

Tearful Carmen Salvino Competes in 30th and Final PBA Tournament of Champions

FAIRLAWN, Ohio -PBA legend Carmen Salvino was overcome with emotion as he threw his final shots in qualifying for his 30th and final PBA Tournament of Champions Thursday.

In front of a huge crowd at AMF Riviera Lanes, the 86-year-old Hall of Famer and 17-time Go Bowling PBA Tour winner extended his record as the oldest player to compete in a PBA Tour event.

PBA's most famous showman is one of the few remaining links to the storied tournament's origin dating back to the inaugural event in 1962. The 1962 TOC was held at Play Bowl in Indianapolis and was actually billed as the Indianapolis 500 Festival Tournament of Champions. It's an often-overlooked event because the tournament would not be held again for three years.

In 1965, when Firestone began its landmark sponsorship, the classic moved to Bowlarama in Akron and then to AMF Riviera Lanes the following year where

it remained for 29 years. PBA's signature event made its return to AMF Riviera Lanes in 2018 after a 24-year absence.

"I never won the Tournament of Champions but it was always my favorite tournament," said Salvino. "The biggest reason I kept coming back was the fans – they always made me feel special."

"Every athlete should be thankful for the fans because without the fans we can't compete," the Chicago native added. "If we don't have the fans you don't have a paycheck. The way the fans treated me here made the last 30 years all worthwhile whether I bowled good or bad."

Salvino's best TOC finish was third in the inaugural tournament. Joe Joseph won with a two-game total of 480 pins followed by fellow Michigan star Billy Golembiewski with 413 pins and Salvino with a 409

Loose Swing Helps Prather Win TOC And \$100,000

FAIRLAWN, OH - Kris Prather got as far left as he could, threw the ball slow, hooked the lane and his look was unbeatable.

That game plan worked to perfection for Prather on Sunday night as he never trailed in any match and climbed the ladder to win his first major title at the 2020 PBA Tournament of Champions at AMF Riviera Lanes.

While several of his opponents tried to play the lanes straighter. Prather plugged away playing a deep inside line and worked his way up to the championship match, where he defeated Bill O'Neill, 280-205, for his 3rd career title.

"I'm just so happy," Prather said. "It's always been the dream of mine to just bowl the Tournament of Champions. For it to be PBA Playoffs, survived


my first major, \$100,000, it's incredible."

BRAD ANGELO, THOMAS LARSEN WIN PBA/PBA50 DOUBLES T

• Brad Angelo of Lockport, N.Y., in his first tournament as a PBA50 competitor, teamed up with Thomas Larsen of Denmark to defeat PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Oxford, Fla. and team mate Nate Garcia of Port St. Lucie, Fla., 2-0, in a best-of-three-game title match to win the PBA/PBA50 Don Vay Memorial Central Doubles Classic title at Legend Lanes Sunday.

Teams in the PBA Central Region's first tournament of 2020 included one bowler age 50 or older, and one bowler under the age of 50. The title was Angelo's fourth overall in PBA Regional competition and Larsen's first. They also split a \$3,950 first prize.

In the semifinal round, Angelo, who turned 50 on December 23, and Larsen blanked Doug Kent of Newark, N.Y. and Tim Pfeifer of Oakdale, Pa., 2-0, while Williams and Garcia shut out Tom Adcock of Decatur, Ill. and Jake Peters of Las Vegas, 2-0, in the best-of-three semifinal round.

- Regional competition over the Feb. 21-23 weekend includes the PBA50 Dave Edwards Toyota South Open at Paradise Lanes in Spartanburg, S.C., and a pair of tournaments at South Point in Las Vegas - the Southpoint West Challenge for non-titlists and a Southpoint Member/Non-Member Doubles Tournament.
- Closing out the February regional calendar over the Feb. 28-March 1 "leap year" weekend will be the PBA Plaza Lanes Central/Midwest Open in Crawfordsville, Ind.

