling News and Pacific Bowler, Dick and Duke got lots of ink. Both were members of five-man teams in the Greater L.A. Traveling Leagues and center general managers.

Dick in Orange County managing Kona Lanes innovating adult, junior, womens leagues, tournaments and open play.

Duke did the same at 32-split, 64-lane Downey WonderBowl, filling it with bowlers.

Both had their special programs. Duke probably a little more "chic". He installed a famous hard maple Brunswick Backbar worth about \$500,000 and he charged a dollar more per drink than the inside "house bar" did.


Dick started his career working for the Compton Herald American owned by colorful food chain operator, C.S. Smith. He had to write and sell ads. The Herald was located across the street from 8-Alley "Bud's" Monark Recreation. He probably had to set pins to bowl. Dick got into a number of hi-performance Halls of Fames, first Cal-sanctioned back-to-back 300 games, plus walls full of awards.

When Duke came West, he was noted a pro, 300 games, 800 series, headlines/banners of Mid-West and East Coast tournament titles and cash.

The TV shows slowly fadded away. So did the scores. They continued ten-pinning as long as they could, attended and Em-Ceed many Bowling Writer's Award Banquets and wrote timely/provocative articles.

This writer and the California Bowling News readers will miss them and their wit.

I guess there isn't enough land here to develop bowling centers? Yes, there is! Just no Dicks or Dukes or technicians like Baker or Holtz around



PBA Experience Enhanced by Videos, Flyers

GREENDALE-Learn how to tame chameleons, cheetahs, scorpions, sharks and vipers with new videos and informational fliers from the United States Bowling Congress and the Professional Bowlers Association.

Although it sounds like a National Geographic special, these videos and fliers - now available for the first time on bowl.com - are related to a unique new league bowling program called the PBA Experience.

USBC and the PBA have teamed up to create a series of short videos and informative fliers that give bowlers inside information and strategies for playing the five challenging oil patterns - Chameleon, Cheetah, Scorpion, Shark and Viper - used in PBA Experience leagues. There is a separate video and flier for each oil pattern.

In PBA Experience leagues, bowlers compete on the same lane oil patterns used on the Denny's PBA Tour. The patterns comply with USBC Sport Bowling guidelines which allow a maximum of three times as much oil on the inside boards of the lane versus the outside boards. This oil application typically is described as a ratio, in this case 3:1. The PBA Experience is part of the USBC Sport Bowling program.

USBC and the PBA created the videos and fliers to enhance PBA Experience competition for bowlers. The materials are sent to each PBA Experience league that registers with USBC.

Bowlers can watch the videos on bowl.com or at their center before their PBA Experience league. Centers use their overhead monitors to play the video that corresponds to the oil pattern on which their bowlers are competing during that league session. Hosted by USBC Sport Bowling spokesperson and PBA star Chris Barnes, the approximately seven- to nine-minute videos are produced in a simulated sports interview show format. The videos include Barnes and other Denny's PBA Tour players discussing oil pattern characteristics and strategies for

EL PASO, TX-The Big Finn is back. Mika Koivuniemi ended the longest title drought of his career, knocking off new roommate Chris Barnes, 214-185, to win the 2007 Sun City Classic at El Paso Lanes for his seventh career Denny's PBA Tour title.

The Finland native and 2003-04 PBA Player of the Year won for the first time since the 2005 Baby Ruth Real Deal Classic, a span of 38 events. He and Barnes just recently became roommates and Koivuniemi treated him rudely in their first-ever matchup on television.

Barnes held a slim lead before leaving a 1-2-10 washout and opening in the 7th frame. Koivuniemi responded with four consecutive strikes to take over the match, marking in the 10th frame for the win.

Koivuniemi has struggled this season by his standards, coming into the week with just one TV appearance and a No. 19 world ranking

"It's been a long time. It really feels great," said Koivuniemi. "A guy like Barnes doesn't usually give you a chance, but he did give me a chance and luckily I took advantage.

"It was just an amazing week. I had to bowl a 246 the last game Thursday just to make

The fliers include pattern descriptions, comments from top PBA pros, last year's Denny's PBA Tour champions, tips for different style bowlers, pattern graphs and amateur and professional average comparisons on each pattern. "The videos and league handouts are valuable resources for PBA Experience bowlers," said Director of USBC Sport Bowling Steve Wunderlich. "Bowlers will find that the inside information from Chris Barnes, Tommy Jones, Jason Couch, Norm Duke, Patrick Allen and other top Denny's PBA Tour stars will help them succeed in their PBA Experience leagues."

match play and two of my matches went seven games and then I had to come from behind to win the title."

