

Tackett becomes ninth player in PBA history to win the Triple Crown

After 48 games and nine frames, the 2023 U.S. Open presented by Go Bowling! title came down to a single frame.

EJ Tackett needed a strike and eight pins to win the title he so desperately coveted. In perhaps the biggest moment of his bowling career, he delivered a pair of strikes to claim the green jacket and \$100,000 top prize.

Tackett defeated Kyle Troup in the title match 221-208, for his 17th career PBA Tour title and third career major. After winning the 2016 World Championship and 2017 Tournament of Champions, the U.S. Open title made Tackett the ninth player in PBA history to win the Triple Crown.

More than that, Tackett, at long last, picked up a PBA Tour victory in his home state of Indiana

"This is just absolutely incredible," Tackett said. "I have so many people here supporting me. What this tournament means is a whole mountain of things. The Triple Crown. The U.S. Open. Winning here at Woodland. Winning in the state of Indiana. Getting my flag down there in the Beer Thirty bar along with everyone else. Another major. The list just compiles what this tournament means."

The match was tied through nine frames as Troup stepped up to finish the match. Troup, looking to win his 10th career PBA Tour title and achieve Hall of Fame eli-



shot in the 10th.

But on the second shot, he missed left and left the big-four on the second shot.

"It's probably the only gibility, struck on his first frame I broke my pro-

cess mentally," Troup "I should have said. stepped off. I don't know why I didn't but that's something I'll never get back, so I've just got to learn from that."

After losing in last last year's U.S. Open title match, Tackett had an opportunity to complete the fairytale ending.

"I never looked at the score to know exactly what I needed," Tackett said. "I felt like I just needed to keep on my process and throw the best shot that I can.

"I knew if I got up there and threw a really good shot like I had been, the tournament would be mine."

He said he thought he left a wrap-10 on the first shot, but the pin fell late. He needed eight pins on the second shot to claim the title, but before the ball reached the pins, Tackett had already begun his celebration.

The 30-year-old unleashed a flurry of Tiger Woods-esque fist pumps as he hurried to where his parents, wife and brother waited with tears of joy. In a moment reminscient of his 2016 World Championship, Tackett hugged his father, who he said has been his coach his entire life.

'We don't really need to share words," Tackett said. "We both know what it means."

Troup, who advanced to this afternoon's championship round after defeating Justin Knowles in the No. 5-9 seed stepladder on Saturday afternoon.

In the semifinal, Troup took down Tomas Käyhkö, who was making his television debut on the PBA Tour. Käyhkö made excellent shots continued on page 6

There's a 25% chance that at least one of these six players will advance to the live televised finals on FOX, Sunday, February 5, at 2:00 pm eastern, and an outside chance that we will have an entire field of foreign players for the finals of the U.S. Open. peared in his first (and only) U.S. Open. I had won the right to represent California by winning the BPAA sponsored "Win-A-Spot" that was contested at L & L Castle Lanes in South San Francisco (just up the road from the famous Cow Palace), and Downtown Bowl, a 2-story bowling emporium in the heart of San Francisco. I lapped the field at the familiar Castle Lanes drives for the first five games, and then held on to win in the final five games at Downtown Bowl, throwing a Brooklyn strike in the 10th frame of the final game to beat out veteran Ed Bourdase.

There was no cash prize included in the "Win-A-Spot." Instead, the prize was an all-expense paid trip to the U.S. Open at Jeanie Hulsey's Forum Bowl in Grand Prairie, Texas. My hotel was located near Lion Country Safari, about 7 miles away. I remember the hotel provided a free shuttle to and from the lanes in a vehicle with zebra stripes. My fellow competitors were so envious of that free shuttle!