- Unrelated note #1 re: 1970 PBA TOC: PBA Hall of Famer and founding member Carmen Salvino, who improved upon his own record as the oldest player to bowl in a PBA Tour event when he rolled his first shot in his 30th TOC appearance at age 86, was sitting on the sidelines when Don Johnson rolled his 299 in the 1970 TOC title match. Salvino finished that tournament in sixth place, 50 pins behind Jim Stefanich, who was the No. 5 qualifier for the ABC-TV telecast. Salvino therefore served as "alternate" to the TV finals. It was standard practice in those days to have a backup ready in case one of the finalists was unable to bowl in the TV finals.
- Unrelated note #2 re: 1970 PBA TOC: all five finalists for the 1970 TOC telecast were subsequently elected to the PBA Hall of Fame. The qualifiers in order were: Don Johnson, Mike Durbin, Dick Ritger, Barry Asher and Jim Stefanich.
- Entering the PBA Tournament of Champions after finishing second in the PBA Jonesboro Open, Chris Barnes had moved into sixth place on the PBA career earnings list with \$2,481,331. He passed fellow Hall of Famer Amleto Monacelli who has earned \$2,475,574. Barnes' next goal is to catch and pass Brian Voss who is fifth on the list with \$2,577,979.
- In his first television appearance of the 2020 Go Bowling PBA Tour season Sunday in the PBA Jonesboro Open, Australia's Jason Belmonte threw seven trikes in a 257-207 loss to Chris Barnes. Fulfilling his pledge to donate \$50 per strike to his "2HandsHelpingAustralia" fundraiser in the wake of his home country's devastating wildfires, Belmonte's first donation was for \$350.

in his next two matches.

Belmonte was the only one who tried to get left and hook it but poor execution kept him from challenging Prather. Rash, Simonsen and O'Neill all tried to play the lanes straighter, and Prather wasn't unhappy about it.

"My swing got really loose because I knew that they were hard over there," Prather said. "I know we didn't spend a whole lot of time on the right side of the lane trying to break them down.

"I felt like if I missed a little right playing straighter, I didn't have any kind of recovery. And if I missed left, it went through the face, and we saw that with Rash, Simonsen and Bill when they were playing straighter. I just tried to get as far left as I could, throw it as slow as I could and just try to control the pocket."

Prather's only non-strike in the championship match came in the second frame when he left and converted a 10 pin.

His 280 game was actually the lowest winning score in a championship match this season. Tommy Jones won with 300 to start the season, Rash shot 289 to win the second week and Kyle Troup won with 290 last week. Adding in Prather's score, the winning average so far this season is 289.75.

As for O'Neill, he was never really in the match against Prather after opening the match by leaving the Big Four for an open. He'd go high on three of his first six shots to fall behind big.

In the semifinal, Simonsen decided to try to take the lane out of play and throw urethane hard and straight. The move didn't work, though, as Prather advanced with a 226-203 win.

Prather struck, stuffed a four pin, and then rattled off four strikes in a row to build a 23-pin lead heading into the commercial break. A blower seven pin in the eighth frame followed by a 6-7 split in the ninth frame for an open that sealed Simonsen's fate.

Prather was able to roll past defending champion Belmonte, 252-179, in the second match of the stepladder finals

Prather started the match with four strikes in a row before a 10 pin ended his run. Belmonte looked lost early on, missing the head pin right several times and even tossed a Brooklyn. He didn't toss a double until after the match was out of the woods and finished fourth..

Despite trailing by 26 pins after six and a half frames, Rash had an opportunity in the final frame to knock out Prather. Instead, Prather survived, 187-164.

Prather was in control until he left and missed the 1-2-7 in the seventh frame. He went on to leave a 4-9 split for an open in the ninth. A clutch double in the 10th frame, however, put maximum pressure on Rash.

Needing a double to win, Rash was distracted when he overheard FOX play-by-play man Rob Stone setup the final frame. He backed off but when he tossed his first shot in the 10th, he went wide right and left the 1-2-8 to lose.

The PBA Tour heads to Columbus, Ohio, for the second major of the season, the PBA Players Championship, which begins Tuesday live on FloBowling.

