WEST COVINA returned to West Covina Lanes where we saw 171 entries come out and support the ABTA. We had a semi toughshot making the cut scores of +57 for the men and +25 for the women. The Super Seniors added to the board (2 men and 1 female) were Leo "Horseman" Tartamella (+51), Mark Anthony Sr (+47), and Sierrie Herradura (+7). Super Seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 47 bowlers making it to the semi-finals.

Our top qualifier for the Men was Dillon Ito with a +123, and for the women it was Sue Okamoto with a +90. They will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event.

Each week our top seed overall draws the Match Series, and this time it was worth \$864. Dillon Ito drew a 455. We had two bowlers that bowled this score during the qualifying squads, it was Manuel Laygo and Benjamin Chung, they got \$432 each. We will estimate the Match Series at \$300 at the Oak Tree event. Last man up in the 3-6-9 roll-off was David Godinez. He needed to get five nine counts or strikes to take home \$1,800. Well folks, David did not make the 4 semis, but made this count to the max as he made all 5 shots of nine or better to take home the \$1,800. The pot will start out at \$500 at Oak Tree.

In our optional doubles, finishing in first were John Phan and Samson Kong with a 1414 for \$100. Finishing second was John Wei and John Phan with 1388 for \$80. There was a total of \$800 paid out in doubles and 18 paid spots with low to cash of 1312.

After the 3 game semifinals, the leader was Carlos Úmana with a +114. He bowled a good second game to jump out in front and then held on during the 3rd game. Finishing in 2nd during the semifinals was affable John Wei at a +83 to sit out the first round. Our top seed in semi-finals had the honor of drawing the match game worth \$1,040. Carlos drew a 119. After a review of all the scores bowled, we had no bowlers who matched that score. We will estimate the pot at 2,200 for Oak Tree.

Now on to the exciting top 16 Match Play finals. In the first round, the seven losers were Mark Fisser, Paolo Dizon, Sarah Magno, John Phan, Wendy SooHoo, Allan Calabio, and Marvin Crowder. They received checks of \$100 each. In the second round, the losers were Mary Huynh, Jesse Boquio, Darrow Tiongco and John Wei. They received checks of \$105 each. We are now down to the final five bowlers. At this point, our horses would be paying anywhere from a low of \$42 (Samson Kong) to a high of \$69 (David Dittlinger) depending on who would win. In this round we saw Alan Libao (10th seed) bowling Samson Kong (4th seed) that would go down to the 10th frame to decide this close match. Alan came up in the 10th frame needing a strike on the first ball and he got that, but on his 2nd ball he left the

4-7 split and needed to pick up both pins to win the match and only got one. So Samson would advance with a 228-227 victory. In the other match we saw David Dittlinger (6th seed) bowling Dillon Ito (7th seed). This would be a match where Dillon, who looks a lot like Jason Belmonte who also uses two hands while bowling, lose his shot and David having a great game, 239 to Dillon's 158, advanced to the semi-final match. Both Dillon Ito and Alan Libao finished in 4th and 5th getting checks for \$110 each.

Our semi-final match was all set now, and would pit the 6th and 10th seeds from the semis against each other. In the weekly "horses" we would see Samson paying \$42 and David paying \$69 if they would win their match. In this match we saw another very close match that went to the 7th frame when David caught a split, and it was sealed in the 9th frame when David missed a 4 pin. Samson would go on to win the match with a 173/212 to 168/193 and advance to the title match. Finishing in 3rd place was David Dittlinger this week for \$200. For those lucky "investors" that had Samson as a horse, he paid \$42.

The title game set now and Carlos, the top qualifier elected to start the match first this week. Carlos would leave the 3-10 split in the first frame and only picked up one pin. Up came Samson, and it appeared he was on a mission this week by starting out with the "ham bone", 4 strikes. It appeared that he was on his way to the

In the 9th frame Carlos got another strike, and up came Samson to finish the match first but he left 3-6 on his first ball and only got the 6 pin. In the 10th frame he would spare and get 8 pins on his fill ball to finish with a184/223. That brought up Carlos needing the first strike and good count to take home the victory. He got the strike on his first ball and then left the 4-9 on his second shot. But it was enough as he would finish with a 189/225 and his first ABTA Championship. He would take home \$1,000 for 1st place and \$850 for Cash and Carry, \$100 for using an 900 Global ball for a total of \$1,950. Finishing in 2nd place for \$500 was Samson Kong who bowled so well.