In the 1975 U.S. Open there were a total of 56 qualifying games rolled, instead of the current 48 game format. After the qualifying rounds of 24 games (8 each day, Monday-Wednesday), the field was cut to the top 80 bowlers, who came back on Thursday morning for an additional 8 games. Then the normal match play competition began, with 8 games Thursday evening, another 8 games Friday morning and the final 8 game block on Friday night. The top five would advance to Saturdays TV finals, where Steve Neff was the ultimate winner with a final 279-217 victory over Paul Colwell.

Those additional 8 games after the qualifying rounds were especially hard for me to swallow, as I was in 32nd place after 24 games, but didn't even cash (80 places). I have written about this before in an article titled, *"Billy Hardwick Makes It Right In Grand Prairie."* A combination of the pressure, change in oiling pattern, and all of the admonishments from Harry "Goose" Golden finally caught up with me. However, it was a tremendous experience, and one that I vividly remember to this day.

Speaking of oiling patterns, I could not help but notice the frustration of most players while watching the qualifying rounds on bowltv.com. Virtually ALL of the right-handed players that were having any success at all were literally throwing the ball out over the top of the lefthand gutter. Is this really bowling? Most lefties (one or two handed deliveries) were playing straight down and in shots near the second arrow.

Another obvious change that I noticed from 1975 was the crowd. While the cameras never turned to show the audience during the qualifying rounds, I could only hear a couple of people clapping. Even the pro-am segment was a sell out to paying spectators in 1975. Everything from beginning to end was standing room only. I suppose that this could be a carryover from the COVID years, but perhaps it's something that the PBA should address.

The same could be said about the professional attendance. In 1975 the event was limited to 240 entries (this was before the introduction of the pro tour qualifier, or PTQ). In the 2023 version a PTQ is mentioned in FAQ, but only necessary if the full complement of 108 bowlers isn't reached. Wow, what a change from 240 entrants and 80 cashing spots in 1975, to 108 entrants and 36 cashing spots in 2023. The only thing that has remained the same is a 1 in 3 cashing ratio.

Scores

Rather than list all of the scores for the week, I invite you to visit bowl.com. There you will find a news release for each day of the tournament. It was fun watching all of the qualifying rounds on bowltv.com. If there's one suggestion that I have for them above all others, it would be the selection of broadcasters. To put it politely, there's too many announcers with too much gossip, and they're not paying attention to the bowlers on the lanes.

On at least five occasions, I found myself muting the sound so that I could concentrate on the bowlers. Aside from that one negative aspect, there are many pluses. I especially liked the four to six different cameras that were provided as options for viewing the bowlers as they crossed the lanes, and the unbelievable amount of statistics provided by lanetalkstats.com.

Recap

I wonder if the bowlers still write their scores on a recap sheet, requiring the signature of the other PBA members bowling on their pair during the tournament as a verification? Hopefully they're not relying on a computer to keep track of their scores as a fail-safe method, like it is in most states with computerized voting machines. Does anyone else wonder why we can't get a copy of how we voted? Somehow that carbon copy with the signatures of the other players was particularly reassuring for me.

It's now Saturday evening and the TV Stepladder Seeds 5-9 competition has just wrapped up on FS1. In this instance, the foreigner (Thomas Larsen) did not prevail, and instead superstar Kyle Troup won the right to advance to the finals tomorrow on FOX (Sunday, 2:00 pm eastern). In keeping with the theme of this article, I'll be rooting for Tomas Kayhko of Finland or Richard Teece of England.

But quietly, of course, I'll be cheering for one of the three Americans that made it to the top five: E.J. Tackett, who led the field by 120 pins; or Anthony Simonsen, who has a way of putting it all together for the big ones; or Kyle Troup, who appeared lost earlier in the day but found a way to defeat Justin Knowles of Michigan in the last match of the Saturday semi-finals, 215 to 191. I've never been much of a gambler, but my hunch is that the winner will be Anthony Simonsen. *Editors Note: I'm going with EJ Tackett :)*

throughout, but struggled to carry late in the match. He wrapped a 10-pin in the eighth frame, followed by a devastating stone-9 in the ninth and another wrap-10 in the 10th frame.