TOURNAMENT OF CHAMPIONS KICKS OFF "MILLION DOLLAR 300 BONUS" SERIES


The two players who will bowl for the \$100,000 first prize in Sunday's finals of the PBA Tournament of Champions also will be the first two players to try for the "\$1 Million 300 Game Bonus" incentive. Live FOX coverage of the TOC finals from AMF Riviera Lanes in Fairlawn, Ohio, will begin at 2 p.m.

This week's finals will be special because the competition will take place on lanes 27-28, the same pair of lanes where Don Johnson came the closest of any player ever to record a nationally-televised perfect game in the title match of a PBA major championship. When Johnson left a 10 pin in his iconic 299-268 victory over Dick Ritger, he fell face-first on the approach and Akron Beacon Journal photographer Don Roese froze the moment in time on film. Roese's photo was later re-created by artist Marc Moon for the cover of the 1971 PBA souvenir program book, and Johnson's historic image was later celebrated as the No. 1 most memorable moment in the PBA's first 60 years.

Under the million-dollar incentive program, a \$1 million bonus prize is again being offered to any player bowling a 300 game in the championship match of one of the following PBA on FOX/FS1 live telecasts: the TOC; PBA Players Championship at Wayne Webb's Columbus Bowl in Columbus Ohio (Saturday, Feb. 15 at 2:30 p.m. on FS1); the Go Bowling PBA Indianapolis Open at Royal Pin Woodland (Saturday, Feb. 29 at 5:30 p.m. on FS1) and PBA World Championship at South Point Bowling Plaza in Las Vegas (Wednesday, March 18 at 5 p.m. on FS1).

Only three perfect games have ever been bowled in the championship match of any nationally-televised PBA Tour event (including Tommy Jones' 300 in the title match of the PBA Hall of Fame Classic to kick off the 2020 Go Bowling PBA Tour season), but no one has ever bowled a 300 to win a PBA major championship.

Go Bowling PBA Tour Majors Stretch Continues with PBA Players Championship Feb. 9-15

Anthony Simonsen to defend Players Championship title in season's second major

COLUMBUS, Ohio – While Australian two-hander Jason Belmonte etched his name in Go Bowling PBA Tour history in 2019 by winning the PBA World Championship for a record 11th PBA major title, PBA Players Championship winner and fellow two-hander Anthony Simonsen of Little Elm, Texas, was carving out his own place in PBA majors

Both players will be among an expected field of 92 entrants who will return to Wayne Webb's Columbus Bowl for the second major of the 2020 Go Bowling PBA Tour season Feb. 9-15. In addition to a major title and the \$75,000 first prize, the \$1 million perfect game bonus will again be in effect for the Players Championship if the winning player bowls a perfect game in the title match of the live finals on FS1 on Saturday, Feb. 15 at 2:30 p.m.

Already in the young 2020 season, the Players Championship is part of a grueling stretch as the second of three consecutive majors in as many weeks. The PBA Tournament of Champions at AMF Riviera Lanes in Fairlawn, Ohio and immediately following the Players Championship the tour travels to Lincoln, Nebraska for the U.S. Open Feb. 16-23.

At age 22 Simonsen, the No. 2 seed, won the 2019 Players Championship to become the youngest player to win two PBA majors, defeating No. 1 seed Belmonte 232-212 in the title match at Wayne Webb's Columbus Bowl.

In 2019, Belmonte, who won the PBA Tournament of Champions the week before, held a three-pin lead in the fifth frame of the title match when he left a 4-6-7-9-10 split. Both players then threw strikes from the sixth through the ninth frames but Belmonte left the door open for Simonsen when he left a pocket 7-10 split on the first shot of the 10th frame.

"To have a second major at this point in my career, I'm speechless," said Simonsen, who won the 2016 USBC Masters at age 19 to become the youngest to win a major. "Jason is the guy everyone is gunning for and as a fellow two-handed player, he's an inspiration."

Competition begins Tuesday, Feb. 11 with six-game qualifying rounds at 11 a.m. and 6 p.m. Qualifying continues with the third round Wednesday, Feb. 12 at 11 a.m. after which the top 24 players will advance to the first eight-game match play round at 6 p.m. After the second and third match play rounds at 11 a.m. and 6 p.m. Thursday, Feb. 13, the top five based on 42-game pinfall totals will be determined for the stepladder finals on Feb. 15.