As the No. 30 seed Koivuniemi became the lowest seed to win a single elimination match play event since the format was implemented in 2001-02.

Koivuniemi advanced to the title match with a 214-202 win over Patrick Allen. Allen opened three times in the first four frames, but mounted a huge comeback with a five-bagger after his third open. A spare in the 10th, however, meant Koivuniemi only needed a mark in the 10th and he struck for his fourth win in six tries over Allen on TV.

Barnes advanced to the title match with a 269-257 win over Mike Edwards. Edwards ran off eight consecutive strikes after an open in the 2nd frame, but Barnes matched him shot-forshot to maintain a one-pin lead. Edwards struck and spared in the 10th forcing Barnes to strike with his first ball in the 10th. He struck three times for good measure to deny Edwards his first title since 1994.

Koivuniemi (Hartland, Mich.) earned \$25,000 and an exemption for the 2007-08 season for the win. Barnes (Double Oak, Texas) took home \$13,000 for second wile Edwards (Tulsa, Okla.) earned \$6,500 for third and Allen (Wesley Chapel, Fla.) earned \$5,500 for fourth.

Next week the Denny's PBA Tour heads to Irving, Texas for the 2007 GEICO Classic, Feb. 7-11 at AMF Irving Lanes. The nationally televised ESPN finals take place Sunday, Feb. 11 at 11:30 a.m. CST.





It's February, 2007 How are *your* New Year's Bowling Resolutions Doing?

In going through my own records of teaching techniques which I've used in instructional leagues (where I usually donate my time *because <u>I also</u> want to learn from the bowlers' mistakes*), seminars with other coaches, such as Hall of Fame "Coach of the Pros" John Jowdy, etc. I've discovered some interesting things. First, that in addition to the valuable information gathered in coaching certification programs, I've also learned from these other coaches.

But I've actually learned more about what works in teaching, from the students themselves. This, I believe, is because the problems and questions that arise are often from way out in left field, so it's necessary to think on my feet to come up with workable answers. Filing these away for future use is how those experiences pay off in helping bowlers improve toward winning status.

Working with professionals is easy by comparison, because most of these players practice often and correctly, so they master the taught techniques extremely quickly, then come back for more. But bringing the low or mid-average amateur to a winning level is highly satisfying for any coach, because such bowlers often provide willingness, an open mind, maybe even great coordination, so all they are missing is knowledge.

My readers, I find, seem to cover every possible area of proficiency...from raw beginner to card carrying PBA professional. That makes it enjoyable, while challenging, for those of us who teach and write instructional articles for magazines and newspapers. Your responses generally help make it all worth while.

More On the Problem of Ball Selection

Do your eyes glaze over when you see diagrams of bowling ball layouts? What would you say if I told you that between 60% and 75% of bowlers are confused (either completely or at least partially) by most of the ball layout diagrams used by ball drillers to drill for certain desired performance results of specific bowling balls?

Beyond that, how do you react when you look at manufacturers' pictures of bowling balls, split in half to show the different shapes and placements of various cores? And what is meant by all those terms, such as "RG", "Differential/Flare", "Torque", "Length", and so on, that you see in manufacturer's reports or in a top instructional magazine, such as "Bowling This Month"?

Well, both the ball manufacturers and that magazine, actually have the balls tested by high level bowlers. So, just reading the instructions of how a given ball should react on various lane oil patterns and lane conditions, should give you the answer as to which ball to buy for the lane condition you might face, right?

Wrong!

Even with the additional explanations given in those ball test results, your own personal ball delivery techniques have a lot to do with how a given ball will react on the lanes, beyond the manufacturer's specifications!

Confused? Well, many bowlers are, as I mentioned above.

Un-confusing Yourself

In past issues of this and other papers, we've discussed instructions for such things as finding the positive action point (pap) of your ball, then throwing it and counting the revs from release to hook-out point, as well as measuring ball speed with a stop watch. Then checking the oil track's location on the ball relative to the holes and finally, listing all that information on paper for the driller.

Great! But not everybody knows how to do all the above without instructions, so is there an easier answer? Well, for those of you who want to simplify it without going through all that, here's how:

1 – Go to a pro shop located inside a bowling center and insist that the driller watch you throw a few hook (strike) shots, so he or she can get that needed information first hand. (A rare few free standing pro shops may contain a "stub" lane, allowing you to throw a ball right there, thus at least allowing the driller to get the gist of the information...those are good places, too.) Otherwise, go to a shop where they already know your bowling style...a shop you've been happy with in the past.

