The nine-year veteran came into the day just 7-15 in title matches, but improved to 2-0 in the Metroplex after winning the 2003 Days Inn Open. He has also won back-to-back Motel 6 Roll to Riches crowns, a special event which has been held in the Dallas area the last two seasons and awards a winner-take-all

"Its euphoric any time you win. Finishing second as many times as I have, any time you do win it makes you appreciate it that much more," Barnes said. "Every title is sweet but there's no better environment than winning in front on your family and friends.

The Double Oak, Texas, resident controlled the match from the beginning, striking with his first three shots. After a ninespare in the 4th, Barnes put together another turkey while May could not keep up. A spare in the 10th frame gave Barnes at least one title in six consecutive

Barnes advanced to the title match with a 229-192 win over 2005-06 PBA Rookie of the Year Bill O'Neill. O'Neill struck just three times in the match, while an early turkey in frames 2-4 helped Barnes take a lead he never relinquished.

In the second semifinals, May defeated Mike DeVaney, 193-188. May, making his first TV appearance since 2001, had a turkey in frames 3-5 to take the early lead, but DeVaney stayed close until a five-count and an open in the 9th frame. A strike and nine-spare in the 10th by DeVaney meant May only needed count in the 10th frame.

Barnes earned \$25,000 and an exemption for the 2007-08 season for the win, while May (Iron Station, N.C.) took home \$13,000 for second. O'Neill (Levittown, Pa.) earned \$6,500 for third and DeVaney (Temecula, Calif.) earned \$5,500 for fourth.

Next week the Denny's PBA Tour heads to Council Bluffs, Iowa for the 2007 Go RVing Classic, Feb. 14-18 at Thunderbowl. The nationally televised ESPN finals take place Sunday, Feb. 18 at 11:30 a.m. CST.

Bowlfest Helps Usher in 2007 USBC Open Championships

RENO, Nev.—In less than a week, the 2007 United States Bowling Congress Open Championships will begin in Reno, Nev., and it will bebusiness as usual for the tournament as more than 80,000 bowlers make their way to the National Bowling Stadium from Feb. 17 until July

But on Sunday, it was all fun and games as the USBC hosted Bowlfest, a celebration of bowling and the USBC Open Championships, which was an entertaining way to re-introduce the upcoming tournament to the community that will host it for a record eighth time.

"It was great to see so many bowling fans and members of the media come out to help us celebrate our return to Reno," said Open Championships Tournament Director Brian Lewis. "We were able to show off some of the sport's most entertaining stars and showcase the one-ofa-kind National Bowling Stadium and its recent renovations."

Bowlfest, which drew more than 300 fans, featured USBC spokespeople Diandra Asbaty and Carolyn Dorin-Ballard, former pro and defending Open Championships Regular Singles champion Wendy Macpherson, USBC/Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer Carmen Salvino, five-time PBA champion Bob Learn Jr. and Jim Cripps, the Backwards Bowler.

The event opened with a Ladies and Legends match in which Macpherson and Learn defeated Dorin-Ballard and Salvino 200-193, although the score wasn't as important as the unique chance the fans had to see a lighter side of bowling and get to know some of their all-time favorites.

One of the highlights of the two-hour event was the Media Challenge, in which four TV stations and two newspapers from the Reno area turned out and teamed up with the stars for a one-game Baker-style match to crown the media bowling champion of Reno.

The field included KTVN Channel 2 (CBS), KRNV Channel 4 (NBC), KOLO Channel 8 (ABC), KREN Channel 27 (CW), the Reno Gazette-Journal and Sierra Strikeline, the local bowling newspaper. In the end, it was Sierra Strikeline and USBC Chief Officer of Tournaments and Events Roseann Kuhn hoisting the trophy. The group will have the chance to defend its title when the Open Championships returns to Reno in 2010.

"It was great to see the local media taking an interest in our event, and I'm glad they had a chance to bowl on the tournament lanes and share in the Open Championships experience," Kuhn said. "We hope to do more events like this in the future because it gives us an opportunity to let the community and the media know what to expect in the 4-6 months that the USBC Open Championships are in town. It also gives us a chance to promote bowling and have some light-hearted fun on the lanes."