Tommy Jones capped a storybook week in the season-opener in January when, after his induction into the PBA Hall of Fame the night before, he won the PBA Hall of Fame Classic with a dramatic 300-237 victory over Darren Tang in the title match for his 20th career title. While the Hall of Fame Classic was not part of the \$1 million bonus lineup of tournaments, he did receive \$10,000 for that remarkable accomplishment.

The \$1 million title match bonus is in effect for the Tournament of Champions, Players Championship, Go Bowling PBA Indianapolis Open and PBA World Championship.



- CEDAR LANES, Fresno. Need we say more? Memory lane led right to CEDAR LANES. Sorry, can't repeat the stories.
- Bob Thomas was named Manager of the NATIONAL BOWLING STADIUM in Reno. (If you haven't been there, take a roadtrip up 395. It's worth the trip.)
- Local Robin Romeo captured her 6th WWPB Title in Danville.
- One more time -SAN GABRIEL LANES headlines; new ownership, new lanes, new setters, new masking units, new scoring, new arcade, new sports lounge and new interior. Call Ron or Paul. Who??? Opening soon.
- Betty Goulding general manager at CLARK CENTER surprised kids from the Shriners Children's Hospital at their bowling party (fundraiser). Santa Claus helped the kids on the lanes, gave out gifts, sang Christmas songs. Santa in July was a delight!
- The ABC was ranked 17th in size on the list of membership organizations with 2,576,809. World's largest SPORTS organization. Triple A and AARP are the top two in membership
- Tish Johnson finished third 16 times in the LPBT. (Now she's on the Senior Tour).
- More advice: don't depend on your "smart ball" for scores. If you can't hit your mark or know where your mark is - you ain't gonna score either! Good or bad?? Try to NEVER bowl a tournament on an end pair. (Everybody has an opinion from "always wear a clean shirt" to "don't put shoe polish on the ball to make it look good.")
- Hope was still alive to get bowling into the year 2000 Olympics in Sydney, Australia. They had 150 centers and bowling was popular.
- Bowling fever was a promotion by the State Lottery. If you bought a \$5 lottery ticket at 7-Eleven, you also got a free game of bowling. Most centers accepted the freebies.
- Quote of the Week: "If you have \$200 to spend on the latest ball, save it and take lessons. Learn to use what you've got."
- Wheelchair bowler, Al Uttecht, was legend. He received awards in his sport so often that some of the awards were eventually named after him. Never saw Al without a smile. Loved his cologne.
- Billy Myers, Jr. won three of the four PCB tournaments he entered. In Ventura he aced 118 entrants including Rick Berry to win by a spare.
- California WBA held free bowling classes for WIBC members. Instructor for the class at KONA LANES was Bobbe North. All a local association had to do was ASK the State! Then find a center and invite 30-40 students. Helen Duval was a favorite instructor. Another great program that faded away.
- What was the favorite name for a fun league? T.G.I.F. (after searching all the pages from 1994).
- The "Bowling de Marrakech" in La Palmeraie was near Casablanca. No, their motto was not "play it again, Sam!"
- The French Tenpin Association proposed bowling as an Olympic sports because the U.S. government got nowhere in 35 years. No was the answer to the French also.
- The latest bowling ball cleaner was called AWESOME. Guess the idea to use Coca Cola didn't pan out.
- EL DORADO BOWL in Los Angeles sponsored a "Celebrity Bowl Day." It was 12 hours of bowling with stars from Baywatch, Melrose Place, Beverly Hills 90210, General Hospital, Wings and MORE! Only \$14 for three games. Who said "bowling isn't for
- PBA announcer Randy Pederson won his 10th PBA title. Randy was raised in Southern California. He turned Pro in 1981, and we've followed him from lanes to mikes.
- Another ball cleaner for the market. "Squeaky Clean." One problem. It got the ball TOO clean and took half a game to get a hook back. Advice from the makers of ball cleaners... "Never put your ball away dirty." Still good advice in 2020, the pros say.

