USBC SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION DEADLINES APPROACHING Almost \$40,000 to be awarded in three national scholarship competitions

GREENDALE, Wis. - Three national scholarship opportunities are available for United States Bowling Congress members this spring, offering a total of \$39,500 in awards.

"One of the best advantages to being a young USBC bowler, besides tournament opportunities, is the ability to apply for some serious scholarship money to pay for college," said Brian Graham, USBC's director of youth development. "USBC offers several scholarship opportunities throughout the year, providing thousands of dollars in awards to bowlers in high school and in college."

Students should act now - April 1 is the application deadline for USBC's Gift For Life Scholarships and Annual Zeb Scholarship competitions. Up to 12 Gift For Life Scholarships of \$1,000 each will be awarded to USBC Youth members who are high school students and demonstrate financial need. Two of these awards are reserved for a son and a daughter of fire department, emergency rescue or police personnel.

"USBC's annual Gift For Life Scholarships competition began in 2002 in honor of the Sept. 11th heroes who risked their lives to save others," Graham said. "Since the Gift For Life awards are based purely on financial need, bowlers who are freshmen, sophomores, juniors or seniors in high school can apply each year they are eligible, even if they have already won a Gift For Life Scholarship in a previous year."

The Annual Żeb Scholarship - a \$2,500 award - recognizes a USBC Youth member who is a high school junior or senior, achieves academic success and gives back to his or her community through service. The award also includes an expense-paid trip for the winner and a parent or guardian to attend the awards ceremony held in conjunction with the USBC Junior Gold Championships this July in suburban Detroit. "Since the Annual Zeb Scholarship is named for Jim Zebehazy, who was executive director of USBC's predecessor youth organization during the launch and rapid growth of the Junior Gold program, it's fitting that the Annual Zeb Scholarship is presented at the championships," Graham said. High school seniors and college students have until May 1 to

High school seniors and college students have until May 1 to apply for USBC's Earl Anthony Memorial Scholarships, a competition which recognizes five USBC members for their community involvement and academic achievements. Financial need also is considered. These awards are \$5,000 each. "Earl Anthony did so much to encourage youth bowlers during his professional bowling career and in his later years," Graham said. "These awards are provided in his memory to uphold the ideals that Earl held dear: good citizenship, fair play and dedicated action to achieve goals."

Barnes Bounces Back

Chris Barnes took over the lead in the 2007-08 PBA Player of the Year race.

EL PASO, TX —Many people predicted after his latest disappointment in a title match that Chris Barnes would break out of his slump in a big way. They were right.

Just two weeks after one of the biggest mistakes of his career, Barnes responded with his ninth career Denny's PBA Tour title, defeating Tommy Jones, 241-158, to win the 2008 Bayer Classic at Oasis Lanes. The victory also gave Barnes the lead in the 2007-08 PBA Player of the Year race.

Barnes has struggled throughout his entire career in televised championship rounds despite appearing in the finals more times than any bowler on the Tour since 2000. This season has been no different as he came up empty in seven championship round appearances coming into this week, the biggest heartbreak coming in the H&R Block Tournament of Champions two weeks ago. Against Michael Haugen Jr., Barnes lost a 52-pin lead late in the match and missed a singlepin conversion which cost him his third career Major title.

The 37-year-old bounced back by making his fourth consecutive championship round and Tour-leading eighth of the season. "Getting away from all the drama was the most important thing. You can make a lot of what you see in 20 minutes on TV and forget about the 15 hours during the week it took to get there," Barnes (Double Oak, Texas) said. "It was important to concentrate on that. The mistake I've made a lot has been losing focus for a couple frames here and there

and that cost me. I did lose my focus a couple times today but fortunately I got it together and made some good shots."

Barnes knocked off his Tour roommate, Mika Koivuniemi, 240-198, in the semifinals in a rematch of last year's title match at Oasis Lanes. He then took on Jones who is Barnes' polar opposite on television. Jones came in with a Tourrecord .811 winning percentage in his career on TV (30-7) and an 11-2 record in title matches compared to Barnes' 8-18 record when a title is on the line.

