WCST-Ebonite Singles Set For Forest Lanes February 19-20

The WCST is getting ready for the WCST-Ebonite Singles to be held at Forest Lanes, in Lake Forest, CA. next week-end, February 19-20. We are expecting a full field of 64 plus bowlers for this one squad event, that begins on Saturday morning, February 19th, with the qualifying of two 5 game blocks, starting at 10:00AM. The format now with two age divisions, the regular division, Men, ages 45 to 59, and Ladies 40 to 49, and the super senior division, Men ages 60 & up, and the Ladies, ages 50 and up.

The number of finalists and prize fund for the tournament cannot be determined until the qualifying is over on Saturday. The Finals will bowl on Sunday, February 20th starting at 10:00AM. The following formats are the possibilities for the super seniors. (1) Ten or less entered, No Finals, they will receive one cash prize for every three bowlers entered.

That amount of prize fund to be paid out to them, less any super seniors crossing over to the regular division finals. (2) Eleven to Fifteen entered, then a step-ladder roll-off following the qualifying. Tournament Director to determine the amount of bowlers for the step-ladder, and prizes to be paid accordingly after each game of the step-ladder roll-off. (3) Sixteen to Twenty Two bowlers entered, will have 6 bowlers (Guaranteed) to bowl a finals on Sunday, No matter how many super seniors cross over to the regular division finals. (4) Twenty Three plus bowlers entered, then 8 bowlers (Guaranteed) to the finals, No matter how many bowlers cross over to the regular division finals.

Both Divisions to be paid 100% of their prize fund. Super Seniors crossing over will add their prize fund of their entry fee to the regular division, and those amounts to be deducted from the super senior pay-off. The Entry Fee for the tournament for current WCST Members is \$165.00 Guests, add \$15.00 to that fee. Current WCST

Members due to re-new their Annual Dues, and if entering this tournament must pay the \$60.00 fee, or pay the guest fee with their entry fee.

New bowlers may also join for \$60.00, and your Dues are good for one year from the time you join. Current WCST Members for 2005, that will bowl in at least 4 WCST tournaments this year will be eligible for our final singles tournament of the year and the \$2500.00 plus to be added.

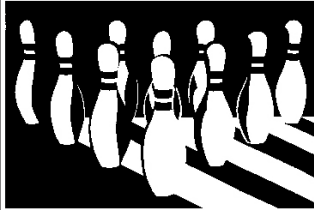

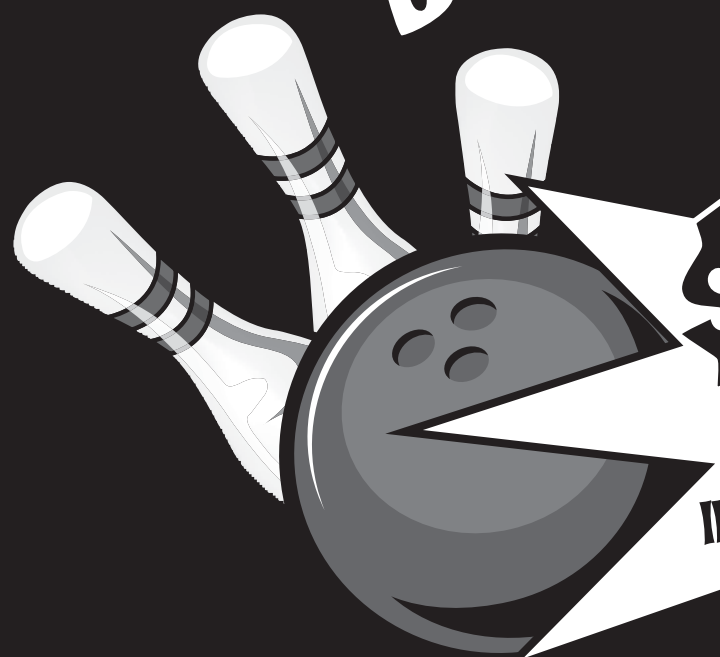

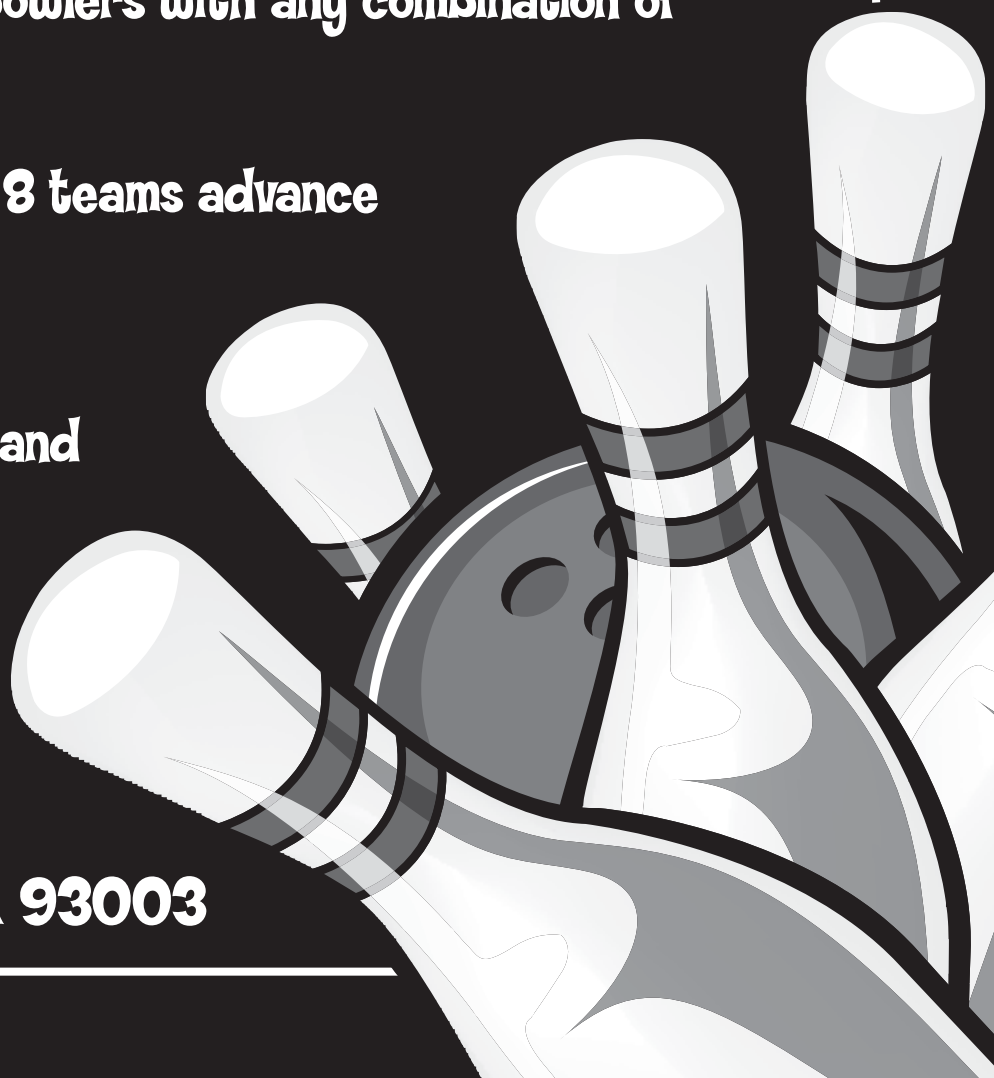