- U.S. government in one way or another had controls over big businesses. Bowling is a business but the U.S. never had any control over any part of it. The ABC/WIBC had control over most rules, owners, associations, insurance and guidelines. A safe business to be in and profitable if run right.
- General Tire gave up PBA sponsorship to sponsor auto racing. Since they produced tires, not balls, it made the decision easy. New sponsor? More later.
- Don Johnson and Jack Tanner bought TEMECULA VALLEY BOWL -formerly PIN-KY'S. A hard luck bowl from the beginning.
- Tish Johnson brought a pie to the WWPB tourney at MISSION HILLS to throw at Robin Romeo (Tish thought Robin would win). Ooops. Tish won, so she got the cash, the trophy AND the pie. Picture of Tish's pie face made front page.
- The ABC/WIBC had millions of members but was unable to promote bowling. Most of their income was spent on insurance, awards, travel, payroll, Hall of Fame, national tournaments, museum, taxes, rent, phones, etc. etc. etc. The average, once-a-weeker had no clue. (Same today! The average bowler says "I'll never bowl 300, why should I buy a sanction card?" The average secretary has no answer.)
- A first-time bowler -Bud Turrell, went with some buddies to try out this game called bowling. He got shoes at the desk, a ball off the rack and shot a 253 game!! Highest recorded first game. What was your first game???
- A few 1994 centers that aren't around in 2020: AZUSA BOWL, FRIENDLY HILLS, CLARK CENTER, COLUMBIA, HOLLYWOOD STAR, MISSION HILLS, DEL ROSA, CADILLAC, HEMET, SAN HI and probably more. These were weekly advertisers.
- The ABC sanctioned 100,000 leagues in 1993-94
- The great Joe Norris of San Diego rolled a 300 at age 85. The officers of his weekly league voted not to sanction the league at the kick-off meeting!
- New advertiser ... Logos Plus a new company in Paramount, Calif. They did embroidery, silkscreening, art design and lettering on sports apparel.
- Odd, but true: Lawrence Butler rolled six consecutive 180 games in the ABC Nationals.
- Lifetime membership in the ABC was \$400. That covered national, state and local dues. They threw in a money clip too!
- Frank Baker, ABC secretary, was the inventor of the Baker System of bowling (I wondered why it was called Baker). Its format offered faster, more exciting league play. Still played by many in 2020. Where? Check your center. Ask for it. See what the answer
- Two centers for sale: 10 lanes in Bishop and a 16 laner in Delano.
- A Southern California Hall of Famer (2019) won the Cal State Masters. Nice to have on his resumé. Right, Marv Sargent!
- Gibson's Bowling Supplies has a "quitting business" sale.
- More names I like: Pete Kizziak (802) and Mark Violin (299).
- Five centers looking for mechanics!
- GRAND OPENING –"Bowler's Warehouse" in Newbury Park; complete with a 28-foot practice lane. Drillers available: Mark Rizzo, Jeff Massey, Bryan Albert, Jeff Hickenbottom and Aaron McKissick.
- Another boring fact: of the 7,700 certified centers, the average number of lanes in each was 20. Only eight centers had over 60 lanes. Vegas holding the record for bed count per center
- 10-year-old Scott Oswley of Fontana rolled a 300 game. Scott was the youngest on record.

This gleening at a glance takes us through August, 1994. Next jumble of facts and fiction will cover September through the end of the year. If you know something that I didn't cover (except 300 games), call me Monday at (562) 807-3600. Watch for 1994, Part 5. You might be a headliner.

of the Year after winning a record-tying seven titles (Patty Costello, 1976). She tied or broke 11 PWBA records that season, setting the record for most TV appearances in a season with 18.

Her 20 PWBA titles is tied for seventh on the PWBA all-time titles list with 2019 PWBA Hall of Fame inductee Wendy Macpherson.

"It's the icing on the cake for my career," Dorin-Ballard said. "It's something I hoped I would be eligible for one day and be most fortunate to get there. But it's funny because when I bowled, I never really thought about hall of fames and I never thought about the money.