2- If the driller is also a coach, as some are, suggest that he or she also watch your swing and hand release. Why? Because how you get to your release, how you use your wrist and hand, etc. are also important pieces of information which can be used to determine which ball suits you best and how it should be balanced when drilled.

3 – Be absolutely certain that you know exactly how you want your new ball to work, in terms of any specific lane oil conditions in which you intend to use it. For example, if your ball hooks too much or too early when lanes dry out, ask for a ball that is manufactured to "go long" before it hooks. The driller can then suggest one made to do that, as well as locate the holes in a spot (related to the "pin") which will guarantee the greatest possible delay before the hook begins. Conversely, in freshly or heavily oiled lanes, you may want an "oil" ball...one which will grab the lane and hook earlier rather than skid through that slippery oil so far that it appears to never want to hook. That's why many bowlers carry at least two balls plus a "spare" ball (one which is hard and slick, deliberately designed to go straight, no matter what the oil conditions are). you practice, there's the score being automatically shown on the screen, easy to see.

"What's wrong with that?" you may ask. Simple...While practicing, if you keep score because it's so easy to see your scores on the screen, you often can't help shooting *to see the score results*. Well, when you're playing to see scoring results, you are <u>not practicing to see improvement in your execution</u>. And execution improvement is your reason for practicing, isn't it? You must realize that scores are completely irrelevant and unimportant during practice!

Correct Practice Rules

1. Do <u>not</u> even look up at the overhead screens.

2. Before even leaving for the bowling center, make a decision about whatever it is you're going to specifically work on that day. Things such as pushaway, free armswing, timing, hand release, follow through, adjusting principles, whatever.

3. Stick to practicing only the thing you have decided on for that session. To help with this, use a little "self talk" reminder before starting each approach. That will help you stay on purpose and keep you from "shot-gunning" your practice (over-thinking), which is deadly.

4. With each shot, pay attention to how your practice item feels. Practice that same item until it begins to feel comfortable. In professional sports, this is called "stretching your comfort zone", which creates improvement by gradually improving repeatability.

5. Practice fewer games more often, rather than too many at one stretch. This depends on your work schedule of course, but is an important basic principle, since it helps keep your mind on what you're doing.

6. If available, have a friend use a camcorder (or use a tripod) to photograph your movements. Many bowlers are surprised when watching themselves. "Did I do that?" is often what you'll say to yourself when first seeing what you look like. But that is a quick way to become aware of what you're doing now...and a great way to see the difference in yourself as you improve.

In addition to the above practice methods, some bowlers help themselves improve by joining practice leagues or flex leagues, in which there is little or no prize fund. The cost is less, so the league can be used for practice purposes only. If you're a senior, those "Senior Fun Day" events are perfect. You're in a league format, yet you never need to worry about score...a great way to train yourself to improve by using the above practice principles.

Today's Rolf-ism: Your bowling New Year's Resolutions should show improvement by March. Are you ready?

Here's another item we have discussed before, actually some time ago. But because I continue to see far too many bowlers practice, practice, practice...yet never seem to improve, I'm going to go into the main rules of getting closer to your goals by practicing correctly.

Actually these rules are quite simple...but you must sell yourself on the idea of sticking to them. Do not allow yourself to fall into those old habits, which cost you money for games played, but never show results. That's often difficult to do. Why? Because it is difficult to follow the most important practice rule of all...don't keep score!

Among the most important "improvements" in modern bowling center design, are the electronic scorekeeping systems. Great! No longer do we need scorekeepers. So what's the problem? Well, when





Bowl Ten Bagger



It must be getting a little crowded at the Big Bowling Center in the Sky. In my last column, I wrote about the passing of Dick Stoeffler, a Southern California bowling pioneer whom I knew for almost four decades. Ol' Steff died on Jan. 14 at his home in Las Vegas after a seven-year battle with cancer. I had written that it was a three-year battle, but Steff's son, Mike, assured me that it was seven.

Just one week after Stoeffler left us, I learned that Duke McGrew, another well-known Southland bowling personality, had died. His death was so sudden that it shocked his many friends.

Duke's wife, Helen, said he had complained of pain, so she insisted that he see a doctor. After a series of medical procedures, Duke was diagnosed with lung cancer. He was to undergo treatments but died before they could be started.

"He went to sleep and never woke up," said Helen, his wife of 56 years. They were an ideal couple, according to USBC Hall of Famer Andy Marzich, who was a longtime friend of both Duke and Helen

Marzich added: "In all the time I knew Duke, I never saw him mad once. He was a great guy.'

Duke, who was 84-although he looked 20 years younger-had many friends, including Dick Stoeffler. They had much in common.