Champion Carlos Umana is from Rialto and one of many friends that bowl regularly with the ABTA manily from popular Brunswick Foothill Lanes (Fine People). He used a Missing Link from Global 900 drilled by Mary Sargent. He is married to Naomi and they have two children Christopher and J. J. He would like to thank his family for their support, his friend Emilo Flores, David Pruett for his coaching, the people that bowled with him during the 6 pm squad, the ABTA and its Staff, and last but not least God for all His blessings. Carlos is a gentleman and well-liked by all. Weare proud of his first Championship. Congrats to one of the Good Guys!

Samson Kong (2nd Place) is from Temple City and used a Storm Reign drilled by Ed Williamson. He is single and would like to thank the Mou-Liu league bowlers along with his cheering section that stayed to watch all his matches.

For The Love Of Bowling

My father didn't bowl. It wasn't because he tried and failed. It wasn't because he didn't like the sport or had a bad experience. It was because he had to work. In those days a family man with kids had to work two jobs to get by. He drove a coal truck during the day and an oil truck at night.

Dad was an orphan, raised by an older sister, from the time he was five years old. He never had a chance to play games or sports. Household chores included gathering fire wood, mopping floors, washing dishes, washing windows, laundering clothes, cutting grass and shoveling snow. He had a job by the time he was nine years old. He sold the old DELINEATOR Magazine on street corners, for a nickel. He earned one penny for every ten copies sold.

It was the "great depression" and a penny would buy a loaf of bread.

Pop never finished grammar school and when he got his GED High School diploma, at the age of sixty, the whole family celebrated. Dad passed at the age of sixty-three never having entered a bowling center. Yet, my father loved bowling.

He loved bowling because I loved bowling. He loved bowling because I was a bowler. FOR THE LOVE OF BOWLING my dad took a third job on weekends, so I could bowl. He took a job shoveling coal so I could bowl. He shoveled coal on Saturday so I could bowl on Saturday.

As a kid, I lived for Saturday mornings. I spent those Saturdays at THE PALACE, with other youth bowlers. The Palace was the bowling center close to my home. It was a two story "cathedral" of bowling. Six lanes downstairs and six upstairs. The decor was western, with wooden Indians and cowboys in every corner. Powder blue saddle bags were on the sides of the ball returns. There was a Wall of Fame that every junior bowler wanted to be pictured on. I was no exception. I wish dad could have seen my picture there.

Dad was a poor kid. Because he had nothing, he wanted his kids to have everything. He never had a dog, so my brother and I had several. He never had any toys, so we had a box full. He never had time for sports, so we could play any sport we wanted. Our favorite was bowling. He never had a bowling ball, so we had the bowling ball of our choice.

When I was ten, Santa brought me a new Brunswick Black Beauty. I could see myself in it's mirror finish. I really liked polishing that ball, and used Simonize floor wax for the best results.

That Black Beauty was a magnificent ball. Maybe the best bowling ball ever manufactured. Surely it was the most beautiful. A surface texture as smooth as a cue ball and pitch black in color. It held it's luster better than any other ball. It shined no matter how many games it was used. Boy, did it glow when polished.

I still have that ball. It sits among my bowling trophies as a reminder of my dad's love for me and a testament of his love of bowling.

My father never won a trophy, never received an award. He never won a tournament. When I brought my first bowling trophy home dad was elated. He was the happiest man in the world. He was so proud. His face glowed as my trophy was placed on a small shelf above our radio, next to Grandma Dydula's portrait. That trophy sat in it's place of honor for years. It was there when I left home for military service.

Years later Mom told me that dad cherished that plastic statuette.

That trophy represented the fruits of his labor. It was there for him when I was a world away. It was there for him when I couldn't be. Now that trophy is here for me when dad can't be. He is gone now, and for me that trophy represents his love for me and his love of bowling.