Bowlfest's grand finale was a trick shot exhibition that featured Cripps, a real estate agent who has made a second career as the Backwards Bowler. Cripps entertained the crowd with strike after strike with his back to the pins, which was followed by a series of trick shots pre-set by Learn and the other stars using extra balls and pins, chairs and ball returns

U.S. Pan Am Games Athletes To Be Determined At Team Trials

Barnes, Pluhowsky top women's standings while Page, O'Sullivan lead men's field

GREENDALE, Wis. — The battle to see who will represent the United States in bowling competition at this year's Pan American Games will conclude with the U.S. Pan American Team Trials in Milwaukee on Feb. 16-17.

The United States will be represented by two men and two women from Team USA 2007 at the 2007 Pan American Games, which will be held July 19-28 in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. The four individuals will be announced on the evening of Feb. 17 following the conclusion of the U.S. Pan American Team Trials.

Nine men and six women from Team USA 2007 are scheduled to compete at the U.S. Pan American Team Trials, which will feature four separate tournaments (three five-game blocks on Feb. 16 at Olympic Lanes, one six-game block on Feb. 17 at the United States Bowling Congress testing facility) on four different lane oil patterns. This will account for the remaining 45 percent of team qualification.

"Competing in the Pan American Games is one of the biggest honors in any sport," USBC Team USA High-Performance Director David Garber said. "This is a chance for our Team USA representatives to shine alongside Olympic gold medalists and experience this premier showcase of athletes."

Selection criteria for the U.S. Pan American Games team:

* Total ranking points from 2006 major competition at the U.S. Open, USBC Open Championships, USBC Women's Championships, USBC Queens and USBC Masters (15 percent of weight).

* Actual pinfall finish at the 2007 USBC Team USA Trials, which were held Jan. 8-11 at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, Nev. (40 percent of weight).

* Total ranking points from 2007 U.S. Pan American Team Trials, consisting of actual pinfall total in four separate tournaments (45 percent of weight).

Reigning U.S. Amateur women's champion Lynda Barnes of Double Oak, Texas, holds a slim 10-point lead over 2006 USBC Queens champion Shannon Pluhowsky of Phoenix in the women's standings. At the 2003 Pan Am Games, Pluhowsky won the women's singles gold medal and earned silver in doubles with Stacy Werth.

Sitting in third place only 17.5 points behind Pluhowsky is 2005 Queens champion Tennelle Milligan of Yorba Linda, Calif., who regained a spot on Team USA after a stint on the Professional Women's Bowling Association tour. Reigning QubicaAMF World Cup champion Diandra Asbaty of Chicago

The Pan American Games are an Americas version of the Olympic Games but also include those not designated as Olympic Program sports, such as bowling. Conducted every four years, the first Pan American Games were held in 1951 in Buenos Aires, Argentina.

An estimated 5,500 athletes from 42 countries will compete in 28 sports at the XV Pan American Games in Rio de Janeiro. The bowling competition is scheduled for July 23-26 at Barra Bowling Center, a 20-lane facility located in the Barra Shopping Mall.

USBC Hall of Famer Rokuro "Fuzzy" Shimada Dies at age 85

GREENDALE, Wis.— United States Bowling Congress Hall of Famer Rokuro "Fuzzy" Shimada died Feb. 8 in Greenville, N.C., of heart failure. He was 85.

Shimada was a leader in promoting the sport to Japanese-Americans. The Santa Clara, Calif., native shared his knowledge as an instructor and promoter throughout California and helped organize the National Japanese-American Championships where he won 13 titles in 43 years of participation.

Elected into the former American Bowling Congress Hall of Fame in 1997 in the Pioneer category, Shimada was an accomplished bowler who was originally barred from ABC membership because of the organization's Caucasian-only membership rule that was in effect prior to 1950.

He was the first Asian-American to roll a 300 game in organized play, but it was not recognized because of the Caucasian-only rule.

As an accomplished bowler Shimada had 10 top-10 ABC Tournament finishes to his credit. He joined the Professional Bowlers Association in 1959 and competed in PBA events until his mid-70s. He also competed for the Fresno Bombers in the short-lived National Bowling League (1961).

Shimada moved to North Carolina approximately five years ago.

A memorial service will be held Feb. 17 at 7 p.m. at the San Jose Buddhist Church Betsuin, 640 N. 5th St., San Jose, CA 95112. He is survived by his wife, Bonnie, and son Steve.