"I always just wanted to win. I always wanted to be the best. I didn't care what the trophy looked like and I didn't care what the check was. As I progressed in my career, you get to a certain point and you say, 'Wow, I got there.' I met a goal that I had as a little girl."

Dorin-Ballard was selected to the Bowlers Journal International All-American Team 14 times in her career, including 10 selections to the first team. She also was named the Bowlers Journal International Female Player of the Decade (2000s) and the first woman to be named the publication's Person of the Year (2001).

In 2001 and 2003, she led the PWBA in earnings and average and was named the International Bowling Media Association Female Bowler of the Year.

Dorin-Ballard was inducted into the USBC Hall of Fame in 2008.

Gianotti, 52, became a major champion at age 21, capturing her first professional title at the 1989 USBC Queens. The Perth, Australia, native would claim 16 PWBA titles from 1989 through 2000, adding her second major title at

the 1996 Sam's Town Invitational.

"I'm very grateful and very honored," Gianotti said. "It's a dream come true for me because that's where it all started. I feel very over-whelmed and it tops off my career. I'm looking forward to the night and sharing it with the other inductees."

She won a career-best four titles during the 1992 season, which helped her earn Quit Australian Sportswoman of the Year honors in 1992 and 1993. In 1998, she won two titles and was named PWBA Player of the Year after leading the PWBA in earnings and average.

Gianotti was named the 1998 International Bowling Media Association (IBMA) Female Bowler of the Year, the 1998 Bowling Digest Female Pro Bowler of the Year and was selected to the Bowlers Journal All-American Team 12 times, including four times as a first-team selection

She represented Australia at the 1988 Seoul Olympic Bowling Exhibition and is a multi-time member of Team Australia.

Gianotti was inducted into the USBC Hall of Fame in 2011.

Buckner, 73, of Reno, Nevada, won her first PWBA title at the 1975 PWBA Championships, and picked up her second major championship at the 1976 USBC Queens. She won seven total PWBA titles between 1975 and 1980.

"It's an honor," Buckner said. "It means everything. As an athlete, you go out, you work hard and do the best that you can and that's the highest honor in my estimation that any athlete can receive. I'm totally elated, very honored and very blessed to be elected to the PWBA Hall of Fame."

Along with her two major titles, Buckner owns nine career PWBA 300 games, four PWBA 800 series awards, and averaged a career-high 214.5 in 1980. At the 1980

Stroh's Light Classic, Buckner tossed 30 consecutive strikes during games 8-10 of qualifying. The run featured back-to-back 300 games ahead of a 280 game.

She added five top-five U.S. Women's Open finshes and two fifth-place finishes at the PWBA Championships.

A nine-time Bowlers Journal International All-American selection, Buckner was named a first-team selection three times.

Buckner was inducted into the USBC Hall of Fame in 1990

The PWBA Hall of Fame committee elected the 2020 PWBA Hall of Fame class based on applications received. The committee is comprised of three PWBA Hall of Fame members, three Bowling Proprietors' Association of America (BPAA) board members, three USBC board members, and three media members.

Nominees in the PWBA Performance category must be at least 50 years of age and have a minimum of 10 PWBA Tour titles or a minimum of five PWBA Tour titles including two majors.

The inaugural PWBA Hall of Fame class in 1995 included Donna Adamek, Patty Costello, Dorothy Fothergill, Mildred Ignizio, Marion Ladewig, and Betty Morris in the Performance category, LaVerne Carter, Helen Duvall and Shirley Garms in Pioneer, and Georgia Veatch in the Builder category.

With the 2020 class, there are 41 members of the PWBA Hall of Fame – 24 in Performance, 10 in Pioneer and seven in Meritorious Service/Builder.

The 2020 PWBA Tour season will have 14 events, kicking off with the PWBA Tucson Open on April 23-25 at Lucky Strike Bowl in Tucson, Arizona.

It was Salvino's 734th PBA Tour event since competing in the first PBA tournament ever held – the 1959 Empire State Open at Schade's Academy in Albany, N.Y. He is a member of numerous Halls of Fame including the National Italian American Sports Hall of Fame headquartered in the Chicago area and was ranked 17th on PBA's 2009 list of 50 greatest players in PBA history.