In the title match Sunday, Barnes jumped out to an early lead with strikes in the first three frames while Jones had two spares and an open in the first four frames. Jones started to climb back in the match after Barnes had three consecutive spares in the fourth, fifth and sixth frames, but after Jones doubled he left the 2-8-10 split and opened.


Playing the outside part of the lane compared to the other finalists who played inside, Barnes struck in the seventh, eighth and ninth to clinch the victory.

"Tommy doesn't give a lot of people second chances and fortunately for me today he did," Barnes said. "I looked at playing the lanes inside because typically I like to play where everyone else is playing and try to beat them shot-for-shot. Friday night I moved outside the last game and I felt good there so it was in the back of my mind."

Devin Bidwell and Jeremy Davis captured Junior Bowlers Tour titles in exciting Southern California Conference action on Saturday, February 2nd, at Indio's Fantasy Lanes.

The PBA Shark pattern really challenged the field, as it took only a 170 average to qualify for the semifinals. The semis used our low-man-out Survivor format, adding extra pressure on everyone, since they could be eliminated in any game, no matter how high they qualified.

This format can often be brutal on top seeds, but Bidwell had the answer all day long in the scratch division, leading the 5-game qualifier at +121. The 21 semifinalists were eventually whittled to four, and in those semifinal matches Bidwell defeated Joey Chuo, who nonetheless enjoyed his high finish in a JBT event, and Forrest Holland beat Bear Wiltfang, to set up the title match.

Devin and Forrest are two of the best JBT bowlers without a JBT singles title, though Devin has a doubles title. That anomaly had to change for one of them, and Bidwell's opening five-bagger left no doubt as to who it would be, as he rolled the high game of the tournament en route to a 253-162 win over Holland for the title. A good day in brackets and an extra \$100 from Ebonite for using their brand new Complete NV ball resulted in a big \$465 scholarship payday for the talented righty.

San Diego's Kirk Chui led the handicap division qualifier, and survived as 21 semifinalists were whittled to eight before losing in that round. In the round of four, Jeremy Davis edged Wesley Low 202-197, while newcomer John Wright got past veteran Drew Stern 234-187, setting up the finale.

In the title match, Wright struggled early, allowing Davis the space he needed to claim his first JBT title with a 221-188 victory

The following day, Matt Cormack and Michael Unger captured JBT titles at Morongo Casino's Canyon Lanes.

No 300 game has yet been bowled at the spectacular new center, and lots of bowlers had a crack to be the first, with Cormack's 299 opening effort proving to be the closest call. After briefly losing the lead, he ended up qualifying first for the stepladder finals.

The scratch finals opened with Matt Jones squeaking by Arizona's Kyle King 203-180. 26-time winner BJ Baker then defeated Jones 227-201, then followed with a 259-198 walloping of Jeff Spiesman to get to top seed Cormack.

Matt won his first JBT title on Feb. 4, 2007, and is now 2-for-2 on that date, as a ninth frame Greek Church from Baker gave Matt the edge for a 223-206 win and his 4th career JBT title.

On Super Sunday, no adjective was better to describe Unger, who after a string of forgettable JBT results, destroyed the field en route to the top seed. His 5-game qualifying score (+288) and his 330 game with handicap were both the 5th best efforts ever in our 500+ event history.

Four other handicappers fought it out for the right to dethrone Unger, beginning with Chris Tucker, who opened the stepladder finals with a 203-180 win over Drew Stern. Tucker then snuck by Kyle Frederick 204-198, before red-hot Eddie Sayles beat Tucker 244-221, to reach the title match.

No opponent could have been scarier for Unger than Sayles, who has already won three times in So Cal this year. However, Eddie's carry suddenly disappeared, as he left a solid-8, solid-9, solid-10, and two 7 pins in the title match, while Unger kept on doing what got him to the top seed, giving Michael a 229-203 win and his first career JBT title. Big thanks to Mr. Randy Johnson and everyone at Canyon for a great job hosting our Tour- if you haven't seen this beautiful new center yet, please check it out soon! Over \$1,900 in scholarships were awarded to bowlers of all ages and averages. Want in on the fun? Come on down to the next JBT event, it's as simple as that! 