Both had a keen sense of humor. Both were excellent bowlers. Both were members of the SoCal Hall of Fame. Both produced successful local TV bowling shows. Both loved all sports. Both had an amazing knowledge of baseball, its teams and players. And most important, both were devoted husbands.

Duke also was a very good golfer. He was justly proud of the fact that he had scored three perfect games in bowling and three holes-in-one in golf. (I don't know of anyone else duplicating that amazing feat.)

A touching obituary ran in the Los Angeles Times on Jan. 25. In case some of his friends missed it, here's how it read.

John "Duke" McGrew died Sunday, January 21, following a short illness. Duke was born in Chicago in 1922, son of Lila Murphy and John McGrew.

He attended Mt. Carmel High School, graduating in 1938. After serving in the Army in World War II, he returned to Chicago. In 1950, he married Helen Clemente and they moved to California in 1954.

Always an excellent athlete, Duke began bowling at an early age and later turned his hobby into a business. He bowled professionally, was (part) owner of two bowling alleys (WonderBowl-Downey and WonderBowl-Anaheim) and was a partner in WonderBowl, an innovative bowling chain established in the 1960's.

He was also host of several bowling shows, including Bowling for Dollars. Following this, he launched a successful vending business in which he was active until his retirement.

Duke was also a lifelong golfer. He was proud of the fact he had three holes-in-one and three 300 games in bowling.

He is survived by Helen, his wife of 56 years, a sister, Celeste Nemmers, 19 nieces and nephews, 13 great, great nieces and nephews and 27 cousins.

Duke was buried in San Jacinto, Calif., a Southland desert community where he owned a second home and where he went to play golf...often

It is doubtful if Southern California will ever see the likes of two better men-not just bowlers-than Duke McGrew and Dick Stoeffler.

SWITCHING REELS: Tenpin Slants spent five productive days at the recent Denny's PBA Dick Weber Open at Dave Osborn's Fountain Bowl in Orange County's Fountain Valley.

I had a wonderful time because so many old friends were there. It's the only time I see some of them, especially since the demise in 1998 of the annual SoCal Bowling Writers' All-Star Awards Banquet.

One day at the Dick Weber Open, I had a chance to listen in as Hall of Famers Carmen Salvino and Glenn (Mr. 900) Allison talked about the good ol' days. Salvino bowled in the tournament at Fountain Bowl "out of respect for my friend Dick Weber."

Salvino is still incensed because Allison's 900 series was never recognized by the ABC/USBC. "Glenn should've been honored by every bowler and proprietor in the country," Salvino said. "Another bowler who also deserves to be honored is Bill Bunetta, who has done so much for bowling (as an instructor).

On another occasion, I sat in on a conversation between Hall of Famer John Jowdy and Ron Hoppe, a couple of world-class professional coaches.

Hoppe, a native Southern Californian who now makes his home in the Northwest, is the one who developed Finland's Mika Koivuniemi into a major player on the pro tour. Jowdy, of course, has helped so many stars that he's known as "the coach of the

Hoppe has another international player who could be a future PBA champion. He's Alexander Medveditskov, a 19-year-old righthander from St. Petersburg, Russia.

"I've been coaching Alexander for three years," Hoppe said. "He's a high-rev player like Chris Barnes."

Alexander, who can't be more than about 5 feet 6 and 125 pounds, arrived at Fountain Bowl too late to compete in the Dick Weber Open. He made his pro debut in the PTQ (Pro Tour Qualifier, or rabbit squad) the following week in the Motel 6 Classic at the Strike Zone at Sunset Station in Henderson, a suburb of Las Vegas.

It turned out to be learning experience for Medveditskov, who finished 55th out of 80 bowlers in the PTQ. Hoppe, however, said his pupil is undaunted and will rabbit in the remaining PBA stops this season.

'There's no better way to learn and get experience than bowling on the pro tour," Hoppe said.

It should be interesting following the maturation progress of Alexander Medveditskov, the young Russian rookie, who has averaged as high as 240 in tournaments.

As for Jason Couch, who successfully defended his title in the Dick Weber Open, the talented Florida lefty may want to buy Fountain Bowl. Why not? He already hits the place like he owns it.

Couch, the hottest bowler on the tour, has a good chance of attaining his bowling goal this season-"to be the Player of the Year.

As a final note on the Dick Weber Open, Dave Osborn, who has hosted a PBA stop at Fountain Bowl for the past six years, says the annual tenpin classic will return in 2008. "I worked out a two-year agreement with the PBA," he said. "I got tired of having to negotiate year after year."