Dad taught me that a life of hard work, a life providing for one's family, a life serving one's community, a life being a good citizen is a life well lived. It is a life with true joy and deep meaning. His example showed me that love is extravagant. Love will pay any price, expend any time, and endure any hardship to make a loved one happy. Dad proved you don't have to be a bowler to love bowling. You don't have to be a bowler for bowling to make you happy. If bowling makes someone you love happy, it will make you happy.

2012 PBA World Series of Bowling Returns to South Point in Las Vegas

LAS VEGAS (Feb. 9, 2012) - South Point Bowling Center in Las Vegas will host the fourth annual Professional Bowlers Association World Series of Bowling, a multi-event international competition, Nov. 2-11, that will kick off the 2012-13 PBA Tour season, PBA Commissioner Tom Clark announced Thursday.

The 2012 World Series of Bowling, the third consecutive hosted by South Point, will feature four PBA "animal pattern" championships and conclude with the PBA World Championship. The package of events also will include six ESPN television events, plus the 2012 WTBA World Bowling Tour Finals presented by the PBA. Two PBA Regional special events also are in the preliminary planning stage.

"Since its inception in 2009, the PBA World Series has

evolved into the true world showcase for bowling that we hoped it would become," Clark said. "Our newly-adopted relationships with the World Tenpin Bowling Association to expand PBA competition around the world will only enhance the drama that will unfold when we return to South Point in November. World Series IV is going to be fun."

The World Series, which last year attracted more than 200 players from a record 15 different countries, will get underway with an open practice session on Friday, Nov. 2. Over the next four days, competitors will bowl eight-game qualifying sessions in the Cheetah, Viper, Chameleon and Scorpion Opens, respectively. At the conclusion of each daily qualifying round, the top 16 players will advance to an additional six-game qualifying session to determine the four players who will advance to the ESPN eliminator finals.

Combined 32-game pinfall from the four animal pattern events also will serve as qualifying scores for the PBA World Championship. The top 24 after 32 games will advance to round robin match play on Nov. 7 and 8. After 24 additional games of match play, the top eight players will advance to an eight-player stepladder final.

Television finals for delayed telecast on ESPN will be conducted on specially-installed lanes in an exhibition hall at South Casino and Hotel. The preliminary schedule calls for the WTBA World Bowling Tour Men's and Women's Finals, Cheetah Open and Viper Open finals to be conducted on Saturday, Nov. 10, with the Scorpion Open, Chameleon Open and PBA World Championship stepladder finals (in two sessions) to be conducted on Sunday, Nov. 11.

PBA Tournament of Champions. Belmonte won his only previous PBA Tour title in the 2009 Bowling Foundation Long Island

Open.
"This feels a million times better than my first title," Belmon-

te beamed. "I bowled one of the best games of my life.
"In the second match, I got very lucky," he added. "When you

get a break like that, you have to take it, pardon the expression, in both hands and I was able to do that."

By winning the Chameleon Open, Belmonte became the third straight international player to win a PBA World Series of Bowling title. In two previous events, Palermaa captured the PBA World Championship and England's Stuart Williams won the Bayer Viper Open.

The third "animal pattern" championship, the Scorpion Open, will be settled next Sunday at 3 p.m. ET on ESPN. The finalists will be England's Dom Barrett; Dave Wodka of Henderson, Nev.; Rash and Patrick Allen of Wesley Chapel, Fla.

"It feels good to be back on a positive note," said Blanchard. "I knew the fall at the World Championship was just something I was going to have to shake off. I never felt it was going to be something that I couldn't come back from."

Both players were looking for a partner to compete in the RPC doubles when their paths crossed at the World Series of Bowling in November.

"Whenever you're in a team or doubles format you want a player who matches up with your game," Smith said. "Josh and I are very compatible because we play similar angles and throw the ball with a similar roll. It made it very easy for us to read the lanes and make the adjustments we needed to make."

Competition included an eight-game qualifying round after which the top eight teams advanced to an eight-game Baker format doubles match play round.