Troup then converted a 10-pin to shut out the Finnish two-hander and advance to the title match.

The long-awaited match between PBA superstars Troup and No. 3 seed Anthony Simonsen lived up to the hype. Troup opened with a hambone, but allowed Simonsen back into the match by leaving the big-four in the fifth frame.

Troup again opened the door for the defending champion after failing to convert a washout in the 10th frame. Simonsen needed all three strikes to win the match by a single pin, but left a game-ending 3-4-6-7 split — the inverse of the split Justin Knowles left in his loss to Troup last night.

Troup defeated Richie Teece in the opening match of the day. He had a chance to take a commanding lead with a strike in the eighth frame, but just as he began his celebration, he noticed the 8-pin still standing.

Teece could not capitalize on the opportunity, missing a washout in the eighth frame, then throwing another errant shot in the ninth. Troup converted a 2-4-5 spare in the 10th frame to secure the match.



TACKETT RETURNS AS TOP SEED AT 2023 U.S. OPEN, TROUP JOINS CHAMPIONSHIP FIELD bu Nolan Hughes

The five finalists for the 2023 U.S. Open at Indianapolis' Royal Pin Woodland were determined on Saturday afternoon and a familiar name led the 48-game marathon.

For the second straight year, EJ Tackett earned the No. 1 seed for the U.S. Open finals. He paced the field with a total pinfall of 10,858, leading the next-best player by 120 pins.

Tackett will be the top for the stepladder finals, airing at 2 p.m. on Sunday, Feb. 5 live on FOX. With a win, he would claim his third career major title and become the ninth player in PBA history to complete the Triple Crown.

Tomas Käyhkö, Anthony Simonsen and Richie Teece also qualified for Sunday's championship round by earning top-four seeds.

Simonsen, the defending champion, is seeking his fifth career major title, while Käyhkö and Teece are making their major championship debuts.

The final competitor with hopes of donning the prestigious green jacket is Kyle Troup, who advanced from Saturday afternoon's stepladder finals featuring the No. 5-9 gualifiers.

Troup, who slipped from the fourth to the fifth seed during the final two games of match play, defeated the No. 9 seed Justin Knowles in the final match of Saturday's stepladder.

Knowles, a two-handed lefty from Michigan, was one of the last players to earn a spot in the pre-tournament qualifier. After earning his spot into the main field at the PTQ, he secured the final spot in the 24-player match play field, then the final spot on Saturday's show.

The 32-year-old's late-game heroics came to an end against Troup. He needed two strikes in the 10th frame, but failed to make the proper adjustment and split for the second consecutive time on the right lane.

Troup, making his first U.S. Open match play appearance in seven tries, will bowl for the title tomorrow afternoon.

In the previous match, Knowles defeated Denmark's Thomas Larsen, who made his second career televised round at a major championship.

Knowles and Larsen exchanged missed single-pins early in the match, but Larsen's three-bagger in the sixth through eighth frames gave him the advantage. Larsen could have shut out Knowles with strikes in the ninth and 10th frames when a pocket 7-10 split in the ninth frame ended his bid for a second major title.

In the second match, No. 7 seed Marshall Kent opened the game with a pocket 7-10 of his own. He responded with five strikes in a row and held a 15-pin lead through eight frames. A 2-10 split and open in the ninth frame opened the door

for Knowles.

After Knowles left a 7-pin in the 10th frame, the match swung back into Kent's hands. He left another 2-10 split and failed to convert the spare, allowing Knowles to advance.

In the opening match, Knowles took down Frank Snodgrass, a fellow Michigan native. Snodgrass struggled to carry, compiling five single-pin-spares in the first six frames. Then a pair of errant shots in the 8th and 11th shots gave Knowles all the room he needed.

Troup returns to the lanes for a showdown with England's Teece, as the finals of the 2023 U.S. Open begins at 2 p.m. on Sunday, Feb. 5 live on FOX.




